





B.C. honours to Adams and "Wall" Berlin date

Bryan Adams became the first recipient of the Order of British Columbia (June 21/90), although the legislation that created the award was passed almost a year ago. The honour is bestowed on citizens of B.C., for outstanding service to the province.

Adams, and his manager Bruce Allen, have brought much attention to the province through their many generous offerings to the needy and handicapped, not only in B.C. but throughout the world.

Continuing in that vein, Adams will take part in what Kimberley Blake, publicist for Bruce Allen Talent, describes as "the most spectacular global event ever staged to raise funds for disaster relief worldwide." Blake is referring to The Wall, which will be staged by



British Columbia Lieutenant Governor David C. Lam, and Bryan Adams at recent investiture.

Denon adds Blamires to Cancon roster

With very little fanfare, the Denon label has released the debut album from The David Blamires Group, a contemporary jazz quintet. Blamires is well known in jazz circles, having won a Grammy for his previous work with the Pat Metheny Group.

Besides Blamires, the group is made up of keyboardist Boko Suzuki, bassist Peter Bleakney, drummer Paul De Long and Arturo Avalos on percussion. Besides guitar, Blamires is featured as a vocalist.

Hawkins goes to the wall for Waters' fundraiser

Ronnie Hawkins kicks off his European tour (July 21) with a guest appearance at Roger Waters' Memorial Fund concert at the Berlin Wall. Steve Thomson, Hawkins' manager, says the Hawk's appearance will be "reminiscent of The Last Waltz," the documentary film on The Band, which evolved from the Ronnie Hawkins Band. Hawkins was to join former Band members Levon Helm, Garth Hudson and Rick Danko at the Berlin Wall for what Thomson suggests will be "an extraordinary moment in rock history."

After the Berlin concert, Hawkins and his band will continue their tour with dates in Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Holland, England, Germany and Poland. Additional dates are being pencilled in as the tour progresses. These include dates in France, Italy, Austria, Belgium and Ireland.

Pink Floyd's Roger Waters at the wall at Potsdamer Platz in Berlin (July 21/90). Adams will perform a track from The Wall before an expected live audience of 250,000. Organizers are predicting a television audience of one billion worldwide.

Adams has been in England where he is working on his new album with writer/producer Mutt Lange. However, he took time out to headline a 3-day festival in Mifjys, Denmark (June 30) where he performed in front of an audience of 75,000. The news that Adams was in Europe quickly spread and the promoter from another festival in Roskilde, who was left high and dry by the last minute cancellation of two of his headline acts, The Cure and Sinéad O'Connor, asked if Adams would appear. He agreed, and as Blake points out, when Adams was announced as the headliner, "another 15,000 tickets were sold on top of the existing 65,000 tickets."

I.R.S. moves to Capitol for Canadian distribution

I.R.S. Records Canada and Capitol Records - EMI of Canada have entered into a manufacturing and distribution agreement, effective Sept. 1st of this year. The move was revealed after a similar agreement was made known between I.R.S. Records and CEMA Distribution in the U.S.

Under the agreement, Capitol will handle the manufacturing and distribution for all future I.R.S. releases as well as provide added promotional and marketing services. All titles released through the I.R.S./MCA deal, 15 months ago, will also shift to Capitol, including current projects by Concrete Blonde, Scott Merritt, Squeeze and Pato Banton.

Deane Cameron, President of Capitol's Canadian operation, expressed delight in the signing, pointing out that "They (I.R.S.) are an exciting music-driven label with a credible artist roster culminating from both the international and domestic artist communities." He concludes with, "The Canadian I.R.S. label team has a tremendous reputation across Canada for breaking records and we, at Capitol, are looking forward to being part of their future growth and continued success."

Paul Orescan, President of I.R.S. Records-Canada, added, "Our distribution change to Capitol - EMI represents yet another step in the evolution and growth of I.R.S. in Canada. We're thrilled by the tremendous opportunities this new relationship will bring. Capitol - EMI have an aggressive and innovative approach to doing business in Canada." He concludes with, "The proof is not only in their sizeable and successful domestic roster, but also in their track record of breaking international artists well ahead of other territories in the world."

Orescan has brought the I.R.S. label quietly yet effectively into the Cancon field and boasts three domestic signings: Scott Merritt, Candi and the recently signed Molly Johnson and Norman Orenstein (RPM - July 14/90).

