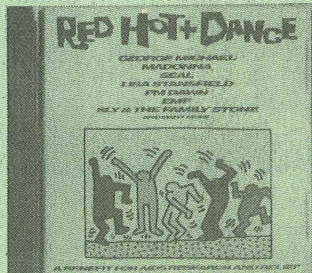

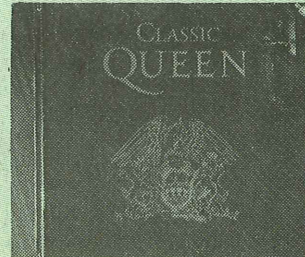

Flood and Ross form new label for Canadian acts

A new Canadian record label called *fre* has been launched by Terry Flood and Derrick Ross.

Flood is the former president of Aquarius Records, where he was involved in developing the careers of April Wine, Corey Hart and Sass Jordan. Ross started his music career as the drummer for the Spoons. He then became general manager of Enigma Records Canada, which was distributed by Capitol Records/EMI of Canada. Enigma was dissolved after four years and Ross, along with former staff members Mark Smith and Debbie Pauk, started DMD Promotions. The company provides marketing and promotional services to Capitol

Genesis is the top draw for concert-goers so far

Genesis was the top concert draw in North America during the first six months of this year, according to the American concert industry's trade publication, Pollstar.

Phil Collins' band grossed \$28 million (U.S.) while the Grateful Dead came in second with \$26.3 million. Bryan Adams ranked 10th on the list, with gross earnings of \$10.4 million.

U2 and Garth Brooks were the hardest tickets to get, while Metallica was the busiest group in the top 10, grossing \$22 million while performing 89 shows in 83 cities.

Backstage Pass and Giant sign distribution deal

Brent Kopperson and Joel Rabinowitz, partners in Backstage Pass, have announced the signing of an exclusive sales and distribution contract with California-based Giant Merchandising.

Backstage Pass is Canada's largest manufacturer and distributor of entertainment-themed licensed merchandise. Giant Merchandising is a two-year-old company whose roster includes Nirvana, AC/DC, Red Hot Chili Peppers, Tesla, Def Leppard and Bryan Adams.

The new titles are now being shipped to retailers across Canada.

Helix Canadian tour ends in tragic B.C. accident

Paul Hackman, the 40-year-old guitar player of Helix, was instantly killed in a motor vehicle accident near Kamloops, B.C. on July 5.

Crew members Allan Russel and Michael Palmer are in serious but stable condition in hospital. Bass player Daryl Gray escaped with minor injuries.

The band had just completed a 22-day western Canada tour and were returning home to Kitchener when their van suddenly veered off the road and went down a 40-foot precipice. Mr. Hackman was killed instantly when thrown from the vehicle. The other members of the band had flown home earlier.

Mr. Hackman co-wrote with the band since its inception 16 years ago. During those years the band released eight albums and gained not only recognition from coast to coast in Canada, but internationally through their many global tours.

"Paul Hackman was a beloved member of the band, and a good friend," said manager Bill Seip. "He will be sorely missed."

A native of Port Franks, Ont., Mr. Hackman is survived by his wife Connie, mother and father, sister Pam Harvey, and two brothers, Larry and Mike. Funeral services were held in Lucan, Ont. on July 10.

October dates set for Foundations Forum

Foundations Forum, billed as "the world's only hard rock, heavy metal convention," is scheduled for the Stouffer Concourse Hotel in Los Angeles October 1-3.

Open to both the industry and the public, the forum was launched in 1988 and has become one of the major music events of the year, last year attracting more than 4,000 participants. The forum features workshops, panel discussions and an exhibit hall featuring booths manned by suppliers, media people and artists.

Special events are also staged, including preview parties for major record releases, presentations of new artists and live music.

The convention is credited with helping to introduce such bands as Warrant, Soundgarden, Extreme and Ugly Kid Joe, and has also featured such major acts as Ozzy Osbourne and Judas Priest.

band's self-titled 1990 album, which has been unavailable since Enigma folded, will also be re-released on *fre*. Ross also manages the Skydiggers and he has high hopes for both the album and its first single, *A Penny More*. "The band has grown with this record. It still has the same intimacy as the first record but there's also progression in the sound. It's a very good mix and it sounds great."

Ross says *fre* won't initially release too many albums, but he expects another one out later this year and four or five more in the next two years. He won't name any acts that *fre* may work with, but he says there are a number of talented Canadian bands that the label is interested in.

"Discovering new music is always exciting and we hope we're going to discover new and exciting artists that will not only capture Canadians' imaginations, but also the rest of the world. Our plan is to have these artists released in all parts of the world and have them perform in all parts of the world. You certainly have to go global to be successful."

The Skydiggers album is only available domestically at the moment, but Ross says Capitol has 45 days to decide if it wants to distribute it in the United States and Europe. If not, *fre* will look down other avenues.

Space-age Blue Rodeo; Star Trek in High Park

Blue Rodeo had an amusing brush with the law while filming the video for their current single, *Lost Together*.

The band and a film crew were set up in Toronto's High Park at 3 a.m. when police cars rolled onto the scene. Thinking that the music was disturbing the neighbourhood, the group stopped playing. However, the police assured them that noise wasn't a factor; they were in the area to investigate a number of reported sightings of unidentified flying objects.

Filming resumed immediately after the crew showed the police the flying saucer that was being used in the video.

Joanna Petty's title track sparks AC interest

Joanna Petty's new single, *Silhouettes & Shadows*, the title track of her *Homestead* album, is beginning to catch on with AC programmers.

The Edmonton-based label has encouraged the use of the song for locally produced music features, public interest programs and fund-raising campaigns directed at "increasing awareness of the plight of children of the street."

