The Bryan Adams Waking Up The World Tour was launched with sell-out dates in Belfast and Dublin. Eight UK dates followed: Whitely Bay, two dates in Sheffield, three in London, two in Birmingham, then on to the continent.

Lee Aaron's Attic album certified gold in Canada

Lee Aaron's new album, *Some Girls Do*, has attained gold status in Canada after only five weeks of release. The album is currently bulleting up the RPM 100.

The first single and video from the album, *Sex With Love*, is also enjoying good chart action across Canada.

Aaron is currently working on a video for the album's title track, due for release Nov. 18. The video is being directed by Don Allen. On completion of the shoot, Aaron will complete the eastern leg of her cross-Canada tour and then head for Germany for a 20-date concert tour.

CARAS chooses five for Entertainer of the Year

The Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (CARAS) announced the following nominees for Canadian Entertainer of the Year: Bryan Adams, Blue Rodeo, Celine Dion, Colin James and the Tragically Hip.

This fifth annual "People's Choice" Juno Award, sponsored by Molson Breweries, will be presented to the performer or group voted the most popular by fans across the country.

The nominating process starts with the creation of a long list of 150 nominees selected by CARAS members. Representatives of Canada's entertainment media from across the country were then asked to participate in the selection of a short list of five nominees. Molson Breweries, primary corporate sponsor of CARAS, will co-ordinate the national distribution of ballots through record outlets, newspaper and magazine advertisements and all major Molson Canadian Rocks concert events.

The award will be presented during the Juno Awards ceremonies, telecast live on the CBC, Sunday, March 29, 1992 between 9 and 11 p.m. from the O'Keefe Centre in Toronto.

Increase in retail orders a sign of cautious optimism

The President of the Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA), Brian Robertson, says he's not ready to throw a party for one good month of retail figures.

Industry statistics show a 17% increase in the number of CD and cassette orders from retail outlets for the month of September. "There was a lot of product ordered and I'm cautiously optimistic that there won't be a lot of returns, but you can't predict anything in this business. It's still a very volatile market and a recession hangover is still out there."

Robertson attributes the September increase to a lot of superstar product, like Guns N' Roses and Prince, being released around the same time. "I wasn't surprised that it was a good month, the challenge will be to keep those figures up through to the Christmas season."

Classic jazz recordings set to be released on Denon

Denon Canada is set to release the first 40 titles of the historic Savoy jazz catalogue. Savoy was the leading advocate of the be-bop style of jazz from the mid-forties to the end of the fifties.

The list of artists who recorded on the label reads like a "who's who" of modern jazz. Charlie Parker, Miles Davis, John Coltrane, Dizzy Gillespie, Stan Getz, Max Roach and Art Pepper.

Nippon Columbia, Denon Canada's parent company, purchased the Savoy catalogue outright from Muse Records in New York earlier this year and immediately began a program to restore and reissue these jazz classics. Fragile lacquer masters have been used for the source material for a digital remastering process that included noise reduction. Great care, however, was taken to ensure that the original "live" sound was not altered. The net results were transferred to compact disc and packaged with their original artwork and liner notes intact.

Denon Canada's music division is the distributor for the Denon label, CBC Records, Marquis Music, Varese Sarabande, Dark Light, Rykodisc - Hannibal and Silva Screen.

New Air Farce album to cap hectic year


Attic Records has set Nov. 4 as the release date for the Royal Canadian Air Farce's new album, *Farce On A Stick (Stick Not Included)*, the comedy team's fifth such release. The album release will actually herald the group's 18th anniversary which will be celebrated with a Dec. 6 performance at Toronto's Massey Hall. The show will be the group's fourth consecutive birthday appearance at the famous hall, featuring the annual original cast reunion of Roger Abbott, Don Ferguson, Luba Goy and John Morgan with former partner Dave Broadfoot, who left the group in May 1988.

