



Thorn EMI completes acquisition of SBK

Thorn EMI has announced it has completed the acquisition of SBK Entertainment World, Inc., regarded as a major portfolio of music publishing copyrights. The deal was first entered into on January 5th of this year.

It was revealed that the final purchase price was US\$295 million. It was further pointed out that the agreement stipulated that "the maximum price of US\$337 million could be reduced based upon completion of an audit of the composition of SBK's 1988 net publisher share figures."

The implementation of the program to integrate SBK and EMI Music Publishing is expected to be announced later this month, at such time it is suggested, "the program will realize the significant savings on overheads which were envisaged at the time of the earlier announcement."

In conjunction with the SBK acquisition, EMI Publishing has also acquired from Swid, Bandier, and Koppelman the assets of Combine Music Corporation, described as "one of the pre-eminent country music catalogues" in Nashville for a purchase price of US\$13 million.

Two of the founding shareholders of SBK are now in place with senior positions at EMI Music Publishing Worldwide, based in

Carlton Waddling, Vice President, Corporate Development for Selkirk Communications, has officially announced that Randy Timmins is leaving the position of General Manager of Westwood One Canada at the end of June (RPM - June 17). He will be succeeded by Don Bradley, who has been appointed Director of Advertising/Broadcast and Satellite Sales at Westwood One Canada and Seltech Satellite Systems. Bradley, who, prior to his Westwood/Seltech appointment, was Corporate Sales Director for CFMX-FM/Different Drummer Productions, will oversee sales and marketing of the satellite syndication and advertising services offered by both Westwood One Canada and Seltech. Bradley was also a founder and is currently President of the Canadian Association of Radio Syndicators and is a member of the Association of Cultural Executives.

Waddling points out that Timmins played "an instrumental role in making Westwood One Canada the leading entertainment programming radio syndication company." In addition to his role as General Manager, he maintained responsibility for station relations and also served as Executive Producer on all of Westwood One Canada's domestic productions.

Most recently, Timmins managed the merging of Westwood One Canada with Seltech Satellite Systems. Westwood One will continue to operate as a separate department within Seltech Satellite & Syndication.

Waddling praises Timmins as having "made substantial contributions to the industry, Westwood One Canada and our other operating divisions." He concludes with, "One bright spot is that Randy will be available to consult with Selkirk on a variety of business matters."

EMI publishing arm represents Yeston's Goya

EMI Music Publishing Worldwide will represent the score for *Goya . . . A Life In Song*, a major musical and theatrical project written by Maury Yeston, Tony Award-winning composer/lyricist. The international deal was capped through an agreement between EMI and Yeston Music (BMI).

CBS Records recently released a concept album of songs from the forthcoming Broadway musical based on the life of Francisco Goya, the great Spanish painter. A Broadway production is scheduled for next year. The album was produced by Phil Ramone and features Placido Domingo, Dionne Warwick, Gloria Estefan, Seiko Matsuda and Richie Havens.

The score has already produced the Barbra Streisand/Don Johnson hit single, *Till I Loved You*, which entered the RPM Top 100 singles chart with a bulleted 91 on November 5th of last year, climbing to the No. 22 position after only eight weeks of charting. A new Placido Domingo/Jennifer Rush version is currently bulleted up U.K. charts.

Set for release are a 12" dance single, *Viva Espana*, plus multi-lingual versions of *Till I Loved You* for foreign release, including those by Seiko Matsuda and Domingo for Japan, and Simone and Domingo for Brazil. A Spanish-language album will also be released with Domingo, Gloria Estefan and other Latin artists.

Hall and All Star Band to Big Valley Jamboree '89

Albert Hall and the All Star Band have been firmed for the final day of the Big Valley Jamboree (July 23), which is held in Craven, Saskatchewan. Also appearing that day are K.D. Lang and The Reclines, Ricky Van Shelton and Highway 101.

The proceeds from this event will be donated to Bosco Society for Disturbed Adolescents to establish treatment centres for children and teenagers with serious emotional and mental problems.

A&A goes highbrow with renovated Toronto store

They are billing it as "a store like no A&A store you've seen before", the company's newly renovated First Canadian Place location in downtown Toronto. Taking centre stage in the reception area is a glittering red baby grand piano further enhanced by strategically placed Roman columns, the gateway to A&A's unique classical music department. 