Petty says she came across the song one day while sitting on her back porch watching her son play and reading a book about *Covenant House* in Toronto called *Sometimes God Has A Kid's Face*, by Bruce Ritter. "All of a sudden this song came on. It was demo'd by Greg Paul, whose voice I instantly recognized."

"Then, as I heard the lyric, I knew this song was meant for me . . . it couldn't have been more right. It became the title song for my album which is dedicated to my son Matthew . . . and to all of the kids alone on the streets of our cities."

Triumph in studios with new guitarist Phil X

Rather than fold, as some industry pundits had predicted, *Triumph* is alive and well and recording a brand new album.

The announcement of the band's studio activity followed news that Toronto guitarist Phil X has joined the band. The new guitarist has spent the past 18 months touring and recording with several top names in the business, including Aldo Nova, *Frozen Ghost*, *Randy Coven*, and *Jon Bon Jovi*. He has been labelled as "the next true guitar superstar to come out of Canada."

"Phil was one of the guys on our list from day one," says *Triumph*'s Mike Levine. "Gill (Moore) and I are flipping. We're ready to rock."

The trio is currently in *Moore's Metalworks Recording Studios*, where they have already recorded seven band originals. Mixing is expected to be completed by August, allowing for an early fall release for the album.

The band is currently label shopping, and is expected to make an announcement of a major label coupling shortly. A tour is also being pencilled in for early next year.

Frank Stachow, an Edmonton writer who co-wrote the song with Rick Brown, was concerned "with the ever-growing problems of children from broken homes or abusive and uncaring backgrounds who are being forced to look to the streets for survival. They are looking for someone to listen to them, and for any love or security they can find."

The honour includes an appearance on CITY-TV's *Electric Circus* on July 11, plus performances at this year's *Caribana Parade* on August 1 and at the *Olympic Island Caribbean Music Festival*, from Aug. 2-3.

Second prize winners, *W.I.S.E Movement*, will perform at the *Junior Carnival* on July 26. Third place winners were *CIA*.

All competitors had rap lyrics based on a *Caribana* theme.

The competition was open to all rappers and DJs age 25 and under.

Judging the competition were Wayne Williams of *Dance 108 Burlington, Ont.*, and *WBLK*'s Roger Moore.

Mark Altman, recently elected president of SOCAN (RPM - June 27/92), held the position of president of CMRRA for the past eight years.

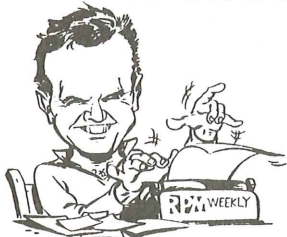

By the way, his Capitol album, *If You Believe In Your Country*, enters the RPM Country 33 album chart this week at No. 25, the biggest jumper of the week. (EC: *No sour grapes here ... !*)

Hey! La Belle Province ... ! There was a time, not too long ago, when Quebec's entertainment industry was singing the separatist jingle in hopes of finding favour with the now departed little René ... and now, Jacques the pom pom man. Well, some of them have discovered the world doesn't revolve around Quebec. Celine Dion is a pretty good example of what can happen with a bilingual or multilingual attitude. (EC: *C'est la vie ... !*)

O! For the love of Mike ... Canada! There they were on Canada Day in Ottawa, with all of Canada watching. Random Killing wins with major label distribution

Random Killing was formed in a Toronto basement in 1984 and, despite a number of lineup changes, the group has remained a vital force in the Canadian independent punk scene ever since.

But after releasing a number of records and cassettes in Canada and Europe, the group found themselves without a lead singer. Drew Kiteley, with no musical background to speak of, volunteered to fill the vacancy. On the strength of his sheer enthusiasm, he was taken aboard in the spring of 1990.

"I play the microphone. That's my instrument. It's a good release to channel your aggression," Kiteley says in an interview at RPM's offices.

Kiteley has been writing most of the band's lyrics lately and says he sings "about things that I can relate to, or that people I know can relate to. I don't know shit about music so I just write the lyrics and tell the other guys to

do something with them."

Kiteley's no balladeer but he was recruited by ska band King Apparatus to contribute some "enforced vocal emphasis" on their debut album. King Apparatus lead singer Chris Murray then recommended Random Killing to their label, Raw Energy. The two parties came together in January.

The band had been writing and recording material in bits and pieces over a two-year period, and eventually 20 songs made it on to their new album, *Welcome*. In April, Raw Energy signed a distribution deal with A&M Records Canada. That makes Random Killing the only hard core band in the country to have a distribution deal with a major label. While Kiteley says some punks have accused the band of selling out, he's more than pleased with the arrangement.

"I'm not fucking doing anything that I haven't done before. All I'm doing is getting someone else to pay for the production, which we're paying for in the end anyways. It's basically an interest-free loan.

BMG and Windham Hill enter into agreement

Windham Hill Productions, a 16-year-old business enterprise, has entered into a new joint venture agreement with the Bertelsmann Music Group (BMG). The signing is part of the company's expansion plans.

Effective May 1, the partnership was unveiled by BMG chairman and CEO Michael Dornemann and Anne Robinson, Windham Hill president and CEO. Robinson becomes managing partner under the new agreement and will continue to direct the company's operations from its corporate headquarters in Palo Alto, California.

Robinson explains, "Since launching our distribution agreement with BMG in 1990, we've been interested in exploring an expanded relationship that would allow us to utilize a wider array of BMG's capabilities while permitting Windham Hill to retain its creative stamp and organizational strategy. BMG's philosophy of seeking strong partnerships, rather than simply acquiring new companies, struck us as the most appealing and potentially rewarding path to follow in evolving Windham Hill's core businesses through the '90s."