Continuing the Air Farce's birthday wish, fans who like to bring gifts are encouraged to bring non-perishable food, which will be presented, together with a portion of the box office proceeds, to Metro Toronto's Daily Bread Food Bank. When this policy was first adapted two years ago (1989), the Air Farce's audience contributed 789 pounds of food. Last year's audience brought in 4,728 pounds, an indication of the power of this outstanding Canadian comedy group.

The Massey Hall performances will be recorded for national broadcast on the CBC Radio networks, plus Radio Canada International, the Canadian Forces Network, and Minnesota Public Radio. The shows will be heard Saturdays (Dec. 7 and 14) at 10:35 am on CBC Stereo 94.1 FM and Sundays (Dec. 8 and 15) at 1:08 pm on CBC Radio 740 AM.

The new album will feature 16 tracks of the most-requested sketches from the 1990/91 radio season, totalling more than an hour of comedy. The original cast is on board along with guest performances by Broadfoot and Barbara Budd.

The Dec. 6 Massey Hall date winds up yet another year of coast-to-coast dates which included such major centres as Edmonton, Winnipeg, San Francisco and Detroit, plus many smaller markets including Pembroke, Banff, Brantford and Blyth.

Sony Classical signs Toronto's Tafelmusik

Toronto's period instrument orchestra, Tafelmusik, has been signed to a long-term exclusive recording contract with Sony Classical. The signing took place in New York (Oct. 11) with Sony Classical President Guenther Breetz and Tafelmusik General Manager Ottie Lockey.

The contract seals what is described as "an unprecedented commitment" to as many as 20 compact discs over a two-year period.

Toronto area press and retailers were treated to a sneak preview of the initial Vivarte label releases (Oct. 30). Nov. 4 is the official release date.

The first four releases are Tafelmusik's first collaborations with well-known conductor Bruno Weil under the musical direction of Jeanne Lamon in four recordings as a tribute to Mozart.

Mozart Overtures (SK 46695) includes what is described as "fresh, inspired performances" of the favourite overtures plus an added bonus of Mozart's Eine Kleine Nachtmusik, recorded in Ludwigsburg, Germany last May.

Rhino Records releases an ambitious box set

Feeling down, need a little inspiration? How about JFK's inaugural address to pick you up? Feeling paranoid? How about listening to Richard's Nixon's '62 concession speech or his '74 resignation speech?

These nuggets, along with others, comprise 70 key excerpts from the greatest speeches and events compiled on Rhino Records four CD or cassette box set entitled, Great Speeches of the 20th Century.

The box set is divided into four categories: political speeches, events in history, topical & controversial and inspirational. Such notable speeches and events include: Nixon's Checkers speech, the first recorded message on Edison's phonograph, Neil Armstrong's moon landing and Babe Ruth and Alan Freed's farewells to their fans.

The set includes a booklet that features extensive liner notes that provide background information on each speech.

(SK 46696) was recorded in Kitchener/Waterloo Ontario's Centre-In-The-Square. Also completed in the same theatre by Tafelmusik and Weil, was a special Mozart project, a two-disc set of Six Symphonies after Serenades (SK 47260). The Kitchener/Waterloo venue is considered one of the best, acoustically sound theatres in Canada. Both recordings were completed earlier this year.

As well, and to celebrate the Mozart Year, Sony Classical has recorded an opera, which was a precursor to Mozart's popular Don Giovanni - Giuseppe Gazzaniga's (1743-1818) Don Giovanni (SK 46693). The opera was recorded in June of 1990 at Doopsgezinde Gemeente Kerk, Haarlem, the Netherlands, and features Douglas Johnson and Carlo Allemano, tenors, Ferruccio Furlanetto, bass, Luciana Serra and Elzbieta Szmytka, sopranos, members of the Stuttgart Kammerchor and the Tafelmusik Baroque Orchestra with Bruno Weil conducting. The opera is recorded without recitatives on one

disc and is packaged with full libretto in a colourful slipcase.

