





Pindoff/Music World show "substantial increase"

Since taking a closer hands-on approach to Pindoff Record Sales and the 68-store Music World Limited chain more than 16 months ago, Kriss Pindoff has been brimming with enthusiasm at the gains both operations have made.

"The operation is much smoother, and much more profitable. We have experienced a substantial increase in business," he says.

In the last four weeks alone, Pindoff has personally opened five new stores: three in Quebec, the new Markville Shopping Centre store in Markham, Ont., and one in Vancouver.

In spite of the record industry's economic problems, Pindoff insists there is still room for growth within his organization. He expects to close out this year with a 30 per cent increase over last year. He has also set his sights on more store openings in March and April. He also expects to concentrate more on videos.

"I just don't open stores to add to our numbers. I'm very cautious. I look for good locations, where a store can produce. There are a lot of stores available, but I want to make sure they are right for us."

He admits that, through past mistakes, he

has had to close a couple of locations because they weren't producing and because of over-inflated rent demands.

"Things would be more profitable and we would have better stores if I spent all the time here. But my health and happiness counts to. So I had to pay a price for that."

The opening of the Markville store was somewhat of a coup for Pindoff. The store boasts the latest in record retailing convenience, from bright colours, to state-of-the-art lighting fixtures and compact modular racking systems which allows for better security.

Along with the new store concept, Pindoff has brought all 68 stores into computerized central warehousing. When a sale is made, central warehousing is made aware immediately of each stores sales and needs.

Pindoff is also very proud of the success he is having with the Eaton stores, which is serviced by Pindoff Record Sales. Video sales for the coast-to-coast chain, according to Pindoff, have registered a 70 percent increase with record product showing an increase of 50 per cent.

The international four-album deal with Seattle's infamous Sub Pop label is expected to be signed by the end of the month. Sloan, in addition to their much ballyhooed deal with DGC, will also be releasing a single on Sub Pop.

Eric's Trip is currently preparing a new six-song EP entitled *Peter* for a January release on Sloan's Murderecords label.

Fox and BMG Music launch record venture

Twentieth Century Fox, Twentieth Television and Bertelsmann Music Group (BMG) have entered into a multi-year agreement to form Fox Records, a new label.

All future soundtracks from Twentieth Century Fox motion pictures and Twentieth Television programming will be released on the new label, which will be distributed by BMG on a worldwide basis.

BMG will also distribute other albums produced by artists signed to the new label.

Twentieth Century Fox and Twentieth Television are divisions of Twentieth Century Fox Film Corporation, a subsidiary of Fox Inc.

Recent films from Twentieth Century Fox include *White Men Can't Jump* and *For The Boys*, both of which featured high-profile soundtracks, as well as *My Cousin Vinny* and *Alien 3*.

Twentieth Television productions include *In Living Colour*, *L.A. Law* and *Rhythm and Blues*.


Taylor Campbell, who had been with the Pindoff organization in an executive capacity for more than 12 years, retired three months ago.

The promotion resulted in front-racked displays for Oak Street product as well as increasing awareness for UNICEF Canada. Final donation figures won't be available until early December.

Les Misérables returns to Toronto for holidays

The Cameron Mackintosh and David and Ed Mirvish production of *Les Misérables* will return to Toronto for a limited farewell six-week run, with revised dates starting Dec. 31/92 to Feb. 6/93.

In commenting on the casting, executive producer and director Richard Jay-Alexander said, "It's been quite complex due to the scheduling of actors for this return engagement, which was a surprise due to popular demand by the public."

Shipments and sales were strong in October

Sales and shipments of prerecorded music showed a dramatic increase from this October over last according to figures released by the Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA).

Total shipments were up 21 per cent from October, 1991, while the net value of sales was up 28 per cent. "The numbers certainly reflect a much higher level than last year," says CRIA president Brian Robertson.

"If the sell-through follows the same pattern, there will be some happy people at both retail and at the record companies in January and February. But we'll have to wait and see what happens between now and then."

The strong October boosted the total shipment figures for the year to date to three per cent ahead of 1991. The net value of sales is up nine per cent over last year.

Robertson hopes that the figures aren't just an aberration and that they're the beginning of a trend. "There's certainly been an air of optimism in the business in the last few weeks, which is a positive sign. Perhaps we've reached that upturn that we thought was coming for the last two or three years."

Eric Nagler product released on MCA label

MCA Records Canada is now distributing record product by Eric Nagler. The initial release will comprise four titles, which will be available in stores on Dec. 1.

Three of the albums are Nagler's best-selling catalogue titles: *Fiddle Up A Tune*, *Improvise With Eric Nagler*, and *Come On In*, which received a 1985 Juno Award nomination for Best Children's Recording.

The fourth release is Nagler's latest album, *I Can't Sit Down*, described as Nagler's "most eclectic collection of songs ever."

Nagler has been in the forefront of family entertainment since 1978. His hectic tour schedule has resulted in a large fan base throughout North America. He has become a recognized television personality as well, with his guest appearances on *Mr. DressUp*, *Sesame Street* and *The Elephant Show*. He also hosts *Eric's World*, a television sitcom that is currently being aired on *YTV*, *The Family Channel* and *PBS*.

Nagler is managed by Bruce Davidsen of Toronto-based Tanglewood Productions.

Broadway's Craig Schulman returns in the role of Jean Valjean, with Tony-award winner Michael Maguire as Enjolras.

Michael Burgess will make a special guest appearance for one week as Jean Valjean, the role he originated with the Toronto production.

Jay-Alexander points out that in view of Schulman's popularity in Canada during the last six months, he wanted Toronto audiences to see him. "I felt it would be a shame to break up the company that began the tour, and also felt strongly that they should end the tour together."

Toronto was not on the tour schedule until recently, and Schulman had accepted

Digital formats ready when agreement reached

Sony is gearing up to release their new Mini Discs and portable players and recorders, but the launch could be delayed because of the lack of a licensing agreement.