Mediacomp systems to Confederation College

The Confederation College Broadcasting department in Thunder Bay, Ontario has installed four specialized media computer systems, compliments of Mediacomp. The Kitchener-based company donated a music scheduling program (R-Sound), a news editing program (R-News), a traffic accounting and billing system (R-Tabs) and an electronic filing and word processing system (R-Copy) for use within the Broadcasting-Radio and Television Program.

A computerized newsroom complete with printer and microcomputers has been established to house the new system within the broadcasting facility. Approximately 80 Radio and Television students will use the system in the day-to-day completion of assignments.

Mediacomp is apparently one of only a few Canadian software companies to specialize in media systems. The company's products are in use in Thunder Bay and area radio and television stations as well as in a number of stations across Canada.

Says Mediacomp's Richard Byrne, "Donating to a college is one of Mediacomp's ways of putting something back into the broadcasting industry." He concludes with, "We are investing in young people and giving them tools to aid in their future success."

The four systems will be integrated into the broadcasting curriculum at the college beginning this fall.

Public and private radio vie for national awards

This year's setting, Toronto's Convention Centre, the entertainment: Prairie Oyster, Liona Boyd, Dan Redican and Gordon Lightfoot, who obviously didn't just play for their supper, plus the elegantly prepared banquet, was an indication of the growth in popularity and funding (with additional sponsorship from Labatt Breweries) of the awards show.

There were the odd mouthy presenters and winners, salivating at the thought of a national radio audience, but for the most part, professionalism triumphed and the only threat to the future of the awards show would be for it to go to television.

Hold on to your Festiva



New to the park this year, which was first opened in the spring of 1987, was a water toy shaped like a tug boat, donated by TV Week.


CFFX programming post for Sterry

In this exposé, Ellie will talk about the little groups, who have been formed to take over certain aspects of the industry and working very hard on their own behalf. This problem has come to Ellie's attention and, in the weeks or months to come, we hope to expose some of the conflicts of interest, under the table benefits and other unethical and immoral practices of this ilk! (EC: *I intend to name names and tell the truth whenever it doesn't muck up a good story! I will tell all and know all!*). Wagoneers on the road touting Good Fortune

Despite the fact his wife Bonnie recently gave birth to their first child, a son, Monte Warden, of A&M country signing The Wagoneers, acknowledges that "now is not the time to slow down . . . everything's in place." The band is currently on the road promoting their second album, *Good Fortune*, due for an early July release.

"To be completely realistic," stresses Warden, "recording careers, unless you're somebody like George Jones or Emmylou Harris, usually last five or six years. So, what I'm trying to do is have the most successful career I can and hit it as hard as I can while my son is little and maybe, after all is said and done, I will have made enough money to provide a nice childhood and future for him."

Indeed all the pieces do seem in place for this young band. While their first release, *Stout And High*, saw healthy response, especially in Canada, Warden is confident the new album is a stronger package. "When we made the first record we'd never really been out on the road," he states. "We'd only been together nine months when we got signed."

When the time came to go back into the studio, "we'd been on the road a year, and what was so neat about this record was this was the record that the fans picked the songs," he goes on to explain. "We put the ten songs on the album that got the best reaction on the road. The four of us discussed it

in the van one night, driving to a gig, and we decided on the songs within fifteen minutes."

In addition to the belief of the band and A&M, according to Warden, that "there's more potential on this record," the company is presently better equipped to handle the product than it was last time out, when the Wagoneers were its debut country group. "When we first got signed," he recalls, "they (A&M) figured, for some reason, that breaking a country act would be easier than breaking a pop act."

"A&M has really taken the time to learn the country market," Warden asserts, "and learn that, in most cases, you gain a country following one step at a time and not by leaps and bounds." He continues, "I've been very impressed by how they have employed people in the field and employed people in Nashville to really learn the ins and outs of the country industry."

Concerning last year's buzz that country would be the next major crossover item, Warden quips, "I never thought that would happen, not with real hillbilly music, which is what we do, and not with the state of pop music right now." He suggests, "Pop right now is in the throes of something similar to the teen idol craze of the late '50s and early '60s. Your faces are selling records; nobody's listening to the music."

"In country it's always been the music and the story first," he maintains, "and I feel that the young people that are looking for a

music with substance are turning towards country. At least 70 percent of our crowds are college aged kids and it was maybe 10 or 15 percent when we started."

"The 17 to 25-year olds that are coming to see us are not your mainstream 17 to 25-year olds," Warden continues, "They are predominantly the alternative radio crowd that are completely fed up with what they hear on the radio . . . and they're looking for something real and with meaning and finding it, rightfully so, in country music."

