SOCAN reports improved figures for 1994 year-end

Francois Cousineau, president of the Society of Composers, Authors and Music Publishers of Canada (SOCAN) has announced that performance rights license fees and royalties reached \$78.9 million in 1994, an increase of 1.4% over the previous year.

SOCAN is a non-profit society owned and

administered by its member composers, songwriters, lyricists and music publishers. The organization collects performing rights license fees for the public and broadcast performances of the world's copyright music in Canada and distributes royalties based on those performances. SOCAN also collects and distributes royalties for performances of Canadian

music around the world.

According to Cousineau, "SOCAN is proud of the achievements of its members, and we are especially gratified to watch their success abroad. We will continue to fight hard for the protection of creators' rights."

Cousineau also reported that SOCAN is continuing to lobby the federal government to enact some form of copyright legislation regarding the collection of licensing fees from cable television systems in Canada.

1994 did see slight decreases in license fees from radio and television. However these decreases were offset by increases in other areas. Royalty payments from SOCAN increased by 24% over 1993, to \$75.4 million. This increase came about thanks to a special distribution last year representing a portion of the commercial television license fees withheld since 1990 pending that tariff's approval in the end of '93.

SOCAN general manager Michael Rock indicates that, although the growth was certainly marginal, it's still something worth celebrating, considering today's economic environment.

"It's up marginally, we're up about a million from the previous year, which is pretty good, considering the way things are these days. We had been used to growth, but there's really not much growth in the part of the economy that we're connected to.

"The growth has to do with a couple of things. We got some money from the Quebec government, and we got some money from the concert tours as well. Pink Floyd and the Stones were on tour, and that helped to get an increase of half a million dollars over the previous year. But the radio



EMI Music Canada restructures sales departments

Al Andruhov, vice-president of sales for EMI Music Canada, has announced several reorganizational changes within the company's sales department.

John Toews has been named to the newly-created position of special markets and catalogue national sales manager. In this new role, Toews will develop sales volume and strategies for catalogue campaigns with national accounts, budget product,

special markets and premium exploitation.

Brad Morrissey has been appointed central regional sales manager. Morrissey joined EMI more than 10 years ago, and has been a key member of the western regional sales team.

Ralph Schmidtke has assumed the position of western regional sales manager. Schmidtke joined the company in 1986, and since then has grown within the ranks at EMI, where his most recent position was west coast sales supervisor.

All the above appointments are effective July 1.

Effective June 1, Kelly Zamiski will move to Vancouver to assume the position of sales representative. This too is a newly created position, due to market growth within the west coast region. Also, Kalen Morton will be promoted to Edmonton sales representative, replacing Zamiski.

Andruhov also announced that the

replacement for Schmidtke as west coast sales supervisor and Kalen as Calgary customer service rep will be decided upon at a later date.

Annie Lennox's Medusa hits platinum in 4 weeks

BMG has announced that Annie Lennox's latest RCA release, *Medusa*, has surpassed platinum status in Canada in just four weeks.

This latest album hit #1 on the RPM 100 Albums chart on April 24, the first number one record for Lennox, either solo or with Eurythmics. The success of the album is being spurred on by the lead single, 'No More 'I Love You's', which is #1 on both the RPM Adult Contemporary and 100 Hit Tracks charts.

Lennox helped promote the album herself by doing a rare live performance on *MuchMusic's* *Intimate and Interactive* program this past March. The program will be repeated on June 3.

Livent adds PR muscle to Toronto/Vancouver offices

Livent has announced two new appointments to its public relations departments in Toronto and Vancouver.

Grant Ramsay takes on duties as press representative for Sunset Boulevard. He is officed in Toronto.

Ramsay has worked as a publicist in Toronto for the past eight years, most recently at Harbourfront Centre. Prior to that he held publicity positions at various arts organizations in Toronto. As an independent publicist, he has worked for

Follows/Latimer Productions, Concert Productions International and Roy Thomson Hall/Massey Hall Corporation. Ramsay has a Bachelor of Applied Arts in journalism from Toronto's Ryerson Polytechnic University.

Janet Mitchell has been appointed director of media relations for western Canada, working out of Livent's Vancouver office.