CRTC raps knuckles of three Toronto FM outlets

In an unusually mild form of criticism, the CRTC has chastised three Toronto FM stations for "minor" programming infractions during recent licence renewals.

The CRTC pointed out that Q107 had "slight shortfalls in the levels of foreground (information) programming, combined foreground and mosaic (general interest, cultural or enrichment) programming and traditional and special interest programming," which was discovered by the federal broadcast regulator during a recent analysis.

Q107 had filed a renewal application earlier this year and was allowed to reduce the level of spoken word programming from 25 hours to 18 hours a week. However, the CRTC refused the station's request for an amendment to its promise of performance to reduce foreground programming from 20 percent of the broadcast week to 15 percent, indicating that the higher level of foreground programming is "now a condition" of the station's licence.

CKFM-FM, which was paraded before the CRTC a couple of years ago, was once again found to be out of wack with regard to the policy limiting the quota of hits to a maximum of 49 percent. The CRTC claimed the station was registering 51.6 percent hits. However, a second analysis by the CRTC, after the station had taken a closer look at measuring its broadcast week, found the Standard Broadcast station to be within the limits.

CJEZ FM was found short of airing its traditional special interest music (between 8 and 9½ hours) per week when the CRTC monitored the station in April. The easy listening station promised the CRTC 11 hours. The station had apparently added two new programs which feature traditional and special interest music in January. The CRTC stressed that it "expects CJEZ to meet its commitment to broadcast 11 hours weekly" over the period of its licence.

All the above stations were granted renewals to their licences until August 31, 1992. It's expected there will be major changes in the CRTC's FM radio policy by that time.



the stage and a track where the rollerskating trains weave in and out around the audience, this production becomes a light show like no multi-million dollar rock show could ever do. The music and the skating is secondary to the staging and the lighting. The production yields only one memorable song, Only Me, and the album (if it was released in Canada) wasn't the hit that Cats and Les Misérables became. Only He is available on a WEA album, The Music Of Andrew Lloyd Webber (61-82674). It's becoming one of my favourite songs. Finally . . . it's not very often I would go back to see a musical, but I would gladly return to enjoy this one again. Maybe when it opens in Kitchener later this year. (EC: You give it five stars?) Six laser beams . . . !

People make this business . . . ! As I stood at the buffet at an after theatre party recently, I looked around at some of the people who had been invited and thought to myself . . . this is a really nice crowd and they seem to show up at a lot of these parties. They aren't critics . . . because a critic can kill a show . . . but they were supporters who have a voice in the media and they highlight, showcase, enhance. I like that. I like to be told what's happening . . . but I don't want anyone telling me whether they like it or not. Critics have been displaying a remarkable failure rate lately. Many a panned show has gone on to become a giant hit. Do people really pay attention to critics? (EC: You seem to be very critical of critics . . . !)

I've been listening to the Hog! as well, and Gary Aube is trying real hard . . . a little like an AM Q107 . . . but that's not so bad. In the meantime, I see Pete Taylor, ex of RPM and C-FOX is still sporting his Stetson, much too expensive to be a throw-away from the

old formal. He's looking after promotion for both stations. I think I can dig up a not-so-old photo of this promotion dynamo. (EC: I remember Pete . . . when they called him Peter . . . and he got his start at RPM!)

That George Fox is a sly one, he just goes from one successful date to another. Last year he caused a stir at the Craven Country Music Festival and he's done the same this year at the Carlisle Festival. According to the promoters, the best response of the 3-day event went to George, who also had the longest line-up for autographs, including that for the visiting American stars. Never too far from an original saying, George was asked recently what songwriting was really like. Without so much as a stir in his stirrup, he

answered, "It's a bit like breast-feeding, I guess. A certain amount of privacy is needed for me to relax." (EC: He's been watching those cows too long . . . !)

You didn't hear it from me, but there's an MCA VIP . . . initials are JM . . . who is househunting in the Toronto area. He's being wined and dined by a major brewery, and no names here, but you've only got two guesses. Once this former Los Angeles resident is bedded down in the most expensive city in North America . . . he will no doubt call a press conference . . . and AWAY we go. The booking and promoter scene in Canada is about to heat up. (EC: No wonder the big man in Bi-Bi town wants to retire . . . !)