Tafelmusik, a rare orchestra on period instruments, was founded in 1979. Jeanne Lamon took over as Music Director in 1981, and since then, the orchestra has achieved international stature and is considered one of the best in its field. Tafelmusik's recording of Boccherini won a Juno Award in 1989 as Best Classical Album, Large Ensemble.

Award-winning producer Wolf Erichson, who has worked with Tafelmusik on recent projects, oversees the production of the Vivarte recordings.

In May of this year Tafelmusik also recorded Gluck's Orpheus and Euridice with the Stuttgart Chamber Choir under its conductor Frieder Bernius. Featured are Michael Chance and Nancy Argenta. Also in the works for the orchestra are Handel's Concerti Grossi and Vivaldi's Four Seasons featuring Music Director Lamon as violin soloist. Next year, Tafelmusik have pencilled in sessions for works by Haydn, Gluck and Vivaldi.

Songwriter winners for Scarborough Arts Council

The Scarborough Arts Council has announced the winners of its third annual Songwriters Competition. The winners in the Country and Any Style categories were selected from a large number of entries from areas throughout Ontario.

Lindsay Thomas Morgan of Kitchener won the Country category for his entry of Flowers. Morgan, well-known in country music, is currently charting with Love Is, taken from his self-titled Spyder album. The track is included on RDR Country Pak No. 4.

In the Any Style category, Doug Billard and Beverley Golden-Billard of Thornhill won for A Different World.

Honourable Mentions went to Colleen Peterson for Another Day Begins and Cyril Rawson for Two Steps At A Time. Peterson, no stranger to the charts, is currently living and

recording in Nashville. Rawson, a native of Peterborough, and a leading writer in country music, won the Scarborough Arts Council award in 1989.

Kim Kawamura, a grade 13 student at Toronto's Woburn Collegiate, was the Youth category winner for her entry of Moving On.

Adult winners receive 24 hours of studio time, and a bursary from the Arts Council goes to the Youth winner. The competition was open to all ages and all musical styles with the intent of stimulating the art of songwriting.

This year's judges were Jack Feeney, Director Emeritus of the Canadian Country Music Association (CCMA), Scott Richards, former Vice President and General Manager MCA Records and now lecturing at the Harris Institute for the Arts in Toronto, and RPM's Walt Grealis.

CMPA names winners of Song of the Year Awards

The Canadian Music Publishers Association (CMPA) has announced the winners of the 1990 Song of the Year Awards.

In the Rock category Lawrence Gowan and Eddie Schwartz were the winners for writing All The Lovers In The World. Recorded by Gowan, the track, released as a single, peaked at No. 6 on Sept. 15. The track is included on Gowan's Columbia album Lost Brotherhood. First Runner-Up was She Ain't Pretty, written by Bryan Potvin and recorded by Northern Pikes. The second Runner-Up was the penning of Watcha Do To My Body by Lee Aaron and John Albani. The track was recorded by Aaron.

Every Little Tear, written and recorded by Paul Janz, was the winning entry in the Adult Contemporary/Pop category. The track, which is included on Janz's Renegade Romance released on the A&M label, peaked at No. 5 on the RPM Hit Tracks (Apr. 14/90). The First Runner-Up was Jane Child's Don't Wanna Fall In Love, recorded by Child. The Second Runner-Up was Jay Semko's penning of Girl With A Problem, recorded by Northern Pikes.

In the Country category, George Fox's penning of Lime Rickey was the winner. The song was recorded by Fox, and is included on his WEA album With All My Might. The single peaked at No. 10 (Aug. 18/90) on the RPM Country 100. The First Runner-Up was Fox's Bachelor Girl. The Second Runner-Up was Tim Taylor's penning of Hello Again, which he recorded.