Most recently, Mitchell was with the BC Ministry of Attorney General. However, she is best recognized for her work at the Vancouver Opera Company where she held several positions, from publicist to marketing manager. Mitchell has also worked as marketing manager for the faculty of commerce at the university of British Columbia. She has also worked in both Toronto and Vancouver with such clients as Procter & Gamble, China Airlines, the Portuguese government tourist office and Six Flags amusement parks.

Deadline for entries is June 23.



"The world market for television has expanded greatly in the past 10 years," notes Rock. "There is a great demand, and Canadian shows are seen all over the world now and they have, by and large, Canadian music in them. So it's been excellent for a number of members who are in that area. Children's shows have been a highpoint, certainly. It's a very competitive area, but I guess once you're in there, it can be very rewarding too."

The impact Canadians are having on foreign television makes the proposed copyright legislation for cable television even more important.

"It's an important source of income for just the balance of payments in Canada. Music is only a small component of that. There are the actors, the script writers, and it's all high-tech stuff. There are several Canadian companies that are on the leading edge of computer animation, so this cable rights thing is important for everyone, not just music people."

SOCAN also reported that Canadian songwriters received considerable airplay internationally in 1994. Members whose hits saw international play included K.D. Lang, Ben Mink, Mars Bonfire, Tom Cochrane, John Capek, Marc Jordan, Luc Plamondon, Shirley Eikhard, Charlie Major, Jean-Pierre Ferland, Roch Voisine, Stephane Lessard, the writer members of Crash Test Dummies and Tragically Hip, and classic writers Gordon Lightfoot, Randy Bachman and Burton Cummings. Concert-music composers whose works received foreign play included Jacques Hétu, Bill Douglas and Oskar Morawetz.


WALT SAYS . . . !

Free enterprise . . . YEAH!!! A guy asked me the other day if I was upset that Canada Council would be cutting off its support. After he picked himself up, I carefully explained to him that never, NEVER, in all the 30 years that RPM has been publishing, had we received one dime of government support . . . any government support, for the magazine. We are proud to be part of free enterprise, something that a lot of magazine can't boast. (EC: *Shout it out loud and clear, FREE ENTERPRISE . . . !*)

Look out for NXNE . . . !

These guys have it all together, with a lot of help from KM, you know, late of . . . whatever. Toronto's going to be the place to be over those three days in June, from the 15th through the 17th. On the music side, they're covering everything from dance, country, Caribbean, native and even classical crossover music. (EC: *Sounds like a street festival . . . !*)

More radio news . . . ! Watch for Triple A Radio to finally surface in Toronto. Speaking of which, in the July 11, 1987 edition of RPM, Warren Cosford, who was then programming CHUM-FM, proved what a visionary he was, and still is. Here's a portion of what he wrote. "For the first time in 30 years, most of radio is programming to adult listeners, because the advertisers want them. The music industry however, is still making music for kids, therefore radio is forced to play a lot of old records. For the record companies, this has created a boom for reissues. But at some point, everyone has got to see that we are in a era of music by adults for adults, and today's adults will buy records. It's a habit. They're buying old records now, and they'll buy new records tomorrow, if someone makes some new music for them. It's starting to happen. The first music for adults by adults records is the first album in many years to reach the #1 position on US trades without first having a Top 20 single, and that's Graceland. In Canada, we have another, Jennifer Warnes' Famous Blue Raincoat. Both of these records have at least one thing in common, a '60s rock and roll attitude using '80s technology. They are not pop pap, nor are they nostalgic. They are the beginning of a new cycle." With knowledge like that in the '80s, is it any wonder that Cosford had the magic touch to establish a Canadian radio station, The River (CIDR-FM 93.9), as the first REAL Triple A radio station in North America? (EC: *Triple A Radio won't work in Toronto . . . just yet!!!*)

Is the empire collapsing . . . ? Well, it's just a small empire, but when the roster begins to get smaller, even by one, that's a sign of trouble brewing. If you ain't taking care of business, and playing favourites, not to mention interfering and living high on the hog, people talk and talk and talk. (EC: *Is it bigger than a breadbox . . . ?*)

Another radio guy gone . . . !

