





CRIA's Robertson broadsides broadcasters

In a stinging rebuttal to criticism of proposed copyright legislation made (Nov. 13/89) at the annual conference of the Canadian Association of Broadcasters (CAB) in Montreal, Brian Robertson, President of the Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA), dressed down the criticism with CRIA's positioning.

"Because of the changing influences of new technologies," Robertson points out, "our industry is increasingly experiencing the escalating unauthorized exploitation of sound recordings," continuing with, "Our only guarantee of a stable industry in the 1990's is to protect our rights through copyright legislation."

Robertson goes on to point out that the Canadian recording industry "has been a victim of an outdated Copyright Act for decades and for the first time, we are seeing a government that is willing to address these inequities." Robertson goes on to stress, "A

Performing and Performers Right is established in law in virtually every major Western country except Canada and the United States . . . its objective being to allow both the performer and the copyright owner in the sound recording the opportunity to control the exploitation of their work. It is a parallel right to that currently enjoyed by composers and music publishers."

Robertson was obviously perturbed by what he describes as broadcasters making statements "about rights money leaving the country . . . but what they will not concede is that the royalty flow is only reflective of the music that they themselves program."

He continues his attack on the CAB

Beatles settle all claims against Capitol-EMI

Bhaskar Menon, Chairman, EMI Music Worldwide and Capitol-EMI Music Inc., and George Harrison, Paul McCartney, Ringo Starr and Yoko Ono Lennon have jointly announced "the settlement of all outstanding lawsuits between the artists, Apple, EMI Records and Capitol Records."

According to the report, issued by Sue Satriano, Vice President Public Relations/Corporate Communications, Capitol-EMI Music Inc., the parties have agreed, "as a specific term of the settlement, that neither they nor their representatives or advisors will be permitted to make any comment or statement regarding the settlement other than as appears in this announcement."

The only comment made was by Menon, who stated, "The Beatles' recordings are a unique legacy in the history of popular music which EMI has been privileged to represent since 1962," continuing and concluding with, "We are most delighted to have resolved all the differences which arose between us in recent years, and look forward to the continuation of our long standing and close relationship with the artists and Apple."

Les Mis and Friends record for Kids' Hospital

Les Misérables And Friends, members of Les Mis company and friends, well-known Canadian recording artists, Jannetta and Dan Hill, are scheduled to record Light A Child's Life, an original by Wendy Lands (Les Mis) and Jim Gillard at Toronto's McClellan Place Studios (Nov. 26). The single, to be produced by Hayward Parrott (Tears Are Not Enough) and Tim Thorney (Einstein Brothers), will be used to raise money for the Children's Cancer Research project at Toronto's Sick Children's Hospital.

It has been pointed out that "no one will be paid a penny for fees or expenses." Parrott, who is President of McClellan Place, has donated studio space and all recording facilities, Ed and David Mirvish and everyone connected with Mirvish Productions will also be contributing their services and facilities, and several radio stations have already committed to free coverage to help the sales of the finished product.

Lands and Aggie Cekuta Elliot are the major force behind this fundraising event for the Children's Cancer Program.

with, "They (the broadcasters) also fail to acknowledge the benefits of reciprocity, whereby countries that currently have the right will reciprocally return performance revenue to Canadian artists and rights owners," suggesting that "With Canada representing only 4 percent of the world music market . . . the inflow could far exceed the outflow."

In conclusion and in respect to the concerns of smaller, less profitable radio stations, Robertson reveals that CRIA has already made a proposal to the CAB that, "in our view, addresses this issue . . . however, it must be recognized that the radio broadcasting industry is increasingly being dominated by large, profitable corporations that have every ability to compensate performers and copyright owners for the exploitation of their works."

Black signs deal with Isba label

Paris Black has signed a multi-album recording and management agreement with Isba Records and MCM Entertainment Management of Montreal. The above announcement was made (Nov. 2/89) by Maurice Velenosi, President of the label and management firm.

Originally from London, England, Black has established himself with a large teen and A/C following through his previous independently released LP entitled Secret Seduction, as well as his heavily rotated video releases.

As Velenosi points out, Isba Records and MCM Entertainment Management "are fully committed to increase Paris Black's status in the Canadian and world markets."

Black is currently recording his new album, to be released in the new year with distribution by CBS Records in Canada.

Isba is currently on the charts with Montreal-based Mitsou, whose debut album, El Mundo, has just gone platinum.

