







Lombardi maintains grip despite takeover threats

Johnny Lombardi has become a legend in Canada's ethnic community and certainly a leader in the field of ethnic broadcasting through CHIN Radio/TV International, of which he is president. The station now commands much respect as the "only" ethnic listening post for Toronto and area minority groups.

It hasn't been easy for the good-natured Lombardi, son of Italian immigrants. When he first bought CHIN, in the mid-sixties, he found himself in a difficult position. "The Board of Broadcast Measurement (BBM) doesn't measure languages other than English or French," says Lombardi, "So how was I going to get people to know that we were being listened to so that we could sell

advertising . . . everything is a cost per 1,000 listeners."

Lombardi goes on to explain that the only path that was open to him was to do "a lot of high-powered promotion to get people aware of CHIN . . . so I hit on the idea of a picnic at Toronto Island." The major component for this type of promotion was a sponsor. Lombardi approached his old friend Mel Lastman, now the Mayor of North York, who then ran a chain of Bad Boy appliance stores. As Lombardi recalls, "Mel jumped at the idea to get to the ethnic market . . . he was spending a lot of money at all the other stations, but he took a chance with us. That year, we drew 20,000 people to our picnic and then Mel became a very special sponsor after that and he built a terrific business in the ethnic market."

The first eight years of the CHIN Picnic were held at Toronto Island, but because the crowds became so large, it was decided to move to Exhibition Place where the attendance has grown yearly to an incredible 250,000 over the three days. Obviously, it was easy to claim the record as the world's largest free picnic, a record that still stands. The annual three-day event is now more than a picnic. There are a variety of events, bikini contests, boxing tournaments, circus shows, and top entertainment from Europe and the Caribbean Islands, and a bazaar that this year moves to the Better Living Building where the booth area was sold out weeks prior to the show.

Lombardi still maintains a "hands-on" policy with his picnic. "I'm still the boss," he gloats, "and I've resisted takeovers . . . you know this whole picnic thing got so big there were outside factions that wanted in . . . but I fought back. Of course, I've got a great team working with me . . . Joyce Barslow and

"I wanted the CHIN Picnic to be on Canada Day," says Lombardi, "the day we should all be grateful and thankful that our forefathers came here." He concludes with, "It's our way of saying 'Thank You' Canada."

When A Tree Falls promo a priority for Sam's/CBS

Alan Fletcher, Director Central Region for CBS Record Products, reports a highly successful campaign that ran in conjunction with the company's When A Tree Falls rainforest promotion. Says Fletcher "this was one of the most rewarding projects I've been involved with."

The promotion, supported by Sam The Record Man stores, World Wildlife Fund and TTI Travel Willowdale, tied in with Bruce Cockburn's video, If A Tree Falls, which was promoted nationally through commercial time on MuchMusic. Viewers were encouraged to visit their local Sam's store to fill in a ballot which was printed on 100 percent recycled paper. The contest ran from April 24 through May 15 and the grand prize winner, Arthur Popenda, had 50 acres of rainforest in Guatemala preserved in his name, received two tickets to see Bruce Cockburn in concert at Toronto's Roy Thomson Hall, airfare, two nights accommodation, limousine to the show and a complete Bruce Cockburn True North cassette catalogue.

As Fletcher points out, "Perhaps we're too far away and not interested enough to realize the damage that is being done to the rainforests all over the world. I'm more than pleased with the overwhelming response the World Wildlife Fund has received through this promotion both from Canada and internationally."

Denon Canada pacts with Masters Film Music

Denon Canada's Music Division continues its high profile campaign to become a major player in the Canadian entertainment industry with the signing of a distribution agreement with Masters Film Music. Masters represents the U.S.-based Varese Sarabande label and U.K.-based Silva Screen label in Canada and produces and licenses its own projects. All three companies specialize in soundtracks and original film score recordings.

New projects from these companies include a re-recording of the Lawrence Of Arabia score by Maurice Jarre and the original soundtracks to Stephen King's Pet Sematary, Cold Feet (starring Tom Waits), Talk Radio and Wall Street performed by Stewart Copeland (formerly of The Police). Also in the works is a four CD set of the music of Bernard Herrman including Citizen Kane, Jane Eyre and Psycho.

As Denon Music Division Manager Lloyd Nishimura explained, "The signing of this agreement represents another step in the growth of Denon Canada into a broad-based national distributor," concluding with, "By carrying a small number of high quality labels, Denon can assume a special role within the Canadian industry."

