## J. Robert Wood appointed General Manager CJEZ

J. Robert Wood, regarded as one of Canada's top broadcasters, has been appointed General Manager of Toronto's CJEZ-FM 97.3, effective April 15. The announcement was made by Robert Redmond, President of Redmond Broadcasting.

The news came as somewhat of a shock, in that Wood has been at the forefront of a major movement to helm a much needed black urban, dance radio station for the Toronto market. He has submitted three separate applications to the CRTC, two for 92.5, the last remaining unassigned FM frequency in Toronto, which he found, and

It's estimated that more than half a million dollars has gone into Wood's three applications for a Toronto frequency. However, Wood stresses that his main priority now is to bring

CJEZ into prominence as a major easy listening station for the Toronto market.

Although the need for a black urban, dance station remains, it's not known what role, if any, Wood will play in the bid for the dismembered CKO Toronto all-news (99.1) frequency. However, it's expected that the staging for this fight won't be until sometime in 1993.

In announcing Wood's appointment, Redmond praised Wood's dedication as a Toronto broadcaster, "recognized for his unwavering commitment to the industry." He concludes with, "I am confident that he (Wood) will take a significant role in shaping the future direction of CJEZ 97.3 FM and will build a strong presence for the station in the Toronto market."

## FACTOR lays it on the table for open industry dialogue

Having battled through several years of mudslinging and name-calling, much of it unfair, FACTOR has invited the industry to debate the organization's function, whether, as FACTOR's Executive Director Heather Sym suggests "it would be an artist-support initiative or an industry strategy." Sym goes on to point out that "There is also an alarming number of people who misunderstand FACTOR's policies and objectives."

Sym stresses that FACTOR "keeps the lines of communication with the industry wide open," and that "every effort is made to consult

the industry and respond to its needs. However, still far too many people talk only to each other about FACTOR and not to the organization directly."

Hoping to encourage "direct dialogue," FACTOR has arranged an industry debate to take place Wednesday, April 17 in the Variety Club Room of the Westbury Hotel in Toronto. The discussion gets underway at 5:30 pm.

Industry lawyer, Stephen Stohn of McCarthy Tetrault will moderate a panel comprised of Alexander Mair, President of Attic Records and former FACTOR Board member, Earl Rosen, President of Marquis Records and former Executive Director of CIRPA and FACTOR, journalist Larry Leblanc, and industry lawyer Ed Glinert of the Farano Green law firm.

The debate, which will be centred around the question, "What Should FACTOR's Focus Be" is expected to be stormy. Sym punches home her message that whether those in the industry "are in agreement with the way FACTOR's programs are developing or feel sweeping changes should be made, we want to hear from you." Sym also suggests that members of the Canadian music industry should shoulder some of the responsibility to make sure their views and concerns are properly addressed, concluding with, "This debate is a perfect opportunity."

## A&B's Fred Steiner in critical condition

It has been learned, as we go to press, that Fred Steiner, owner and founder of A&B Sound, has suffered a massive heart attack at his Vancouver home. Mr. Steiner has a past history of heart problems and this attack is being viewed as very serious.

Mr. Steiner is in hospital in Vancouver on life support system where his condition is listed as "very critical".

Mr. Steiner, who is 64, retired from the organization four years ago, but has remained actively involved with corporate affairs on a part-time basis. His son Nick is President of the 7-store chain, and daughter Barb Eslake is General Manager of the Victoria store.