Missed, but not forgotten . . . ! It was one of those days when I just couldn't get away, so I missed the first annual A&A Stampede Barbecue. However, thanks to Lyle Drake, I now have an A&A Stampede bolo tie. It must have been quite a barbecue with 250 hungry record hands ready to chomp on anything that moved. I heard that GN was there but the British Bulldog and JW weren't. Seems they had a little bit of a hot session going for themselves. (EC: Would Simpson's go to a Zeller's barbecue? Come to think of it, they're all part of the family now . . . aren't they!)

Good luck to the Junos . . . I like the idea of the Junos going to Vancouver, but that town is so unionized, even the biggest events can be cancelled . . . or brought on again, for a nominal sum, of course. Come to think of it, isn't that what happens in Toronto where the people who move things around are given a "gift" of quite a few bucks . . . a few weeks before the show. Sort of a "I'll scratch your back . . . but don't return the favour" deal. And, woe be to anyone who might move a mike or prop by accident. (EC: I thought you were warned not to bring that up . . . !)

Bill is developing some class . . . ! After Starlight Express there was a party thrown by CPI and their people for the cast and invited guests. They do this quite a bit and they're starting to get good at it. It gives these opening nights a New York kind of feeling. This is the kind of PR that helps to create success for CPI and consequently will bring more and better commercial theatre to Canada. Watch it Bill . . . you're getting pretty classy! (EC: I saw him helping an old lady to her seat . . . !)

Roger Desjardins - a profile

A 'million-and-one' things in a day

With a voice reminiscent of Burl Ives, WEA Artist Relations chief Roger Desjardins relishes his experiences through three decades of working in the world of entertainment.

Born and bred in Montreal, Desjardins got his start at an early age. "Before I got married I was involved in show business, in one form or another," he recalls. "I started at age 17, while I was still in school. There was a nightclub in Montreal called the Bellevue Casino. They were famous for booking in fairly big names like Edith Piaf, Sammy Davis Jr. and Sam Cooke." The teenaged Desjardins worked his 1959

person when you walk into these situations, because you're bringing in the philosophy of what you represent - plus you have to look at all the concerns that are on the table. You try to be a mediator." This role as an intermediary can sometimes be trying, as all sides have things they do and don't want to do. Desjardins explains how some artists don't want to do any publicity or meeting of contest winners backstage.

As well, he cites the difficulties involved when managers or promoters are less than accommodating. "(Often) promoters think the record companies have to do everything" for them, he says. "Promoters seem to forget one little aspect here - the record company is there to sell product and promote the artist. If this coincides with promoting a show, all the better. But sometimes it's not necessarily done the way the promoter would want to see it."

He points out that if the show does extremely well and makes a big profit, "the record company gets absolutely nothing out of it."

Desjardins says it's tricky being a successful artist relations person, as "you represent almost every facet of the company because you're on the front line. You're the guy who's stuck in the limo between the airport and the hotel, face-to-face with the artist and the manager. Or, later on that evening, you're face-to-face with them in a hotel room and you have to know about sales, promotion, a little A&R and how things work in the whole company."

As a boy working in a club in Montreal, Desjardins got to rub shoulders with celebrities such as Milton Berle, Jimmy Durante and Liberace. As a WEA executive, he has had the chance to become closer to major stars, such as Madonna and Phil Collins. But he is particularly fond of the relationship that has spawned between himself and Julian Lennon. "I met him in Phoenix six years ago," he says. "We get along extremely . . . extremely well." The two are such good friends that on the several occasions when Lennon had to come to Canada to get his (U.S.) Green Card renewed, he stayed with Desjardins. "He's a very, very sweet person," says the ex-Montrealer. "I have nothing but admiration for him."

For the time being, Desjardins says he's "very content with what I'm doing." He says his job gives him the opportunity to promote a lot of Canadian artist, through his connections, by getting them on U.S. or domestic tours. He also says the future may

include managing a group, after he retires from WEA.

Many miles and many years from the old Bellevue Casino, Desjardins' success hasn't removed his feet from the ground. He modestly suggests that artist relations "is all part of a machine that works well (at WEA). I'm just a little cog that turns around in there."

First all-reggae station for Jamaican airwaves

What is being billed as "the world's first bona fide reggae station," is being launched in Jamaica the latter part of July. IRIE FM's 24-hour broadcast will reach the eastern half of the island and extend to Montego Bay.

Grove Broadcasting Director Danny Melville says the playlist "will include 90 percent reggae with 10 percent reserved for hits within other music formats."