Warden partially attributes the success of the Wagoneers to the fact that they record original material. "People really have to believe what they're singing," he insists, "and the best way for somebody to do that is to sing and play their own songs. The singer/songwriter is essential to the success and believability and credibility of country music," he declares, "and there definitely is a return to the singer/songwriter."

A second reason Warden advises young country bands to record their own material is that "only the big artists get the best songs" from publishers. "Naturally they're going to pitch the songs to the Ricky Van Sheltons and Reba McEntires and the Randy Travises," he says, while "an up and coming artist is going to get the bottom of the barrel."

"For up and coming artists to make a name for themselves, it's imperative that they have quality songs . . . and that's why I believe that we got signed to a record deal so quickly," he elaborates, "because the label knew they wouldn't have to spend the time finding songs for us; we have the songs."

Having turned industry heads with their first album, both the Wagoneers and A&M realize how vital the reaction to *Good Fortune* will be in establishing the act as long-term favourites of the country scene. If, as Warden contends, "The singing, playing and writing (are) ten times better," this time out, this release could go a long way towards extending their recording career past the five to six year period he views as a realistic estimate.

Legends of Rock 'N' Roll set for Toronto's Dome

The Toronto-based S.D. Entertainment have announced the firming of July 9th for The Legends Of Rock 'N' Roll, the first full dome concert at the Toronto Skydome. Firmed at press time are Chuck Berry, Jerry Lee Lewis, Fats Domino, Bo Diddley, Little Richard and Frankie Valli and the Four Seasons.

Everyone appearing, with the exception of Frankie Valli, are original members of The Rock 'N' Roll Hall of Fame. This showcase was originally performed in Rome in November of last year and was filmed by Cinemax for airing on HBO in the U.S. earlier this year.

For the Toronto showing, each artist will perform a 35-minute set. The grand finale will feature all the performers, plus an All-Star Band. A limited number of advance phone interviews will be available. As well, 3/4" videos of the Cinemax film are available for dubbing purposes. 

HENRY LEE SUMMER - Pop/Rock
I've Got Everything
CBS Associated - OZ-45124-H

Does he have everything? Let's see: strong material, strong vocal chords, appearances by (among others) members of John Mellencamp's backing band, and a contract with a major label. What more could he want? Well, a hit record for starters. The first single, Hey Baby, is taking its time climbing up the charts so initial reaction has been slow, but it's still too early to tell. He had a minor hit last year with Wish I Had A Girl, so there's definitely the potential for greater success, provided radio gives him the exposure he needs. Other good cuts are My Turn Train, a cover of Treat Her Like A Lady, and the title track. - DS



PAUL McCARTNEY - Pop/Rock
Flowers In The Dirt
Capitol - C1-91653-F

Chart-wise, the 1980's have not been all that kind to McCartney. His last big success was in 1983, Say Say Say, and for that he needed the help of Michael Jackson. This new LP though, featuring an impressive lineup of musicians and producers, may just put McCartney back on top. A collection of mostly mid-tempo tunes, McCartney's voice still has that boyish quality that was so appealing in his days with The Beatles and Wings. My Brave Face is a great multi-format track that is doing well as the first single and either Rough Ride, Figure Of Eight or the reggae-tinged How Many People would be great as a follow-up. - DS

BUDDY DEFARNO - Big Band
Born To Swing
Star Satellite - 711

Clarinet soloists are an endangered species, which makes this collaboration between one of the world's greatest jazz clarinetists and the all star big jazz band of Al Raymond a classic and a must for every easy listening (A/C) station in the country. DeFranco has a strange habit of running hot and then cold, but swinging all the time, a strange mixture, but, that's been his trademark for years and his loyal fans expect it. It does cool out some tracks. Great stuff for morning and afternoon drive. Key are Skyliner, Tenderly (soloists Larry McKenna: tenor and Pete Jackson: piano), and I Wanna Be Loved (soloists Larry McKenna: Alto Sax, Tony De Santis: trumpet, and Pete Jackson: piano). Distributed in Canada by Trend Records. - WG

LOUDON WAINWRIGHT 3 - Folk
Therapy - Silverstone - 1203-1-J-N

Champion of the lost art of lyrics, Wainwright's offbeat humour and backhanded introspection continue in the vein he established twenty years ago. While the album is thoroughly enjoyable, the likely lack of radio support will keep stardom elusive. Bill Of Goods and the title track are standouts and T.S.D.N.H.A.V. (This Song Don't Have A Video) takes some interesting shots at the video era. Musically, this folksy offering is tastefully sparse and

understated. While not humorous in a belly-laugh fashion, comedy shows should definitely take note, as should campus radio, which thrives on this type of irreverence. Released on new BMG licensee Silverstone Records. - CM