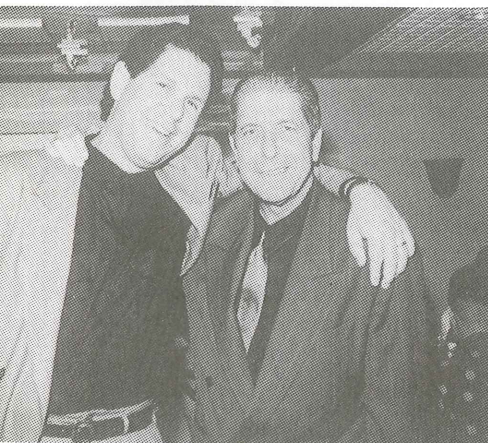

## MuchMusic's Big Ticket for Dion's Toronto date

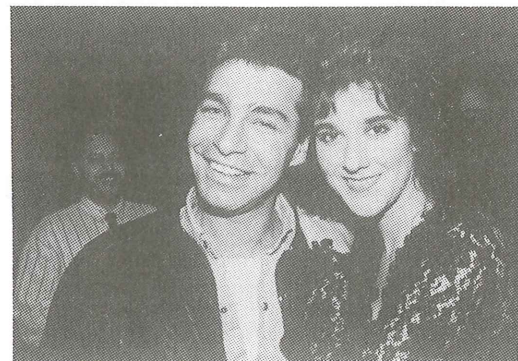
MuchMusic's next Big Ticket special (April 8) will present Sony Music's Celine Dion, shot live at Toronto's Winter Garden Theatre earlier this year.

This is Dion's first North American concert television special and features interviews and backstage footage along with her concert performance, where she sings several tracks from her Unison album, including Where Does My Heart Beat Now, Have A Heart and her current hit track, The Last To Know. The latter is already established on RPM's 100 Hit Tracks and 40 AC charts.

The special is timely, coming on the heels of Dion's double win at the Junos: Best Album (Unison) and Female Vocalist. The Unison album is now over the double platinum (200,000 units shipped) plateau.

## Maurice Velenosi brings Isba into prominence

Question: What word is written and pronounced the same way in almost every language in the world?

Answer: 'Isba'. It's actually taken from the Russian dictionary and simply means 'log cabin'. When Maurice Velenosi started his record company, he was a musician in a band called Bob's Hut. He checked a thesaurus for a pseudonym for hut and found the word isba. It stuck with him because of its simplicity and easy recognition.

"I started consulting some Quebec area artists - strictly administration, accounting and tax consulting," explains Velenosi, founder and co-owner of Isba Records Inc. "That led into some independent productions, mostly 45 rpm 12" product and in 1983 I opened Isba Music Publishing." So the ground work was laid and in the spring of 1985, Isba Records had its first release by David Alexander Winter. Their first major hit broke with the release of Nuance's *Vivre dans la Nuit*; both the single and album went gold in Canada.

Since then, Velenosi has been one of the busiest independent record entrepreneurs in the country. Isba's roster has exploded to 21 artists with more signings expected this year. Included on the present roster is Mitsou whose October '88 release, *El Mundo*, achieved platinum status. The hit single *Bye Bye Mon Cowboy* has been remixed and released in the U.S. where it has charted on major trade dance charts. Her follow-up album *Terre des Hommes* was released in November '90 and is quickly approaching gold status.

Another rising star for Isba is singer Paris Black. Originally signed to Karrera Records, he has bolted on to the Canadian music scene since signing with Isba with tunes like *Better Get Ready* and *Lover* and his most recent track, *Conspiracy*, getting early radio attention. The

success of Isba is largely due to a series of wise business decisions. Velenosi started out with a distribution plan by Trans-Canada Distributing and after two years struck a more advantageous deal with Select Distribution. It wasn't long before his label and artists came to the attention of the majors and, for the past two years, he has enjoyed having his product distributed by Sony Music. The agreement has just been renewed for another five years.

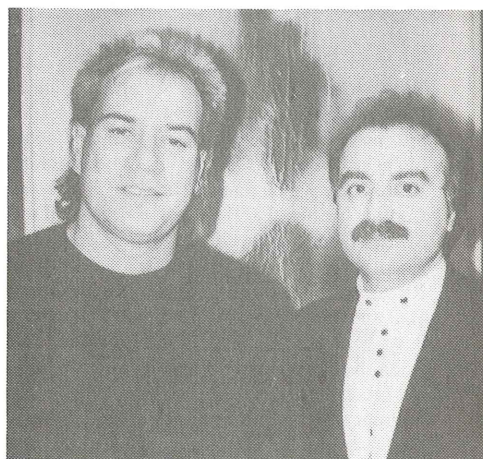
"Since being distributed by Sony, companies around the world have taken us more seriously. Especially when meeting with representatives at MIDEM and other such forums", says Velenosi.