"Like many of our creative partners," noted BMG's Dornemann, "Windham Hill is a strong entity that has carved an impressive niche for themselves in the music industry. This new deal offers Windham Hill sound financial backing as well as the opportunity to grow and explore new creative avenues. At the same time, it offers BMG the opportunity to further exploit the innovative product of this unique company, both internationally and domestically."

It was stressed that the deal represents the next step in a relationship that began in 1983, when Windham Hill signed a distribution agreement with A&M Records, which was channelled through the RCA/Arista branch system, precursor to the present BMG network. When A&M was sold to PolyGram, Windham Hill opted to continue its ties with BMG via a U.S. distribution agreement.

"Why shouldn't I let someone pay? It makes sense to me. If you stay independent you can't do fuck all if you don't have any cash. There are a lot of guys out there who would die to have one of these things."

Kiteley knows the market for his music is limited, but he cites the decent sales figures for other Canadian hard core acts such as the BFGs, SNFU, and the Dayglo Abortions. He thinks people are tiring of recent music trends and may be ready to embrace a band like Random Killing. "The time is right. People are looking for better outlets for their energy."

Energetic sums up the band's 'Fluorescent Hell' live show. They dress in glow-in-the-dark colours and the backdrop is a collage of dayglo caricatures which Kiteley paints himself. People are invited on stage as Kiteley flops around and the rest of the band thrashes out songs in rapid-fire succession.

"It makes for a good surreal situation. It's more than just a band. It's a show," Kiteley says. "I like people to feel like they're getting their money's worth."

Molson Accordion Festival returns to Harbourfront

The Molson Dry Big Squeeze Accordion Festival will be held at various locations at Toronto's Harbourfront from July 17-19.

Kicking off the three-day event will be the July 17 evening performance by Buckwheat Zydeco, presented by the Molson Indy Foundation. On the same bill are Montreal's Danielle Martineau and Rockabayo, The Stoaters, and Grievous Angels.

The next day, Martineau and Rockabayo are back for afternoon performances, with Happy As Hell from St. Catharines, Ont., and British duo, Chris Wood and Andy Cutting.

Performing in the evening will be the Toronto Squeeze, featuring the sounds of Brazil, Newfoundland and Greece. The night will be hosted by St. Catharines' four-time Grammy Award nominee and accordion virtuoso, Walter Ostenak.

Highlighted will be: Da Forro (featuring the Brazilian forro accordion and members of Da); Newfoundland's Freddie Northcott and the Bay Boys; and Slowpoke (with Dennis Keldie playing Louisiana cajun and zydeco). Also on tap are Montreal's Boulevard du Crime, the Ottawa Valley's Barney McCaffrey, and a return of The Stoaters. Completing the evening performances will be the Grievous Angels.

Boulevard du Crime are back for a Sunday afternoon performance, along with Chris Wood and Andy Cutting, and Sudbury, Ont. vocalist Daisy Debolt. The afternoon is rounded out by Little Jack Melody and His Young Turks. There will also be a special accordion workshop at 5 p.m. hosted by Peter Jelard of Grievous Angels.

The weekend closes out with a 7 p.m. performance by the 24-piece classical accordion youth orchestra, Akkordeon Landesorchester, from Baden-Wurtemberg, Germany, who will take over the Molson Place Stage.

A big lead! Mariah Carey's version of I'll Be There is solid at No. 1. It increased its margin and now leads the others by a wide margin. You can expect it to remain on top for a few more weeks at least. A lengthy stay at No. 1 won't be new for Carey. Vision Of Love and Someday both stayed at the top for four weeks.

A League Of Their Own. XTC's The Ballad Of Peter Pumpkinhead moves to No. 48. No artist filed under the letter X has ever had a No. 1 song. As a matter of fact, XTC is the only artist filed under that letter to even have a charted song. Making Plans For Nigel was their biggest hit, peaking at No. 12 in 1980. Next on the infrequent list is the letter Z. Name the only two artists filed under Z to have a No. 1 song.

Cochrane does it again . . ! For the second straight week, the song that was the top add the previous week is the hottest song. Tom Cochrane's Mad Mad World jumps 29 places, that's one more than U2's Even Better Than The Real Thing. That combination of top add/hottest song has only been accomplished five times this year, twice by Cochrane. He did it a few months ago with Sinking Like A Sunset.

Slow week. For just the third time in the last eight weeks, no album debuts in the Top 40. Black Sabbath's Dehumanizer has this week's top entry at No. 45.

Gone fishin'! There are plenty of frozen playlists around the country as music directors enjoy some much-needed R&R. Some of those taking off for greener pastures include Tim Bennett of CHUR North Bay, James Warner-Smith of CHAS Sault Ste. Marie and George Gregory of CJCB Sydney.

Getting some Z's. The only two artists filed under the letter Z to have a No. 1 song are Zager & Evans (In The Year 2525) and The Zombies (Time Of The Season). Both songs went to No. 1 in 1969.

MCA's Wharton brings humour to the music business

Rick Wharton isn't your average record weasel; unless, of course, I just haven't heard about other record company promo people climbing onstage to play percussion on an Elvis bust -- like the MCA Ontario promotions and marketing representative does -- as part of a sketch comedy troupe.

The three-man troupe, called Plead The Fifth, takes up much of Wharton's time whenever he's not hustling the latest releases from MCA Records Canada. "I've been at MCA for four years now and they've been really good," he says of his employer. "They know about doing the comedy at nights. It doesn't conflict with my radio promotion work."