Joan Haines-Foster, of Spectrum Public Relations, says while the station's initial broadcast will be limited to Jamaica, "they are looking at syndication opportunities" for expanding coverage. Haines-Foster can be reached at 416-597-8556.

Kussin finalizing sound for new Scott album

Al Kussin is putting the final touches on Lorraine Scott's new album, *All Talk*. Producer Kussin hopes to have the album, ready for a late summer release. The title track will be released as a single along with a video.

Says Kussin, "For lovers of dance, R&B and pop music laced with unbelievable vocals, this album is a must." The single will be included on a compilation CD to be shipped shortly.

Scott has made her mark on the musical theatre stage as well. Her debut, in the cast of *Buddy*, has already drawn critical acclaim, and she is expected to continue with the company when it plays San Francisco and Broadway. Also on tap is a performance for the young Slak artist at an international music festival in Normandy, France in October of this year.

weekends as an usher at the Bellevue. "I became interested in the mechanisms of what made the show work," he reflects, "and worked my way into being the stage manager."

Desjardins says during his time at the Casino he learned how to promote the acts that were coming in. He utilized local radio stations to showcase and expose the artists, "a little like MuchMusic does now." He says the contacts he made in promotion "helped manoeuvre me into the circles where I was eventually headed."

After leaving the Bellevue, Desjardins worked as a 'rackdropper' for a hometown record company. After that, he handled various positions at several record companies. "I left (what eventually became) WEA to work at Capitol in promotions, then came back as a promotions supervisor for WEA." He says that in 1978 there was a need to have someone "who could relate to the artists, on behalf of the record company." As he had a reputation as someone who could do such a job - and as artists had already started to request that he be there when they came to town - Desjardins was promoted to National Artists Relations Manager at the company.

At WEA "it's a one man Artist Relations department. You make use of the promotion people in the field. They're on the street, day to day, (and) they know what's

COVER STORY by Jill Lawless**Manteye: From back alleys to your living room**

The back pages of newspapers and magazines across Canada are crammed with classified ads taken out by musicians seeking bands and bands seeking musicians. The musical relationships thus established are rarely as fruitful as in the case of Manteye.

The Toronto-based band, which has just released its self-titled debut album on the Justin Entertainment label, was formed when guitarist, singer and songwriter Mark Manthei took out an ad in a local entertainment weekly in 1987. After a string of unsuccessful respondents, a slightly desperate Manthei met brothers Augy and Ernie Guidoccio. Jamming together in the brothers' east-end apartment, the trio discovered that, despite different musical backgrounds and diverse influences, they shared some fundamental things: Northern Ontario roots (Manthei is from North Bay, the Guidoccio brothers from Sudbury), and a love of forceful, down-to-earth songwriting.

"Before meeting Mark, we were doing a lot of recordings using MIDI technology," says Augy. "It comes out glossier, but it really doesn't kick out. If you don't have a real song, you can shine it up and it'll fool a lot of people . . . but it's not the same." Manthei agrees. "We all have different influences, but we all like the one thing that the music business always seems to forget, or rarely acknowledges, and that's the song. The song," he says emphatically, "is the all-important god of the music business. If you

don't have that . . . you don't have anything."

The trio soon realised that they were on to something. But, as in all creative partnerships, not everything went smoothly from the start. "It wasn't all smooth sailing," recalls Ernie. "We had problems."

"It all came naturally, through a painful process," laughs Mark. "But in a year we managed to write an incredible number of songs . . . and nobody is expendable."

The band's demo tape caught the ear of entertainment lawyer Steven Ehrlick, who had been working to start a production and management company with his partner, producer Peter McNamee. "He'd been driving around with the name of his label on his licence plate for seven years, but he'd never been able to get anything started because he never heard anything that struck his ear," says Mark. Soon Manteye became the first band signed to the newly-formed Sirius Music Corporation.

While Augy says that now the band "feels really good about the management and the label", he readily admits that "at first, we didn't trust anybody...The worst thing that can happen is you get a (record) deal and suddenly everything's taken out of your hands." But this clearly didn't happen to Manteye. The band's rough-and-ready approach to recording ("There wasn't a lot of preproduction . . . we just played," says Mark) managed to capture the band's energy

on the record. And the band was impressed with the attitude and talent of guitar legend Chris Spedding, brought in to play on the song Seven Minutes To Midnight. "He showed a lot of conviction," recalls Augy. "His attitude toward recording is very primitive. He'll plug it in and just go for it."