Whiteman to HMV board as Vice President

Tony Hirsch, President, HMV Canada, has announced the appointment of Roger Whiteman to the HMV board as Inventory and Distribution Vice President. His appointment is effective immediately.

Whiteman is a fourteen-year veteran of the Canadian music industry and has been with HMV Canada since its Canadian launch in 1987. He will report directly to Hirsch.



Redmond Communications has joined the FACTOR team becoming the tenth sponsoring broadcaster. Robert E. Redmond, President of Redmond Communications, which owns Toronto's CJEZ-FM, CRY-FM, Calgary, CHSC, CHRE-FM St. Catharines and CHNR Simcoe, presents his initial contribution to FACTOR's Executive Director Heather Sym.

The Juneau bash . . . ! "It's better than the Junos!" said one of the attendees. "At least I know some of the people." With 140 people on the Tribute Committee . . . just the members and their wives would have filled the room, but an estimated 1,000 people were in the Grand Ballroom of the Sheraton Centre to honour Pierre Juneau for his contribution to Canadian music. Even those strongly opposed to the Canadian content ruling were there. The format was very unusual . . . with a recital sandwiched between the appetizer and the salad and a variety of events between courses. (EC: *This could catch on . . . sort of a sit for your supper format . . . !*) The tribute to Juneau was well deserved, but, aside from the steep ticket price of \$150 a head to the lineup for the pay bar . . . it began to turn a little political and started to lean toward the CBC too much. Rita MacNeil stole the show, bringing us all back to the point of the whole tribute. I felt that too much was made of the beer company logo, emblazoned on the program. It really wasn't THAT tasteless.

Next stop is the other Juno bash . . . yet another tribute to the man this industry owes everything to. (EC: *You mean Sam Sniderman is being honoured again . . . ?*)

You mean they want more . . . ? I'm confused . . . I thought the French-language radio stations in this country were doing more than their bit to boost FrancoCancon recordings. Considering their English-language counterparts who have two thirds of the population to work on and who can only squeeze out pitifully few gold albums and maybe one or two platinum certifications, the Quebec record industry has been churning out gold and platinum records by the bushel, and they could only do that with the help of radio. However, a lot is not necessarily enough. ADISQ, which represents Quebec's independent recording industry, are after the CRTC to lay a 65 percent French-language music quota on the stations. The quota used to be 65 percent, but it was lowered to 55 percent a couple of years ago, because there was a definite lack of French-language songs being recorded. (EC: *I've heard that song before . . . !*)

Overheard at the Juneau tribute! One astute observer at the Pierre Juneau tribute was heard to say, "You can tell the people who got grants . . . they're wearing tuxedos!" (EC: *I remember when they couldn't afford the rental of a tux . . . !*)

Rumours are just rumours . . . but! Have you heard about the horsemen investigating "a touch of favouritism" that's allegedly going on between a second banana with a

government agency and a top banana in the broadcast business? It's just a rumour, but it has taken priority over most of the comments coming down from the hill the last few weeks. (EC: *Is there a story there?*)

Big Bill has been watching . . . ! If you think infringing on song copyrights is bad, wait till you hear about the busts coming up for illegally manufacturing, distributing and selling T-shirts, jackets, caps . . . you name it, that belong to some pretty heavy dudes in the business. These guys are out and around the country and they've been making raids on stores in small towns. We'll hear more about it officially over the next couple of weeks. (EC: *There's more to the profit barrel than suds . . . !*)

It's not over 'til the soprano sings! I noticed at the Pierre Juneau bash that when the soprano hit a high note, all the record people made a grab for wine glasses. One A&R guy was overheard to say, "I wasn't sure if it was live or Memorex!" (EC: *What a great idea for a commercial . . . !*)

Jeff Burns on the move . . . ! Well, the rumour is fact . . . Jeff Burns has resigned from CBS to launch his own record company . . . Justin! Entertainment Inc. Did you know that Jeff has been in the business for 27 years, starting out in retail, going on to MCA then GRT and for the last 12 years with CBS . . . which is quite impressive. Like he did at CBS, he will be concentrating on developing Canadian talent and he's "very well funded," he tells me. His label will also be distributed by a multi-national, but he's not saying what multi-national at this time. He'll be signing some new acts . . . and a couple of established acts as well. He has his staff all lined up and ready to go. You can get hold of him at 416-757-9991.