As well Denon recently announced the signing of a license agreement with Marquis Records, a Canadian classical label and the signing of popular '60s band, Lighthouse, to the Denon label (RPM - June 10/89).

Toronto's Harbourfront setting for Molson Place

Toronto's Harbourfront will be sporting a new entertainment arena that will hold 7960 and seat 2002 with standing room for an additional 5968, when the renovation and expansion of the existing outdoor ShipDeck Stage at Harbourfront is completed. The new stage is to be renamed Molson Place at Harbourfront.

The above announcement was made jointly by Harbourfront and Molson. It's interesting to note that all seats will be under a new specially designed glass roof. The existing stage had capacity for 3500 people but was unusable during inclement weather when concerts had to be cancelled or moved indoors where the capacity was reduced to only 400 patrons. As well, the new stage, which will have a nautical theme with glass to blend in with existing site architecture, will face the lake, which will eliminate much of the problem of past concerts that disturbed surrounding residential areas.

Alternative music is apparently the focus for the new stage. As H.J. Moran, President of Molson Ontario Breweries explained, "We welcome the opportunity to help support alternative and mainstream entertainers. Many of the performers you will see have not played venues accessible to the public, but with Molson Place at Harbourfront, this will change."

Frost In June set for Lee's Palace showcase

Being billed as "Toronto's best kept secret in new music," Frost In June will unveil their unique talent at Lee's Palace in Toronto on June 27. The aggressive young band are also armed with a new LP, in CD form only, titled Serendipity, which, if applied to the band, could be interpreted as "a gift of being able to make delightful discoveries by pure accident," a clever little phrase coined by Horace Walpole after The Three Princesses Of Serendip, which was a fairy tale.

Of particular interest and an indication of the band's regard for independence, they managed to record their premier album and shoot a video of Catch The Light without the aid of outside financing, which in itself is a rarity among Canadian talent.

Frost In June first felt their oats, taking No. 1 honours in a talent contest at CKAN and they didn't do too bad in the Top 50 in CFNY's Great Ontario Talent Search '88. The band comprises Glenn Goddard (vocals, rhythm guitar), Steve Lundy (bass guitar, vocals), Andrew James Stokes (electric and acoustic guitars, vocals), Mark Steven John Lappin (drums, percussion) and Paul Curtis (keyboards, programming).

The album which contains all original material written by band members, was produced by Angelo Civiero and Dave Platt at The Room in Weston, Ontario. Their CD, released on The Debut Label, is distributed by Montreal's Fusion III.


Alert's Kim Mitchell opens new HMV store

HMV customer service now computerized

HMV Music Stores have introduced the HMV Music Centre, described as "an interactive shopping system", to their Square One store in Mississauga, Ont. The system, which was unveiled on June 2, was designed by St. Clair Videotex Design, a Canadian firm, and consists of a computer driven touch screen television and CD jukebox.

The system is also described as having been designed to "eliminate some barriers" to music shopping including visual/audio identification. Customers put on headphones and merely touch the screen to select a route through an audio-visual presentation of new releases, current hits and classics. The computer also contains suggestions geared to the personal music tastes of the user and shows the consumer "what's new, what's news, and where to find it" in the store.

As Tony Hirsch, president of HMV explains, "We believe that providing quality product information to our customers will encourage them to purchase music from new artists and help to build confidence in their purchases."

blocks at the top and on the first page and even rubber stamps that modestly direct the FAX . . . and there are fewer of those nearly black lead pages. Just from that mention in Walt Says. What we use is called a FAX header. We never send a lead sheet. (EC: *Walt Says . . . bringing the industry together!*) You still get the message!

While we're on the subject . . . ! A few of the broadcasters are getting a bit of a rash over the return of SF . . . who was there in the beginning. Things could get a little touchy over the summer and fall months, particularly for the gobblers. (EC: *If it's good for the gander . . . !*)

Life could be easier . . . ! If you've ever read CAB submissions and the columns and columns of CRTC verbiage, no wonder both sides come away looking as if they've been drawn through a knot hole. With all of today's technology at hand, why doesn't the CRTC come up with a compendium of regulations . . . a “how to” with ease booklet that would define the regulations, policy for open-line shows and all the minor, but brain-draining problems that could be explained away so easy. (EC: *Sort of like blind man's bluff . . . ?*)