It's a sad commentary on radio to see so many of the REAL programmers being let out. The latest is Doug Anderson, PD and morning personality at CKRC. He made a lot of friends in the record industry, and helped make the station a country institution in the Winnipeg area. (EC: *With that kind of endorsement, he won't be on the loose too long . . . !*)

Bad news . . . ! BA is lurking somewhere on the internet. He's also managing a couple of bands. And, he has discovered, much to his surprise, the friends he thought he had when he had power, don't return his calls. (EC: *Burning bridges . . . falling down!!!*)

A yuk from Kevin . . . ! CFGP Grande Prairie morning guy Kevin Hilgers tried this on his listeners. "Elton John's new album is out . . . Made In England . . . although his hair's still made in Taiwan." And then he tried this one. "A guy's driving down the highway in his pickup and gets pulled over by the RCMP. The cop walks up and notices the guy has a Budweiser label on his forehead, and asks, 'Have you been drinking?' The guy says, 'Oh no sir . . . I'm on the patch'." (EC: *Do they get better . . . ?*)

More piracy problems . . . ? CD-Recordable (CD-R) equipment is adding to the piracy problems the record industry is faced with. This time around however, the majors are playing hardball with the hardware manufacturers. (EC: *How does that work if you are a manufacturer of both hardware and software . . . ?*)

CDs are unreal . . . ? Now, who would have thought that the great and wonderful technology that brought us into the world of the compact disc, could be flawed? Remember when the consumer was sold a bill of goods that the sound on a CD was free from hiss, pop and crackle -- that, in fact, the listener could finally enjoy the REAL sound of music? Well, forget it. There's a couple of guys in California with Pacific Microsonics, who have developed what they call a High Definition Compatible Digital (HDCD) system. According to a report in the Economist (April 15/95) the new system will allow listeners to "pick out individual instruments and voices," and get this, "hear a twig crack in a forest." Now, ain't that great news for the consumer? Apparently the majors, or those with muscle, are lining up against the new system. But, and here come the hardware manufacturers again, "a decoder to decipher all the extra data on HDCD recordings," is now available and a bunch of hi-fi firms now have available HDCD-based converters or CD players containing a \$40 chip, or decoder. So, watch out, the HDCD system is here. (EC: *More confusion for the consumer . . . !*)

Broadcasters were pissed . . . ! The Big Country people, of which I am one of two, in their wisdom, or lack of, made the decision a couple of years ago, to pull the plug on the write-in categories for country radio and for country radio personality. The mail has been building. The broadcasters want

their awards back, and this year, VOILA, they're back. The radio personality category was among the first awards, launched in 1975. The winner that year was Charlie Russell (CJCJ Woodstock, New Brunswick). The next year it was Johnny Murphy (CHML Hamilton). Ted Daigle (CKBY-FM Ottawa) won it the next year. The winners in the following years were Bill Anderson (CFRB Toronto), Robin Ingram (CFAC Calgary), Cliff Dumas (CHAM Hamilton), Randy Owen (CKGL Kitchener), Paul Kennedy (CHFX-FM Halifax) and finally the last one in 1992 which went to Cliff Dumas (CHAM Hamilton). The top country radio station category was introduced in 1985. The first recipient was CFGM Richmond Hill, followed by CHAM Country in Hamilton, which won every year, up until we dropped the category. (EC: *Maybe that's why the category was dropped . . . !*)

Livent productions score NYC's critics awards

Livent's production of Show Boat won four 1994-95 New York Outer Critics Circle Awards, and Sunset Boulevard was named outstanding Broadway musical.

Show Boat, directed by Hal Prince and which opened at New York's Gershwin Theatre on Oct. 2/94, headed the list with four awards, the most received this season by any Broadway musical or play. Prince was named outstanding director of a musical, Susan Stroman received the outstanding choreography award for her work on both Show Boat and A Christmas Carol, and Show Boat's three designers, Eugene Lee (production design), Florence Klotz (costume design) and Richard Pilbrow (lighting

design), together won outstanding design. Show Boat, which has the distinction of being the highest weekly grossing show on Broadway, also received the award for outstanding revival of a musical.

Sunset Boulevard won outstanding Broadway musical and Glenn Close (Norma Desmond) won outstanding actress in a musical. Livent is co-producing Boulevard with The Really Useful Company for its Canadian premiere starring Diahann Carroll at the Ford Centre for the Performing Arts in North York this October.

Show Boat, which had its world premiere in October 1993, will conclude its Toronto run on June 11/95 before touring to St. Paul, Minnesota and then will be staged as the inaugural production of Livent's new \$24.5 million Ford Centre for the Performing Arts in Vancouver.