He has broken ground in several key territories around the world, including an exclusive licensing and distribution deal with Korean based Hanyang Distribution and a similar agreement in the Ivory Coast region of South Africa. Isba is currently in negotiations for distribution and licensing in the Benelux/Scandinavian territories which should be finalized in the next couple of weeks. Similar discussions are taking place with a company in France for distribution in that territory.

"Benelux and Scandinavia are important areas for us," says Velenosi, "it is easier to cover because it has over 25 million people in a concentrated area, unlike Canada. I'm confident that once we have product released there, it will automatically spill over into European markets, particularly Germany."

With the many business transactions going on, one would think there is hardly any time available for scouting new talent but Velenosi seems to find his artists through various means. He is active on the juries of FACTOR and MusiqueAction as well as listening to tapes sent to him from across Canada and Europe.

Steve Sechi, manager of Isba's Toronto office is also involved, primarily with the English product. "No one is strictly involved with A&R. In a small company it's a team effort," says Sechi. The efforts are on-going. Isba is also responsible for the promotion of their product. Their agreement with Sony does not include record promotion so this very important aspect of the business also keeps them

hopping. "We concentrate on being a full service label," adds Sechi.

Together with his partners, Larry Mancini and Sean O'Brien, Maurice Velenosi has built a very solid 'log cabin'. Truly an international record label that does not affix itself to one dimension of musical styles like some boutique labels. Just as the word Isba is universal in language, so is the the music contained in its product. -RW

## Sony sponsors first Much closed captioned special

Rio Notebook will be MuchMusic's first in-house special to be closed-captioned for the hearing impaired. The program will air Tuesday April 23rd at 5:00 PM ET with repeats at 9:00 PM and 5:00 AM the following morning. It will run again on Sunday April 28 at 1:00 PM and Monday April 29 At 1:00 AM and 9:00 AM.

The captioning will be performed by Toronto company, Video Captions Inc., with funding provided by Sony Music Canada. "We're hoping this will be a ground breaking venture", says Kim Zayac, Director of National Promotions at Sony Music, "I'm sure there are thousands of hearing impaired fans who would not normally get the chance to hear what their favourite performers have to say."

The thirty minute show, hosted by Kim Clarke Champniss, includes interviews with rock giants such as Billy Idol, Inxs, A-Ha, Slash from Guns N' Roses, Faith No More, Debbie Gibson, Run DMC, Queensryche and footage of a New Kids On The Block press conference in which they get booed. All footage was shot on location in Rio de Janeiro during Rock in Rio II, January 18 - 27.

## CRIA February figures paint dismal picture

The latest Canadian recording industry statistics are, in a word, disheartening. Overall, sales figures were down 17% from January while total shipments were down 27%. However, these figures may not necessarily reflect a trend for the coming months as several incidents can be cited as part of the problem.

One major element to be considered is the effect that the loss of A&A stores has had on retail business. "here we have the country's largest retailer severely downsized and I think that has had quite an effect on these figures", says Brian Robertson, President of the Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA), "I don't think it's the the whole story but it has certainly contributed to the problem." It may be too early to tell if there is a serious sales problem in Canada or if this is just the adverse reaction to losing 25% of the retail capacity.

Our tax system may be another factor that has affected record sales. The GST may have initially hindered buying patterns for many Canadians in the early part of the year. "We (the industry) tend to think that the GST issue hasn't really had that amount of influence in our business but we don't really know", adds Robertson, "the first few months of this year

have been a sort of volatile period for the business and I think we're going to have to wait and see what's going to happen."