Negotiations over a new mechanical licensing agreement have been ongoing between the Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA) and the Canadian Musical Reproduction Rights Agency (CMRRA). CMRRA president David Basskin has said that he won't license either the Mini Disc or Philips Electronics' Digital Compact Cassettes (DCC) until he's signed a new deal with the industry. That could make Canada one of the last countries in the industrialized world to have the new digital technology in the marketplace.

As a means of trying to curtail home taping, Basskin is anxious to have a levy applied to both the new digital formats and existing analog cassette tapes and recorders as part of the agreement.

When asked if the introduction of digital technology could be delayed due to the lack of an agreement, CRIA president Brian Robertson declined to make any predictions.

"They're incredibly complex negotiations involving many parties and, until I get through the process, I can't even give you an idea of what the outcome is going to be. It's an ongoing process and we don't have an awful lot of time. I can't tell you any more than that."

Sony Music Canada president Paul Burger is more upbeat and doesn't think there will be a delay in getting the Mini Discs out to consumers. "We've got a fair sampling of titles between the companies that are involved in the launch (Sony, Capitol, Warner). I think we've got a pretty fair representation of what's going to be out there."

"Clearly, we just want to get these out as part of the introduction to the new technology. I don't think anybody is expecting that this is going to take off like a bolt of lightning. But we're finding a lot of enthusiasm about the Mini-Disc project and we're happy to be part of this global launch."

Approximately 300 Mini Disc titles are initially expected to be released.

another engagement in the U.S. This prompted Jay-Alexander to ask Burgess to return as Jean Valjean for one week.

The Canadian premiere production of *Les Misérables* opened at Toronto's Royal Alexandra Theatre in March 1989, where it played nightly for 14 months before heading out on its first national tour.

A second production began in Montreal in early 1991 and toured the country through the summer and fall of 1991. Demand for the return of the musical to Toronto was so great, a new company opened in the spring of 1991 with an extended run through to July 22, 1992.

This fourth production has won critical acclaim in Hamilton, Ont. after playing in western Canada since June. This is the only Canadian touring company to play Honolulu (Nov. 11-22). The company returns to Canada for a Dec. 10-27 engagement in Regina before returning to Toronto.

Since its opening in Canada, *Les Misérables* has played to more than 2.5 million people across the country, from Vancouver to Montreal.

Cohen's Closing Time features talented cast

Closing Time, the first video from Leonard Cohen's new album, *The Future*, features an impressive cast both in front of and behind the camera.

The video was conceived by Cohen and the award-winning team of director Curtis Wehrfritz and cinematographer Miroslaw Baszak. At the recent Canadian Music Video Awards, Wehrfritz was named Best Director for Tom Cochrane's *No Regrets* video, and he also directed 54-40's *She-la*, which won the prize for Best Video. Baszak was named Best Director Of Photography for the Holly Cole Trio's *Calling You* video. Baszak also did the cinematography for Bruce MacDonald's excellent feature film, *Highway 61*.

The video for *Closing Time* is set in the honky tonk atmosphere of Toronto's famed Matador Club. The video features Cohen along with such notable Canadian theatre and film actors as Earl Pastko (Mr. Skin from *Highway 61*), Rebecca Jenkins (Bob Roberts, *South of Wawa*), Tracey Wright (*Roadkill*, *Highway 61*), and musician/actor David Ramsden.



Bourbons have sold beer, now it's time for albums

The Bourbon Tabernacle Choir has come a long way since being formed by a bunch of bored North Toronto high school brats who first got together in the mid-'80s because they shared a fondness for '70s funk and gospel music.

The band, which over the years has acquired a nationwide reputation for its wildly unpredictable and energetic live shows, has just released its first compact disc. *Superior Cackling Hen* is the first release from newly-formed Yonder Records, which has a pressing and distribution deal with Sony Music Canada.

While the Bourbons have largely gained their stature as up-and-comers through their relentless one-nighters in clubs and bars, co-lead singer Dave Wall says the group would now prefer to move on to playing theatres and concert halls. "We're sick of being glorified beer salesmen, which is the essence of clubbing," he says.

"When you're in a band and you're practising in your garage, your aspirations are not to sell beer. Your aspirations are to have people listen to your music and get off on it. We want people to listen. That's the new phase of The Bourbon Tabernacle Choir."

Have no fear, the Bourbons are going to continue to be a funky party band, but they're now paying much closer attention to the actual crafting of a song. On the group's past independently released cassettes, they

Raw Energy releases being readied right now

Raw Energy Records has a full slate of material to be released in the first-half of next year.

A compilation entitled *Raw Energy*, featuring 14 bands from across Canada, will hit the streets on Feb. 9.

Two weeks later, on Feb. 23, the second album from King Apparatus will be released. A video for the first single, *Michael & Anne*, and a tour will follow the 17-track album's release. The three bonus tracks appearing on the current Hospital Waiting Room CD single will be re-recorded and included on the as yet untitled album.

The debut album from Leanne Haze -- a Wicca high priestess, ardent environmentalist and Green Party activist -- is scheduled for a March 9 release. Pre-production for the album, tentatively titled *Witch*, has begun with Pukka Orchestra's Neil Chapman and percussionist Michael Spencer.

basically went into the studio and recorded themselves live off the floor. But now, after working with producer Jon Goldsmith (Bruce Cockburn, Jane Siberry) and engineer Lenny De Rose (Julian Lennon, Alice Cooper, Honeymoon Suite), the band has come to realize and appreciate the nuances which differentiate between playing live before a crowd and recording an album in a studio.

Says Wall's co-lead vocalist, Kate Fenner: "It takes restraint because ultimately what your goal is, is to make something that's going to be listenable for a long time and that's going to stay relevant. So instead of the peaks and valleys that you reach in a live show, you have to really aim for consistency. If it means holding back and not doing the screaming guitar solo, or not showing your vocal prowess on every line, then that's what it means."

"We could focus on the songs and approach each song in the studio thinking of the lyrical content and the musical aspects, as opposed to the live show where your job is to keep everybody up and drinking and having a good time."