Veracruz Ole! Ole! Ole! If you're looking for a really great winter getaway, RPM's resident travel expert Stan Klees recommends a week in Veracruz, which is on the Gulf side of Mexico. It's the third largest city in Mexico and is just starting to become an attraction for Canadians. Klees tells me there are three excellent hotels which he visited (EC: *And danced in the floor show of one them!*) and all of them are enjoyable. According to Klees this is still one of the spots in Mexico that tourism hasn't spoiled.



COVER STORY - by Chris Murray**Patrick Bernard mixes science with new age**

When an artist is classified as new age, you know his music runs a different course from the mainstream. When he states that the goal of his music is "to create a peaceful world, to create a healthy society," it's clear that his is a project involving more than artistic concerns. Such is the case with Montreal-based Patrick Bernard, who has engaged in an extensive study of the science of Japa, which focuses on the effect sound vibrations have on the body and the consciousness. On his newest release, *Alantis Angelis*, Bernard applies his findings to his work in an attempt not only to affect the listener in the usual manner through musical enjoyment, but also to initiate a much more direct interaction between the listener and the music.

Bernard explains the scientific theory that he practices in his work: "It is well known today that matter is not matter; it is energy, it's vibrations. As a matter of fact, now they say it's not only energy, matter is consciousness," he informs. "The body itself is also vibrating, and the reality behind new age music, relaxation music, mantric music, is to reharmonize all the vibrations in the body.

"Today we have scientific facts that [say] all the problems of the body, diseases are coming from the mind emotionally, from negative emotions," Bernard details concerning the internal connection between the mind and the body.

In his music, Bernard makes use of the mantra, a Sanskrit word meaning liberation of the mind. He reports that "these sounds have the ability to reduce stress and anxiety ...[creating] a state of inner well-being." The mantras are not Bernard's invention. Rather, they are taken from the Sanskrit, Vedic and Hindu traditions.

The damage done by the tremendous levels of stress that result from Western

lifestyles is well documented. "You have to do this. You have to do that. You have to earn money," says Bernard. "Competition creates stress. There is a lot of stress in Western society. You can take a pill, but there is a very sad side effect.

"If you want to get free of the stress, you have to understand that you are not what you think you are," Bernard suggests. "Generally we think we are a material body. This is why we are so nervous, because the material body is going to die. We can die at any moment, so this is a very stressful situation and we live with it.

"We are the body, but if we think we are only the body, it's incomplete. We come to a consciousness where we understand what we are is a force, an eternal living force, and these mantras, this music, by creating a nice atmosphere of relaxation and meditation and peacefulness, is a big help for the transformation of consciousness, to be more aware of the real self, the real identity."

For this unique project, Kathy Hahn, Marketing Director for K. Hahn and Associates Inc. has arranged a unique distribution network. "Distribution is multi-layered," Hahn reports. "Trans-Canada is doing distribution to the record stores, GRD Recordings (Vancouver) is handling fringe accounts...They handle something like a Fifth Kingdom here in Toronto or Banyan Sound in Vancouver that have an awful lot of esoteric material.

"There's Aura Musik out of Montreal that's handling book stores and libraries and it's also available through Quebec Loisirs, which is an arts and nature magazine," she continues. "It has just been put into Jean Coutu Pharmacies, which is like Shoppers Drug Mart here. We'd like to get it into places like that across the rest of the country as well.

"It's really Quebec where it's starting from and we're starting to spread as we're going around," she declares. "We just set something up to handle the new age symposiums and fairs...Psychic fairs are really starting to expand on the clientele they have been attracting traditionally. They've got people who have got disposable income that are really curious and so it isn't what it used to be. It isn't the staple client image that it might have had ten years ago. It's really becoming a showcase for different people that are involved with different aspects of new age.

"Because we're multi-tiered with the distribution, we have the flexibility to be able to do something like that, whereas if we were with a major at this stage, it would be really hard to be able to put that together as quickly as we did or to be able to interest that market," contends Hahn.

"A lot of those aspects could never be interested through major distribution. They aren't set up for it at this stage. If, over a period of time, major record companies become more aware of the values and the kind of dollars in sales that are involved, then they might try to duplicate or emulate the way the system is set up in order to get on the bandwagon," she suggests, "But at this stage it's pretty much happening independently of the kind of support that that finds."

Many potential fans will have the opportunity to experience Bernard's work over the next while as he is currently preparing the soundtrack for the original silent film version of *The Phantom Of The Opera*, while audiences in Montreal are presently able to attend a series of multimedia showcases held at Dow Planetarium each Monday. Future planetarium series are now being planned.

