Ron Dann's death leaves a giant void in industry

It was barely two months ago when Ron Dann, steelman extraordinaire, producer and songwriter, and one of the most respected musicians in the industry, was diagnosed as having lung cancer. There was hope however, but treatment, which wasn't covered by OHIP, would be costly.

His close friends established The Ron Dann Fund, and a benefit concert was planned and in short order an impressive list of acts had volunteered to perform. As well, very generous contributions began to pour in, ensuring Mr. Dann the necessary medical treatment even before the planned benefit concert.

The cancer, however, spread too quickly and Mr. Dann, at age 43, lost his valiant fight on September 13th, with his wife Linda and very close friends at his bedside. He was his usual jovial self right to the end, cracking jokes and trying to comfort those who were with him. Of great comfort to him in his last few hours was knowing that through the Ron Dann Fund, his wife would not be left destitute.

B.J. Cook, noted Canadian songwriter and performer, fondly recalls when she first met Mr. Dann. "He was the first person I met here in the music business who was willing to give a new artist a hand up without a price figure attached." She continues with, "He was a really wonderful person, who loved the music industry and because of his great and humourous outlook on life, he brought a lot of joy and love to the business."

Fellow steel guitar player and very close friend, Al Briscoe, also has fond memories of Mr. Dann. "Ron was such a great guy to be around. He was always doing something for someone out of the goodness of his heart. He really helped me through some very rough times with the Steel Guitar Club of Canada. We're all going to miss him very much."

A private funeral service was held for Mr. Dann in Toronto on September 17th. He is survived by his wife Linda, mother and two sisters.

Drew's legal muscle scuttles Tip Top Tailors

The Canadian Achievers, the 1985 branch of Vancouver broadcaster Dick Drew, has been widely billed as "Canada's national network radio program for Canadians, about Canadians." The syndicated series is heard daily from coast to coast on 126 Canadian radio stations.

In spite of this far reaching promotion, Tip Top Tailors launched a radio campaign carrying the banner of Canadian Achievers. Three 60-second commercials were produced, time was booked on stations across Canada and everything was in place for the launch of the campaign.

Drew points out that the Tip Top Tailor people "were immediately notified by our lawyers that they were infringing on our established use of 'Canadian Achievers' as a radio series, and our federal copyrights of 'The Canadian Achievers' and 'Les succès Canadiens' dated June 18, 1985."

Drew goes on to point out that there was a happy ending for his side, "To their credit, Tip Top Tailors immediately produced a new series of commercials withdrawing the phrase 'Canadian Achievers'." He concludes with, "We trust this did not create too much confusion between their commercial campaign and our series."

Teen market targeted for Artiste's Papp

Artiste Records' president Paul Levesque has set his focus on a definite group when marketing his newest act: anglo teens.

The head of the Montreal-based label says Sonya Papp will hopefully fill a void he sees these days. "There's no teen idol, I think, right now in Canada," he says. "I feel that Sonya can fill that gap." The 17-year-old Papp is a natural for teens across the country, says Levesque. "It's a natural for her because she's still a teenager . . . but it's only a stop in her career."

While Papp, who is giving the personal touch to the promotion of her Destiny album, has been compared to Mitsou, her focus is almost exclusively English audiences; a statement backed up by Levesque. "Maybe the approach is a Mitsou for the English market," he says, "but this is also an international project. I'm going to push as much in L.A. and New York as in Toronto."

Virgin set to release World On Edge debut

Virgin Canada will release World On Edge's self-titled debut album October 15. The Montreal band was signed to the label last autumn, and recorded the work at Toronto's Eastern Sound studio during the spring and summer of this year.

The quartet (vocalist Rob Meyer, bassist Steph Thompson, guitarist Peter Hopkins and keyboardist Jon Daniels) were joined by ex-Regatta drummer Greg Critchley on the LP. The band is managed by Derek Sutton, who is noted for his former association with Glass Tiger and Styx.