The Bourbons have gained the respect of the Toronto music community not only because of their affability, but because each member of the band seems to have their own defined, original musical or vocal style. This year alone, various members of the band have made guest appearances on albums by the Rheostatics, Barenaked Ladies, Big Sugar, Gregory Hoskins and the Stickpeople, and others.

Part of the reason why many Toronto musicians are so tight, Fenner says, is because they're often out at the city's many live music clubs watching their cohorts, or sometimes even joining them on stage. It's a fairly well-known fact that musicians in most other cities in North America are envious of both the amount of and accessibility of live music

Dead Reckoning relocates to Toronto and firms dates

Dead Reckoning, a popular rock band from Long Harbour, Nfld., have relocated in Toronto "to give the rest of Canada a taste of what has made them such a successful group back home," writes publicist Jane Harbury.

The band gave Toronto club goers a chance to hear their music with a couple of sets at the Horseshoe on Nov. 30.

Comprising Dead Reckoning are Tim Norman, Perry Murphy and Mike Kelly. The trio have known each other since childhood and went through school and university together. They have released two independently-distributed albums, and released a video which was played on MuchMusic.

Harbury reports the band's material now has "a harder edge" than their earlier compositions and the lyrics have an added social conscience and environmental awareness.

venues in Toronto.

"Montreal has virtually no live music scene," says Fenner with a tone of regret. "They have great bands, but people go out and drink or they go out and dance, but they don't go out and watch music. And Vancouver has lots of good music coming out of there, but they don't have the places to play that we do."

But, if a band is to make a full-time living making music (which the Bourbons have done for the past three years), they have to be willing to go out on the road and generate interest outside of their hometown. The Bourbons have criss-crossed the country a number of times and anticipate doing a tour of western Canada in January. Through the end of this year, they're playing various dates in the Windsor-Montreal corridor.

The frequent gigging has ensured that *Superior Cackling Hen* (the album title apparently comes from a garbled message -- about alien chickens taking over the earth -- found in Jimi Hendrix's *Third Stone From The Sun*) is getting airplay and selling respectably across the country. And Wall and Fenner both agree that Sony has gone above and beyond its mandate with Yonder as far as being supportive goes.

Superior Cackling Hen is currently only available in Canada but, after performing showcases in New York and seeing the current stateside success of such similarly-minded groups as the Spin Doctors and Phish, Fenner feels that her group might also be ready for the international market.

"We feel very good about this record. We would really like to see what our possibilities are in other countries."




Houston No. 1 bound! Whitney Houston's *I Will Always Love You* blasts up to No. 13 in just its third week on the chart. That's a strong indication that it will probably reach No. 1. Six other songs this year have been that high in their third week and all have gone on to reach the Top Five. That list includes *Sometimes Love Just Ain't Enough*, *I'll Be There* and *Don't Let The Sun Go Down On Me*, which all went to No. 1.

A question question. With five songs in the Top 20 asking questions (*How Do You Talk To An Angel*, *Do You Believe In Us*, *Who's Gonna Ride Your Wild Horses*, *Would I Lie To You* and *Where You Goin' Now*), the question is what kind of question has been more popular. Of Who, What, When, Where, Why and How, which word has started more No. 1 question songs? Hint: think Bee Gees.

It must be Costner...! More than likely it's Whitney Houston's voice resulting in quick sales of *The Bodyguard* soundtrack. The album makes a strong debut at No. 19. That overshadows Genesis' *Live/The Way We Walk* album, which enters at No. 24.

Canadian bonanza! Of the seven new entries on the Hit Tracks chart, five are from Canadian artists. The Rankin Family's crossover hit *Fare Thee Well Love* leads the way as it debuts at No. 89. The other Cancon songs are: Jane's House by Sue Medley, Neil Young's *Harvest Moon*, Kim Mitchell's *Some Folks* and *Sometimes I Wish* by Leslie Spit Treeo.

Working twice as hard. An artist pushing two songs on the Hit Tracks chart is a little unusual, but to have two artists doing it at the same time is very unusual. Alannah Myles has the No. 1 song in Canada and is also charting with *Tumbleweed*, which bullet to No. 62. Neil Young's *War Of Man* jumps to No. 53 while *Harvest Moon* debuts at No. 93.

A very rich man! Paul Tracey, MD of Calgary's CJAY, must be earning a decent buck. He put up some big time money betting on the Grey Cup. He wagered 20 hundred million billion dollars on a Stampeder victory!

How about that. Of Who, What, When, Where, Why and How, it is How that has started the most No. 1 songs asking a question. The four songs are: The Young Rascals' *How Can I Be Sure* in 1967, The Bee Gees' *How Can You Mend A Broken Heart* in 1971, The Bee Gees again in 1977 with *How Deep Is Your Love* and Whitney Houston's *How Will I Know* in 1986.

(and worst) albums ever released, even if some are now deleted. The releases date back to the '50s and '60s (with Paul Anka, Buffalo Springfield, Bobby Darin, Johnny Mathis, Ronnie Hawkins, Bob Dylan and the Beatles), the '70s (with Bachman-Turner Overdrive, Kate and Anna McGarrigle, Gordon Lightfoot and Robbie Robertson), and right through to the '80s and '90s (with Madonna, Harry Connick Jr., Bryan Adams and Gloria Estefan). What's puzzling is the omission of Anne Murray's albums, of which there are 32 since *Bidin' My Time*, her 1970 Capitol debut. Her record sales are close to \$30 million, which far surpasses some of the albums given the nod here. Murray has also been the favourite of two (and perhaps more) U.S. presidents. That's no mean feat. Perhaps the oversight came about because the number of writers was trimmed to four, rather than the more than 50 who contributed to earlier versions. What's interesting, however, is how many Canadian acts are acknowledged. Even Nova Scotia's favourite son, Hank Snow, made the list. A great source for the record collector. - WG



Weighing in at almost 10 pounds, this book would make a perfect coffee table conversation piece. The first edition, released in November

of 1981, contained only 1076 pages, so obviously a lot more information has been accumulated since then. Another 820 entries were added at the cost of eliminating 200 old entries. The Canadian recording industry has also grown tremendously over those 10 years, but the authors obviously are very preoccupied with non-popular music. The front cover photo is that of a Sousa or French horn, not very many of which are used in rock or pop recording session. The first edition was a little more liberal, with a display of several brass pieces adorning the front cover. The coverage given some of the memorable events of popular music in Canada is somewhat limp. Nonetheless this is a very interesting and well laid-out guide to all forms of music in Canada, and it's quite liberally peppered with interesting photographs. This was obviously a monumental chore and probably would not have been possible without outside support. In fact, there was a great deal of support from both the private sector and governments: federal, provincial and municipal, the naming of which takes up almost a full page. If they all received a copy, the first printing would most certainly be close to depletion. An index supplies some names and events, but in missing others, puts the credibility of the suppliers of information in question.