The Outer Critics Circle is an organization of writers from out-of-town newspapers, national publications and other media beyond Broadway, who critique New York theatre. The awards will be presented at the 45th annual awards ceremony May 26 at Sardi's Restaurant.

K-Tel re-enters dance field with Club Mix 95

K-Tel Entertainment (Can.) Inc. has announced the launch of its new Cold Front dance compilation label. The premier release on the new label will be Club Mix 95, a new 74 minute, 15-track compilation that will be released June 9.

The album, which will be backed by some strong TV advertising, will be K-Tel's first foray back into the dance music field since the disco days of the late '70s.

K-Tel will be keying on two tracks which have been made available exclusively to them via US indie dance label, Eightball Records. The Mack Vibes Jacqueline hit Mr. Meaner and the Joi Cardwell dance fave Jump For Joi will both be promoted via 12" and CD single versions to dance pools, clubs and radio.

Also included on the album are such US dance hits as 20 Fingers' Short Short Man, Fun Factory's Close To You, Dawn Penn's You Don't Love Me and Right In The Night by Jam Spoon.

Cinram acquires second French video duplicator

Toronto-based Cinram Ltd., North America's largest independent manufacturer of pre-recorded music carriers, has announced the purchase of the shares of Video Pouce, S.A., one of the leading video duplicator companies in France. The company, situated near Paris, has an estimated production capacity of 20 million video cassettes per year.

One-hundred percent of the shares of Video Pouce was acquired for a cash consideration of approximately \$1.5 million. The company was purchased from Altus Participations, S.A., an affiliate of Credit Lyonnais.

Video Pouce reported sales of approximately \$30 million Canadian in 1994, incurring a loss of \$1.8 million. The loss included a one-time severance cost of approximately \$1 million, due to a significant reduction in the company's labour force.

Earlier this year, Cinram announced the acquisition of Duplication France, S.A., one of France's largest video cassette duplication companies (RPM - Apr. 3/95). The new acquisition of Video Pouce means that Cinram now holds a substantial share of that market in France.

Cinram has already begun putting in place a new management team, a cost reduction program and a new marketing and sales effort. The company also anticipates adding compact disc replication to the current facilities, and eventually, digital video and disc manufacturing capability.

Liona Boyd gains artistic freedom with latest album

The classical music field has always been the most conservative and restrained of all the musical genres. New artists are always looked upon with guarded optimism, and new composers even more so. The classical repertoire continues to subsist largely on works that were written hundreds of years ago, with the classical community always maintaining a wait-and-see attitude when it comes to fresh compositions.

It's for this reason that Liona Boyd, an artist with 19 albums to her credit, found it enormously difficult to get her own music heard. Long considered this country's finest exponent of the classical guitar, Boyd has consistently struggled to get her own material on record.

"I've been including some of my pieces on my records for about the last 10 years. When I was signed to CBS New York, I asked to put a couple of my pieces on and they said 'well, okay, if you really need to'. They never really encouraged me that much. That was actually one of the main reasons why I left Sony, because they wanted me to do a mariachi record, and I wanted to do my own pieces."

Her efforts to gain her artistic freedom eventually landed her at A&M, via her own Moston Records label. And after writing her own material for many years, she was finally able to release an entire album of Boyd originals, entitled *Classically Yours*.

"I've got enough material actually for a couple of albums, but I tried to pick my favourites for this record. I think production-wise this is the best record I've had, I really like the sound."

Stylistically, the album ranges from the traditional Spanish sounds of Asturiana, Habanera and Madrilena, to the more Vivaldi-esque piece, *Serenades For The Seasons*. (see RPM - May 8/95, page 8). But perhaps the piece that Boyd takes the greatest pride in is *My Land Of Hiawatha*, her tribute to her native Canada.

"The Canadian one, *My Land Of Hiawatha*, was actually written when I spent a lot of time in Mexico, but I was remembering a lot of the adventures I had in Canada. I'd done a whitewater canoe trip on the Mississipi River, and that inspired me to write things that had a Canadian flavour. Because there really isn't anything typically Canadian in the classical guitar field."

"It is my interpretation, it's not really based on any particular theme. It's about the feelings I had

while traveling through the north. I know it may sound corny, but that's the one I dedicated to everyone in Canada, all the people that have supported. Not just my friends, but everyone in Canada that's appreciated my music."