BIG BIG SUN - Rock
Stop The World
Atlantic - 78-19641-P

Formed less than eighteen months ago in the U.K., Big Big Sun have produced a Police-inspired debut that may appeal to those who favour the British style of rock music over American rock and roll. There are some good tracks (Sportsday, Lilacs, Revenge), but vocalist John Joliffe may be in for the same fate as Lenny Wolf of Kingdom Come - criticism for sounding too much like someone else. In this case, Joliffe could pass for Sting any day of the week, but whether or not that will be a plus or a hindrance to the success of the band is anyone's guess. - DS

CAPTAIN CRUNCH & LET'S DO LUNCH - Alternative
Hillbilly Lounge Music
OG - OG-23

It's a shame that the sound quality on this record is so poor because some of the songs are truly inspired. Sounding like a rawer REM or Echo & The Bunnymen, the group experiments with harmony and discord, employing catchy choruses and standard pop song structure. While all but a couple of the tunes are strong, standouts include Goes Without Saying, Pee Wee Private Eye, The Letter, and Captain Groovy & His Bubblegum Army. Campus programmers will find it is well worth digging through those countless indie efforts in search of this one. - CM




BOB MOULD - Pop
Workbook - Virgin - VL-3066-W

A solid effort by past leader of now defunct Husker Du, Workbook successfully showcases Mould's fine songwriting. See A Little Light, the clear single choice, is definitely the most CHR accessible song on the album. While Whichever Way The Wind Blows is a raunchy rocker, the other songs sound, unfortunately, very much alike, resulting in an overdose of Mould's doubled voice and jangly guitar. Nevertheless, taken individually, tracks like Lonely Afternoon and Compositions For The Young And Old are likely AOR candidates. - CM

QUEEN - Rock
The Miracle - Capitol - C1-92357-F

Superstardom for Queen in North America has never reached the level it has in other parts of the world, like Europe and South America, where they've sold millions of records and played to SRO crowds. They've put together a new LP that was a year in the making and by the sound of it, they should have taken a bit longer. There's still a certain edge to their sound, but the quality of the material is far from what it used to be. Once the single, I Want It All, has fallen off most playlists, AOR programmers will be hard pressed to find another track on this one worthy of heavy rotation. - DS




DAVID WILCOX - Pop
The Natural Edge

An absolute departure from the bluesy pop rock which built his loyal following, The Natural Edge is bound to confuse Wilcox fans. The majority of tracks are slow, subdued affairs which feature keyboards as well as guitar. The title-track first single is slightly more derivative of the established Wilcox sound, but squeaky clean production has driven out the spirits which possessed his earlier music. The bouncy Our Town stands out as a likely follow-up single and folky Miss You When You Go should find a home at AOR. - CM

VAN MORRISON - Pop
Avalon Sunset
Polydor - 839 262-1-Q

Morrison's newest is another fine collection of laid back pop songs, albeit with religious overtones, that continues in the musical style of his last few releases (with the exception of his Chieftains collaboration). Whenever God Shines His Light On Me and When Will I Ever Learn To Live In God are certainly the most spiritual, and there are hints of his beliefs on a couple of other cuts as well. Morrison's skill as a writer of love songs is also evident on Have I Told You Lately, a track destined to become a favourite with those lovebirds who chose Someone Like You (from Poetic Champions Compose) as 'their' song. - DS



DAN HILL - Pop
Real Love - Columbia - FC-45162-H


The way to best describe this latest album from Hill would be to call it a 'couples' album. The underlying theme on all the tracks is love - gained, lost and everything in between. Unborn Heart, the first single, is slowly making its way up the charts here and in the U.S., and A/C programmers have lots of good choices for additional tracks to add to their rotations. An album suited more for cuddling by the fireplace than anything else, and it should prove to be Hill's most successful release yet. - DS

NEAL SCHON - Rock
Late Nite - Columbia - FC-45106-H

Having been one of the members of the late sixties-early seventies lineup of Santana, and then lead guitarist for Journey, Schon has certainly proved himself as one of the best axe-men of the last two decades. His new solo LP showcases his talent, but the overall effect of the record might leave the listener with a feeling of *deja vu*. This sounds like nothing more than another Journey record, and may end up fading away fast with only die-hard Journey fans providing it with any support at all. - DS