Pink Floyd's boxed set shipped by Columbia

Columbia/Sony is marking the 25th anniversary of the release of Pink Floyd's first album and single with a lavish new boxed set titled *Shine On*.

The set, which should hit stores on Nov. 24, spans the group's entire history over the course of seven of their best-known Columbia and Capitol albums (all newly repackaged and remastered to sound better than the original compact discs), a digipak of rare single sides, and a 112-page book.

Shine On contains the following albums in their entirety: *A Saucerful of Secrets* (original U.K. release in 1968; U.S. 1973); *Meddle* (1971); *Dark Side of the Moon* (1973); *Wish You Were Here* (1975); *Animals* (1975); *The Wall* (1979, double CD); and *A Momentary*

Lapse of Reason (1987). Each album will be housed in a special all-black jewel case which, when the CDs are arranged in the set's collapsible slipcase, will create a special visual image.

The Pink Floyd Early Singles disc will contain very hard to find singles and their B-sides, including: *Arnold Layne* and *Candy* and *a Currant Bun* (Pink Floyd's debut single; March, 1967); *See Emily Play* and *Scarecrow* (June, 1967); *Apples and Oranges* and *Paintbox* (November, 1967); *It Would Be So Nice* and *Julia Dream* (April, 1968); and *Point Me at the Sky* and *Careful With That Axe*, *Eugene* (December, 1968).

The 112-page, four colour hardcover book accompanying *Shine On* contains archival photos and illustrations, concert posters, single and album artwork, newspaper and magazine covers, an overview of each selection, lyrics and original recording/production notes, background secrets about the album jacket artwork and design, record

Jaffe and Robinson back together again

Ira Jaffe has been named president of The Famous Music Publishing Companies, the worldwide music publishing division of Paramount Pictures.

The appointment re-teams Jaffe with Irwin Z. Robinson, chairman and chief executive officer of Famous, who made the announcement.

Jaffe, who will be headquartered in Los Angeles, will report directly to Robinson. He succeeds Robert D. Fead, who resigned to pursue other interests.

The appointment marks the fourth time in 23 years that Robinson and Jaffe have worked together. Their professional association dates back to 1969 at Screen Gems and extends through their leadership of two other major music publishing companies -- Chappell/Intersong Music Group-USA and EMI Music Publishing.

After joining Screen Gems in 1969, Jaffe remained with the company through its acquisition by EMI in 1976, holding various positions including senior vice-president of creative. In 1980, he was appointed senior vice-president of creative at Chappell/Intersong Music Group-USA by Robinson, who was then president.

The two executives again joined forces after Robinson was named president of EMI Music Publishing Worldwide, and he subsequently appointed Jaffe president of EMI's U.S. operations. After the EMI/SBK merger in 1980, Jaffe became president of the Los Angeles-based NEM Entertainment.

In the years that Robinson and Jaffe have worked together they have jointly signed several major acts including Boston, Journey, Cheap Trick, Fleetwood Mac, BTO, RATT, Cinderella, Jody Watley and Rod Stewart. They also signed such top writers as Bernie Taupin, Diane Warren, Holly Knight and Franke Golde.

In addition to Moxy Früvous, Ross has had past success booking such acts as the Barenaked Ladies, Skydiggers, One, and the Leslie Spit Treo. Moxy Früvous' bookings will still be handled by The Agency.

Ross is also hoping to sign other young and talented acts to his new company, which is called Jack's Artist Management. He may be reached after Nov. 27 at (416) 603-9461.

In other news from The Agency, Michael Greggs has left the company due to downsizing brought about by a decline in live music bookings.

Toronto's Darlene Love releases on Fox label

Toronto singer Darlene Love has teamed with Little Steven Van Zandt for the recording of *All Alone On Christmas*, the first single from the motion picture soundtrack, *Home Alone II* Christmas.

The song, described as "a classic Christmas rocker," was written and produced by Van Zandt, and will be included in one of two soundtrack albums for the film which was released by Fox Records and distributed by BMG/Arista on Nov. 20.

Home Alone II: Lost In New York, the original score album, features new material by *Home Alone* composer John Williams.

Love gained early rock recognition in the '60s through her recordings for Phil Spector. Her first recording with the Crystals, *He's A Rebel*, topped the U.S. charts. Other recordings with Spector, including *Da Do Ron Ron*, *Today I Met The Boy I'm Gonna Marry*, and *Wait Til' My Bobby Gets Home*, all became Top 10 hits.

Musicians on *All Alone On Christmas* include five of the seven original members of the E Street Band: Clarence Clemons, Danny Federici, Garry Tallent, Little Steven and Max Weinberg. This was the first musical collaboration by the group in 10 years.

Home Alone, the original film, is the highest-grossing comedy of all time and the third highest-grossing film of all time behind *E.T.* and *Star Wars*.

Steve Jackson & Co. is a place for musicians to meet, jam, test and purchase a large variety of keyboards and computers. The company has a live digital recording studio and also offers live, professionally produced promotional video services, and full remanufacturing, repair, touch-up and refinishing services.

Also at the Dupont-Dufferin site is a concert stage with a backstage lounge with digital pianos and keyboards, used pianos, music books, videos, equipment stands, accessories and the Pianotronic Composer's Workstation.