Let Your Backbone Slide won the Alternative category. Written by Anthony Davis, Peter Davis and Wes Williams, the song was recorded by Maestro Fresh-Wes. The track was included on Attic's Symphony In Effect album. The single peaked at No. 10 (Mar. 31/91) on the RPM 100 Hits Tracks. The First Runner-Up was Drop The Needle, another Maestro Fresh-Wes single, Drop The Needle, written by the same team as the winning song. The Second Runner-Up was Moe Berg's She's So Young, recorded by Pursuit Of Happiness.

Just arguing about how long a "king for life" should reign. (EC: *I bet there are a lot of people who think you're kidding!!!*) Just talking about "how to win friends and influence people."

About that Charlie and Di gala . . . ! What turned out to be the best kept secret, should have remained that way. The federal government-sponsored gala for the Royals in Ottawa was what one record person called "a national disgrace." Howcum they had to bring, at public expense, that bunch of no talent Canadians, who are living in Hollywood, to be representative of the best we have in Canada's entertainment field. Maybe Bryan Adams wasn't available and maybe Anne Murray and Bruce Cockburn

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were on tour, but come on . . . give me a break. Just look at the charts and you don't have to be too bright to discover who would put on a dynamite show. The only saving factor was the performance by Celine Dion. Leonard Rambeau, who was in the audience, tells me Celine was the star of the show. She communicated an honest and humble feeling of wanting to be there. She was performing, because she really wanted to, and that's a professional plus. Too bad there weren't more Celine Dions. It must have been tough to have been the only, non-egotistical performer. (EC: *At public expense . . . all the way from Hollywood yet . . . !*) It seems we were spared even more expense, however. Several other ex-patriate hacks were apparently approached, but they declined because they reportedly wouldn't take part in a concert, even a command performance, that our beloved Prime Minister was involved in. (EC: *What disappointed me was that he didn't even do a duet with David Foster. I guess there wasn't enough room on stage for both of them . . . !*)

That community spirit . . . ! My deep trough in Ottawa/Hull tells me there's concern at the CRTC about the possibility of more than a couple of radio stations turning in their licences. They aren't the one-owner variety . . . the stations that are drawing concern belong to a chain, with another chain in the wings. (EC: *They've experienced it in the record business. Bigger isn't necessarily better . . . and a lot of great talent bites the dust . . . !*)

Is there a message there . . . ? After 24 years, a farewell party with a cash bar . . . ? You gotta be kidding. (EC: *That's the American way . . . !*)

A nice touch . . . ! After Anne Murray's Thursday concert at Toronto's O'Keefe, Balmur and Capitol had a little "say hello to" party for Anne. What a classy affair . . . desserts, and lots of them, mineral water and tea or coffee. One observer, whose nose tells me he likes the booze-type of parties, told me on his way out, 'that's the first record party I remember walking away from.' (EC: *There's a message there wouldn't you say . . . ?*) By the way, I've been told that Anne had been invited to five functions for the Royals, but had to decline because of the pressure of touring. Don't go away. How's this for some good time news? Anne's five dates at the O'Keefe attracted an audience of 13,986 out of a possible 16,115, which works out to 87 percent. Tickets ranged from \$23.00 to \$39.00 plus the 7 percent GST. The five days grossed \$470,534.64 Canadian. (EC: *Would you expect them to pay her in yen?*)

I got so excited over the new Liona Boyd album, I mentioned in my review that Something Special, a Liona Boyd original which had been recorded by Kimberly Richards, was on the album. It's not. It should have been. It's too late. (EC: *Is that a retraction . . . ?*)

Celine Dion is hitbound . . . ! It's not very often that I'll go out on a limb, but the blood, sweat and tears, that went into the making of Celine Dion is about to pay off. Celine's new single, *Beauty And The Beast*, a duet with Peabo Bryson, has hit written all over it, to borrow a well-used phrase. In fact, I don't have to borrow

that well-used phrase. Listen to it, this Canadian is on a roll . . . big time! (EC: *Yeah! Big time?*)