Stan Kulin, President of WEA Canada, isn't that optimistic. With cassette singles down 67% in sales and album cassettes down 39%, he fears this may be an ongoing trend. "There are serious signs that this is probably going to be the worst year in the last ten or eleven for us", says Kulin, "although I do sense some improvement over last month. My guess is that March figures will only be down about 10% (in dollars) from last year." Vinyl products continue to slide into oblivion. LP shipments are down 160% reflecting a decrease in sales of 156% while 7" singles dropped 99% in both shipments and sales. The only positive note is that CD sales are up 11% over January totals. Overall totals for all formats indicate a decrease in shipments of 24% resulting in reduced year-to-date sales of 13%.

Robertson is hopeful that figures for March and April will be healthier but, if nothing else, they should certainly be more indicative of what the trend will be for the remainder of the year.

**Where did the Junos start?** Peter Steinmetz, President of CARAS, appearing on the Juno telecast, said it was at the St. Lawrence Centre. On page 43 of the Official 1991 Juno Program, Lisa Finley writes that it was the St. Lawrence Centre. The Feb. 23/91 issue of RPM says it was St. Lawrence Hall, which is not the same place. Finally, I took a look at the March 7/70 issue of RPM, which showed photos of St. Lawrence Hall and the first awards presentation. On page 3, we learn that "In 1850, the St. Lawrence Hall (then the town hall of Toronto) rang out with not much more than a jig, a reel or a polka. On February 23rd, 1970, the same town hall, now restored, was the meeting place of the music industry in Canada when young and old mingled together as part of their Annual Gold Leaf Awards presentation. The party, which was intended to honour the greats of Canada's music industry, later became a tribute to RPM

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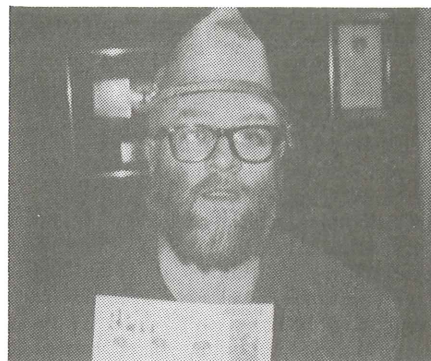
Weekly." So, I think the controversy will go on and on, until we find someone who was there to set the record straight. (EC: Or just rewrite history, which we seem to be very good at...!)

on March 7. The public, including area politicians, media personalities and students challenged one another in the "Loonie per kilometre" fundraiser on available stationary bikes. No-55 was there for live coverage of the event and Narasnek cycled "just over 700 km," says Belfiore, "and after 24 hours, we had raised \$20,000 for the Kidney Foundation," a good start for the \$160,000 goal.

## Simply Majestic promoting dance/rap talent

Anthony Bond, spokesperson for dance/rap producing team, Simply Majestic, dropped by RPM's offices recently to provide an introduction to the concept.

He explains, "We are a group of producers who are looking to highlight Canadian dance/rap producers and artists. There is a large talent pool out there that hasn't been tapped into yet, and we want to open the door to them for exposure."

Simply Majestic has been signed to a distribution deal with Capitol for just over a year and a half. Their first release, *Dance To The Music* by B. Kool, won them a Juno this year in the category of Best R&B/Soul Recording.

As a follow-up to the B.Kool single, Simply Majestic is releasing *Play The Music D.J.*, which features Frank Morrell, a production by Brothers In The Ghetto. As well, Simply Majestic will be releasing a compilation of 14 dance and rap artists entitled *We United To Do This*, hopefully by spring.

To amass talent for the *We United To Do This* project Simply Majestic conducted an extensive Rap Search. Three of those artists will be given a spot on the compilation. Various Canadian dance/rap experts lent a helping hand to judge the entries.

"This compilation will bring 14 artists to the attention of the world," says Bond. "And to

let them know that we have much more than that."

Having spent a good part of his career in New York, Bond is acutely aware of the repressed nature of the Canadian dance genre, but he is confident that the avenues will develop to deliver the talent to the public.

"Maestro-West sells 150,000 albums, Vanilla Ice and MC Hammer 750,000 each... Simply Majestic looks at it this way," says Bond, "if these artists can sell like that here, who is going to be the first Canadian artist, dance or rap, to go to 750,000? That's what everybody's trying to capture right now."