A 100-square metre sound-proofed showroom will display a collection of grand pianos and a 110-square metre area will be dedicated to rebuilding and reserving pianos.

Jagger's solo album set for a February release

Atlantic Records has scheduled the first week in February for the release of Mick Jagger's solo album, *Wandering Spirit*.

The album, produced by Jagger and Rick Rubin, marks the renewal of Jagger's ties with Atlantic. The Rolling Stones' product was distributed by Atlantic from 1974 through 1984.

The new album also marks Jagger's first collaboration with Rubin as a producer. Rubin has chalked up an impressive track record, having produced albums by Red Hot Chili Peppers, LL Cool J, Run-DMC, Slayer, and the Beastie Boys.

Jagger originals make up 10 of the 14 songs on the album, including the first single, *Sweet Thing*. Covers of several R&B classics help fill out the album.

Guesting on the session were Lenny Kravitz, Flea from the Red Hot Chili Peppers, bassist Doug Wimbish, saxman Courtney Pine, and keyboardists Billy Preston and Benmont Tench.

Mannheim Steamroller's Fresh Aire to O'Keefe

Chip Davis will roll his Mannheim Steamroller into Toronto's O'Keefe Centre for three shows from Dec. 10-12.

Davis is both the founder of the group and its label, American Gramaphone.

Davis composes his music at the controls of his 48-track computerized basement studio, often using a creation he calls the "digital upright." He is credited with bringing "authentic period instruments forward in time," and considers his ability to compose original works with a classical base and a pure view of production as "key elements" of his music. He has in fact been credited with creating a style which is described as "18th century rock and roll."

Each year, Davis packs several tons of equipment into a semi-trailer and heads out with his entourage, which includes seven featured musicians, for an exclusive series of Christmas shows.

The group performs with full orchestral accompaniment in a concert of light and sound sophistication that delivers what has been described as "an eclectic blend of new pop in the classical tradition."

The holiday traditions are credited with inspiring Davis to infuse familiar Christmas melodies with his distinctive Mannheim Steamroller style. This resulted in two albums,

CKXL shakes Calgary with move to MOR

When I was a kid, CKXL was the only rock station out of the four available in the Calgary area. Now there are 12.

CKXL tried a few different formats over the years, even adopting different call letters along the way. For a while they were known as CISS and, until Oct. 30, they tried CFXX. Now the call letters are back to CKXL and the format is now MOR.

A little more than a year ago the station switched over to the increasingly popular classic rock format. That same weekend, Calgary's CJAY also switched over to a classic rock format. When KIK-FM also went to classic rock, the resulting battle for marketshare got fairly muddy.

I called CKXL program director, Jim Jackson, to ask why, when everyone else seemed to be switching to a classic rock format, they'd abandoned it for a MOR format (Neil Diamond, Barbra Streisand, Kenny Rogers, Rita MacNeil). I told him that RPM had been reporting several switches to classic rock, and Jackson said, RPM was quite right that the trend is going toward the lucrative classic rock format. He also pointed out that CKXL's switch was a reaction to market conditions, not an indication of a new trend.

"Could we actually be getting too much classic rock pumped out over the airwaves," I asked. With a one word answer, he replied "Yes."

Bob Wiseman continues to promote Canadiana in his seemingly never-ending musical projects.





The station's promotion director, Martin Spalding, says the station wanted to make sure as many people as possible had a chance to see the band, and the

Vancouver's 99.3 The Fox recently mounted its What Would You Do For U2, Part Two promotion, "and they did just about everything," reports the station's promotions director, Jody Elle. The five finalists aired

But the best stunt was performed by Brad Calbick of North Vancouver who went to a Canucks hockey game wearing only a diaper while singing I Am A Loyal Hockey Fan at the top of his lungs. Calbick and nine friends won tickets for a fully catered private suite at BC place for U2's Nov. 4 concert.

Kevin Hilgers gets his morning going with a little humour that he likes to pass along to his CFGP Grande Prairie listeners. He recently asked: "How well is Madonna's Sex selling? Newsweek says she sold 150,000 copies on its first day. I say why not wait a few months and get sex at the library for free?" Here's another. "You know they now have plastic glow in the dark Slinkies? Now you'll be able to play with them in the tub and won't have to worry about them rusting. Keep them away from chest hairs though." And, "Today's little known fact. If a ventriloquist slaps his dummy in the head, a politician somewhere gets a headache."

Hamilton's Y95 Classic Rock celebrated its 430th day on-air on Nov. 3 with a private party for listeners only at NRG Nightclub. The evening featured performances by 54:40, Barney Bentall & The Legendary Hearts, and Hamilton's own Rita Chiarelli. Tickets were free, but available only from the station. The event was the grand finale to Y95's Rocktober campaign, a month-long celebration featuring 31 days of non-stop parties, festivities and classic rock. Darren Wasyluk, APD/marketing director for Y95, points out that, in just longer than one year, Y95 "has become the third largest rock station in Canada, garnering phenomenal listener support with over 450,000 listeners in the Hamilton, Kitchener, Guelph, and Brantford areas of south-western Ontario."

CHML's Talkline won First Place Gold at last week's CAB awards held in Vancouver. The Hamilton station's show, hosted by Roy Green, took the Best News and Public Affairs Show category. The show was judged on a series of programs about Canada's judicial system which aired earlier this year. During one of the segments, Green broadcast live from a prisoner's cell block in Kingston Penitentiary. This is the second time in three years that CHML has won a Gold Medal Broadcast Award. In 1990, the station's Christmas Tree of Hope campaign took top honours in the Station Promotion/Community Service category of the CCBA Awards.

Hamilton's K-Lite FM will be encouraging area businesses to help feed the hungry by donating non-perishable food items to the 102.9 K-Lite FM At-Work Network Food Drive. The campaign runs from Nov. 23 to Dec. 18. Local offices and businesses in the Hamilton-Wentworth Region and Burlington have been asked to fax the radio station on their company letterhead in order to receive food drive boxes. Station reps will then deliver the boxes to those requesting them and the individual businesses will run a food drive at their respective companies. The filled boxes will be picked up by Hamilton Food Share and donated to those in need for Christmas.