DRIVIN' N' CRYIN' - Rock
Mystery Road - Island - ISL-1228-J

The first track, Ain't It Strange, may sound like The Waterboys but don't let that fool you. This Atlanta-based band fuses southern rock and roll with country and folk, and comes up with a sound that works. The group's music to this point has largely been aired on college radio, but with this release, their third, they may just impress a few AOR MD's. Standout tracks are House For Sale, Honeysuckle Blues and You Don't Know Me. - DS



NENEH CHERRY - Pop
Raw Like Sushi
Virgin - VL-3067-W

While the smash hit, Buffalo Stance, is clearly the strongest track on the album, a number of others show good single potential. The softer Manchild is already seeing some club action, while Heart is a catchy hip-house number. Running from straight rap to dance ballads to hip hop and dance pop, this package contains something for any contemporary dance music fan, as initial sales are showing. - CM

BIGSTORM - Rock
Living In Exile - WEA - 25-61591-P

Australia has thrust so many bands into the international spotlight over the last few years, it's hard to keep track without a scorecard. Although it's weak at times, Bigstorm's debut does shine on a few tracks, among them Not Guilty and Rubber Love, the latter of which is a hard driving rocker that will leave the listener humming the chorus after one listen. Lead singer Stewart D'Arrietta sounds like a combination of Roger Daltrey (circa Who's Next) and Joe Cocker - quite a screamer, and, overall this album deserves a shot at AOR success on this continent. - DS

TUCK & PATTI - Jazz
Love Warriors
Windham Hill Jazz - WH-0116-W

Their 1988 debut, Tears Of Joy, was one of the freshest albums of the entire year, showcasing both the 'only ten fingers' wizardry of guitarist Tuck Andress, and the spine-tingling vocals of Patti Cathcart. Their new LP provides the listener with more of the same, and the two elements have never been matched as well by anyone else. This is a collection of originals and covers (Hendrix, Beatles, Santana) with an overall sound that gives new meaning to the word smooth. An outstanding album from one of the hottest duos on the jazz scene. - DS

COUNTRY

New Donna & Leroy single released

The Nashville-based Cardinal label has released a new single by Donna & Leroy titled Sweet Sensation. Produced in Nashville by Tony Migliore, the plug side of the single was written by Leroy Anderson and Cyril Rawson and carries a three-part Cancon logo (MAL).

Bookshop signs West Hill native

Bookshop International has signed Erik Johnson, a native of West Hill, Ontario, now living just south of Vancouver. His debut for the label, Erik Johnson/Waycross, was produced in Nashville by Vancouver's Tom Keenlyside.

New singles from Comstock

The latest releases from the Comstock label include a follow-up from Mary Beth and a new single from Tanya Marie. Beth's single, The Nature Of Love, was written by Chris Anderson and carries a full MAPL logo. This is her follow-up to Fool's Gold, which did well nationally earlier this year. Marie's single, I Don't Miss Often, was penned by Ben Van Den Hoogenband and Sue Rodgers-Young and produced by Patty Parker at Nashville's Chelsea Studio. The single carries a two-part Cancon logo (AL).

Dann production for Lee Ann Allison

New to the country field is Whitby, Ontario's Lee Ann Allison with her Ron Dann production of My Mother's Eyes. Although only eighteen now, she has already made an impact on the record business, both in Canada and in Europe through her 1987 release of You're Just A Memory. Session people on the new single included guitarist Mike Francis, bassist Kim Brandt, drummer Barry Keane and Dan on steel. Debbie Fleming supplied the background vocals. RDR Promotions is handling the promotion.

Lorrie single added at CHSJ

One of the first to add the new Myrna Lorrie single, Blue Blue Me, was Bob Henry, Program Director at CHSJ Saint John, and Bob sends along a couple of interesting notes on this country music veteran. Myrna worked the Country Time show which followed the Saturday night Hockey Game on CBC-TV during the late sixties, a very late show for the Maritimes. Myrna was the girl singer with Vic Mullin and The Hickorys who were the house

band. The show had special guests and regulars, much like the original Don Messer Show. The co-host was Don "Trigger" Tremaine. Myrna's single has been released on the Sibley label, distributed by Trend Records. Promotion is being handled by The Music Brokers.