The troupe's show, which incorporates sketches, improv comedy, musical parody and improv games, has made Plead The Fifth one of the most popular sketch acts in Toronto. Wharton explains, "If you want the masses to laugh, you've got to be mainstream but hard-hitting. Everybody has to be able to make

contact with it and say, 'Yeah, I've been that guy.' You take reality and put in your own little things and characters."

Plead The Fifth plays a regular Wednesday night gig at Hector's Comedy Cave, which has done a lot to attract local media attention. "We've had articles in almost every Toronto publication with the exception of the Toronto Sun because Billy Ray Cyrus has taken up all their space," Wharton quips.

The troupe is now preparing to shoot a 10-minute segment for a television pilot, called The Badger Show, featuring upcoming Canadian talent. If things go well with the pilot, Wharton believes, the weekly show will most likely appear sometime on the Global Television Network. "Hopefully we'll be the featured comedians each week. We're still waiting to hear what their intentions are."

Taking the live show on the road and doing a comedy radio show, a seemingly lost art form just begging to be revived, are other possibilities.

Wharton and fellow Plead The Fifth member Sean Tweedley are also working on a musical parody production. A lot of the material is together, Wharton says, but they've temporarily shelved the project until Weird Al Yankovic's current album, *Off The Deep End*, fades from peoples' minds.

A one-man stand-up show, tentatively titled *Songs from the B-Side*, is also in the works for Wharton. He thinks his music business experience will help him incorporate music and comedy into a routine that will take shots at the record, radio and retail industries. He's already enticed a lot of co-workers and

associates out to Plead The Fifth shows and, he says, they've been generally impressed.

Wharton welcomes the steadily increasing success that his burgeoning act is enjoying, but the commitment to comedy may eventually become more than his already hectic moonlighting schedule can bear. The 28-year-old's dream is to make a full-time living at comedy, but he still loves being involved in the music industry and would find it hard to leave.

"I guess pretty soon I'll have to make a choice. I do Ontario promotions and, if I wanted to do national, I couldn't do comedy. And if I wanted to do comedy full-time I couldn't be in the record business. So I kind of sit right in the middle.

"Either way, I'm pretty happy right now. I know I can do both and do them really well."

CJRT's Jeff Stubbins receives Ondaatje award

Jeff Stubbins is the recipient of the 1992 Ondaatje Foundation Award for Excellence in Broadcasting. The award is given annually to an individual in recognition of outstanding effort and achievement while at Toronto radio station, CJRT-FM.

Stubbins joined CJRT's staff in 1981 as music director and also took on the mantle of broadcast concert manager. Among his many duties were booking talent for the Sound of Toronto Jazz Concerts (presented by CJRT at the Ontario Science Centre), producing *Records In Review*, and assisting in the recording of classical concerts at the Royal Conservatory of Music.

The award is named after Christopher Ondaatje, a major corporate donor.

West End Girls replace Petrozzi with new face

Vancouver's West End Girls have added 19-year-old Janele Woodley to their lineup to replace Silvana Petrozzi.

Woodley has played piano for nine years and has appeared in school musicals. The Vancouver native has also modeled and acted in movies and television shows which have been shot in the area.

Woodley and the group's two other members, Camille and Aimee, are currently in the studio writing and recording for their next release. Last year's self-titled debut album on A&M featured the hits, *Not Like Kissing You* and *I Want You Back*.

Petrozzi has decided to pursue a solo career and is dedicating her time to writing her own material.

Ted Kennedy publishes new radio research book

There's a new research book available for radio called Canada Pop Weekly.

It's published by Canadian Chart Research and covers the period from January 1960 to December 1991. The book contains a week by week Top 10 along with the top add, top Canadian, and top country song each week.

Ted Kennedy operates Canadian Chart Research and says the book was designed to give a sample of what was happening in Canadian radio. "If you travelled across Canada in any one of those given weeks, you were likely to hear those 10 songs regularly."

Canada Pop Weekly retails for \$49 and Kennedy explains how it came about. "The new book is something I'd wanted to do for a long time because you looked at American chart data and it didn't really reflect what was happening. The easiest example is the Beatles. They got a lot of airplay in Winnipeg in 1963 and, indeed, all across Canada well before February of 1964. I also wanted to give recognition to the Canadian artists that weren't

Art Phillips, well-known songwriter, arranger, orchestrator and producer, is currently scoring a film entitled *Entangled*, which stars Pierce Brosnan (Remington Steele) and Judd Nelson. He is also preparing a soundtrack CD for the movie.

Phillips has also kept his hand in the pop recording business with the release of *Heaven Is Inside Your Love*, which is included on RDR Promopak CD compilation 16.

The song, a Phillips original, has an interesting history. It was first released as a CBC jingle that was turned down. He then put it in a movie entitled *Man In 5A*, which was later changed to *Killing 'Em Softly*.

Performed by Clark Johnson and Irene Cara, the song was omitted from the film because of its length. "What you hear," explains Phillips, "are two Montreal artists (Andrea Kenney and Zander Ary) doing the demo for Irene. I thought it had merit, and decided to put it out anyway. Market reception in a test of 50 people from 18 to 60 was 100 per cent positive."

In addition to Canada Pop Weekly, Kennedy also updates Maple Music semi-annually and Country Canada yearly. Those two books, which retail for \$99 and \$79 respectively, are an artist by artist listing of every song that has made the charts. It is helpful for such CRTC regulations as hit content and Canon.

Kennedy is also directly involved in the music business. "I still do some radio work and I own some retail outlets in B.C."

Kennedy explains why he started putting out the research books. "It started off when I was working in radio. There were no books that would assist radio in CRTC compliance. Obviously it was something that was desperately needed and that's what the first two books are."