Mark says that the main problems the band has encountered stem from the fact that "we weren't quite formed when we were signed." He jokes that the band "has had as many bass players as gigs," but says that "now that the album's done we've had a chance to form what we want to take out on the road." With a more stable lineup to back up the nucleus of Mark, Augy and Ernie, the members of Manteye feel they can only get tighter and better.

Things are moving quickly now for a band that claims to have done its best songwriting while playing in an alleyway (whose exact location is a closely-guarded secret) in east-end Toronto. One gets the feeling that, even when they go out on the road later in the summer, the members of Manteye are not going to leave the alleyway behind. "The alleyway is a symbol for us," reflects Augy. "We even had our record release party there."

Robertson is the longest-serving employee with CBS. He joined the firm in 1957 as Assistant Plant Manager.



The music of Tchaikovsky is featured throughout the competition. However, competitors are encouraged to include music by a composer from their own country.

Augusta LaPaix will host 13 hours of concerts, talk, color and reflection from the three rounds - July 26-28 from 8 to 11 pm and July 29 from 2 to 6 pm on CBC Stereo.

Rick Phillips, executive producer, is heading the CBC's team which also includes CBC producers Bob Bauer of Halifax, Karen Wilson of Vancouver and CBC Vancouver recording engineer Don Pennington.

The competition which began in 1958 is held every four years. Past winners included Van Cliburn, Vladimir Ashkenazy, Barry Douglas (who appeared in the film Madame Souisatzka), Canadian Andre Laplante, a 1978 silver medalist, cellist Nathaniel Rosen violinist Gidon Kremer and mezzo-soprano Elena Obraztsova.

As Phillips points out, "If you win the Tchaikovsky Competition, you'll do fine. It's a rocket to stardom."



There are some heavy names on this package of music from the latest Tom Cruise action film (whose plot so resembles his last action film that maybe it should have been called *Top Car*). The compilation is littered with tunes from the likes of Elton John, Cher, Guns N' Roses, Tina Turner and Chicago, neatly packaged into a fairly standard 11-track offering. Unfortunately, it's fairly consistently boring. The songs, most of which seem destined for chart action, often have the feel that they are either excess works by artists, or just a contractual obligation. The tracks that stand out as not bad include Roses' rendition of Dylan's *Knockin' On Heaven's Door* (a strong song anyway) John's *You Gotta Love Someone* and Apollo Smile's *Thunder Box* (which is only good because it breaks up the monotony of the rock tracks). But the soundtrack exits on a weak note, with Terry Reid's lame cover of *Gimme Some Lovin'* (though, in all fairness, it's hard to better the original version). 

Aided by ace players like Rush's Alex Lifeson, *Brotherhood* is both harder-edged and more lifting than the past few Gowan albums. Never at a loss to showcase his talents as a singer, Gowan adds both raw power and soft intonation effectively throughout. The success of the first single, *All The Lovers In The World*, simply restates the fact that Gowan is always a strong part of the Canadian music scene. 


POISON - Rock

As one of several bands vying to claim Van Halen's former position as California's quintessential party band, *Poison* relies heavily on image to sell themselves. But unlike their last album, on which the group looked like a walking ad for Max Factor, *Flesh & Blood* is letting the music shape the image. Rocking back to front, with blues hooks tossed in here and there, the album is surprisingly good. *Poison* has proven that it can write and play songs that have as much depth as glitz. While some of the arrangements are predictable and many of the riffs sounding dated, non-fans will probably be pleased with the good-natured rock available over 14 tracks. Though *Poison's* earlier image may have turned many off ever considering liking them (and their new image resembling other groups of the same genre), *Flesh & Blood* may restore some faith in California-rock's musical value these days. 

Wes is the newest kid on the block. Another product from the long line of Maurice Starr stable acts (New Kids, New Edition, Perfect Gentlemen), Wes has something that sets him apart from the rest - a deep voice. While it can't dip as low as Barry White, the teen crooner does provide a break from the endless castrata voices usually found on Starr-inspired works. Unfortunately for Wes, the album starts off with a fanfare that attempts to compare him with the Beatles, the Jacksons and the New Kids. The latter is a bit more believeable, but Wes shows, at least on this album, that he doesn't really have all it takes to live up to his billing. Produced by Maurice Starr. (CD reviewed) - PS



