





I received a call the other day from a gentleman I had the pleasure of hearing from a number of years ago when I had an artist that performed very well on the Juno Award show. That, if I remember correctly, was 1975. He called to offer his congratulations to both me and the artist. He was the first to do so and he made my day.

It is now a few years later and the same type of congratulations. This time, to me and country artist Cindi Cain. He read about her successful year at the MACA Awards and about her number one colour cover on the Indie Bullet out of Texas. It was another instance when he made my day.

What is most meaningful to me is that it came from a man I have respected in the management business for some years. He encompasses all that is good in the music business: integrity, honesty, humanity, respect, and class.

Maybe 1989 will be the year award voters will wake up and smell the flowers. Regardless of the outcome, he'll get my vote again this year for all the right reasons. In these informal settings, you meet the people who are often not available to you during business hours and you may talk business. I can go back in history and tell you about artists meeting previously unavailable A&R people, and the result of that meeting led to multi-million dollar deals. I have witnessed a conversation that led to a TV special and I can tell many stories that sound like fiction, but it does happen. This is the reason for events like the Big Country Awards. This is an evening for the industry and the chance to meet many of the major players in the business, who you might never have the chance to meet . . . and talk a little business. (EC: *Speak again, oh! bald and toothless one . . . !*) I try never to miss a party! (EC: *You've been to some with DK, SK and GL, to name a few; that you should have missed . . . !*)

**Stop the presses . . . !!** Sooner or later there will be an earth shattering news item that will really shake this industry. Rumours are just now beginning to materialize, and to many of us . . . it won't be a surprise. (EC: *Give us a hint . . . !*)

**Stop the presses . . . again!** Radio! Radio! Wherefore art thou going . . . ? Hold onto your mikes . . . there's a big change coming to Toronto radio, and it will effect the rest of the country. 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


## Watt and Orlick named in MCA appointments





## Never give up on a record that one truly believes in!

*"Shoot low sheriff, they're ridin' Shetlands"*  
(a well known Ronnie Hawkins admonition to always be ready for anything).

Remarkable resilient rock records like Sheriff's When I'm With You can be a bit of a problem for the status quo. They can also be a real heartstarter for the jaded and sometimes sceptical music industry observer. Sheriff suggests that all is not lost - the band's belated success gives one fresh justification and all the other hazards of hope. I'm sure you must have been reading lots on the Sheriff story in the Canadian media from Macleans on down.

This, after all, is undeniably the world's most amazing music success story of the past year, maybe even of the entire latter half of the decade. This is serious stuff.

It's a long long way from a relatively unsuccessful 1983 Cancon single, all but ignored in its homeland, to the very top of the Billboard American charts in '89, against some unbelievably powerful competition. All thanks to two minor market U.S. stations in Las Vegas and Phoenix having the faith. When all's said and done, the Sheriff story is as simple as that.

This is a true-to-life simple success story that would be a crying shame to complicate, but there's a few unavoidable lessons to be learned herein. When I'm With You, by reason of its very route to success, raises some fascinating insights. First of all, it shows that one should never give up on a record that one truly believes in. That fact should be embroidered upon every promo person's bomber jacket - when you've got a real one, keep on keeping on.

There's ample hope for every record, given the right place and the right time. If you believe in a record, don't give up on it no matter how many PD's tell you that you're full of shit. They just might be wrong. Today, tomorrow and maybe the next day,

but who knows about next week? That's another story. The hit stories of rock are written upon this credo.

If Sheriff can lie dormant for five long years before getting the kiss of playlist life, then there's still hope for a whole lot of other gone-but-not-forgotten potential smash hits. Their success can restore one's belief in the unsuspected, the main chance that someone with a good sound can still break through the clogged channels of the contemporary corporate rock beehive. There's still room in these late '80s for the lean left field shot to the top.

For a while, it seemed that this vital aspect of rock's evolution had disappeared from the realms of late '80s rock. More's the pity.

KLVC Las Vegas and KZZP Phoenix thoroughly deserve a standing ovation for their infinite wisdom in going with the Sheriff record simply because they believed in it. Despite the trades, despite the avalanche of no action from other stations, all the trade media activity that didn't predict this record's number one chart action. Not, at least, until KLVC and KZZP showed the way.

Wouldn't it be great if we could turn back the clock to those golden days when radio frequently programmed from the gut, and no one minded being the first cab off the rank with a hot new tune by an unknown artist. Some of the most fantastic records ever made came to the attention of our ears by this method.

I hardly need to provide a list of examples because you're certain to have a personal list of your own running around in the amps of your mind.


Let's hope that this trend is contagious and more stations give it a shot from the gut. Research and its related ramifications are all well and good but we should never forget that unknown records and unknown artists have to start somewhere. Why not at your station?