Joey Vendetta moves up to acting program director at Toronto's Q107. He takes over the post vacated by Gary Aube, who has moved on, possibly to Ottawa. Vendetta will be responsible for the supervision of the station's day-to-day operations. Elsie Xynos has been promoted to program director of AM 640 -- The New Beat of Toronto. She will be responsible for the supervision of the day-to-day operations of the station as well as continuing as music director, a post she has held since 1990. Xynos is a graduate of the University of Toronto with a Bachelor of Commerce Degree. She started her broadcast career in 1985 when she joined Toronto's Q107. Two years later she was promoted to promotion director for the station. In 1990 she moved to sister station AM640 as music director.

Adams and ZZ Top lead June metal parade

There were 17 certifications in June, down considerably from the 22 certified last June.

However, picking up some of the slack was the welcome news that there were two diamond certifications. The closest last year's certifications came to that magic number was a seven-time platinum, which went to Def Leppard for the *Pyromania* album.

Scoring diamond certifications were: Bryan Adams for his A&M album, *Waking Up The Neighbours*; and ZZ Top's Warner Brothers album, *Eliminator*. Ironically, ZZ Top has just signed a \$30 million deal to jump ship and join RCA.

Tom Cochrane, now established on U.S. charts with both his *Life Is A Highway* single and *Mad Mad World* album, gets the seven-times platinum nod in Canada for his Capitol album. Capitol also certified the self-titled album by Wilson Phillips as seven-times platinum.

Natalie Cole's Elektra album, *Unforgettable*, was the sole quadruple platinum certification, and The Tragically Hip registered the only triple-platinum certification with their MCA album, *Up To Here*.

Solo platinum certifications were for Wilson Phillips (*Shadows & Light*), Right Said Fred (*Up*), Lee Aaron (*Some Girls Do*), Billy Ray Cyrus (*Some Gave All*), and Ugly Kid Joe (*As Ugly As They Wanna Be*).

Certifying as gold were: Kiss (*Revenge*), Weird Al Yankovic (*Off The Deep End*), The Grapes Of Wrath (*Tree House*), Sun Jammin' 2 with various artists, Marty Stuart (*Tempted*), and Lionel Richie (*Back To Front*).

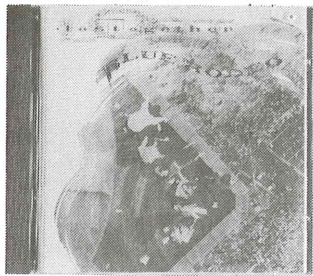

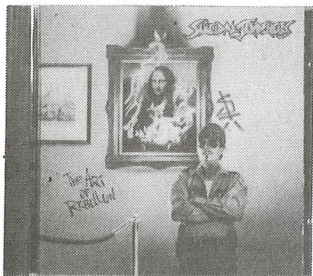

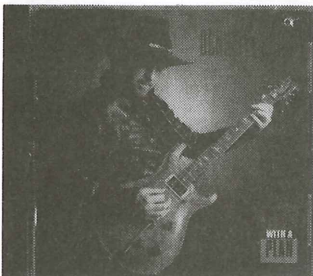

The first single, *Lost Together*, is already making a quick ascent up the charts and others are sure to follow, though some may have to be edited for length to better suit radio. *Fools Like You* makes excellent use of guest fiddler Ian Guenther and Greg Keelor's vocals and lyrics are reminiscent of peak-form Bob Dylan. *Restless*, and *Willin' Fool*, with its extended jam, should prove popular with rock radio. *Casino* was the band's overt attempt to make a pop album but, on this more densely layered release, *Flying* is as close as it gets to classic pop. For those who are more into ballads, *Jim Cuddy* offers *Rain Down On Me*, *Already Gone*, and the first track aimed at country radio, *Last To Know*. Western Skies finds Blue Rodeo at their country-est with Kim Deschamps' pedal steel and Bobby Wiseman's honky tonk piano playing. - SM

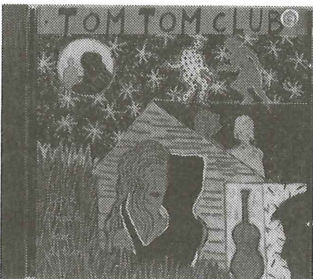


SUICIDAL TENDENCIES - Rock

Vocalist and lyricist Mike Muir isn't a great singer but his voice suits the material well. Muir is still full of venom and vigour and his lyrics can get pretty depressing if you concentrate too hard on them. The top tracks are *Can't Stop, Asleep At The Wheel*, *Which Way To Free?*, *It's Going Down*, and *Where's The Truth*. - SM

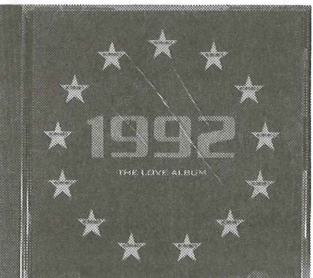


DENNIS ROBBINS - Country

New to the country release field, but a well-travelled performer. Robbins gained much experience during his six-year stint with The Rockets, and during that time he honed his songwriting talents to the point where he gained an important foothold on Nashville's Music Row. He's written for Garth Brooks (*Two Of A Kind*, *Workin' On A Full House*), Shenandoah (*Church On Cumberland Road*), and Highway 101 (*Just Say Yes*). Not too shabby for an unknown. Now he's doing it for himself, with a little help from fellow writers Bob DiPiero and John Scott Sherrill. And he pulled in some of the best pickers in the business for the session, including Barry Beckett, Rusty Young, Larry Byron, Dana Huff and Curt Wolf. He penned the title track with Curtis Wright and Warren Haynes, and *The Only Slide I Ever Played On* with Dean Dillon. His entry onto the charts with *Home Sweet Home*, the first single from the album, has been a little slow, but with a little promotion help, he could bust wide open. Also key are *Paris* and *I Am Just A Rebel*. Robbins is certainly a new country artist to watch. - WG