The first release off the album, Still Beating, will be accompanied by a video; both of which are scheduled to come out September 24. Virgin says that the pop group will be released in the U.S. on the Charisma label, and that no tour plans will be announced until after the album is released.

Voisine pens tribute to hockey's Lemieux

Star recording artist Roch Voisine has written a tribute song to former hockey partner, and longtime friend, Mario Lemieux. The song, entitled On The Red Line, is from the video Mario The Magnificent.

Quality Special Products has licensed the song, which will be accompanied by a video which will comprise highlights from the longer documentary. The video to On The Red Line will be released to MuchMusic/MusiquePlus, while the song will be available on Voisine's upcoming, as yet untitled, Star Records album.

Voisine used to play hockey with Lemieux and Lemieux's agent, Patrick Brisson. Both he and Brisson left the sport after injuries and pursued other careers.

"No trouble" with ROW family of outlets - Ierullo

Records On Wheels' (ROW) president, co-founder and co-owner Vito Ierullo responds with "what slump?" when questioned about the effect this summer's slowdown has had on his company.

The 44-year-old businessman, who helped start his company 18 years ago by selling vinyl off of a bus, says ROW's ability to stay ahead of the industry may be in part "by playing it lean and mean." He says that the "biggest one-stop in Canada" has had three consecutive years of increased profits; but adds that "I don't think this year will be able to top last year."

Ierullo points to the sale of "about 400,000" deletes as one of the main reasons 1989's profit margin was as healthy as it was for ROW.

While he cites other product distributors' financial woes, Ierullo says that there's "no trouble" with the ROW 'family' of outlets: numbering 400, with ten percent of those ROW franchises, and coast-to-coast distribution (concentrated in the Saskatchewan-to-New Brunswick region).

"Prudence" key to Justin "umbrella" health

One word Jeff Burns believes in; when charting the course of his company, is "prudence." The head of Justin Entertainment Inc. says he feels that using this principle will help his company overcome the fate that has befallen other independent Canadian labels.

The 40-year-old former CBS record exec says that part of the reason he gave up a successful career as that company's A&R head was that he "wanted to do it properly.

After the number of years that I'd worked with multi-nationals, I also think the timing was right for me. Plus I felt that I'd made all this money for other people . . . and the bottom line is to survive in this marketplace."

Part of the money Burns made for other people came from his 'discovering' acts such as Gowan, Platinum Blonde, Loverboy, Barney Bentall and Mae Moore during his ten years at CBS. Before joining the label, he had "worked (his) way up from clerk to store manager to buyer" at A&A's.

Using both FACTOR and VideoFACT funds, as well as private investment ("a portion" of which was his own money), Burns made sure that Justin was well prepared for the pitfalls of life as a label. At only seven months of age, the company was still a 'newborn' when the summer slowdown hit this year.

CBS conference reveals new company promotions

CBS Records Canada President, Paul Burger, chose the annual Marketing Conference to announce the promotion of Richard Zuckerman to VP, A&R.

In making the announcement, Burger pointed out that the appointment "is a reflection of Richard's success in re-focusing our A&R activities and positioning us for the nineties." He continued with "Specifically our success with the launch of Celine Dion in the U.S., where she is the second most added artist at adult contemporary radio this week, is indicative of the artistic and production quality we expect to maintain in the future."

Also announced at the Mt. Tremblant Club meet were the promotions of Mario Lefebvre to Manager, Marketing and Promotion, CBS Disques, and Nat Merenda to Columbia marketing representative, Quebec.

"It hasn't been easy, as we only had three albums out at that point. I think (survival) comes back to keeping your costs down. One thing I made sure of was that my recoupables - the money I invest in acts - isn't going to kill me. When we were coming into the summer, we didn't have big bills, payables, that had to be looked after." He says Justin's initial budget had the summer slump already projected into it. "It was difficult . . . don't get me wrong," he says. "But we're okay."

Named after Burns' three-and-a-half-year-old son, Justin Entertainment will be more than just a record label, says Burns. "We recently started a publishing company, Justin Music and Justin Songs, so we're becoming actively involved in that. I am expanding the company, in the sense that there are licensing opportunities that are available to us."