Great stuff from Peter Howell . . . ! I've never enjoyed the Toronto Star more since Peter Howell helped shed the "navel gazing" image of some of his former entertainment writers. He latches onto some real meaty stuff. His coverage of the battle between Bob Seger and Rod Stewart over who had the rights first, to Tom Waits' *Downtown Train*, was exceptional. There's lots going on in the industry, and obviously Howell has some pretty heavy connections. (EC: *That's what counts . . . connections!*)

Have you noticed . . . ? In Quebec, Coca-Cola uses Quebec artists, while in the rest of the country they use foreigners. (EC: *Hey! With free trade now being extended to Mexico, watch out . . . !*)

What's a Juno worth . . . ? I read in the paper that the original Genie Award had been stolen. It was valued at \$200,000. My question is: what would the original Juno Award be worth . . . in view of the fact that the Junos were the original awards? (EC: *Whose idea was it to rate these awards in the first place???*)

The RPM Cup is safe . . . ! How much is the RPM Cup worth? Remember, one year it was cupnapped and found on the top of a lamp post in Ottawa? 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

Adams duel No. 1s! Can't Stop This Thing We Started becomes the first song in over ten years to drop out of the No. 1 spot and then regain it. It also gives Bryan Adams the top song and album in the same week. He is only the third person to accomplish that this year. Sting turned the trick back in March and Madonna had both No. 1s in February for one week each. Last year, three artists (Wilson Phillips, Sinead O'Connor, and Phil Collins) had both the top song and album a total of 11 weeks.

Top Canadian already? Four months ago Bryan Adams still hadn't had a No. 1 song in Canada. Now he has held the No. 1 position for more weeks than any other Canadian. Can't Stop This Thing should hold on for at least one more week. That would mean Adams will have held the No. 1 position a total of 12 weeks, which would be enough to move him into eighth place on the list of artists holding the top spot the most number of weeks. Name the Canadian who has had the most No. 1 songs.

Almost a top add tie... It was very close, but Keep Coming Back from Richard Marx narrowly edged out Genesis' No Son Of Mine to get the top entry this week. Keep Coming Back debuts at No. 36. That's only one spot higher than No Son Of Mine. Both are the first releases from new albums. Not to be ignored is the new release from The Grapes Of Wrath, You May Be Right. It also has a very high entry at No. 51.

Hard to pronounce, easy to like. The combination of Zucchero and Paul Young have this week's biggest jump on the Hit Tracks chart. Senza Una Donna (Without A Woman) climbs 35 spots to No. 34. Zucchero (pronounced Zoo-care-oh) may be a stranger to the charts, but Paul Young certainly isn't. He hit the top in 1985 with Every Time You Go Away and just last year he reached No. 4 with a remake of Oh Girl.

Commitments up again. The Commitments soundtrack originally peaked at No. 15 a few weeks ago solely on the strength of the movie. Now radio is giving various tracks exposure. As a result, the soundtrack moves up to No. 6.

Snowbird wasn't one of them! The Canadian who has hit No. 1 more times than any other is Anne Murray. She has reached the top five times so far (Cotton Jenny, Danny's Song, Love Song, You Needed Me, and I Just Fall In Love Again). The Guess Who had four No. 1 songs. Blood, Sweat & Tears, Corey Hart, Gordon Lightfoot, and Paul Anka all have three.

and Ted Templeman (Van Halen, Doobie Brothers) have produced previous Suite albums and tracks. Now, in a collaboration with Paul Northfield, (Rush, Queensryche) the band has just released its fourth studio album, Monsters Under The Bed.

Suite keyboardist, Ray Coburn, explained how the band came to work with Northfield. "We wanted to produce it ourselves but it is good to have an outside ear. But we didn't want too many people around because then you can have "the too many cooks" syndrome. But Paul was available and totally sympathetic to our needs and was open to co-producing it with us, so everything worked out great."

Monster was recorded at Le Studio in Morin Heights, just outside of Montreal, which was perfect for the bands' needs as there were no distractions and they got most of the recording completed in two months.