Montreal's Oldies 990 helped cheer up children at the Montreal Children's Hospital, Hospital Ste. Justine and the Shriners' Hospital to distribute Halloween candies. The station's promotions director, Walter Levitt, says the Oldies 990 Walk For Those Who Can't "brought Halloween's fun and excitement to young hospital patients who were not able to trick or treat door-to-door this year." On-air

personalities, dressed in original costumes, spent several hours at each hospital talking to children and spreading Halloween cheer.

K-Lite FM and Tim Horton are in the midst of their fifth annual Share The Warmth campaign, which runs to Dec. 12. Christopher Randall, marketing and promotion manager of the Hamilton station, says that since the campaign first began in 1988, more than 22,700 winter coats and jackets (10,200 last year alone), have been donated. The station asks listeners to drop off their unwanted winter coats and jackets to any Cameo, Pioneer, Parker's, Wright's, Professional or Family dry cleaning location. The donated garments are then cleaned, repaired and distributed to the needy in the Hamilton and Burlington area by the Salvation Army.

Steve Shannon joins Valley Radio CHVR Pembroke. The 25-year broadcast veteran replaces operations manager Scott Jackson, who has moved on to a similar role at sister station CHUR North Bay. Jon Blair remains as AM Drive, Rob Webster handles music and PM Drive.

Members of the C-FAX staff and volunteers from the C-FAX Santas Anonymous charity dropped off more than \$25,000 on Thanksgiving Day to Victoria's Mustard Seed Food Bank. The station designated the day as

Thanks-For-Giving Day, a day to prepare the Food Bank for the increase in demand for food expected this fall and winter. We know what studios can do. We want to know what the bands can do live." The first prize is a recording session produced by Kim Mitchell. "Once that's done," says Harris, "we'll distribute it to every rock radio station in Canada. The chance to record with Kim Mitchell makes the WOLF Rock Wars grand prize stand far above any other radio station band contest."





LEONARD COHEN - Literary genius
The Future


Even with the death of vinyl, feel free to call this album a record. For it records our past, present and future -- and things don't look too good, by the way -- but Cohen still manages to let some optimism seep into the final mix. This is a welcomed return for Cohen after 1988's I'm Your Man, and is an excellent album for people who find lyrics important. Lyrically, the title track previews a nightmarish version of the future which -- from a musical standpoint -- doesn't sound as bad as the words convey, because of the heavenly chorus of female backing vocalists. Waiting For The Miracle is a song of resignation about the sad state of our culture. Closing Time, the first single and video, is a return to Cohen's country & western roots which reflects on young love misspent over time. Cohen's current love interest, actress Rebecca DeMornay, gets a production credit on Anthem, a slow-moving song urging people to forget about their preconceived notions of perfection. Democracy, set to a military march beat and featuring Jennifer Warnes on background vocals, is a powerful song about politics in the United States. Light As The Breeze, which again features Warnes on backing vocals, rejoices in the fleeting healing powers of sex. Always, sang with a bluesy, boozy drawl, is Cohen's adaptation of Irving Berlin's 1925 song. The Frederick Knight-written Be For Real, and Tacoma Trailer, a mellow instrumental coda to the album, round out the nine tracks. These songs average six-and-a-half minutes in length, and Cohen's voice never has appealed to a lot of people, but there is no reason why The Future can't lift Cohen above being a fringe player commercially here in his home country. After all, his albums have always been consistently big sellers in Europe. - SM

The Minglewood Band held the spotlight as one of the best rock and blues bands out of Canada's east coast (Cape Breton) from the late '70s through the mid-'80s. They even made the cover of RPM on August 25, 1979. These tracks are what album producer Matt Minglewood and Chris Jangaard (BMG's eastern regional representative) and BMG's keeper of the vaults, Paul White, considered the best from the band's four albums. The package also includes two special tracks, Caledonia, considered Minglewood's anthem throughout the east coast, and Stood Up. Both songs are from a pre-RCA independent release. The band dissolved in the mid-'80s, but Matt Minglewood continued to


keep the name alive from coast to coast, which makes this release so timely. The lineup, in addition to Minglewood on vocals, guitar, keyboards and harp, was: keyboardist Paul Dunn, Don Hann on bass and violin, lead guitarist Mark Macmillan, drummer Bob Woods, and the late Enver Sampson Jr. on harp. Sampson, who was killed in a motorcycle accident in 1985, provides the lead vocals on Price He Pays, which he wrote. Retailers should front-rack this item. The name Minglewood is still magic with consumers, particularly the baby boomers. - WG

The follow-up to last year's Bruce Cockburn tribute album features diverse interpretations of 17 Joni Mitchell songs by (mostly) Canadian artists. Universal Honey's Carey, probably the most overtly pop-sounding song on the album, is the first single and video. Ken Greer's pedal steel guitar highlights Big Faith's version of Free Man In Paris. Sara Craig's sultry vocals take off on This Flight Tonight, a song made popular by Nazareth. Kurt Swinghammer receives an able assist from Tom Walsh's trombone on his tongue in cheek, honky tonk country cover of You Turn Me On I'm A Radio. John Cody and Marti Jones' Songs To Aging Children Come is a sparsely arranged gem produced by Jones' husband, Don Dixon. Woodstock by W.O.W. and A Case Of You by Sloan are two more standout tracks. Other artists appearing on the album are Lorraine Scott, Molly Johnson, Andy Stochansky, Martha and The Muffins, Funky Bummer featuring Anne Beadle, Hugh Marsh, Jonathan Goldsmith, Rob Pilch, Martin Tielli, Spirit of the West, Jenny Whiteley, Squiddly featuring Maria Del Mar, and Rocket Science featuring Laura Hubert and Art Bergmann. - SM