What makes this album so special for Boyd



is the profoundly personal aspect of all the pieces. The Spanish influence comes from her own family heritage, with her father's family hailing from Spain. But other material touches an even deeper chord with the first lady of the guitar.

"The pieces are quite varied. I was very inspired by my husband when I first met him. Two weeks after I wrote *Lullaby For My Love*, which is a very romantic song, and obviously it's his favourite piece. The *Seven Ages Of The Seasons* was kind of a sad story. That I dedicated to my closest girlfriend who was killed in a car accident in December. Dale (Mearns) played a big role in my life, we traveled the world together, and she actually introduced me to my husband."

It's clear when speaking with Boyd that her husband has become the most important person in her life. It was after the two got married that Boyd made the permanent move to California, where she and her husband own a home in fashionable Malibu. Boyd admits that, while California can be heaven on earth, it hasn't been without its excitement.

"Ever since I came here, there have been fires, floods, riots, earthquakes, mudslides, just about everything. But it's certainly beautiful, I love being here. I have no complaints, it's a very exciting city because there's just so many creative people."

Boyd noted that, despite being a fellow Canadian, it wasn't until she moved to California that she met Leonard Cohen and Joni Mitchell. And it was also after arriving in California that she met legendary film composer Maurice Jarre, which led to her first venture into film scores.

"I've always wanted to play on a major film score. I got a call almost a month ago from Maurice. We did the music to a film called *A Walk Through The Clouds*, which is coming out in August. We recorded with a whole orchestra though, it wasn't just me. I'd done some small documentaries before, but nothing really big until now. Hopefully this will open the door for future ones as well."

Along with her new interest in film music, Boyd is keeping busy with other interests. She's part of a group of artists, along with fellow Canadian Oscar Peterson, who are working on a music educational game for children. And she's putting the finishing touches on her autobiography, something that's been on-going for the past seven years. After all, she notes, it was writing that she really fell in love with in school, before music.

"I never thought music would be my career. I was studying ballet, and I wanted to be a dancer. And writing was what turned me on the most, English Literature was always my favourite subject. I was in a big dilemma at university, I wanted to study English, but my guitar teacher said I should try for the music faculty. I didn't take it seriously, but, lo and behold, I got accepted."

"But I still love writing. I'm writing my autobiography now, called *With Strings Attached*, of course. I've been going at it for about seven years now, but it should be ready soon. I'm really enjoying it though, because I do love writing."

Thankfully, for the rest of us, Boyd did choose to venture into music. And *Classically Yours* should prove to be her most complete and personal album to date.



GINO VANNELLI -Pop


It might be easy to cast Vannelli off as a has-been, somebody who may have had a modicum of success, but doesn't really have it anymore. But this is a guy who scored a Grammy nomination with just his second album and his first big hit, *People Gotta Move*. A guy who created an album called *A Pauper In Paradise* that featured a 16-minute orchestral piece by the Royal Philharmonic. A guy who scored another Grammy nomination for his monster hit, *I Just Wanna Stop*, and coupled, along with brothers Joe and Ross, five consecutive Junos as top male vocalist, producer and engineer. Sure, that was a few years ago, but the man deserves some respect. Vannelli has clipped into his past on this latest release, finding the feel and the soul of the record in the jazz, be-bop era of the forties and fifties,

and artists he grew up with like Tony Bennett, Billie Holiday and Joe Williams. Instead of coming off as a Harry Connick Jr. pastiche, this is something a little different. Vannelli hasn't just dropped into the past and lifted a bunch of standards into the '90s - he's written his own material, incorporating classic jazz and '50s pop elements. And it works. Lyrically, the songs focus on the struggle we all have for identity, and overcoming the tugs and temptations of life. Songs such as *Jehovah And All That Jazz*, *Walter Whitman (Where Are You)* and *A Little Bit Of Judas* bring that theme into focus. Musically, the album hits several emotions, from the angst of *Unbearably Blue*, to the sorrow of *I Die A Little More Each Day*. Vannelli has always been one of Canada's finer musical exports, and deserves a little respect. This should help him earn it. -RR

