MCA Records resissues classic Who's Next

MCA Records is re-releasing one of the seminal albums of the '70s, The Who's classic Who's Next, the latest in the series of re-issues of the British band's many influential albums. The re-issue of Who's Next was scheduled for a November 8 release.

CMW now accepting submissions for '96 Festival

Canadian Music Week is now accepting submissions from artists around the world to participate in the 1996 Canadian Music Festival, which will take place the week of March 4-10, 1996. The deadline for submissions is December 31, 1995.

The '96 Canadian Music Festival is being promoted as a 'truly international event', showcasing more than 450 of the hottest, up-and-coming bands and artists from across Canada, the US and parts elsewhere. The festival attracts A&R reps from

The 'new' version of Who's Next has been completely remixed and/or remastered from the original sources, and includes previously unreleased tracks from Pete Townshend's never-completed concept album, Lifehouse (which evolved into Who's Next). The re-issue will also feature enhanced

packaging, and all new liner notes chronicling Townshend's creation of the Lifehouse project, written by Townshend and noted Who expert John Atkins.

Who's Next is considered by many to be one of the great rock albums, and the band's shining moment. It contains such AOR anthems as Won't Get Fooled Again, Baba O'Riley, Bargain and Behind Blue Eyes. The re-issue will feature all eight original tracks, as well as five new additions.

The new material includes Pure And Easy (later re-recorded for Odds & Sods), a cover of Marvin Gaye's Baby Don't You Do It (originally intended for the Lifehouse project), concert recordings of Naked Eye and Water, a studio version of Too Much Of Anything, I Don't Even Know Myself (the b-side to Won't Get Fooled Again) and the original version of Behind Blue Eyes.

MCA's Who re-issue program began last February with the release of Live At Leeds, and continued this past summer with the re-releases of A Quick One and The Who Sell Out. Further re-issues planned for late '95/early '96 include Tommy, Quadrophenia, Who Are You, The Who By Numbers and Odds And Sods, plus a new greatest hits package and new live compilation.

Salt-N-Pepa sign with MCA, launch new label

Hip-hop artist Salt-N-Pepa has signed an exclusive long-term recording contract with MCA Records, in a deal announced by MCA Music Entertainment Group chairman and CEO Al Teller. MCA also announced that Salt-N-Pepa (Cheryl James and Sandra Denton) have entered into a joint venture to launch their own Jireh Records label.

Salt-N-Pepa, the most successful female group in the history of hip-hop music, have sold more than 10 million albums worldwide, the only female hip-hop group ever to top platinum sales. Each of their four previous albums - Hot Cool And Vicious, A Salt With A Deadly Pepa, Black's Magic and Very Necessary - have sold in excess of one million units, with Very Necessary topping four million worldwide.

According to Teller, "With each new milestone in their careers, Cheryl and Sandra continue to demonstrate the type of true originality reflective of world-class superstars. I am confident that with this new association, Salt-N-Pepa will remain on the cutting edge with their music and reach greater levels of worldwide success."

Jireh Records will be a collaboration between Salt-N-Pepa's James and Denton and longtime managers, promoters and entrepreneurs Carol Kirkendall, Darryl Brooks and Gerald Scott. Jireh (pronounced 'Jyra') will handle all of its own A&R, business affairs and administration, with MCA providing marketing, publicity, promotional and back room function support. Jireh will be based in Falls Church, Virginia, with affiliated offices in Washington and New York City.

The initial Jireh roster consists of three acts - Deidra 'Spin' Roper, Day Ta Day and Modern Yesterday. Roper, best known as DJ Spinderella of Salt-N-Pepa, was featured on the group's hits Whatta Man, Shoop and None Of Your Business, and wrote and co-produced the track Step (all from Very Necessary). Roper currently hosts a weekly radio show featured on New York's HOT 97 FM and Washington's WPGC.

Day Ta Day is a Washington-based R&B quintet which sang back-up for Salt-N-Pepa on their 1994 summer tour, and also appeared as an opening act for Salt-N-Pepa. Modern Yesterday is an alternative band from Fairfax, Virginia. Jireh will release debut albums from all three acts in 1996.


Arden - Four times platinum in Canada

A&M recording artist Jan Arden was recently presented with a pair of nice, new shiny awards by A&M staff. The first, quadruple platinum no less, was her most recent release, Living Under June. The second was a newly minted platinum award for her debut album, Time For Mercy. Time For Mercy produced a number of hit singles, and also earned the artist a pair of Junos (top new solo artist and top video). Living Under June has created even greater success for Arden on the charts, producing four hit singles, and earning her four Junos last time out, including album of the year.

Arden is now in the midst of a 22-city cross Canada tour, which begins in St. John's (Nov. 11), and finishes up in Kenowna (DEC. 11).



FACTOR to tap industry on dispensing of funds

Heather Ostertag, executive director of FACTOR, has announced the formation of a committee to review the organization's "administrative approach to dispensing the funds available" to FACTOR.

The committee, which is chaired by FACTOR's president Jason Sniderman and CIRPA appointee Brian Chater, will hold a consultative meeting with the music industry in Essex Room C of Toronto's Essex Park Hotel at 9:30 am on Dec. 8/95.

