



Steinmetz stepping down as President of CARAS

Peter Steinmetz, President of the Canadian Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences (CARAS), has submitted his resignation. "I gave them my notice and I have until the end of 1992. So it's not something that's going to happen tomorrow."

Steinmetz, in his letter of resignation to CARAS board members indicated that he would stay on until a suitable successor is found. "If they don't get a replacement by that time, I'll stay on to help out, but I'm sure a year is certainly long enough to canvass the

Canadian stars will be rocking at Cannes '92

Lee Aaron, Rik Emmett, The Box and Ronnie Hawkins are set to perform in Cannes, France at MIDEM '92 on Sunday, Jan 19th. These four artists represent a cross section of the Canadian rock scene and their concert/event is designed to bring a focus to Canada at MIDEM.

It's the first time that an export initiative of this magnitude has ever been undertaken and is the first in a series of activities which the Canadian Independent Record Production Association (CIRPA) is planning in an effort to market Canadian music internationally.

The event is being made possible through the generous support of FACTOR, SOCAN, CIRPA, the Ontario Ministry of Culture and Communications, the Department of External Affairs, Ontario House and the Canadian Embassy in Paris.

Steve Thomson, President of Backstage Productions, the major thrust behind the project, will produce the show for CIRPA. It has been his hope for many years to stage a Canadian gala at MIDEM and, through his many contacts both here in Canada and with the MIDEM executive, he has finally been able to break through the red tape and the general malaise that dogged him for so many years.

In his presentation to the media, Thomson was glowing in his praise of Heather Sym, Executive Director of FACTOR, for the assistance she rendered the project. Thomson can be contacted at (416) 291-4913.

Capitol Canada crushed by Anne Murray's exit

It was confirmed today (Jan. 7/92) that Capitol Nashville and recording star Anne Murray have been "unable to arrive at an agreement regarding contract negotiations."

The news was devastating for the staff at Capitol Canada's headquarters, many of whom were with the label when Murray first signed, over 22 years ago. "Anne Murray was the flagship of our Canadian star roster," said an obviously disappointed Deane Cameron, President of the Canadian operation, himself with the label for 15 of those years. "Capitol, without Anne Murray? That's very difficult to visualize."

Although a signing with another major would no doubt be for worldwide rights, an offer has been extended, whereby she could remain with Capitol for Canada only. As Cameron noted, "Every effort and determination is being made by Capitol Canada to maintain Anne's recording career with this company in Canada. We would like to be part of her success in the future. Anne is to Capitol Records, what the Maple Leaf is to the Canadian flag."

"We have enjoyed a long and fruitful relationship with Capitol" said Murray's manager Leonard T. Rambeau. "We've made 30 albums with the label and experienced tremendous success. After 22 years, it's time to move on." Discussions are apparently ongoing with several major international labels.

Murray is without question the plum of the international market. Her albums consistently sell over a million copies each year and her television specials continually chalk up record ratings. Anne Murray At Disney World, produced by Sandra Faire and aired last year by CBC-TV, drew a television audience of 1,386,000, the most viewed TV variety show of the year.

McKennitt's Visit closing in on platinum sales

Who'd have thought there would be such a demand for Celtic based music? Singer and harpist, Loreena McKennitt's fourth album, The Visit, has sold more than 83,000 copies and should reach platinum status by February.

To coincide with her 11 date tour of Spain, The Visit will be released in the country as well as Portugal, Australia, New Zealand, Japan, Germany, Italy, Holland, Belgium and Ireland. A US release is scheduled for March, along with scheduled showcase appearances in San Francisco and Los Angeles.

There is also a possibility of a promotional tour of Australia and New Zealand in March.

MCA Records Canada breaks \$10.00 CD price

MCA Records Canada has announced the creation of a new Budget Compact Disc Series. Included in the series are more than 150 catalogue selections, all of which will carry a suggested list price of \$12.98, representing a 24 percent decrease from the previous \$16.98 list price.


It was indicated by MCA that "while these are suggested list prices," MCA's accounts have "unanimously indicated that they expect the actual cost to consumers will, break the \$10.00 barrier." All titles will be available at the new price beginning Feb. 1/92.