The expansion is also planned to include a management company and a film division. "I wanted to have one big 'umbrella' that would encompass all the different divisions,"

Fledgling Hamilton label

W.E.T. Records is hoping it will be able to survive on its founders' experience and skill; especially tough these days when many independent labels are failing on what seemed to be stronger ground.

Steve Dafoe, who, along with his brother Kevin and Tom Gerencser, started W.E.T. "about five months ago," is using his experience in the music industry to aid his label's cause.

"We said 'Let's put all the connections that we've always had - and try to get more - and see if three new people in the industry can give it a go.'" The "connections" have come from the years the three have been together in the band Never...But Always (NBA). While the group still records and performs, its members are using the information they gathered through recording to help guide W.E.T. (a logo derived from nicknames the three have).

"We went into (W.E.T.) thinking 'Okay, what we're going to do - instead of putting all our money in - is promote the credits that Tom had (as a producer and engineer). He did all the work in his basement on the Kon Kan song I Beg Your Pardon. It sold close to two million records,'" Dafoe says. He adds that W.E.T.'s strategy was to have artists sign up under the

he says; hence the 'Entertainment Inc.' tag to the Justin name. "It'll be a slow climb, but I'm prepared for that."

The licensing opportunities have come through contacts made at this summer's New Music Seminar in New York. Burns says that deals are currently being made to licence several European dance, rap and metal acts.

This would enhance Justin's own domestic stable of artists, which include The Blondes, Kenny MacLean, Manteye and Seventh Son. As well, Burns says he has "come to an agreement" with Dan Hill for an international signing with the veteran Canadian artist.

Burns commends his own staff and the people at MCA (his distributor), who have helped Justin make it this far. The Toronto native feels that if the organization can keep to its basic philosophy, it will be "around for the long haul."

"Our prime objective is acquisition and development of new talent. As head of A&R for CBS and GRT, I kept that same idea. That is my main focus; I think there's a lot of great talent out there."

condition that they foot all the production, manufacturing and distribution costs of their album.

"We placed a number of ads in papers and got a lot of phone calls. We signed three artists that way (and) at the moment, we're working with two." The 25-year-old Dafoe (his brother is 23, Gerencser 22) says W.E.T. has been particularly pleased with the success of one of its acts - dance-club artist Laura Burgess (who's debut single was financed by the label).

Dafoe, who worked in promotion at Electric Distribution for about a year and a half, says weekly meetings help guide the new label's short-term development. Over the next year, he says, W.E.T.'s goals include "signing a major distribution (deal). As well," he continues, "to have the (Burgess) single licenced to three countries on our own, so we can say we've done something by ourselves."

With recent distribution deals with Montreal's Cargo and Toronto's Roblan, along with NBA licensing agreements with British and French companies, W.E.T. is already proving that it can make headway by doing it alone.

Shorewood ups Southam to VP Sales & Marketing

Morrie Mendelson, Executive Vice President of International Sales for Shorewood Packaging, has announced that Ted Southam has been appointed Vice President of Sales and Marketing for the Music Division.

Southam joined Shorewood's Toronto headquarters in 1988 as Director of Marketing, Music Division, after eight years with CBS Records. Mendelson pointed out that this appointment "reflects the success of Ted and his team in maintaining Shorewood's position as a primary supplier of graphic materials for Canada's music industry."

A Canadian/Dutch connection? Watch for a Canadian paper company . . . and I mean the kind that destroys trees, to become a partner with a Dutch firm in the building of a compact disc (EC: *Canadian/Dutch! I get it, CD!*) factory in Europe. They apparently have a pretty good handle on manufacturing CDV hardware and expect to attract a good chunk of that market as well as the plain old, getting-older-by-the-day, CD software. (EC: *I knew I should have waited . . . !*)

There are still vinyl holdouts! The get-rid-of-vinyl-at-all-costs campaign is still running into opposition, not only in Europe, where vinyl pressings are enjoying good sales, but in the U.S. This is particularly evident with many country stations. Nice to see Capitol and PolyGram still maintaining their 7" vinyl policy, even in its trimmed down state. Watch for BMG to release its Made In Canada series in all configurations . . . yes, even in vinyl. There are still 18 million turntables out there and collectors like to collect. (EC: *Snowie White must have had something to do with that . . . !*)

CRTC may end liquor advertising ban

The Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) is considering lifting its ban on the advertising of hard liquor.