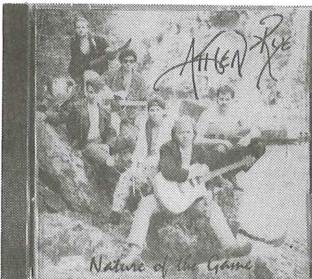


TOM TOM CLUB - Dance/Pop

 The husband and wife rhythm section of Talking Heads started the Tom Tom Club as a side project in the mid-'80s, but Chris Frantz and Tina Weymouth's group is still producing some fine music while Talking Heads are nothing but a pleasant memory and the subject of an upcoming boxed set. This is a sexy album with a lot of funky rhythms that will definitely spawn some dance floor hits. The first single, *Sunshine and Ecstasy*, is the buoyantly danceable first single which apparently has nothing to do with hallucinogens. *Love Wave* features a mellow dance groove, a guitar riff that could have come from a '60s James Bond theme, and Weymouth's vocals sounding like those of a clean-living Marianne Faithfull. *Who Wants An Ugly Girl?* is a gently lilting reggae number. *Daddy Come Home* inserts bagpipes into an electronic dance song and it works surprisingly well. As *The Disco Ball Turns* is another fave. And you can't forget the group's cover of Errol Brown and Hot Chocolate's all-time dance classic, *You Sexy Thing*, this time sung from a woman's perspective. - SM

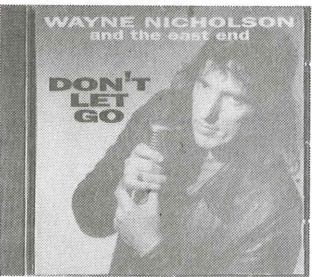


CARTER - Rock

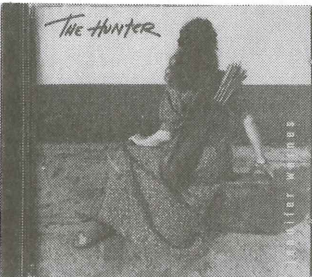

A&R directors should think about giving these guys a second look, as none of these tracks would be out of place on the radio. Lead singer and guitarist Keith Thompson wrote all the songs: two ballads and four more up-tempo tunes. *Hometown Girl* and the title track are both about being in a band and feature some strong playing by the six-member group. *Crash And Burn* chugs along well and *Day By Day*, the most aggressive song on the disc, is highlighted by some impressive guitar work. The two ballads, *It Is You* and *Simple Love*, don't do as much for me. - SM



WAYNE NICHOLSON AND THE EAST END - Rock
Don't Let Go
 East of East - EofE 008
 Nicholson has been a key element in the Nova Scotia music scene for 18 years, first as a member of Oakley and now through fronting his own band. But this is the 41-year-old's first solo effort, released on his own label and nationally distributed by Atlantica Music. The album was produced by blues veteran Matt Minglewood, whose upbeat R&B influence shines through on the lead track, *What's Ailin' Me*. Some nifty work by the Harbour Horns complements another R&B rocker called *Wild About You*. The keyboard player takes a starring role on *Tougher Than You*. The first single, *I Can't Stop Thinking About You*, is a middle of the road tune, as are the other five tracks on the album. - SM



JENNIFER WARNES - Pop
The Hunter
 Private Music - 01005-82098-2-N
 With this package, which Warnes co-

produced with Roscoe Beck and Elliot Scheiner, she stresses that it was "intended to shake out the cobwebs." Based on that comment, *The Hunter* is meant to be a far-cry from her Famous Blue Raincoat release of 1986 (reissued by Private In 1991), a collection of Leonard Cohen songs. It is. Warnes, who has been recording since 1969, exposes a greater warmth and friendliness of song than with her previous releases. Five of these tracks are her own originals. *Rock You Gently*, which isn't one of them (written by Gregory Abbott and Henry Gaffney), has been taken as the first single and will take a bit of work to break at radio. On *Somewhere Somebody*, Warnes is joined on vocals with the song's writer, Max Carl. The song is based on memories of the good times with the late Stevie Ray Vaughan, who performed on *Famous Blue Raincoat*. Other tracks that should attract listener interest are *Way Down Deep*, *The Hunter*, and Todd Rundgren's penning of *Pretending To Care*. - WG



TRACEY PRESCOTT & LONESOME DADDY - Country
Tracey Prescott & Lonesome Daddy

 What the industry thought it had lost, it has gained in spades. No need to go into the history of Tracey Prescott and Lonesome Daddy, but what is important is the excitement generated at Sony Music, a major label, for this Ottawa Valley trio. Don't slot this talent as an old band with a new look. This is a brand-spanking new approach to country that fits right in with the new breed. There's a free-flying vocal freedom here tempered with the confidence and the smooth respect the three players obviously have for each other, with Tracey as the main thrust. Producer Randall Prescott pulled all stops in putting together this memorable package. He mustered some of the best musicians in the business: Eddie Bayers and Ken Post (drums), John Dymond and Jamie Gatti (bass), Steve Pitocco, Terry Tufts and Jon Park-Wheeler (lead guitar), Jon Park-Wheeler and Barry Brown (acoustic guitar), Jerry Douglas (dobro and lap steel), Don Reed (fiddle), Ed Bimm and Steve O'Connor (keyboards), and Barry Brown, Randall Prescott and Terry Tufts on background vocals. Quite a session for Prescott's Lakeside Studio. The first single, *When You're Not Loving Me*, has scored heavy chart inroads. Also key are *Out On The Run*, *Take A Little Time*, and *Nobody's Home On The Range*. Denise Grant did the exceptional photo work for the impeccably laid-out, informative insert booklet. - WG