Liona Boyd's New Year Begins with Kremlin date

Internationally acclaimed classical guitarist Liona Boyd, had a front seat to the happenings in Moscow as the new year began. Moscow Mayor Gavril Popov had invited Boyd to take part in a Kremlin gala to bring in the new year. The gala was to be co-hosted by former Soviet President Mikhail Gorbachev and Russian President Boris Yeltsin.

A twist of fate however, resulted in the gala taking place on the last day of the Soviet Union, which was replaced by the 11-nation Commonwealth of Independent States. Both Gorbachev and Yeltsin were unable to attend the gala. However, more than 700 guests did show up, each paying the equivalent of \$150

for the champagne and caviar buffet and the opportunity to witness Boyd perform two classical Spanish numbers. Also performing was the famed Soviet Army Choir and dancers from the Bolshoi Ballet.

Boyd was accompanied to Moscow by her fiance, California businessman John Simon. Being concerned with news of food shortages in the Soviet Union, they took along their own supply of non-perishable food. However, they didn't experience any food problems during their five-day visit and on their last day, on the way to the airport they gave away their supplies to surprised pedestrians on Red Square. Boyd and Simon are to be married in February.

Boyd is currently on release with *Dancing On The Edge*, an instrumental album released by A&M. *We're Only Children*, taken as a single, is picking up AC radio play. The track is included on A&M Radio Sampler Vol. 12.

Anne Murray introduces Celine Dion's CBC Special

Anne Murray will introduce Celine Dion: Bravo, a CBC-TV special on Jan. 18 at 10 pm. The highly-charged special will celebrate Dion's ten years in showbusiness.

Murray, in introducing the show, staged before a sold-out Montreal Forum show, described Dion's voice as "one of the best you'll ever hear." Dion punctuates this remark with a devastatingly effective performance of *Where Does My Heart Beat Now*, her signature song, that literally brings the house down. The song is included on *Unison*, Dion's Columbia album that has sold more than a million copies worldwide. The album ranked No. 63 on RPM's Top 100 Albums of 1991.

Dion also performs *(If There Was) Any Other Way*, *The Last To Know*, *I Am Calling You*, the theme from the *Baghdad Cafe* movie, plus a medley of the French-language hits that won her four platinum albums in Quebec alone. The Dion special is a production of Radio-Canada, directed by Laurent Larouche,

Glass Tiger opens for Stewart's Toronto date

Capitol recording band Glass Tiger has been firmed to open for Rod Stewart at Toronto's Skydome (Jan 22).

Stewart performs a duet of *My Town* with Tiger lead vocalist Alan Frew, a track on the band's *Simple Mission* album. The single reached Top 10 (No. 8) status on the RPM 100 Hit Track charts (Nov. 9/91), and the album enjoyed 35 weeks of charting on the RPM 100 Album chart. They are currently bulleting up the charts with their latest single, *Rescued (By The Arms Of Love)*.

Most recently the band took their brand of Canadian rock to the European theatre where they opened an extensive 45-date tour for label mates Roxette.

Six Grammy nominations for A&M's Bryan Adams

Bryan Adams has been nominated for six Grammy Awards: Record and Song of the Year and Best Pop Vocal Male, and for Song Written Specially for A Motion Picture *TV*, all for *(Everything I Do) I Do It For You*, plus Best Rock Vocal Solo and Best Rock Song of the Year for *Can't Stop This Thing We Started*.

The highly successful A&M star, boasting worldwide sales of more than 4 million of his *Waking Up The Neighbourhood* album, is now heading to Canada for the North American leg of his *Waking Up The World* tour.

The tour kicks off with a sold out show at the Arena 2000 in Sydney, Nova Scotia (Jan. 13), followed by the Metro Centre in Halifax (14), Ottawa's Civic Centre (16), The Forum in Montreal (17), Toronto's Maple Leaf Gardens (18), London's Memorial Gardens (20), Quebec's Coliseum (22), Sault Ste. Marie's Memorial Gardens (24), Saskatchewan Place in Saskatoon (27), Edmonton's Northlands Coliseum (28), Calgary's Olympic Saddledome (29), and Vancouver's PNE (31).

CRIA introduces new identification system

The International Standard Recording Code (ISRC), described as "a radically new system" for identifying sound recordings and music videos, has been developed for use by the Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA).

CRIA President Brian Robertson explains that the system will be digitally encoded into recordings produced worldwide by record companies affiliated with the International Federation of the Phonographic Industry (IFPI). The system will be administered in Canada by IFPI's representative.