FIRE ROOSTER - Pop



East Coast natives Dave Roberts and Bruce Nelson have been mainstays of the maritime music scene for years, fronting several bands and numerous recording projects. When the pair met up with bassist Paul O'Brien, the result was a group that should keep Roberts and Nelson tied down to one project, for a while at least. Most of the music pouring out of the east coast scene these days is of a celtic flavour, usually with an eye on the



country charts. But Fire Rooster has gone another route, preferring instead to focus on more of a pop/rock style. It may not make them an instant add at radio, what with the

pre-conceived ideas concerning maritime music. But given a few listens, the record could spark some interest at some of the harder AC and pop adult stations in Canada. The band was tabbed for an ECMA award for top pop/rock artist, and the first couple of singles, *River Of Tears* and *I Never Told You*, have picked up airplay on various stations throughout the country, in formats ranging from CAR to Country to campus. The addition of drummer Chris Munro has rounded out the band, giving it a stronger focus. This album, produced by David Rahsed at Glace Bay's Overtom Studios, could be a left-field choice. Pick singles include the aforementioned pair, along with *Red Moon* and *Put The Pieces*. -RR



MARIO ARCURI -Pop



The realm of male pop crooners in this country seems to begin and end with Quebec native Roch Voisine, but this up-and-comer is hoping that there's room for at least one more Canadian at AC radio. Arcuri is a native of Caledon, Ontario (just north of Toronto), and makes a living, during the daylight hours, as a teacher at a local catholic school. When the night comes, Arcuri pulls his guitar and keyboard out of the closet and works on his own material. Arcuri isn't example a foreigner to the music scene. He honed many of his skills as a member of Toronto '70s cover band, The Torch, a group that ultimately opened for the likes of Burton Cummings, David Wilcox and Carole Pope. Arcuri was influenced by the likes of Seger, Springsteen and Mellencamp, but those traditional rock and roll influences don't carry over here. Instead, Arcuri has painted more of a pop adult picture here, more reminiscent of Jon Secada or Voisine than Seger or Springsteen. His music isn't anything flashy, to be sure. Simple pop melodies, adorned with basic instrumentation, cushioned by some strong production values. Arcuri, like Secada, has a voice that weaves in and out of the music, not overpowering it. A recent gig at the Stage West in Mississauga, which also served as an audition for the Rita & Friends show, could help open some doors. Key here is the first single, *With Or Without You*, as are *Room For Love*, *Innocent Moments* and *Waiting For A Sign*. With distribution by CMIC. -RR


JIM CURRIE - Punk/Folk

Vancouver's Jim Currie creates an interesting vocal mystique with this release that puts him in a class of his own. The punk influence adds that ingredient of credibility to Currie's lyrics that rise above just storytelling. Currie has a hidden anger, that isn't altogether hidden. His power-play approach to laying it all out is his main asset. The projection and the sometimes icy tone is somewhat overpowering. This guy's got a message, and you better listen. However, that doesn't take away from the entertainment value, and Currie has a lot to spare. Currie has cleverly attached his unique musical signature to each of these 13 tracks, to which he provides tongue-in-cheek sub-titles: *Time To Burn (Immolation)*,



Thrill Of Choice (Societal inflexibility), String of lights (A Pre-Christmas carol) and I'm Coming Home (There at last), all of which are key, Currie provided most of the instrumentation himself (acoustic guitars, keyboards, bowed nylon and lead guitars). A giant assist is provided by Vancouver Symphony Orchestra violinist Toni Stanick and k.d.lang's drummer Randall Stoll. Currie produced the album with Shae Wrinch. Recorded at Vancouver's Beatty Lane Studios. Lots of fare here for alternative radio. Dance mixes of a couple of tracks would gain club attention. A.J. CROCE - New Orleans Jazz

Having A.J. on an album is enough reason to buy, but get a load of his guests: Ry Cooder on mandolin and guitar; David Hidalgo (Los Lobos) on guitar and accordion; Waddy Wachtel (Keith Richards' Xpensive Winos) on guitar; Sir Henry Bowen and Sweet Pea Atkinson (from Bonnie Raitt's *Nick Of Time*) on back-up vocals; and a guest appearance by pianist Billy Payne of Little Feat. The producer of the album, Jim Keltner (Little Village, Traveling Wilburys, Eric Clapton) also looks after drums and percussion. With that lineup of talent, Croce leans into what might be considered uncharted waters, but that's what makes this guy so entertaining. He has a natural ability to capture the very essence of whatever music form he constructs, be it his signature New Orleans jazz, blues, a little rock'n'country done to waltz time, and a touch of folk. Croce's vocal rasp, his open-book approach to the lyric content, all of which are his original works, and his keyboard magic make for an invaluable entertainment package. All tracks are key, but check out *Some People Call It Love and Night Out On The Town*, but don't overlook *Music Box*. In-store play will attract. The cover says it all.