CRYSTAL GAYLE - Country

For the track record that Gayle has set over the years, she deserves better at radio. Country programmers have been somewhat hesitant to add her current single, *Everybody's Reaching Out For Someone*, one of the best tracks on this Allen Reynolds production. Perhaps it's Gayle's method of styling that might go over their heads. This is a perfect nice and easy collection of songs containing great lyrics. Also key are *Just Like The Blues*, *More Than Love* and *Once In A Very Blue Moon*. (CD reviewed) - WG

HARRY CONNICK, JR. - Jazz/Big Band
We Are In Love

In what looks like the second half of Connick's new career approach, *We Are In Love* showcases the big band style he loves so much. Having been touted as "the new Frank Sinatra" by critics in the past, Connick relishes the big showmanship vocalisation that accompanies the big sound. But like his alter ego on *Lofty's Roach Souffle* (the new instrumental album), Connick seems to be plagued with material that lets him down (especially when compared to his big band recordings over the last few years). You can see where the young New Orleans entertainer is coming from - he likes quiet jazz and



He is a young man whose talents far outdistance his age, though his years grinding it out on the Bourbon Street jazz circuit of New Orleans were the best possible training any pianist of his type could ask for. But unlike earlier works like *20* or *When Harry Met Sally*, *Souffle* seems a bit lost. The songs are pretty uninspiring when compared to the beautiful tracks he performed on his previous albums. Connick is still young and still at the top of his field, so this little setback shouldn't do his career any permanent damage. Produced by Tracey Freeman. (cassette reviewed) - PS

SHAME - Pop/Rock

This combination of finished tracks and demos took "a month of Sundays" to record and mix both in Scotland and Toronto. *Shame* is really vocalist/instrumentalist Norman Roger, a Scotman currently in the middle of transferring his life and career to Canada. A member of Britain's TV 21 and musical associate of the Waterboys, Roger is a gifted songwriter never discouraged at the fact that it took two-and-a-half years to get *Symi* off the ground. Named after a Greek island dear to his heart, the Scot has filled this album with various musical styles. But no matter what approach, each track is gifted with Roger's impressive vocal abilities and sheer commitment. Produced by *Shame*. (CD reviewed) - PS



STEVEN VITALI - Instrumental/Pop
Dream With Me
Enigma - D2-73584-F

Written, arranged and produced by Vitali, *Dreams* success at cracking the barrier into radio proves instrumental music's strong following. Called "theme music" rather than new age by Vitali, the album's varying musical textures have propelled it onto RPM's A/C chart. Also key is his tribute to the Air Force's Snowbirds. (CD reviewed) - PS

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS - Rock
Home Fires Burning
Sensible Records - WRCI-6373

The sound coming across on *Home Fires Burning* is pretty indicative of what is happening at the club level in Toronto. Out of Metro's east end, the Commandments come across as a replica of dozens of bands that play downtown establishments. *Fires* doesn't have anything new to offer as far as musical styles or sounds are concerned. Based on a mid-sixties guitar-driven feel, with a definite garage essence added, the album is pretty bland, end to end. Even the best track, *When You're Around*, suffers from a guitar solo that sounds like it could come from a number of Toronto groups. (album reviewed) - PS

The last day will begin with Sunday Morning Country hosted by George Hamilton IV. The CCMA Annual General Meeting will follow with the President's Dinner/Citation Awards and the President's Dance to officially close the six day event.

The two new releases are Anne Lord's Cherokee, described by Fara as "a totally new, sound and direction" for Lord, and Harrison Lloyd's Don't You Worry Darlin' . . . "real good old C&W," says Fara. To balance off the new CD, Fara added six former releases from over the years, "which we hope programmers will be glad to get new copies of," Fara points out, "and, of course, new CD format for old vinyl favourites." The six other tracks are from Alex Fraser (Four States To Go), Billie J. Helmkay (Spreadin' My Hurt Around), Gale Wahl (Canadian River), Tanya Marie (I Don't Miss Often), Dave Cornelius (Heartbreak Gambler) and Roman Churko (You Need Some Lovin').

Lionel Bernard makes an impressive bid for chart action with his instrumental entry of Lake St. Peter's Breakdown and Four Mile Run, both Bernard originals. This is old time fiddle, like it should be played, and Bernard was teetethed on the instrument in his home province of Prince Edward Island. In fact, he was impressing hometown crowds with his talent at the age of ten. Bernard modestly admits, "I've wanted to make this recording for a long time, but I was afraid there wasn't a market for my music."