The vocal magnetism and emotion-inspired lyric structuring by Scottish tenor John McDermott presents an unsettling yet poignantly beautiful mindscape of wars that were to end all wars remembered only for a brief two minutes every November 11th. Be prepared for some very sobering and thought-accentuated moments that will prompt the tear ducts to overflow more than a couple of times. These works, so beautifully assimilated into word magic, represent a lost art. Outside of the electric guitar work by Bill Bridges on Iain Campbell's penning of The Sun Is Burning, the instrumentation is acoustic and perfectly balanced to further enhance McDermott's vocal warmth. From Eric Bogle's penning of And The Band Played Waltzing Matilda and The Green Fields Of France, to the more

traditional Rose Of Tralee, The Minstrel Boy, Auld Lang Syne, and Danny Boy (performed a cappella and with instrumental backing), this album is more than memorable in that it is mindful of how supremely satisfying recorded music can be. Produced and arranged by Bobby Edwards and recorded at Toronto's Sounds Interchange. The creme de la creme of Toronto's session musicians added to the professionalism of this production: guitarists Rob Pilch, Bill Bridges, steelman Bob Lucier, keyboardist Norman Amadio, harpist Charlotte Moon, Johnny Cowell on Trumpet, bagpiper Norma Thompson, Jack Zaza on harmonica, accordion, flute and mandolin, acoustic bassman Dave Young, the string quartet of Gerrard Kantarjian, Lenny Solomon, Walter Bablak and Jose Shapero, plus the backup vocals of Pat Power and Doug Tranquada. An exceptionally informative and graphically illustrated booklet included. Did you know that Danny Boy was written by an Englishman? Front-rack this one. It's a great Christmas item. - WG



JACK GRUNSKY
Waves Of Wonder

BMG Kidz - 74321-11971-2-N

Grunsky fancies himself somewhat of an ethnomusicologist and, on his third album, he incorporates both musical styles and instruments from around the globe. In addition to guitar, bass, drums and accordion, there's also a berimbau (Brazilian musical bow), a mbira (an African 'thumb piano'), and a dundun (a Guyanese 'talking drum'). Wave After Wave is an example of African highlife music. I Can Read is a '50s-styled number somewhat reminiscent of Alley-Oop. Junk Rhythm Band teaches children to conserve to a Brazilian samba beat. Pyjaramara is a fun one, as is the Austrian polka tune, I Can Yodel, You Can Too. The album ends with yet another message of positive reinforcement, a version of Louis Armstrong's What A Wonderful World. Waves Of Wonder is an album that even parents shouldn't tire of after repeated playings by their kids. - SM



BRIAN HUGHES - Contemporary Jazz
Under One Sky

Justin Time JU5T-49-2

Edmontonian Brian Hughes, now living in Toronto displays his guitar expertise in contemporary jazz works, all of which he wrote and arranged for this package. He also produced this album which was recorded at Toronto's Inception Sound. Hughes commands a tight ship of equally gifted jazz musicians, regulars, drummer Mark Kelso, percussionist Rick Lazar, electric and acoustic bassman George Koller, and Les Portelli at the acoustic piano and keyboards, with addition keyboard work by Anthony Panacci. The key here is the intricate and sometimes complex synth insertions, which would

probably turn off most jazz purists. Nonetheless, self-taught guitarist Hughes and his team have a natural freedom of instrument impact, whether it be Brazilian, Spanish or African influenced or overly complex. Key are the title track, Thin Blue Line and Nieve Pueras. Percussionist Lazar adds a bit more of the contemporary feel with his vocal rap on Here Comes Trouble (Too). Hughes, who co-produced and performed on Loreena McKennitt's platinum-selling The Visit and just completed a 20-city U.S. tour with the Quinlan Road/WEA recording artist, headlined his own dates at Toronto's Top of the Senator this past week. - WG




VARIOUS ARTISTS

There should be something on this album to please almost every kind of dance music fan. The album gets off to a quick start with its best track, and first single, Simply Majestic's DJ's Put This in The Mix. The very danceable rhythms and the slick rapping of The Boxx make this track geared for the clubs, but the female vocalists in the chorus add a pop element to the song that gives it the potential to hit at radio too. Simply Majestic's The Rhythm Takes Control is another strong club track. The title of Having Fun, a piece of hip hop from Brothers From The Ghetto With The Swing Along Gang, is certainly appropriate. Rave Rain by E.F.A. should be a monster hit with techno types at the clubs. For those into techno house, I'm Over You by 2RSQ is a good choice. And, if you're too tuckered to techno, Proper Etiquette's Thank You Girl is a velvety ballad that could induce some pumping away from the dance floor. - SM



NOWHERE BLOSSOMS - Pop/Rock
What The Flowers Are For
What Gives? Records - WGD.001

The Nowhere Blossoms continue the tradition of fine bands (Jr. Gone Wild, Jerry Jerry and the Sons of Rhythm Orchestra, SNFU) which have emerged from Edmonton. This band makes music that can go from acoustic-based country-folk to powerful rock without missing a beat. And the alternating lead vocals of guitarist David Jackson and keyboard player Lisa Duncan (who has apparently left the band since this album was recorded) also work quite well. All The Way is propelled by guest musician Teddy Borowiecki's accordion. Where Do We Go From Here harkens back to another, more simple, era. Way You Speak reminds me of The Tragically Hip, though I can't pinpoint exactly why. Keep It To Yourself shows a bit of an older R&B influence. And Duncan's Sit, the only song not written by Jackson, is a rollicking tail shaker. The Nowhere Blossoms were nominated for a 1992 CASBY for Favourite New Group/Artist from Western Canada and, although they didn't win, they seem to have a lot of potential. - SM

Gene Watson moves up to #95 with his latest Mercury single, *One And One And One*, a song that was written by Buddy Cannon and John Northrup. Released as a CD single, the track was taken from *In Other Words*, Watson's debut album for Mercury, and is also included on PolyGram CD compilation *Country Focus Autumn '92*. It's interesting to note that well-known Canadian producer Gary Buck produced Watson's album, which might be a good omen. Watson recorded *Paper Rosie*, a song written by Dallas Harms, one of Canada's top country recording artists of the '70s. Released on the Capitol label, it became the #1 single on the RPM country chart on May 28, 1977.