"The ISRC is the new world standard for the identification of audio and video recordings," Robertson goes on to explain. "The ISRC identifies the recording throughout its life and is designed to facilitate the identification of copyright ownership as well as increasing the efficiency of the identification of the product for the purpose of royalty collection by rights organizations."

Robertson went on to reveal that the ISRC information is incorporated in the sub-code channel of digital recording media at the pre-mastering stage. Each separate recorded track will be assigned an ISRC number.

The ISRC code includes the name of the owner of the sound recording, the year of release and the track identification. Separate codes are issued for sound recordings and music videos.

Junos! (EC: *So forget the politics and start looking for a him or her who can do the job.*)

Remember the name Carla Hills . . . ! This is a name that will be cropping up fairly regularly over the next little while. This broad has too much power and she's like a fart in a mitt, all over the place. Mention Canada and it's like waving a flag in front of a bull, or, I guess I have to qualify that and say cow. Wow! has this lady got balls or what? It wasn't a happy camp when the US Congress dropped its plans to limit the number of foreign performers, namely Canadian, into the country. I hear all hell broke loose and Hill will definitely have culture, namely Canada's culture on the table when it's our turn. (EC: *Where's Long Dong Silver . . . ?*)

The last dance . . . ! Well, our scam artist has turned off another partner in his label/promotion/publicity business. He managed to get a Quebec account, but that will sour very quickly and, now that his partner is gone, who will answer the phones? (EC: *What goes around comes around . . . !*)

Radio station for sale . . . ? There are more than a few radio stations for sale . . . but there are no buyers. In fact one station in lotus land, owned by an easterner, is so shaky it just might become a parking lot. (EC: *Parking lots make money . . . !*)

Thinking of a talk show . . . ? If any broadcaster wants to get into the talk show format, they better have deep DEEP pockets. Few realize that it costs about four times more to run a talk show station than it does any other type station. Each on-air host has to have a support team to screen the calls, make sure there's a finger on the delay switch, research the subject matter and run errands for the hosts, many of whom become monsters in short order. It's tough to get rid of these guys, who demand a big buck to begin with and once they find they have a listening audience, look out. Piecing them off is like the national debt. (EC: *Do you have anyone in mind . . . ?*)

Watch country music . . . ! A couple of television network boardrooms have been humming over the last few weeks and the discussions have been all about country. The trouble is there are very few production people capable of putting together what could develop into a weekly country variety series. The Tommy Hunter Show has been successful, up to a point, but the audiences have been dying off . . . literally, and no one seemed to know how to tap the younger audience. What Sandra Faire did with George Fox in capturing a campus audience was brilliant, but that would be difficult to do on a weekly basis. There's no end of country talent that would line up to get on the show, but that's the rub. Audiences aren't interested in acts they haven't heard of. It's a big problem. (EC: *It's time for Supercountryman . . . !*)

There's an artist with class . . . ! After reading Richard Cromelin's interview with John Mellencamp: Rocking On At 40 (Toronto Sun - Jan 5/92), I gained a whole new respect for the guy. He's against using his song material or music to endorse any of the toys in

"Corporate America." He said: "My instincts tell me it's wrong. Every time you throw in with Goliath in hopes you can ride on Goliath's slingshot, Goliath shoots you. John Lennon did not write Revolution for tennis shoe commercials." Right on! (EC: *Obviously, he stands alone . . . !*)

Diane Francis and the Skydome . . . ! I mentioned a few weeks ago that Financial Post and/or the Toronto Sun's Diane Francis was expected to put together a sizzler on Toronto's hallowed Skydome. Now that arbitrator/collaborator extraordinaire Bob White has completed his job of pacifying??? the taxpayers and getting them off the hook??? from that massive sinkhole to the sports world, an exposé would be timely. Being the crusader she is however, Francis is probably waiting until ALL the players are in place and the parties and handshakes are over before dropping her bombshell. (EC: *Go get 'em Dianne . . . !*)

Put a cork in it . . . ! These daily snoops give me a pain in the ass with their bleating over poor Bryan Adams. Navel gazing John Sakomoto writes, in his Sun column of Jan. 9/92, "Bryan Adams may not be appreciated by the Canadian powers-that-be, but the U.S. musical establishment has warmed up to him in a big way." 

Looking back on a troubled year

The red flag was up in 1991 - some heeded it!!