Bernard and Hahn note a considerable growth in the new age field in the recent past and predict an even greater boom for the near future. With his releases scientifically designed to provide not only immediate enjoyment, but also a deeper and more spiritual benefit, consumers may find a dollar directed toward Bernard is a dollar wisely spent.

Boyd and Chapman are coupled for major tour

A&M recording artist Liona Boyd was no sooner off the plane from her tour of the Far East when she signed to do a fifteen-day international tour with Tracy Chapman. The pair capped their tour with two sold-out concerts at London's Royal Albert Hall (Nov. 15 & 16).

In view of the European tour it was necessary to re-book Boyd's Montreal date from Nov. 17 to the 23rd, after which she is off to Vancouver for a concert on the 25th.

Boyd is currently on release with *Christmas Dreams*, which features, for the first time, the classical guitarist singing (a duet with Roger Whittaker) on the title track. As well, pan-piper Georges Zamfir guests on three tracks.

They are A Little Christmas Music (The King's Sisters featuring one track with Kiri Te Kanawa), the Carol Album (Taverner Consort, Parrott), French Opera Arias (Kiri Te Kanawa), and Henry V (Patrick Doyle). The last is the original soundtrack recording of the film which opened in Toronto (Nov. 11/89).

Palmer's Addictions last kick at Island can

Island Records is scheduling a Nov. 21st release for Robert Palmer's Addictions Volume 1, described as "a best collection with a difference." The 13-track compilation includes such Island era Palmer hits as Addicted To Love, Bad Case Of Loving You and Looking For Clues. Also included are two of his hits which originally appeared on other labels; last year's Simply Irresistible and 1985's Some Like It Hot from his one-off collaboration with The Power Station.


Palmer no longer records for Island, but he was apparently "eager to become actively involved" in this new package. He selected all the tracks and supervised the remixing and instrumental overdubbing of several tracks.

54-40 extends hand to Baltics Ultima Thule

WEA's 54-40, based in Vancouver, are currently crossing Canada on their Tour For Love 1989 with Ultima Thule a band from Estonia, one of three Baltic states which made news recently in a nationalist struggle for democracy and autonomy from the Soviet Union. Jason Grant of Gangland Artists, points out that Ultima Thule represents the "musical spearhead" of this independence movement, continuing with "their biting social commentary and brazen anti-government sloganizing have brought them to U2-like status in Estonia, accompanied by a similar increase in surveillance and harassment from Soviet authorities."

54-40 came across Ultima Thule when they both appeared at Interchange '89, a six-day rock festival in Moscow, featuring sixty Soviet bands and five from the West including 54-40 and The Scramblers from Canada, England's Crazy Head and It Bites and The Continentals from West Germany. Ultima Thule was 54-40's first choice to join them on tour, being as the Estonian band is regarded as "breaking the same frontiers in Soviet rock as 54-40 have in Canada," Grant concludes.

The tour has already played dates in Eastern and Central Canada and move west to Winnipeg (Nov. 19) followed by Saskatoon (20), Calgary (21), Edmonton (22), Vancouver (24) and winds down at the Royal Theatre in Victoria (25).



Mamas & Papas' Doherty bible-thumps in Fire

The Canadian Stage Company has remounted *Fire*, the Canadian musical created by Paul Ledoux and David Young, for the 890-seat Bluma Appel Theatre located in Toronto's St. Lawrence Centre. The Chalmers award-winning rock and gospel musical, inspired by the lives of rock and roller Jerry Lee Lewis and his cousin, television evangelist Jimmy Swaggart, was first staged in 1985 with a successful run in theatres across Canada. The Chalmers award-winning musical also picked up five Dora Awards at Theatre Passe Muraille last season, beating out *Les Misérables*.

Alec Willows plays several roles from a small town radio producer to a sleazy TV show host. Also featured are Melanie Doane, David Smyth and Paula Wolfson as members of the congregation. Set and costumes were designed by John Ferguson, with lighting by Jock Munro and musical direction by John Horsburgh who is assisted by Pat Perez as co-musical director. John Hazen is the sound consultant.

Directed by Brian Richmond, *Fire* opened Nov. 16 and is scheduled to run through Dec. 9. For further information contact Vivienne Kugler or Sandra Tesolin at 416-367-8243.