Goodbye black vinyl . . . ! As I said a few weeks ago in this column . . . I'm completely sold on CDs and the sound that this new technology has afforded the consumer is awesome. Many of the companies are now supplying us with CDs and cassettes and only resort to vinyl when the superior product is not available. Practically all the reviews in RPM result from listening to cassettes or CD. If vinyl could come up with a comparable sound and ease of programming, I might revert, but right now, I'm completely sold and know what the consumer is getting so excited about. As for a drop in price, I'm predicting that it is just around the corner. (EC: *They'll kick and scream . . . !*)

Here come the cassette singles . . . ! Will there be cassette singles . . . ? You bet there will and the organizers have scored another coup. They've got a bunch of CHR programmers interested in running a contest that would award the Top 40 cassette singles to lucky listeners . . . on a national scale. What a great promotion idea, but like Bill Ott says, “where there's a will . . . there's a way!”

Worth a million words . . . RPM is very photo oriented and often we get phone calls to ask what kind of photos to supply us with. We prefer 5X7's, but other sizes are easily accommodated. Black and white photos are preferable, but colour photos can be used. Our own in-office photographs are taken with a state-of-the-art Polaroid Spectra

System camera. The results are instant and the quality is excellent (once you learn to use the camera). Keeping the shot tight is the secret. The camera works best at three and four feet . . . and any fool can get good results. (EC: *That's another reason!*) No record company promo department should be without one for those moments when there isn't a photographer around. (EC: *The Polaroid people must love you!*) Since the camera takes only one photo . . . remember to take a few so you can send them around. (EC: *The Polaroid film people must love you . . . !*)

Old fashioned promotion . . . ! I haven't seen promotion enthusiasm like this since the last time Herb Forgie dropped by the office. You can't mistake Forgie . . . the noise maker. He came bounding up the stairs the other day with a box of Red Baron beer under his arm, a Razorback T-Shirt in one hand and Razorback's new CD, Live A Little in the other. “Don't have much time Walt, I'm on my way to see Batman, but have a drink and a listen on WEA . . . ” (EC: *Red Baron beer . . . ?*)

A touch of A&A class . . . ! Well, that shy old devil Fred Rich laid the final plans for the posh opening of A&A's latest store . . . in Canada Place in the heart of Toronto's financial district . . . and took off for Yugoslavia so he wouldn't have to take any bows. The emphasis is on classical and jazz recordings . . . a nice change. Take a bow Fred . . . you brought more than a little class and exquisite ambience to Toronto's concrete jungle, not to mention a clutch of well-wishers from the industry for the opening. It was even at Fred's insistence that the beautiful baby grand piano, which takes centre stage in the store, was painted an off red with sparkles, which made Frank Mills feel right at home. The store will feature noon hour concerts, weekdays, by young Toronto pianists, a far cry from the usual din heard in most stores.



Richard Marx triumphs over industry interference

When the time finally came for Richard Marx to sign his EMI deal in 1987, he had already achieved a level of professionalism far above most artists who had recorded one or two complete albums. From his very early childhood he was singing jingles with his father professionally. Then on to co-write two No. 1 singles with Kenny Rogers, and sing background vocals for Lionel Ritchie, all before his 22nd birthday. Marx had been all but living in a recording studio for most of his youth. Add to this the fact that his debut LP was to make a sudden climb to triple platinum status in the U.S., as well as gaining him production jobs on *Vixen*, *Poco*, and *Animation's* newest, and you have a resume boasting of an incredible talent.

Now consider that on several occasions, including a few at EMI, Marx was turned down flat, shopping the same songs that made it on to his commercially giant debut. One has to wonder if A&R is at all in touch with the taste of the market. "I chalk it up to the fact that most of the people at A&R are idiots. That's why so many talented people don't get signed, and that's why there's so much shit on the radio! The men and women that make up the bulk of the A&R Dept's are the most un-musical people you'll ever meet. They couldn't hum a note of music if their life depended on it. Most of them are like critics. They're people who didn't have the goods to make it themselves." Strong words from Marx, but not an uncommon criticism of A&R of late.

Due to his experiences early on, Marx has learned to put complete faith in his talent to support and motivate his career. He has never embraced guidance from the record company with open arms, but was even more adamant on his newest release, *Repeat Offender*. "The best difference is that they didn't have anything to do with this one until it was finished. They said - You know what you're doing, just go ahead and make your record. I didn't want their involvement. In

fact, I recorded this album for quite a while without telling them. I labelled all my tapes *Poco*. I didn't want anyone from the record company snooping around and then saying - Why don't you change this section? What do they know about writing songs?"