In response to a request by the Association of Canadian Distillers (ACD), the CRTC has put out a call for comments on the proposal to lift the ban on broadcast advertising of liquor containing more than 7 percent alcohol by volume.

The ACD maintains the ban is in contravention of the Charter of Rights and Freedoms, and has begun legal proceedings challenging the constitutional validity of the prohibition.

If the ban were lifted, the CRTC would continue to pre-clear commercial scripts and storyboards for alcohol advertisements. A proposal in 1986 to replace the pre-screening process with a code for advertisers met with concern from members of the public making submissions. In September 1986, the CRTC decided to maintain its pre-clearance role, and to amend its regulations to permit commercials for beverages, such as spirit-based "coolers," containing no more than 7 percent alcohol by volume. It also developed a code to explain its screening criteria.

The CRTC is looking for evidence that would support or refute the present distinction made in the regulations between beer, wine and spirits.



MCJ & Cool G - riding rap's Canadian wave

Since the surprising breakthrough of Maestro Fresh-Wes, interest in domestic rap and dance music has been on the rise in Canada. Recent Capitol Records signing MCJ & Cool G are excited to be part of this new wave.

The duo now resides and works in Montreal, but they were raised in Halifax, and remain proud of their Nova Scotia roots. "When I moved to Montreal, all I got was fishing jokes," laughs MCJ (James McQuaid). "I'm from Halifax, and I can't even swim. Halifax is a normal town, except it's down by the water." He feels that Canadian cities should be as fertile ground for rap artists as their American counterparts. "There's a ghetto in Halifax. There's a ghetto in Toronto, there's a ghetto in Montreal. Our scene is probably not as harsh as the scene in Los Angeles, but we still have our problems. A lot of rappers seem to have a negative background. They came from the streets, or they were in a gang...With me and G it's basically the same thing, but it's not a real harsh story, there's no street thing."

Both men think it's about time Canada started staking its claim to the dance market. "Just R&B alone coming from Canada is unheard of," says Cool G (Richard Gray), and MCJ agrees. "I find there's not much of our style of music happening...It's time Canada started biting off some of the international market."

That may be starting to happen. Since

the success of Attic's Maestro Fresh-Wes, Canadian majors are looking with new interest at Canada's rap and dance artists. "I think they were hesitating to see who would be first to jump on a rap act in Canada," says MCJ, "and after (Maestro Fresh-Wes) did so well, they all said 'let's try it.'" Capitol was first off the mark, making MCJ & Cool G the first Canadian rap act signed to a major domestic label. They are confident their music can stand up to the responsibility and the scrutiny.

"I think they (the labels) may be trying to find another Maestro," reflects Cool G. "But our situation is a bit different. Our music has more of an R&B groove. I think there's a difference in our music (that will let us) hang on a bit longer than the average rapper." The duo have dubbed their distinctive sound Double R&B - rap, rhythm and blues. "Putting singing on our tracks totally enhanced our sound," says MCJ. "We approach it like music."

The success of MCJ & Cool G is a testament to the thriving network of independent labels and producers which sustains Canada's rap community. "We were with an independent, CEC Records in Montreal," explains MCJ. "It's a little production house, no big time, but what they do as an entertainment company is record and shop the material around to the majors...We shopped around for a while, but no majors were interested in Canadian rappers. So we released our own single." The single, "So Listen," garnered heavy play in dance clubs, "and created a nice buzz, and the majors came knocking on our door. It wasn't an easy deal. We worked hard for it...We owe it to our independent record company."