The year 1991 began like any other year. Many in the industry were hopeful that the much ballyhooed Christmas rush would end the year on a positive note. However, CRIA industry statistics for December were disappointing, which set the pace for what was to be a year fraught with nervous anxiety, particularly on the retail front.

After A&A and Discus crapped themselves, the message was even more poignant. Industry leaders also indicated a cautionary approach for the coming year. "I think 1991 will be a fairly tough year," opined Warner Music Canada President Stan Kulin. "Hopefully, all our retailers will survive, but I think that during that eighties phenomenon there was rather serious over-expansion." (RPM - Jan. 19/91). "We're going to be cautious, just like everyone else," said Capitol Canada President Deane Cameron. "We are not recession proof." (RPM - Jan. 26/91). "It's going to be a tough year," cautioned Joe Summers, President A&M Records Canada. "The economy is going to dictate the year for us." (RPM - Feb. 2/91).

Madonna's *The Immaculate Collection* was the No. 1 album on the RPM 100 Albums chart as the new year dawned and George Strait's *I've Come To Expect It From You* was No. 1 on the RPM Country 100.

JANUARY

Don Kollar resigns his post as President and General Manager of BMG Music Canada. Bob Jamieson, a major player in PolyGram's acquisition of Island and A&M, while with PolyGram Holding, takes over the reins of BMG Music Canada as Vice President and General Manager. CBC-TV and The Balmur Co. were ecstatic over the ratings of Anne Murray's Family Christmas TV special which drew 1.7 million viewers. Jane Reynolds, wife of Ross Reynolds, President MCA Records Canada, is taken off the critical list and is now mending after the near-tragic pedestrian/auto accident on Dec. 13. Cinram enters the new year showing an increase of \$2 million on year-to-date figures, but suffering a weaker than expected third quarter in revenue. Rick Dunlop takes on the position of Sales Executive Classics for PolyGram Canada. The CRTC announces a new FM policy to be installed in September. David Lindores exits CHAM Country and joins BMG as Ontario Promotion Representative. Andy Frost leaves his Program Director post at Q107 for a position with Intrepid Records. BMG's Vice President A&R, David Bendeth, reveals plans whereby BMG will make *Cancon* a priority in the coming year. Crash Test Dummies is a major act being groomed for both the domestic and international markets. Annie Croft to Director Licensing and International Services for Warner/Chappell Music Canada. Dick Damron puts the finishing touches on his 35th Anniversary album.

FEBRUARY

DC103.5's morning personality, (Ross) Carlin In The Morning, makes a bid to bring attention


to Canada's National Anthem, which opens the door for his "revitalized" *O Canada*. CARAS announces that this year's Juno Awards, the 20th Anniversary of the highly-rated awards show, will be held in Vancouver on March 3rd. Capitol Canada creates Picture Music Canada, a new video distribution arm, headed up by Rob Brooks, Capitol Canada's International Marketing Manager. Virgin's Maureen Shea joins Siren Records in London, England as Label Manager. Virgin's Laura Bartlett is appointed Vice President of Promotion and Marketing. Rod Stewart so impressed with Marc Jordan's penning of the Celtic-oriented *The Rhythm Of My Heart*, he includes it on his next album and releases it as a single which is an immediate chart happener. CRIA steps up activity against pirating and home taping. Madonna's *The Immaculate Collection* holds fast at No. 1 and *Unanswered Prayers* by Garth Brooks tops the RPM Country 100. A&A files for bankruptcy and sends industry into a spin. CRIA releases first ever certifications for long form video sales. True North signs Gregory Hoskins, the first signing for the Toronto-based label in five years. Bill Banham moves from Warner Music to MCA as Marketing Manager for GRP, Narada, Motown, Chess and Impact. Toronto-based Harem Scarem signs with Warner Music Canada. CBC-TV airs Anne Murray in Disney World, her third special for the CBC. David Baxter takes on Creative Director duties at EMI Music Publishing Canada with Raine Munro moving up to Creative Manager and Barbara Sedun joining the firm as Creative Coordinator. FACTOR goes to MIDEM for information exchange. Derrick Ross, former President of Enigma Entertainment forms DMD Promotions and takes on former Enigma employees Mark Smith and Debbie Pauk as National Press/Media Coordinator and National Retail Marketing Coordinator respectively. HMV launches unique *Don't Quit Your Day Job* Music Awards. The Variety Club Heart Award is presented to Charlie Camilleri. Campbell Ritchie, former Managing Director of PROCAN, is dead at 75. Liza Zbitnew appointed Director, Artist Marketing for Sony Music Canada. Ray Rosenberg, formerly of A&M Records, launches his own Intersound International operation with release of Colleen Peterson's *Let Me Down Easy* CD. Federal Communications Minister Marcel Masse announces the creation of the Canadian Council on the Status of the Artist. FACTOR revamps programs and introduces two new ones: a Compilation CD Program and a Producers Demo Program.