ALBUM PICK

MAE MOORE

If Mae Moore wasn't a Canadian, if she were say British or American, she might very well be a huge international success by now. But Canadians have that built-in "are you really sure" attitude, often waiting until our colossus to the south picks up on something before we ourselves consider her breakthrough in North America until her second album, *Bohemia*, which gained rave reviews both her and in the US, and gained her something of a solid fan base in the states. What might enable Moore to really break out and become the next big thing is the fact that AAA radio seems to be the format-of-choice at radio these days, and her music is tailor-made for AAA. What separates Moore from so many in the pop field is, not only her unblemished songwriting skill, but also her ability to incorporate the best that technology has to offer music, without overusing it. The integrity of the music remains intact - you don't need to cut through waves of over-production to find the spirit and the soul of the music. Moore wasn't without help during the sessions, bringing in talents like guitarists Neil Clarke (Lloyd Cole) and Stephan Nikleva (Sarah McLachlan), percussionist Paul Brennan (Odds), keyboardist Vince Jones (Ginger) and Spirit Of The West's John Mann and Linda McRae. Produced by Gavin MacKillop (Toad The Wet Sprocket, Rembrandts), *Dragonfly* should fulfill Moore's enormous promise, and bring her into the forefront of Canada's burgeoning talent pool. -RR





ON TOUR

Van Halen returns to Toronto for the first time in three years for two shows at the new Molson Amphitheatre on August 18 and 19. Balance is the 11th album from these California rockers, their first new studio release since 1990's For Unlawful Carnal Knowledge. The album recently hit the double platinum mark in Canada, spawned by the top ten single, Can't Stop Loving You.

Mae Moore has just released Dragonfly, her follow-up to the AAA radio favourite Bohemia. Produced by Gavin Mackillop in Vancouver, the album features cameo appearances by a host of Canadian talent, including Odds drummer Paul Brennan, Spirit Of The West's Linda McRae and John Mann, Ginger keyboardist Vince Jones, and long-time Lloyd Cole collaborator Neil Clarke. Moore will aid in the promotion of the album with several dates in her native BC, including Harpo's in Victoria (May 28, 29), Queen's in Nanaimo (30), and Richard's on Richards in Vancouver (May 31, June 1).

CPI and Donald K Donald have put together their own summer festival aimed at a younger crowd, to compete with that massive Cancon fest recently announced by The Bay. Another Roadside Attraction has become something of an annual event on the summer calendar, and this year's lineup should make it the biggest yet. Headlining the mini-tour is The Tragically Hip, fresh off their own recent

19-date Canadian tour. Also on the bill are Ziggy Marley & The Melody Makers, Spirit Of The West, Blues Traveler, Matthew Sweet, Rheostatics, Eric's Trip and The Inbreds. Scheduled locations include Vancouver's Thunderbird Stadium (July 13), that same Rocky Mountain Ranch in High River, Alta. (15), the Craven Big Valley Site in Regina (17), and Winnipeg's Assiniboia Downs (18). Dates and locations for Toronto, Ottawa and Montreal are still to be confirmed.

The Waltons first gained industry attention with their 1992 independent release, Lik My Trakter, which was later picked up by Warner Music Canada. Soon after, the group signed on with US-based Sire Records, and have recently released their follow-up album, Cock's Crow, featuring the up-tempo single, End Of The World. The Waltons are confirmed for June 10 at Toronto's Bathurst Street Theatre, for the low, low price of \$12.

Jewel first appeared on the Toronto scene a short time ago with a four-night stay at the club C'est What? Since that sparkling set of shows, the native of Alaska has signed on with Warner Music, who recently released her debut album, Pieces Of You. Jewel will make a return trip to Toronto for a June 9 show at the Bathurst Street Theatre.

MCA Concerts has announced July 2 as the date for Reggae Sunsplash '95, the once-a-year festival for reggae fanatics.