New from Suzy Bogguss is her follow-up single, *Drive South*. The Capitol recording artist has had a 15-week run up the chart with *Letting Go*, now at #19. The new single is from her upcoming *Liberty* album, *Voices In The Wind*.

Martina McBride charts this week with *Cheap Whiskey* (#99), the follow-up to *That's Me* (87). The new song was written by Emory Gordy, Jr. and Jim Rushing. BMG's Ontario promotion rep, David Lindores, is confident this one will be big for McBride. The single is from McBride's RCA album, *The Time Has Come*, which was produced by Paul Worley and Ed Seay.

Shenandoah's new RCA single, *Leavin's Been A Long Time Comin'*, charts this week at #98. The new track is the follow-up to *Hey Mister* (*I Need This Job*), which peaked at #28 after 13 weeks of chart action and now moves down to #66. The new song was written by Mike McGuire, Charlie Craig and Stowe Dailey. Both tracks are included on

Capitol distributing new music sampler disc

Capitol Records is putting a push on some of their "uncentred" acts with a new compilation compact disc.

Titled *Music That Is...*, the disc contains 15 current tracks from such acts as Thelonious Monster, Graham Parker, Television, Low Pop Suicide, Shriekback, Contagion, Blind Melon, and Peter Hammill.

Capitol product manager David MacMillan is sending the disc out to retail outlets, the press, and CAR and campus radio stations, "just to let them know and remind them of what kind of alternative music Capitol is putting out."

MacMillan says that early response to the disc has been favourable and that another similar compilation will probably be distributed early in the new year.

Country programmers wanting to get an idea of what Gordon Lightfoot sounded like in the '60s can get a pretty good sample on Capitol CD compilation #29, where there are three of his tracks. All three: *For Lovin' Me*, *Home From The Forest*, and *Bitter Green*, are included on *The Original Lightfoot*, a three-CD and two-cassette boxed set just released by Capitol.

Joan Kennedy's Christmas album, *A Christmas To Remember*, is enjoying another year of popularity. Two tracks from the album: *Tennessee Christmas* and *Christmas To Remember*, are included on MCA CD compilation #8.

Billy Dean jumps into #1 this week with his *Liberty* single, *If There Hadn't Been You*. His follow-up, *Tryin' To Hide A Fire In The Dark*, has already been shipped and is getting the glad hand from some of the more astute programmers who recognize Dean as one of country's young stars with the most potential. The new single was taken from his upcoming album, *Fire In The Dark*, and was written by Dean and Tim Nichols. Dean co-produced with Jimmy Bowen.

Lorrie Morgan moves into the Top 10 with her RCA single *Watch Me*, which climbed to #5. This is the title track from her album. The follow-up single, *What Part Of No*, which is also on the *Watch Me* album, is now being readied for release.

Alabama's making its way up the charts and jumps into the #10 slot this week with *I'm In A Hurry (And Don't Know Why)*. The track was taken from their RCA album, *American Pride*.

Ricky Van Shelton is the biggest mover again this week. His Columbia single, *Wild Man*, jumps into the #40 position this week.

Sawyer Brown's All These Years is the most added single this week, and enters the chart at #71. This is another composition by Mac McAnally, who also wrote *Cafe On The Corner*, which is still in the Top 10.

Mary-Chapin Carpenter's duet with Joe Diffie, *Not Too Much To Ask* (#18), is followed with her solo track, *Passionate Kisses*. Written by Lucinda Williams, the track was produced by Carpenter and John Jennings, and was taken from her latest Columbia album, *Come On Come On*.

Ted Daigle breaks ground for new releases from Travis Tritt (*Can I Trust You With My Heart*), Wynonna Judd (*My Strongest Weakness*), and John Anderson (*Let Go Of The Stone*), all of which enter his playlist for this week. Daigle is also giving high rotation to Joan Kennedy's *I Need To Hear It From You*.

Terry Kelly is beginning to pick up action on his new single, *In My Father's House*. The track was taken from Kelly's *Gun* album, *Divided Highway*, which was produced by Floyd King and recorded and mixed by Chad

Irschick, Michael Roper and Jacques Poirier at Toronto's Inception Sound Studio. This week the single gets the nod from: Randy Owen, music director at CKGL Kitchener; Ian McCallum, music director at London's BX-93; and from Danny White at CHAT Medicine Hat.

Billy Charles is gearing for chart action with his debut for the Altair label, *Centreville Three*. The song was written by Barry Brown and produced by Randall Prescott and Nashville producer Pat McMakin. The track is included on Altair's CD compilation, *Super Seven*. Charles isn't new to country music. He has been singing and playing bass guitar with his brothers Jeff and Peter for more than 15 years. Their band, Jeffrey and The Juniors, averaged more than 200 one nighters a year for seven years, playing dates from Ontario down to Florida. An album is expected early next year. Charles also has a Christmas track available, *It's Christmas Time Again*, released on the Sony Christmas Sampler. This track was also produced by Randall Prescott.

Rawlco Communications Limited has applied to the CRTC for an extension of its condition of licence for its new Toronto station to March 17, 1993. The application was made known in the CRTC Public Notice 1992-79, dated Nov. 16, 1992. It was noted that the commission had already granted an extension from Dec. 17, 1991 to Dec. 17, 1992. A decision will be announced shortly.

New from Homestead is a three-track CD engineered and produced by Barry Allen for the Edmonton-based label. The three tracks were taken from upcoming albums by Tony White, Tommy Rogers and Gary Donnelly. The White single, *I Loved You*, is a White original, and his first release since his days with RCA and Columbia. *Magic Touch* is the title of the Rogers single. The song was written by Len Kohls and follows a hectic tour schedule for Rogers, which included the Craven Festival this past summer. The Donnelly Track, *The Widow James*, is a Donnelly original. The song is described as "a great radio song, in the tradition of the old gunfighter ballads, with '90s production values." 