MARCH

Frank Davies' Partisan Music Productions takes on MCA as part-owner of all Partisan existing catalogues and those of Partisan's newly-acquired TMP (The Music Publisher). Carol Wright, former Director of Marketing for Island Records Canada, joins BMG Music Canada as Director of Artist Marketing. The

CBC-TV's telecast of the Juno Awards will be increased an additional half hour from its normal two-hour time limit. Celine Dion, making huge gains in English Canada with her *Unison* (Columbia) album, is booked into Toronto's Winter Garden Theatre for March 15. Blue Rodeo's WEA single *Til I Am Myself Again*, tops the RPM Country 100. Capitol-EMI Canada and its distributed labels leads the Juno field with 22 nominations in 15 different categories. Sony Canada is the first to certify for diamond sales videos with the *New Kids On The Block*'s *Step By Step* and *Hangin' Tough*. Warner Music's Stan Kulin reports that CD sales have made enormous inroads, showing 65 percent of total sales from the beginning of the year. Jerry Wipf accepts the appointment of President and CEO of Discus Montreal. HMV launches its *Made In Canada* campaign, a five-point integrated marketing program to help new Canadian artists. Newly signed to Justin Entertainment, Black Pool, took the Pop/Rock Artist of the Year Award at the East Coast Music Awards held in Halifax. Cindi Cain and Errol Ranville were the big winners in the 15th annual Manitoba Association of Country Arts Awards held in Winnipeg on March 17. Jack Boswell, who heads up Scarborough's (Toronto) Heritage Music, sends word that he is still recording traditional country music. Smiley Bates, who first recorded for Boswell in 1968, is on release with a new instrumental cassette titled Bent River Boogie: Pickin' The Flat Top Guitar. The title says it all from this master of the guitar and other instruments. A new vocal album has just been completed and is expected to ship by the end of January. Roy Payne, who recorded his Goofy Newfie hit in 1970, is off with his latest cassette, Last Of The Reasons I Keep Going Home. This one contains two "Newfie" songs, but the other Payne originals are more of the story type. Boswell also has an interesting release by Ed Forrest. In between drug problems, Cathy Smith, who was involved in the Belushi trial and had been associated with Gordon Lightfoot, provided backup vocals for Forrest's cassette titled Done A Lotta Livin'. The album was produced by Chef Adams. Session people included steelman Frank Barth, guitarist Ralph MacDonald and drummer Randy Semenak. Elisa Amsterdam joined Smith for the

background vocals. The session was recorded at Shag Sound.

George Fox's CBC-TV Special drew close to a million viewers. This was an important show for Fox in that it was staged before a large campus crowd at the University of Guelph. The show also provided a foot in the door to this trend-setting crowd for Patricia Conroy, Kashtin and the Skydiggers. On the Dec. 17 edition of Dan Gallagher's Video Hits, Fox had his mustache clipped by Gallagher and Blaine Schmidt and Don Wilson of the Argos. He had bet if the Argos won the Gray Cup, he would have his mustache shaved off on national television. The quick-draw handlers of Fox, the Balmur people, arranged for an immediate photo session, resulting in the CBC-TV ad and promo shots of Fox, sans the hairy lip, in the Dec. 21-27 issue of TV Guide. Fox has bounced back onto the charts once again, this time with his latest WEA single, Here Today, Here Tomorrow.

Kelita's latest album is titled Letter From Home. The album was produced by John Allan Cameron with Kelita and her new husband, Toronto-based musician/producer Gord Lemon, lending a hand. The album contains a

duet with Bobby Lalonde on Can't Get Close Enough, "which honestly mirrors the way my husband and I feel about each other," says Kelita. "Bobby and I have performed live together over the years, so writing and recording this special song with him was very comfortable and I'm very excited about the song." 




Greg Paul's new album, When I See You