Another notable aspect of all this is the

Canadian angle, no matter how painful that might be. It's obvious that When I'm With You must be a bit of a "frozen ghost" for a number of major Canadian stations which could detect no merit in the record when it first came out in 1983. Might this mean that the allegedly golden ears of some Canadian programmers might not be as keenly tuned as they might rightfully be expected to be? To be or not to be . . . that, mates, is the enduring question that floats through this amazing success story.

With so many Canadian stations still claiming a shortage of programmable Cancon, why does a record that is good enough to go all the way in the good old U.S.A. manage to creep out through a crack in the floor? Why . . . indeed? Maybe there are a few other Cancon slices out there falling through the cracks.

While many of us ponder that enticing equation, perhaps we should be pulling out the Frozen Ghost album and searching for a potential hit single in THAT project. After all, if a songwriter can make it to the top of the American charts once, there's no reason why it can't happen again. This time it would be especially nice if it started in Canada. Major Records, a Kitchener, Ontario-based label, has released Katalin's debut single, You're The Only One (Who Can Make Me Cry). The single, jacketed in a beautifully-executed poster sleeve, was written and produced by Rob Farnham at Major Audio Studios in Freeport, Ontario. The single carries a four-part (MAPL) logo. Chris Mitchell supplied very effective saxophone inserts on the session, and Michael Shotton, who mixed and engineered the session with Farnham, provided background vocals.

## Nylons' Rockapella LP boasts six producers

Attic Records is laying on a heavy promotion for the release of Rockapella by The Nylons, the popular group's fifth album. Adding much interest to the release is the fact that six of the top producers were involved: Hank Medress (Emmylou Harris, Buster Poindexter), John Morales and Sergio Munzibai (Debbie Gibson, Club Nouveau, Billy Ocean), Jon Goldsmith (Bruce Cockburn), David Foster, and Peter Mann, who has worked all the group's albums, and gives an assist on arranging.

As they have done on their previous releases, this album showcases original material by the group, as well as some covers. The covers include Dobie Gray's Drift Away, (All I Have To Do Is) Dream by The Everly Brothers and The Coasters' Poison Ivy. Also included is a version of The Parachute Club's Rise Up.

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

## Big Bam Boo breaking with MCA debut

Who are Big Bam Boo? Well, a Canadian by the name of Shark moved to London to write some songs with UK native Simon Tedd. Surely if you have read anything at all on this band you'll be aware that the two met in a bus station, talked over old times, and in mere minutes had agreed to spend the next few years making music together. Time and lots of hard work aside, all it took was a live tour through every office of every record company in North America and the UK. Who could help but take notice? MCA A&R jumped first, signing the band to a seven record deal.

It makes a great press release, and the package has been serviced well. Unfortunately, as is often said, novelty can get you in the door, but without the goods you'll be back out just as fast. Big Bam Boo have gone about proving that they are more than an interesting press kit. Into the RPM office come the duo, each with only an acoustic guitar, and a simple pre-recorded back beat, to play their debut single *Fell Off A Mountain*. As it turns out they are truly talented musicians with melodic voices, who have great pride and appreciation for what they do.

It is a very well rounded, and now somewhat rare, songwriter who can carry a strong live presence, and still excell in the studio. "I could live in a studio!" Simon remarks. "There are really 3 stages to the whole process. One is writing, and the other is going into the studio, which is another process altogether, neither of which seem to make any sense without playing live at the end of it." According to Big Bam Boo, playing live is the most necessary link in the chain. From this experience they gain feedback and inspiration to write other songs.

Neither the unhealthy club scene in London, nor the lack of any true live shows in Canada has hampered the band's success recently. Their newest single, *Shooting From My Heart*, is making the steady climb across Canada.

While in conversation with some record company staff, Simon queried as to the benefit Cancon has brought their record. The response held that "It really hasn't helped

that much". The band, however, did not take that point negatively. On the contrary, they feel "Thankful that it's standing up on its own merit". They have a lot of respect for the Canadian attitude towards music, and feel that "Canada does sometimes lead the way for America", especially with respect to less commercial acts.

The London press, as usual, does not garner nearly that same admiration. When put to Big Bam Boo that UK media seem to want to place most artists into a certain box, Simon added, "Not only do they want to put you in a box, but they preferably want to put you in a wooden one and bury you six feet underground. They don't seem to work with the idea that making records is just a small part of something bigger. You know . . . a lot of hard work, years of experience, people's dreams being shattered, and whatnot."

This new perspective and confidence comes mainly out of time and the exposure to solo work following the breakup of an earlier team effort within a larger band. "We weren't getting anywhere. We reached a point where we weren't satisfied with the writing because it was a five piece band. Shark and I would instigate most of the songs, but they seemed to get so watered down with the whole band being involved. It sort of came to a natural close." Simon went out to spend some time in the clubs. He used only a synthetic drum and an acoustic guitar, creating a very pleasing mix of high and low tech. This sound similarly struck Shark's fancy, so, with the aid of the fated bus station meeting, things fell together quite naturally.