Simply Majestic are supporters of the Committee For Dance Music Radio (CFDMR), but stress that, unlike some, they are not in favour of racial differentiation (which the CFDMR doesn't support either).

"Canada doesn't need a black this, or a white that," states Bond. "We need a dance music station that will support everything."

Bond also suggests that Canadian television should concentrate more on highlighting Canadians who are helping to build the genre, and to increase exposure of the efforts being made. "A lot of people have to be educated about what time it is."

Simply Majestic has been around for five years, and it credits Daniel Caudeiron of the Cheer Pool in Toronto and Capitol A&R Director Tim Trombley with supporting their move into the spotlight.

Bond admits there is much work to be done in Canada; production teams need to learn more about the genre to eliminate the stigma that Canadian dance/rap artists can't sound or look good.

In conclusion, Bond suggests that "What we have to do is come up with good songs that will stand up to any American act. We need the right record labels to find the groups and the

## Massey Hall date firmed for Warner Music's Isaak

Reprise recording artist (Warner Music) Chris Isaak has been firmed for Toronto's Massey Hall (May 3), a presentation of Concert Productions International (CPI) and rbi Productions in association with Coca Cola Classic.

Isaak has made it to "hit" status in Canada, where his *Heart Shaped World* album has moved past the gold plateau. Unlike his previous two albums, *Silverstone* (1985) and *Chris Isaak* (1987), *Heart Shaped World* is being fueled by a hit single, *Wicked Game*. Ironically, this track was actually recorded over two years ago for the album, and was included as an instrumental track in David Lynch's film, *Wild At Heart*.

A chance playing of the track by an Atlanta dee-jay, sparked much local interest which spread throughout radio in both Canada and the U.S. His album has broken the Top 10 of the RPM 100 after 17 weeks of charting. His next release is entitled *Don't Make Me Dream About You*.

**A new No. 1.** Gloria Estefan's *Coming Out Of The Dark* finally replaces Mariah Carey's *Someday* at the top of the Hit Tracks chart. *Someday* held that position for four weeks. *Coming Out Of The Dark* is only the second song to top the chart for Estefan. Their first release, *Conga*, did so in 1986.

**The Doors nearing the top...** The soundtrack to the *Doors* movie inches up to No. 9. That's the highest position for a soundtrack since *Pretty Woman* hit No. 2 last July. What was the last soundtrack to top the Albums chart?

**Breaking the trend!** The *Doors* soundtrack is also one of five albums in the Top 40 that have not had one song on the Hit Tracks chart. The others are: Peter Gabriel's *Shaking the tree* (No. 25), *The Dream Warriors' And Now The Legacy Begins* (No. 34), *Harry Connick Jr.'s We Are In Love* (No. 35), and *George Thorogood's Boogie People* (No. 36).

**Good start for Stewart.** Both the album and first release from Rod Stewart's *Vagabond Heart* are doing very well. *Rhythm Of My Heart* climbs into the Top 10 from last week's 17. The album, in its second week, has the biggest jump on the chart this week. It climbs 30 places to No. 28.

**C + C = \$ C** + C Music Factory's *Here We Go*, the second release from their *Gonna Make You Sweat* album, top the Dance chart, after debuting at No. 2 last week. It has also crossed over to other audiences. *Here We Go* makes the biggest gain on the Hit Tracks chart, 21 places to No. 71. The album is also doing extremely well, this week at No. 6.

**The top three spots** on the Hit Tracks chart belong to female or female fronted artists for the second week in a row. Gloria Estefan tops the chart with *Mariah Carey* and *Wilson Phillips* right behind. Ironically, the last time that happened, in September of last year, *Wilson Phillips* and *Mariah Carey* were both involved as well. They were one-two and *Janet Jackson* held the No. 3 spot.

**European invasion...** They're coming from Germany, Scotland, Sweden, the U.K., and all over Europe. Of the Top 10 songs on the Hit Tracks chart, five are from European artists.