Standard makes bid for Edmonton stations

Standard Broadcast has made a bid to acquire two more Alberta radio stations. The announcement was made jointly by Gary Slaight, President Standard Radio and Robert P. Lovell, Public Relations Manager Electrohome Limited.

"An agreement in principle" has reportedly been reached, "subject to CRTC approval and definitive legal documentation," for the sale of Electrohome Limited's Edmonton radio stations CFRN (AM 1260) and CJKE FM to Standard Radio Inc., a wholly-owned subsidiary of Standard Broadcasting Corporation Limited.

Standard had, on Sept. 6, announced the acquisition, again, subject to CRTC approval, of Calgary radio stations CFCN (AM 106) and CJAY FM, from Maclean Hunter Limited (RPM - Sept. 21/91).

Standard Radio owns and operates seven radio stations in Ontario and Quebec and apparently, has been planning expansion into Western Canada for some time.

An application to the CRTC is to be filed in November. A public hearing is expected early next year.

However, this time out, the Suite will be playing Canada first on their Monsters tour. "We've usually wound playing the States and Canada back and forth. But this time, I think, we'll be starting out East and going right across Canada to the west coast," Dee said.

As for the actual touring itself, the band says it can't wait to get back in front of a live audience again. "Playing live is the ultimate buzz for us," Dee said. "We've played all kinds of places. Playing clubs is fun, because it's intimate but then we've played places like the Calgary Saddledome which is also fun because it's a big audience. I'm just looking forward to getting out there, because it's been a long two years getting this album together and we're ready to rock."

Like it was . . . like it is . . . sixties vs nineties

Back in the mid-sixties, Top 40 radio was a rarity. And why not? It was targeted at kids. There was a lot more money to be made serving the older demographics. In many markets Top 40 was actually Top 100 plus whatever else the jock felt like playing or doing at the time. Yes, jocks could actually make choices! The foundation of Top 40 was based on hits and personalities, not necessarily in that order.

Underground FM was still a few years away and even when it did arrive, was essentially a trial balloon sent up by station owners who couldn't make a dime playing 200-year-old music performed by 100-year-old musicians. Nice tunes, but who could pronounce them? It was either Franz Schubert's piano sonata Op. Post., D. 959 or the Fugs.

Meanwhile, Bill Drake, an American programming pioneer, implemented essentially a music format that would, in the shortest period of time, get the most popular records on the air the most often. This was the first high rotation format. The personalities at his client stations, by the way, were still doing what they did best and were jamming in what were the forerunners of elemental formatics . . . the calls, scripted liners, jock i.d.'s and the like. Then, when the most creative minds in the business got wind of

what Drake was doing (granted with some spectacular initial results), they did what a number of creative minds in this business have been doing for years . . . they tried to copy him.

They tried to bake a Drake-Cake. And they left out the yeast. (i.e. the personalities) And their cakes did not rise. And, with the exception of outfits who can dedicate massive promo funds, they haven't been able to get past cumes for 25 years. Lousy quarter hours. Lousy hours tuned. Pancakes. No maple syrup. Flat, empty and tasteless . . . filling for a while (maybe three decent books) but the body (audience) was starving. Yet, performers persisted in doing some exciting things on the radio and there were opportunities as the stations still continued to break after every tune. However, by the late seventies, programmers had discovered no-talk sweeps and the bell tolled . . . again.

I think it's important to remind the reader that these formatics were implemented for the express purpose of generating some ballot returns and thus some saleable cumes from a target audience of 12-25 with heavy weighting 12-18. All over, programmers were attempting to build hit-machines with heavy emphasis on "machine". They Just Cranked. Formatic Pyrotechnics. And Gawd help anyone who didn't grease the machine . . . or sound like one. P.D.'s approached their stations like products rather than services. And that, friends, was the first time the bell tolled. But the control room monitor

was up SOOO loud, we failed to hear the ringing. This was, in hindsight, still a lot of fun. Man, we were rockin'.