BLACKBIRD - Rock
Blackbird
 Attic - SBD 5250-Q
 Blackbird consists of singing, songwriting, guitar playing brothers, Chip and Tony Kinman, and a drum machine. The brothers started out in the late '70s as part of The Dils, a well-respected American punk band. In the early '80s they helped create the 'cowpunk' movement by forming the critically acclaimed Rank and File. In 1987 they formed Blackbird. This is their debut album, and it could find a place on AOR stations. *Take Me* is the first single, while *Be My Friend*, *Mary's World*, *Am I Killing You*, and *Howl* are all fine examples of intelligent pop-rock. *Class War* is a remake of a song they originally recorded with The Dils. They also cover the old Little Richard hit, *Lucille*. It's not as frantic as the original but its psychedelic country sound harkens back to the glory days of Rank and File. - SM

Stompin' Tom Connors doesn't get much airplay, but his concert tour and the heavy promotion campaign from Capitol has resulted in his album being very hot at retail. Tim Baker of Sunrise Records slots Connors' album, *Believe In Your Country*, at No. 8 this week. Other Cancon albums included in Sunrise's Top 20 Country are *Prairie Oyster's* *Everybody Knows* (No. 4), *Michelle Wright's* *Now & Then* (No. 15), and *Country Heat* (No. 19), which features several Canadian acts.

Michelle Wright has another chart item with the release of *One Time Around* from her Arista album, *Now & Then*. The track was released by BMG as a CD single and country programmers were quick to pick the track, some moving it onto their charts immediately. The new single is the follow-up to *Take It Like A Man*, which topped the RPM Country 100 on June 6/92, holding onto that position for three weeks. The new song, which qualifies as two-parts Cancon (AP), was written by Chapin Hartford and Don Pfrimmer and produced by Rick Giles and Steve Bogard.

Cindi Cain's new single is looking very good, gaining good chart adds and playlistings. The single (*You Made A*) *Rock Of Gibraltar*, enters the RPM Country 100 at No. 96.

T.M. Harding is getting a push on the release of *What Goodbye Really Means*, the fifth release from the CKWX *Winners Circle* CD. Harding won the Ray McCauley Horizon Award at the 1992 BCCMA Country Music Awards, and is preparing to shoot two videos this fall to support her recently released debut cassette. Harding and her band just completed two weeks at Baldini's Cabaret and Casino in Sparks, Nevada. They have been asked to return for another two weeks in September. On tap are dates at the Calgary Stampede, the Pacific National Exhibition, and the Salmon Valley Festival in Prince George. She returns to Nashville in the fall to showcase once again for several majors.

Charlie Louvin and Crystal Gayle's duet of *Just Beyond The Pain* is being released as a CD single by ATI. The single, now charting in U.S. trades, was taken from Louvin's album, *50 Years Of Makin' Music*. The album, produced by Miami's Jack Gale, also contains duets with Willie Nelson, Charlie Daniels and others. ATI's Scoot Irwin will be releasing Louvin's album in Canada over the next few weeks.

Vince Gill has confirmed a Toronto date for July 28 at the Ontario Place Forum. Gill enters the chart this week at No. 87 with his latest MCA single, *I Still Believe In You*.

TMP and Byron Hill have signed a worldwide songwriting deal. Toronto-based TMP operates a worldwide joint venture with MCA Music Publishing. Byron, who lives in Nashville, is a respected member of Music Row with almost 200 recordings of his songs by some of the top names in the business. These include Anne Murray, Randy Travis, Reba McEntire, Ray Charles, Kenny Rogers and more. He also

wrote Alabama's *Born Country*, George Strait's *Fool Hearted Memory*, and Pickin' Up Strangers from Johnny Lee. Hill will be based in MCA Music Publishing's Nashville office.

Michelle Wright's video, *Take It Like A Man*, has topped both the Nashville Network's Video Top 10 and Country Music Television's Top 10 Video Countdown. Wright hit the top of the RPM Country 100 on June 6, and her single remains in the Top 10 after 16 weeks. Wright's album, *Now & Then*, remains at No. 2, right behind Billy Ray Cyrus, a tough act to follow.

Wynonna Judd's *Winnipeg* date was a media celebration, particularly from radio. The Winnipeg Arena was the setting for a well-paced concert. Backstage after the show, Country 630 Radio's PD Doug Anderson had the chance to meet the MCA star. Also in the receiving line were Brandon's CKLQ 880 Country's Shawna Rigaux, who handles promotions, and Shawna Dubek.

exceptional job on Last Night I Fell In Love Again, which he co-wrote with Don Schlitz. Interestingly enough, the title track, a tribute to Texas, was originally recorded by Walker in 1972. This track would prove to be very interesting as a single. Rykodisc is distributed in Canada by Denon.

Tracey Prescott & Lonesome Daddy are the big news in country this week. Sony Music's Bill Bannon has worked overtime on the release of this Ottawa Valley trio's re-entry into the business. For those who think something old can't be new again. The proof is in the release of Tracey and company's debut for the Columbia label. Great vocals, harmonies, instrumental backing and superb packaging. Everything has been done to perfection, right down to the insert booklet. Not too many domestic acts have had this treatment. The first single, When You're Not Loving Me, has already broken the Top 20 on the RPM Country 100. This album also reveals why Randall Prescott has been voted Canada's top country producer so many times.