They are equally happy with Capitol. "Capitol signs the most Canadian acts in this country. So we're proud to be with these guys, because we know they're behind Canadian artists," says MCJ.

Unlike many rappers, MCJ & Cool G don't consider themselves a "message" band. They say their message, musically and lyrically, is unity. "We don't make 'crossover records.' We just make records that are able to cross over," says MCJ. "We can play our record in a black dance club; we can also take it to a white dance club...We do have a message in certain of our songs, but we approach it differently. We're not telling kids not to do drugs. We're just showing them the scene and letting them make their own choice."

MCJ & Cool G share the rising optimism of many in the dance music community. "Everybody likes dance music," says MCJ confidently. "It's the music of the nineties. It's not going to die, it's going to keep going. I think we've kind of found our place in the industry. I think we're getting accepted as real music. We're getting radio play. Even if the hardest stuff isn't making it to the radio, if you look at country or rock, they don't play everything either. There's some hard rock that's too hard for the radio."

"We plan to break in the States, but our priorities are here first. There are a million rappers in the States signed to a million labels. But here it's like a big apple pie and Maestro Fresh-Wes has only taken a bit of the crust off."

It's been a while! Jon Bon Jovi's *Blaze Of Glory* tops the Hit Tracks chart this week giving PolyGram their first Number One song since November of 1989 when *Tears For Fears* topped the chart with *Sowing The Seeds Of Love*. The *Blaze of Glory*/Young Guns II album is also very strong, holding at No. 4.

In with a select group . . . More Than Words Can Say, the second release from Alias, is blasting its way up the charts. In just its second week, the song is at No. 26. Only two songs all year have been higher on the chart in their second week. Those two were The New Kids On The Block's Step By Step (at No. 17), and Madonna's *Vogue* (at No. 24). Both went on to hit No. 1.

Boy oh boy . . . Paul Young leads the Chi-Lites cover battle. His *Oh Girl* is at No. 4 while MC Hammer's *Have You Seen Her* is right behind at No. 8. They are also two of nine charted songs with *Girl*, *Her*, *Woman*, or *She* in the title. On the other hand, there isn't a single song with *Boy*, *Him*, *Man*, or *He* in the title. It seems songs about men just aren't as popular. How many of the remaining seven songs can you name?

Top Entries . . . Heart's *Stranded* makes a very strong debut this week at No. 49. That's higher than any of their previous two releases from Brigade. *Stranded* just edged out Candi & The Backbeat's *The World Just Keeps On Turning*, which debuts at No. 51, for top entry this week.

The calm before . . . The Album chart is quite stationary near the top with only one change in the top 10. Concrete Blonde's *Bloodletting* switches places with Poison's *Flesh And Blood*.

The storm . . . A two way race for the Number One album appears to be shaping up between Roger Waters' *The Wall Live* in Berlin and George Michael's *Listen Without Prejudice Vol. 1*. *The Wall* won the first round last week debuting 6 places higher. However, *Listen...* wins round 2 with this week's biggest jump, up 26 spots to No. 18, that's two places ahead of *The Wall*.

Second career booming. In Cheap Trick's first career in the late 70's early 80's, they had just 1 top 5 hit (*I Want You To Want Me*). In their second career, they already have 3 as *Can't Stop Falling Into Love* reaches No. 5. It joins *The Flame*, which hit No. 1, and *Don't Be Cruel*, which hit No. 5, both in '88.

Girl Talk . . . The seven remaining songs on the chart with references to women in the title are: *Girl With A Problem* (Northern Pikes), *Gypsy Woman* (Santana), *L.A. Woman* (Billy Idol), *She's On A Mountain* (Five Guys Named Moe), *She Ain't Worth It* (Glenn Medeiros), *She's Insane* (Seventh Son), and *The Girl I Used To Know* (Brother Beyond).






LIVING COLOUR - Rock



This 59-minute video shows the Irish band at their best. 

The production, headed by Albhy Galuten, is professional throughout; but there are moments when the background instrumentation, which gives body to any song, doesn't do justice to the songs. 