Still, the programmers continued to weed out the humanity and spontaneity in favour of more highly-valued pure content elements. I would know. Twenty years ago I was one of those programmers. I too, began to experience anything my guys said that was outside of the format as; inappropriate. That understanding was consistent with the industry standard, my boss and official research. Survey says . . . "Shut your hole and play the hits." What a bind! As a performer, I wanted to "talk dirty and play the hits." as a P.D. I had to shut me up. What to do? Intuitively, I knew. I got out of the P.D. business and stayed with show business. I carried those conflicting positions around with me for another ten years until I found what I believe is a vast middle ground; a middle ground where the talent can perform; a middle ground where a station's need to hold a significant share of audience can be enhanced, while satisfying a P.D.'s requirement for some formatic integrity. This middle ground lies in the realm of communication. (Hey, for a communications business, there sure ain't a lot of communicatin' goin' on'. I heard that some place.)

Now, here's the rub. Offered with the understanding and respect of a colleague who has had the experience, I put it to any jock, writer or programmer that; it is your individual responsibility to find and learn more effective ways of communicating to your audience. Do you really want to be an effective communicator? Then, stop your bitching and go learn something. Challenge the very basics of how you do what you do . . . not in the context of acceptability in the industry, but what may be acceptable to your audience. Go ahead, experience your own responses. It ain't fatal.

Consider; we have been programming our radio stations with the same communication model and formatics that were originally introduced to influence children. And I rush to point out, they only worked for a little while.

Show me a radio station that plays the most music, has the least talk, plays less commercials and I'll show you a radio station going into the tank.

Today, any station that programs exclusively with these elements, if it hasn't already, runs the risk of being blown up at any time. It's happened, it's happening.

Meanwhile, owners and managers continue to look for the hold in the market that will give their station the "edge". And they continue to look through glasses labelled "music". Too bad. I could come into any market on my turnip truck to any station in town and within 25 minutes be up against any station I choose. There goes their "hole". There goes their "format". There goes their "edge". There goes their "market share". And, since so many stations have fallen into the tar pit called "The Most Music", there goes the market share that radio in general enjoyed

compared to other advertising media. Show me a radio station that plays the most music, has the least talk, plays less commercials and I'll show you a radio station going into the tank.

I have never been involved with a successful radio station that didn't play the least music, have the most commercials and the most talk, ever. Yet, we live and die by the music. The most music. The best rock. The perfect mix. Blah, blah, blah. Besides, how many times does Stairway To Heaven need to be auditorium-tested to figure out it's probably okay to play the thing. As I've said before: Blessed Be The Research.

There are thousands of people outside of this business who are working on communication right now, not as a corollary to or a part of pure technology, but as a human psychology. The study of communicating may be a grand development in learning to appreciate the potential for people to reach and affect responses from other people. For us in the communications' business, there may be opportunities to go beyond innocuous repetitive babble, attempts at direct suggestions and authoritarian commands. I can listen to any radio station and immediately identify all of those elements, and it ain't pretty.

Now, with apologies to Bill Drake, who, within the context of what he was doing, had a great thing going, I am suggesting that maybe it's time for us in this industry to grow up and start taking responsibility for our own behaviours and the results they generate. That's right. Grow up. The audience did. Oppenheimer may have built the bomb, but at least he said he was sorry.


THE JOHNER BROTHERS - Country


JAMES TAYLOR - Pop

CKBY morning personality Mark Papousek made the grand prize draw to see who would get to meet Brooks, enjoy front row seats, limo to and from the show, a complete Garth Brooks CD library, and a \$200 gift certificate from a leather goods store. PD Ted Daigle reports that "the wave of Garthmania" began in the nation's capital Sept. 11 when 300 Country 105 CKBY listeners were invited to an exclusive Garth Brooks Ropin' The Wind release party. They heard Brooks' platinum-shipped album, three days before it was released in Canada. The invitees left the party with a limited edition, two song cassette sampler of Ropin' The Wind.