France and, only a few weeks ago, with BMG International, resulting in the release of *Bye Bye Mon Cowboy* to "All the world, but it will be released first in the U.S. and Australia at the end of January," boasts Mitsou, continuing with "We're going to release it in French. I'm sure not everybody will understand the lyrics, but they will get caught up in the rhythm."

Shep Pettibone will be handling the re-mixing of the single and, after doing the musical arrangements for such notables as Prince, Madonna and Elton John, *Bye Bye Mon Cowboy* is expected to hit the streets in competitive condition. Along with Pettibone's re-mixing there will also be a new video shot for the international release.

Isba has released three singles and videos (*Bye Bye Mon Cowboy*, *Les Chinois*, *La Corrida*) from the album, but only in Quebec. The rest of Canada has only been privy to *Bye Bye Mon Cowboy* and just recently to *Les Chinois*. The latter was on high rotation on MusiquePlus when released in Quebec and it was also played regularly on MuchMusic.

All three videos were shot in Quebec. The concepts were done by Mitsou and manager Pierre Gendron with various directors on each of them. Mitsou explains, "When I'm in a video that's my chance to perform, it's like the best of both worlds, I love to act and I love to sing."

While in Toronto to make a presentation at the CASBY's, where she was nominated in the Most Promising category, Mitsou made the rounds of radio stations and the trade

press, which gave her the opportunity to express her views about the difficulty of breaking into the English market.

After pursuing an acting career since age five, doing commercials and working in soaps, at age fifteen, a discouraged Mitsou dropped out of college and decided she wanted to be a singer. "I met some influential people in the business, and introduced myself, 'Hi, I'm Mitsou, I'm a singer', I lied . . . but they believed me. That's how I met J.P. Issac, he told me he had written some songs that he wanted somebody to sing for him. Shortly after that we started working on an album and he wrote *Bye Bye Mon Cowboy* and I knew that was definitely the song for me."

After working for some time with Issac, Mitsou was approached by Pierre Gendron, who asked if he could be her manager, she agreed and the team was formed. This was followed two years later with the release of *El Mundo* produced by Gendron with J.P. Issac credited with the majority of the writing. Mitsou also reveals her talent as a writer, co-writing three of the songs on her album.

Now, with the Quebec market secured, Mitsou is directing her energies to the rest of the world and a new album. With regard to more English tracks on the her next effort Mitsou comments, "I really don't know at this time. I know that in order to break into the English market I'll have to concentrate on more English . . . although it will be difficult because some songs have to be sung in French and certain songs have to be sung in English, so the difficulty lies in deciding which would be more effective in one or the other language."





From Out Of Nowhere

This could very well be the long awaited Canadian super success that is definitely overdue. Not exactly newcomers on the music scene, this finely tuned trio and notable producer Tom Allom have created an impressive effort all the way around. Musically the album is brilliant, with enough guitar to give it an edge but nothing too extreme. Lyrically, with band members Jim Huff, Brian Malone and Stuart Zaltz handling the writing, the lyrics are interesting and easy to relate to, without touching any deep political or social messages. Vocally, Malone's range is truly unique and, for lack of a better word, dynamite. The first single, *Dancing On A Wing*, has charted and is being played on all the major stations. "Trouble Walkin'"

Perhaps one of the most notable guitar players in the 70's this is Frehley's fourth Megaforce/Atlantic album, and could possibly be his strongest solo effort to date, with the exception of his first solo, self-titled release, that garnered the smash hit *Back In The New York Groove*. Frehley's vocal talent and guitar craftsmanship is prominent on this release and should give his ex-band members a run for their money. The first single taken from this album is *Do Ya*, an ELO classic, with ex-Kiss member Peter Criss, on hand to assist on percussion and additional vocals on this and other tracks. Also lending a hand on backing vocals on this offering were Sebastian Bach, Dave Sabo and Rachel Bohan all from hot new band Skid Row. Frehley co-produced the album along with, bassist John Regan and Eddie Kramer, and co-wrote seven of the ten tracks.