**R.E.M. taking off...** R.E.M.'s *Out Of Time* is rocketing up the Albums chart. In just its third week, it has hit No. 10. The first release from the album, *Losing My Religion*, bullets to No. 30. It is the band's third Top 40 song. *Stand* is their biggest hit. It peaked at No. 8 in 1989.

**The last one!** The last soundtrack to top the Albums chart was *Batman*. It topped the chart for one week in August of 1989.

## Management at Sony Going Enviro - Mental

Sony Music continues to tackle the problem of environmental waste. Over the past six months, their ecological awareness program has been paying off not only for the environment but for the economy as well.

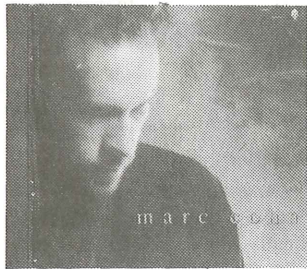
In the fall of 1990, Sony began recycling jewel boxes and cassette library cases for reuse in their plant and found a substantial saving by reclaiming the units. In addition, the program has created so much work that an additional staff member had to be hired. The project also saves money on the company's overall disposal costs.

The program doesn't stop there however; Sony has now committed completely to the project, recycling computer paper, using 100% recycled tissue and paper in all washrooms, arranging for safe disposal of toxic waste from the printing department, using water based inks in the stickering machine and only purchasing non-toxic and environmentally friendly office supplies. Each office in the building is also equipped with a blue box. In the future, Sony will continue to use office supplies which are made from recycled material and switch to environmentally friendly products as they become available in the marketplace.

The program is national in scope and involves Sony's branches and offices across Canada. The message they are sending is clear; with Ontario residents discarding 7,000,000 tons of garbage a year, the time has never been more crucial to start practising the 3 R's; Reduce, Re-use, Recycle.

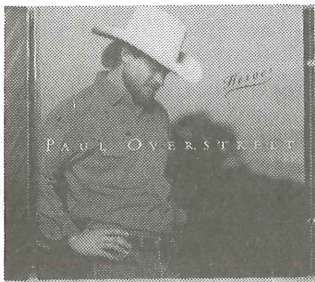

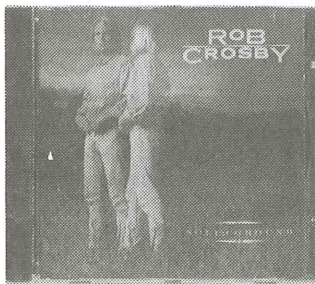
**MARK COHN** - Pop/Soul

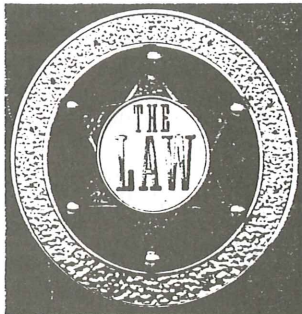

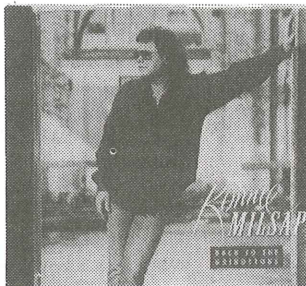

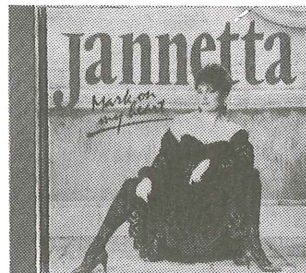

## Veronique Belliveau tapes Special on mts Pegasus

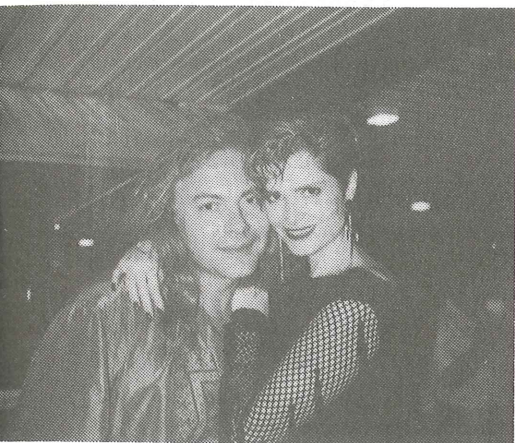

Sharing the billing are Daniel Lanois, The Groove, Murray McLauchlan, Oscar nominee Graham Greene, along with Gary Farmer (Pow Wow Highway), Tantoo Cardinal (Dances With Wolves), Native Earth's Tomson Highway, Ojibway playwright Drew Taylor and Herbie Barnes.