Garth Brooks, finally unshackled by what seemed to be a longer than usual pregnancy for his wife, will soon hit the road for some pretty important dates. One of them will be Toronto's CNE Grandstand on Sept. 3. Also ready is a Brooks Christmas album and his next studio release. Although he hasn't been doing too many dates or collecting of his awards, he has been busy on the charts. His latest, The River, is showing excellent chart gains which should fuel even more sales for his Ropin' The Wind album.

Billy Ray Cyrus is looking good with Could've Been Me, his follow-up to Achy Breaky Heart. His debut single, of course, is still the novelty phenomenon of the year. Every radio format, with the exception of classical music, is programming his Mercury single. There are still some doubters within country music circles and Travis Tritt was the first to hang out the dirty laundry. His negative remarks about Achy Breaky Heart, which he apologized for later, didn't do much justice to the supposed friendly spirit of the country music industry. It hasn't dampened sales of his album. Some Gave All is still the top-selling album at most retail outlets across Canada.

Stacy Dean Campbell has a foot in the door with his debut for Columbia titled Rosalee. Campbell, a native of New Mexico, co-wrote the song with producer Brent Maher and Don Schlitz. The track is included on his upcoming album, Lonesome Wins Again. An interesting note about Campbell's entry into the business was how he did it. On the very day he was offered a job as sheriff's deputy for the Oklahoma County Sheriff's Department, he got a call to come to Nashville to record the song demos that eventually led to his signing to Columbia. He now lives in Nashville where he has a lot of believers, which could catapult him into the winner's circle.

Rena Gaile is taking advantage of her early chart action to do an effective mailing on her RDR single, Daddy's School. Attached to a card, with the heading, "Looking for this summer's hottest ad?" is a clever, fold-down opera/style binocular pack. In the meantime, her single continues to gain chart and playlist entries.

Classic Country Music Reunion will host a three-day jamboree at the Lindsay, Ont. Fairgrounds from July 31-Aug. 2. The weekend will feature a special tribute to country and bluegrass acts from the '50s through to the '90s. The all-Canadian lineup includes Gene MacLellan, Lucille Starr, Ronnie Prophet, Johnny Burke, Gordie Tapp, Eddie Eastman, and more. A steel guitar concert is also scheduled along with a Sunday Gospel Hour, country dancers, a pancake

breakfast, cloggers and clowns. The CCMR is a non-profit organization dedicated to the preservation of Canada's country heritage. Profits will be donated to Crime Stoppers and other local charities in Lindsay and surrounding areas.

Country 101 CHFX-FM Halifax staged a benefit concert for the Westray Miners Relief Fund. The benefit was particularly moving, being that it was held on Father's Day, a day when families remember fathers. The benefit was held at the Dartmouth Sportsplex and was presented in conjunction with Metro Weekly Telecaster, Ross Music Sales and St. Anthony's Men's Association. Donating their talent were John Snider and Fondango, Trio, Trena Fredricks, Gord Giles, Louisa Manuel, Joyce Simone, Darren Tardiff, Mark Raven, Tracy Mader, Keith Ross and his Fiddling Friends, and Sean Bates. All proceeds from the \$5 ticket price went towards the relief fund.

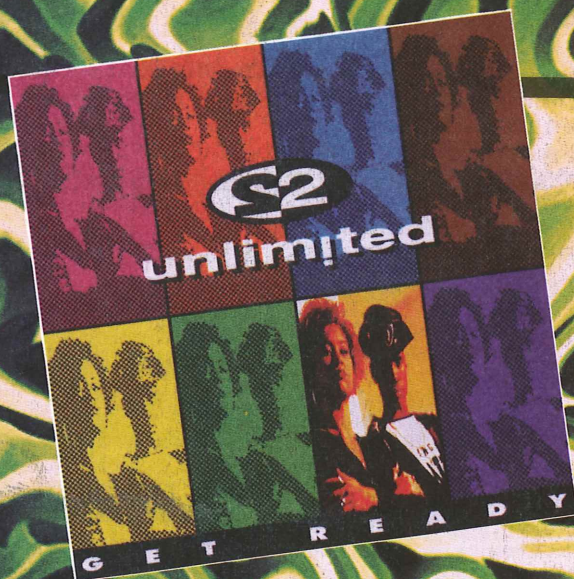

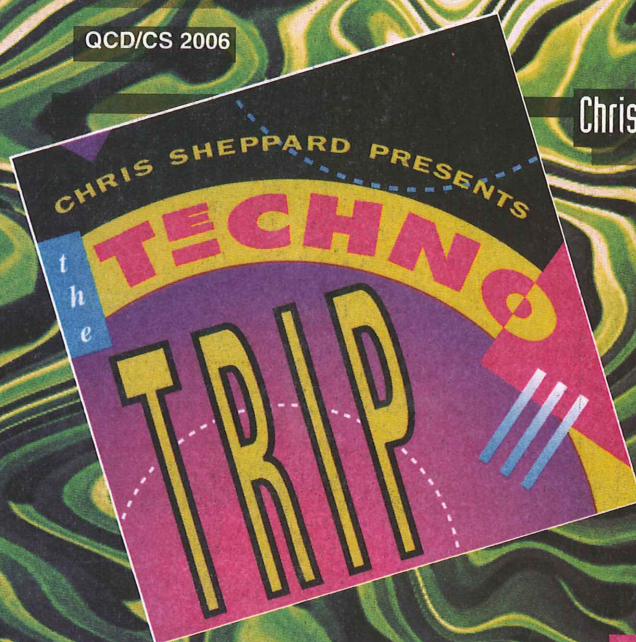