Straight Clean & Simple have a new CD release titled Iron Lady. Old Pine Tree has been taken as the next single from the Roy Warhurst produced album engineered by Robert Bartlett. Iron Lady will be released as a 7" vinyl single in the US. The CD will be released in Europe on the Koch label through a deal the Hussar, Alberta band signed this past summer. A tour of Europe followed from Sept. 24 through Oct. 7. Saddlestone Records of Surrey, B.C. distributes in Canada.

Brad Bailley, a Swan Hills, Alberta native, will shortly make his debut with Leaves On The Ground, released on the ATI label. The single, one of four recorded at Edmonton's Beta Sound Recorders, was produced by Gary Koliger. Release date has been set as Dec. 27. Says ATI head honcho Scoot Irwin, "this is the best song I've heard in years. If a major doesn't pick it up, they have no ears."

Travis Tritt, winner of this year's Horizon Award from Nashville's CMA, will perform in concert at The Palladium, Toronto's newest

showplace, on Nov. 13. Tritt is considered by many as country's fastest-rising star. Anymore, taken from his second Warner Bros album, It's All About To Change, moves up to the No. 2 from No. 12 this week on the RPM Country 100.

The single, which moves up to No. 24 on the RPM Country 100 this week, was taken from their new RCA album Everybody Knows. During the latter part of October, the band was scheduled to play Coyote Sam's in Calgary, Cook County in Lethbridge and Edmonton's Cook County. They open the November leg of their Western tour at the Grande Prairie's Golden Inn (1-2), followed by the Northwoods Inn, Fort. St. John (3), Prince George's Cadillac Ranch (4), Kelowna's Splash's (5), Vancouver's 86 Street (6), Tiffany's in Penticton (7), the Ballroom of Regina's Centre of the Arts (13), Saskatoon's Broadway Theatre (14), and Le Rendezvous in Winnipeg (15).

Michael T. Wall, The Singing Newfoundland, hosted his 20th Annual Muscular Dystrophy Benefit Concert (Nov. 3). The setting was the Newfoundland, a popular hangout for Newfielders and for those who wish they were. Edgar Elliott, who hails from Miller Town was on hand waving the Newfoundland flag, as well, the room was awash with some of the best pickers from down home. Also on hand were two famous Newfoundland dogs, Christmas Knight and Crystal.

Hank Snow will be in print soon. The colourful country music legend has written his autobiography, which zeros in on his Nova Scotia roots. He also mentions his connection with Elvis Presley, which has been kept secret all these years. Apparently, Snow operated a talent agency with Presley's manager Colonel Tom Parker in the '50s and Snow has a little bit of a revelation about this association. The 77-year old Snow promises to "tell all". No publisher information is available at press time.

Wayne Rostad's Storyteller CD is available at all Sam The Record Man stores across Canada. Released on the Stag Creek label, the Joe Turner production comprises 13 Rostad originals. Rostad hosts On The Road Again, a weekly CBC-TV series, that actually takes him on the road and across Canada every two weeks. Wayne and his producer Joe Turner will be in Toronto next week.

Dick Nolan is back! Proud Newfoundland, Dick Nolan, was one of the first from the Island province to make Newfoundland music marketable to the rest of the country. Although he had been kicking around between Corner Brook and Toronto, playing local clubs like the Horseshoe in Toronto, it wasn't until 1967 when he hit the big time, and no one has matched his success since. He hit with an obscure song, titled Aunt Martha's Sheep written by fellow Newfoundland Ellis Coles. Released on the RCA label, the single sold more than 300,000 copies. Nolan is back with a new album titled My Beautiful Island. He shares vocals with Roy and Al Penney, Charlie Crocker and Tom Down. The album (cassette) is distributed by Heritage Music of Scarborough, Ontario.