Included on the album is the Paul Stanley, Desmond Child and Holly Knight penned *Hide Your Heart*, which is currently *Kiss'* single release from their *Hot In The Shade* LP. Key tracks include the previously mentioned titles along with *Shot Full Of Rock*, *Lost In Limbo* and *2 Young 2 Die*. (Cassette reviewed) - SL

And In This Corner . . . Jive 1188-J-N While this duo will long be remembered as the ones who opened the door for smash successes by the likes of Tone Loc and Young MC by showing radio that rap could fit into hit formats, their new album breaks no new ground, relying again on humour, and should establish them as consistent rather than innovative artists. As previously, the strongest cuts are those based on funny stories, the lead single, *I Think I Can Beat Mike Tyson*, and *Who Stole My Car* standing out with *Everything That Glitters (Ain't Always Gold)* showing potential as a depth track. The remaining songs act more as filler than anything else, yet this package should still meet with strong retail action due to the countless fans won over by their last outing. The Time - Epic - FE-45390-H

Although their first album was a smash success in the UK, it met with little support in Canada. With their follow-up effort, Bros have delivered another ultra-slick pop package which, along with the pop image of the Goss Brothers, should have pre-teen females busily tacking group photos to many a bedroom wall. While of the lightweight variety musically, lyrically the duo tackles a couple of header issues: materialism on *Money* and racial harmony on *Black and White*. Other key tracks include *Madly In Love*, which displays a stylistic vocal debt to Michael Jackson, *Chocolate Box*, *Don't Bite The Hand* and *I Owe You Nothing*, which saw some Quebec airplay about a year ago. SOUNDGARDEN - Heavy Metal
Louder Than Love - A&M - SP-5252-W

The PMRC is sure to have some labeling fun with this effort, courtesy of *Big Dumb Sex* and *On The Snake*, which does not mince words concerning the band's sexual intentions. With a very heavy sound and fine wailing vocals, Soundgarden will quickly prove favorites among the metal crowd, renowned for its excellent information networking. Campus radio and hard rock spotlights are the clear airplay outlets for this material, which should fare well at the cash register due to a strong promotional campaign south of the border. The overall standout is *Hands All Over*, which displays an enjoyable psychedelic influence not as evident on the other tracks which plod on with the energy of speed metal while seldom approaching the same velocity. Peter Himmelman should gain uniform respect and critical acclaim for this very pleasing work. Mainly A/C and soft rock material, this album satisfies from beginning to end. A "throw it on and leave it on" type of record which could unfortunately be a tough sell at radio. Lead single is *245 Days with Difficult To Touch* and *The Sweetest Revenge* as possibilities. Definitely worth adding to your collection. (CD Reviewed) - RG




KISS - Rock
Hot In The Shade - PolyGram - 839 913-4-Q

The fire is still burning strong for this veteran rock 'n' roll band. *Hide Your Heart* has been released as the first single, with the album moving strongly at retail after only a week on the street. Original band members Paul Stanley and Gene Simmons handled the production of this effort, with all of the fifteen tracks co-written by either Stanley or Simmons. Nothing too unique in comparison to the umpteen other Kiss albums, but *Hot In The Shade* does sound a lot more like the original Kiss material, which is a welcomed surprise. Tracks that deserve special attention include *Rise To It*, *Love's A Slap In The Face*, *Forever, You Love Me To Hate You* and *Somewhere Between Heaven And Hell*. Standard fare from The Dead; The simplest of melodies and production mixed with that trademark keyboard sound, which once again creates a mood somewhere between irritating and charming. SHEREE - Pop/Rock
Sheree - KKL-1-0602-N

An impressive first outing from this prominent session singer. Radio reaction to the first single *Woman's Work*, co-written by Sheree, B.J. Cook and Lou Pomanti, has been outstanding and the album is currently climbing the RPM 100 chart. With Pomanti, Fred Zarr and David Bendeth on hand to share producer credits, Sheree is credited with co-writing nine of the ten tracks. All cuts are worth a second listen, with *Forever You, Forever Me*, a duet with New Yorker Fonzi Thornton, and *Before We Fall* single contenders. (CD reviewed) - SL

Rita MacNeil has only happened over the last couple of years, but by the time this album was released she emerged as one of the stabilizing factors in the weird, wonderful and, certainly underestimated, world of Cancon. She has the ability through recorded sound to create an awe-inspiring presence, that one might only believe can be accomplished live and she has 12 tracks here that only goes to prove that she's got it in the grooves. A cleverly released single of *We'll Reach The Sky Tonight*, designed for the A/C market, and *I'll Accept The Rose*, with a country slant, accomplished just that with both sides now being charted on A/C and country charts. Front-track this gem. It's the season for buying Rita MacNeil. Produced by Declan O'Doherty. (CD reviewed) - WG

Keys To The Highway - Columbia - FE-45242-H

With the success Crowell had with *Diamonds & Dirts* - five hit singles, it would seem an almost impossible task to come close with a follow-up. 