Also on the bill are Tom Jackson, who will perform with Winnipeg's Shingoose; 7th Fire, the six piece native rap band from Ottawa; Gujawa, a Haida traditional singer and drummer; Lorraine Segato, Loreena McKennett with songs from Parallel Dreams, and two throat singers from kuujuaapik. A number of surprise guests are also expected.

The Royal Alexandra's stage has already been set up for the production of Dry Lips Oughta Move To Kapuskasing, which will remain intact, and offer an interesting, but relative dimension to The Concert. This is Rooney's third production at the Royal Alexandra. "The lineup is terrific," says Rooney, "and every person on it has something to say about the environment, about the need for action... it's fitting that Earth Day in Toronto is being celebrated by Canadian artists honouring the 50 Chiefs, Elders, and Shamans, who will be speaking earlier that day at Queens Park."

The Concert is part of a three-day festival known as Project Indigenous Restoration

(PIR), which begins with a traditional 6 am, sunrise ceremony at Toronto's Queen's Park. Native speakers, representing indigenous peoples from the Amazon to the Arctic, will take part in the all-day event.

The next day, the 50 Elders, Chiefs and traditional teachers will spend the day in elementary and secondary schools throughout Toronto and surrounding area. Workshops, films, and displays will also be set up at the Ontario Science Centre. The final day (23) a three-part public forum will be held at the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education (OISE).

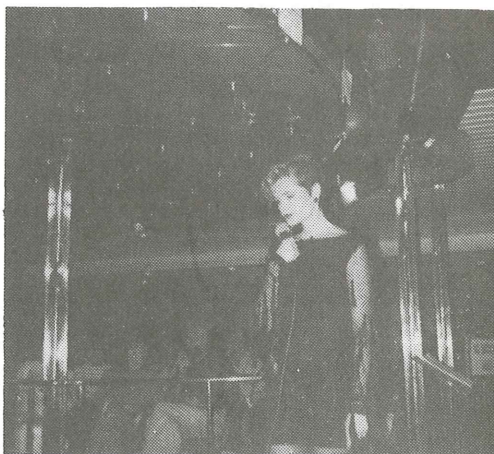

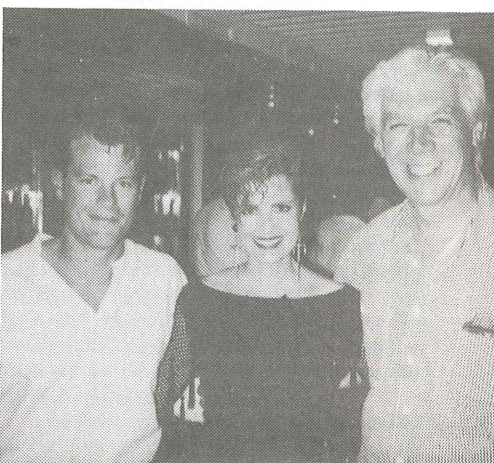
The special will air across Canada in November with the possibility of a second showing in the future.

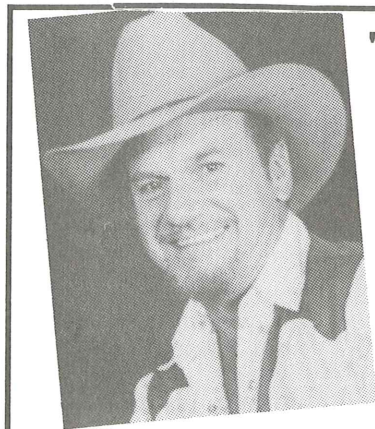