With respect to touring, the team has thrown together a band of personable old tour mates who have proven to assimilate well on the road. Though Big Bam Boo will remain a duo, they "Would like a band that feels like our own".

This very refreshing, albeit sudden, addition to the Canadian music scene, deserves the attention that was apparently denied their demo tapes. They have created a very pleasing mixture of, according to Simon, "The last 40 years of contemporary music", bound to be compared to many. That, however, would be unjust, as their sound is truly unique.

## Heavy concert scheduling for Attic's Spitfire Band





If you didn't know that Dion was one of the original '50s rock 'n' rollers, you would swear this was a great debut from a new artist. Produced and arranged, for the most part, by Dave Edmunds, this album contains several strong cuts that are worthy of radio play. Edmunds' smooth production technique lends a great cruisin'-with-the-top-down quality to such tracks as King Of The New York Streets (with who else but Lou Reed on background vocals), Always In The Rain and the title track, the latter of which sounds a little too much like The Wanderer, but grooves along smoothly just the same. Besides Reed, there are appearances by k.d. lang, Paul Simon and Bryan Adams, who wrote and produced Drive All Night, a bouncy rocker that opens up side two. All in all, a nice return to form from one of the originals. - DS




STAN RIDGWAY

When Feinstein first broke on the scene, there was some trepidation by music critics of his potential. However, after Remember (Feinstein Sings Irving Berlin) and Isn't It Romantic, the mold is set. With this Herb Eisenman production, we hear yet another masterful keyboard/vocal approach from Feinstein, perhaps a bit more daring, but an exquisite package of easier than 'easy' listening, nonetheless. The setting for this recording is the Oak Room of New York City's Algonquin Hotel, Feinstein's home away from home, and his music fare runs the gamut of film and Broadway nostalgia. On this trip, he is accompanied by fellow-pianist Armen Guzelimian. - WG




THE NYLONS

The latest release from this quartet once again proves that strong vocal chords and percussion (slick production doesn't hurt either) are all you need to produce a good record. This one contains the usual mix of covers and originals, the best of both being a gospel-like rendering of Dobie Gray's Drift Away, and No Stone Unturned, a peppy doo-wop track which brings to mind an image of these guys standing on a street corner, singing their hearts out. Their version of The Parachute Club's Rise Up is somewhat disappointing, sounding too

over-produced, with the percussion overshadowing the group's vocals. However, this is a minor flaw in what is essentially a good record, and one that should do as well or better than their previous efforts. - DS

CLINT BLACK  
Killin' Time - RCA - 9668-4-R-N

Not too many new artists break the Top Ten of country with their debut single, but Black is holding in at No. 7 this week on the RPM Country 100 after only eleven weeks of charting. To compare Black to other country acts would be insulting to a talent that has mastered his own musical signature, and one that will no doubt be copied. Lots of vocal muscle, good projection and lyrical confidence. Also key are Straight From The Factory, Live And Learn and You're Gonna Leave Me Again. Produced by James Stroud and Mark Wright. - WG



RICHARD MARX  
Repeat Offender - EMI - E1-90380-F

Not too many surprises here. Smoothly crafted songs, all of which were either written or co-written by Marx himself. Produced by Marx and David Cole, there's plenty of good material here for CHR and AOR programmers to choose from, and if the album's title is any indication, this one should 'repeat' the success of his first release. Nothin' You Can Do About It, the album's lead track, would be a good choice for a second single. - DS



The image of the singer as just a small town boy is still evident in the lyrics and it is obvious that he is sticking to a successful formula. This album contains a few more softer cuts than we are accustomed to from Mellencamp (check out Big Daddy Of Them All and Jackie Brown) and they come across as well as the more rocky tunes like Martha Say and Sometimes A Great Notion. All 'n' all, this LP has the potential for several more hit singles, so a summer full of Mellencamp is a distinct possibility. - DS



Simple Minds picked up quite a few fans after The Breakfast Club soundtrack was released, and they were able to carry the momentum of their hit, Don't You Forget About Me, on to 1985's Once Upon A Time. This LP, however, is likely to alienate some fans who were expecting a repeat of that album. A photo of Jim Kerr alone in a field, in front of a church, on the inside of the LP jacket, gives you an idea of how this album feels - it's moody, lush, and would probably be best enjoyed by yourself, headphones on and eyes closed. The first cut, Street Fighting Years, pretty much sets the tone for what is a very powerful LP, and, in terms of production value, the digital recording of this one makes it all the more enjoyable. Unfortunately, the LP ends on a sour note with a cover of Peter Gabriel's Biko. That song is just too identifiable with Gabriel and Simple Minds can't reach the emotional level to which Gabriel was able to bring his listeners with his version. - DS