What he wanted was a more Rock and Roll oriented album that would transfer very well live. On this decision, and his new love of performing, Marx commented, "Playing live I found out which songs I did the best. I wanted to write an album that reflected that. I really had to think about what it was that I did the best. I think I'm best at the guitar oriented, Rock and Roll stuff. Being out on the road, being in touch with the people, certainly opens up your spectrum a lot more."

Ironically, Marx found rejection of another kind at, what he calls, "One of the worst three gigs of my career" at the El Mocambo, in Toronto. "It was primarily press and my record company people, so at the end of each song there was absolute silence. A typical music industry audience - the worst to play for. Unfortunately, this was unfair because we came back and played Kingswood, and it was everything it should have been." A further expression of his distaste for the unsupportive and surreal environment inside the industry.

It seems that Marx can find satisfaction only in the true day to day life of the studio and the stage. "My attitude was never - I want to sell ten million records. The odds of getting signed are a million to one, and the odds of getting a hit are a zillion to one. I just wanted to sell 150,000 units, and get the

Satellite connection adds clout for CF radiothon

chance to make another record."

Marx's great hope is that the future will find him a place, not as "a guy in a white dinner jacket in Tahoe", but as something resembling "the Quincy Jones of Rock and Roll. The guy that all the young bands phone up and say - Hey, can you produce my record, or - How'd you get that drum sound five years ago?" He feels that his greatest compliment comes when someone says, "That song you wrote is exactly what I was feeling!"

Thanks to his determination, and a 'lucky' A&R Department, Richard Marx has simply appeared before our eyes. His success comes not from his skill as a shrewd businessman, but an artist with a talent simply tailor made to the public's palate. We can only wonder how many others like him are going unnoticed by supposed experts, in their search to be heard.

So Good For You, the initial single from this meeting, released on James' Mellow Drama label, was produced by Bob Bartolucci, and established a base for Medina and James to work from. The pair then got together with producer Rich Dodson at his Marigold Studios, resulting in the release of Medina's follow-up single, *The Tears I Cry*.

Described as a "mid-tempo pop/adult" offering, the thrust of the promotion campaign has targeted all radio formats. Mary Lynn of Marigold Promotions, reports "very favourable" acceptance, particularly with the A/C and Light Rock programmers. "The lyrics make this release a 'must add' for spring/summer programming," says Mary Lynn.

Medina, who has been performing since the age of 12, is also well known in the acting field. Otis Blackwell included in Jazz & Blues Festival




DOLLY PARTON - Country


THE MEN THEY COULDN'T HANG - Pop

McKee's voice is in top form on More Than A Heart Can Hold, Nobody's Child (co-written by Robbie Robertson) and I've Forgotten What It Was In You, a mid-tempo cut that picks up where Shelter left off. Hopefully this album will appeal to those who supported Lone Justice, but also to those who took to Melissa Etheridge, Toni Childs and the rest of the terrific new divas that have emerged in the last year or so. -DS

Stompin' Tom Connors signs with Capitol

Stompin' Tom Connors, a legend in Canadian folk and country music, has signed an exclusive licensing deal with Capitol Records - EMI of Canada. His entire catalogue, as well as his new album, *Fiddle & Song*, is available immediately through the agreement.

Out of the gate and just in time for the July 1st holiday is Stompin' Tom's salute to 'Canada's birthday, Canada Day, Up Canada Way, which includes the line "Oh! Canada! Standing Tall Together." His album reflects his love for Canada as he puts into song his experiences and his hopes for its people.

Connors won his first Juno Award (RPM Gold Leaf Award) as Canada's Top Male Country Singer in 1970, winning again in 1971, 1972, 1973 and 1974. It was not too long after he established himself as a "folk hero" that he became disenchanted with the industry and literally disappeared from the

scene. There were many attempts to track him down, but he remained aloof and suspect of the industry. In the meantime, several of his past releases, including *Bud The Spud* and *Sudbury Saturday Night*, were gaining in popularity, particularly over the last couple of years with alternative (campus) radio. He surfaced earlier this year with his own ACT label (Assist Canadian Talent) and, through

several meetings with Capitol Canada's president Deane Cameron, he finally agreed to sign a licensing deal. All his back catalogue will be re-released on the Capitol label on album, cassette and, for the first time, on compact disc.