CKBY-Bud Talent Search is on

This year's CKBY-Bud Talent Search will wind up June 16, the winner or winners receive a two-song recording session and go on to the National Talent Finals at Canadian Country Music Week '89. The Ottawa station held its first talent search in 1982, offering ten area finalists the chance to win a two-song recording session. In 1986 the talent search became part of the entertainment lineup at Wayne Rostad's Gatineau Clog and contestants have been playing to audiences of up to 16,000. In 1987 Labatt Brewery joined in supporting Canadian country music out of which came the CKBY-Bud Country Talent Search. Past winners include Linda Cruickshank, Donna North, Douglas McCarthy, Rick & Val, Bob Lesenza, Chris McCann, Charlie Major and Andy Langley.

Indie nominations for Cain and Sklar

Uptown recording artist Brian Sklar has been nominated as Most Promising Male Vocalist by the country music stations for the Independent Record Industry Awards as reported by the National Informer in Nashville. Golden Eagle's Cindi Cain was nominated in the Female Vocalist category. These were the only Canadians nominated for the awards. Sklar is currently climbing the charts with his latest single, Let's Get Serious, while Cain has once again established herself on the chart with her new single, I Think That I'll Be Needing You This Time.

Stoker Bros No. 1 on Indie Records

The Stoker Brothers latest Comstock single, Could You Love A Working Man, has topped the Indie Records chart in Nashville. The roots/rock entry from the Brantford, Ontario band was ahead of releases by Razzy Bailey (2), Emie Welch (3), Joe Stampley (4), and Ross Lewis (5).

Swanson wins BCCMA's Top Male

Music Line's Rocky Swanson has taken the Top Male category at this year's British Columbia Country Music Association awards. Swanson, a veteran in Canadian country, made excellent moves up the charts with I Love You I Need You Goodbye, his debut single for the label. A new single, When A Heart Explodes, will be the follow-up. Both singles are included on Swanson's self-titled album, which was produced by Ralph Murphy.

Grashey to Nashville for sessions

Golden Eagle owner/producer Don Grashey has just returned from Nashville where he put a few more tracks in the can for George Carone and recorded ten sides for Cindi Cain. Cain is currently moving up charts with her current single, I Think That I'll Be Needing You This Time. Carone, who recently returned to the business, is making a bid for the charts with his single release, When Is The Right Time. Both singles were written by Fay Walker.

CFGM Bud Talent finals - June 15

The CFGM Bud Talent finals will be held at Toronto's Birchmount Tavern from 9 to 11 pm on June 15. The winner of this session will go to Ottawa for the National Finals to be held during Canadian Country Music Week.

Tembo ships CD sampler of Whittaker/Baker duet

Tembo Music shipped a special radio sampler compact disc of the Roger Whittaker/Carroll Baker duet, One Night With You, to A/C and country stations across Canada.

The sampler includes single (3:47) and album versions (4:13) of the Whittaker penning, which was produced and recorded in Canada by Eric Robertson and Hayward Parrott. The song qualifies as two-part Cancon (AP). Also included on the sampler is the album version of the Whittaker track, So Far So Good. All three are contained on Whittaker's Living And Loving CD.

Super Country CJOC converts to CD players

Super Country CJOC Fort McMurray, Alberta recently installed three compact disc players, each capable of holding six discs. The station is now programming all the music possible from compact discs. Their CD library now contains approximately 1300 selections.

"We are extremely enthusiastic about the incredible quality that going all CD will bring to CJOC's sound," notes the station's General Manager Brian Blackburn, who continues with, "CD technology is certainly state of the art and we are delighted to be able to deliver our listeners the very best music audio available."

As the station's engineer, Larry Howell, points out, "The implementation of compact disc hardware will provide an immediate improvement over previous source methods of audio like reel to reel tape and turntables." He goes on to explain, "The three most apparent improvements are reduced wow and flutter, improved signal to noise ratio and improved frequency and phase response." He concludes with, "All of this relates to a crisper, cleaner and clearer sound, and the ability to hear all of the instruments in the music selection regardless of the pitch or tone."

Says Music Director Barry Britto, "This new system allows us greater freedom in fine tuning the sound of our station. We have new selections of music on CD that we didn't have on records or tape, plus our music mixes better . . . and just plain sounds better."

Program Director Bill Bergen is also happy with the new system, pointing out that "CD's are far more practical for playing than tapes or records. We get optimum sound quality, plus, for playing requests, we can program the CD players to call up the songs virtually within seconds, and, for playing sets of gold hits or two or three in a row from a particular artist, it's much easier with CD's than with tapes."