Ostertag explains that it's hoped the meeting will provide a forum for all levels of the industry to come forward with their suggestions and comments on FACTOR and the approach taken to administering the limited funds available.

"Frank and open dialogue is encouraged. I feel this meeting will provide an opportunity for the industry to have a clearer understanding of what FACTOR is up against with an ever-increasing demand on a very finite amount of money."

would then be distributed as royalty payments to composers and music publishers.

The proposed tariff provides a license fee of \$0.25 for every subscriber on a service that does not earn advertising revenue. For services that do earn revenue from advertising, the license fee is based on 3.2% of gross revenues, with a minimum fee of \$0.25 per subscriber.

Filed in September of 1995, the tariff comes into force with board approval, and would be retroactive to January 1, 1996. The new Tariff 22 is entitled Transmission of Musical Works to Subscribers via a Telecommunications Service not Licensed Under Tariff 16 or Tariff 17. This tariff relates to the right to communicate musical works by telecommunication, which is a right administered by SOCAN.

The use of music on the 'net and by BBS services is growing rapidly, with more than 500 record label sites already on the worldwide Web. Radio stations are also beginning to get on the web, as are many other services.

According to Mark Walker, assistant legal counsel for SOCAN, "This industry is evolving almost on a daily basis, and it's not unlike trying to hit a moving target with the filing of this new tariff. We encourage anyone planning a music-related service or product to contact us to ensure that we are aware of their concerns in formulating the application of a tariff, now and in the future."

Danny Goldberg named president, CEO of Mercury Records

Alain Levy, president and chief executive officer of PolyGram, has announced the appointment of Danny Goldberg to the position of president and CEO of New York-based Mercury Records, effective November 1.

Goldberg replaces Ed Eckstine, who resigned his post at Mercury to start up his own label, which will be funded and distributed by PolyGram. Eckstine was one of the most successful A&R execs at PolyGram, overseeing releases by such artists as Lionel Richie, Vanessa Williams, Tony! Toni! Tone! and Brian McKnight.

Goldberg's most recent position was as chairman/CEO of Warner Bros. Records, from January until August of 1995. Prior to that he was chairman of Atlantic Records, where he was responsible for signing artists such as Hootie And The Blowfish, Juliana Hatfield, Stone Temple Pilots, Bad Religion and Liz Phair. During Goldberg's

tenure at Atlantic, the label grew to the #1 ranking in terms of US market share.

Prior to joining Atlantic, Goldberg was the owner of Gold Mountain Entertainment, where he co-managed such artists as Nirvana, Sonic Youth, Bonnie Raitt and Hole. He began his career as a music journalist for both Billboard and Rolling Stone, and later worked as a publicist for artists such as Led Zeppelin. He is also the president of the Los Angeles affiliate of the American Civil Liberties Union.

Founded in Chicago in 1947, Mercury arose in the post-war era with an eclectic mix of blues, jazz, rhythm and blues and country. Current Mercury artists include John Mellencamp, Bon Jovi, Def Leppard and Vanessa Williams. The label has enjoyed recent successes with newcomers Joan Osborne and Rusted Root, and is achieving developmental success with Brian McKnight and Tony! Toni! Tone!

WALT SAYS . . . !



The envelope please??? This is so hot, it's past the rumour stage. Could it be that one, or maybe two, and there ain't no more, record clubs have made a bid to sponsor that big BIG annual show that's so dear to the hearts of many? One retail representative is spitting mad and ready to go to the wall on this one. He apparently got it first hand. Was it a done deal that had to be overturned because of a threat? (EC: *And the winner is . . . ?*)

Merci? Merci? What a great group that Beau Dommage is. Remember a few weeks ago I mentioned here that they were on the side of the "yessirs" in that Quebec referendum vote? Well, they lost out on that one, but they did better at the ADISQ Awards, much better. They won four awards, one of them for best group. But why waste that television time on thank-yous? Michel Rivard, lead singer of the band, was quoted as saying that he wished the award for best group "had been given out last Monday (Oct. 30), and that the group of the year would have been the people of Quebec . . ." (EC: *Maybe they'll get a Juno next year!!!*)

Crazy for Crazy!!! Had the opportunity to check out the new female lead in *Crazy For You* at the Royal Alexandra Theatre, and, of course, Mickey Rooney, who was added to the lineup a couple of months ago. Ruthie Henshall, a young Britisher is taking the role of Polly Baker. She's incredibly gifted, with the voice of an angel, which doesn't completely fit the rough and tumble setting of Deadrock, Nevada. Her vocal performances are whistle-clean and she has eased into the dance routines as if they were made for her. Mickey Rooney is the very epitome of a "showbiz trooper". He wanders around the stage like a couch potato, coming alive with what must be, his own dance routine and a dialogue that he seems to make up as he goes, but he's never late and the cast work beautifully around him. The company is as fresh this time around as they were on the opening, away back in January of 1994. This is an old time hoofer musical where the audience gets its kicks from the energies from the cast. No shock theatre here. The sets are merely Ziegfeld. (EC: *What! No helicopter???*) *No! Girls! Girls! Girls!*

Let's get together!!! What to do! What to do! Where to go! Where to go! Holy smoke! What a quandary last week when on one night alone, practically every major label had a happening of some sort, and miles apart. A couple of the indies had some beer and cheezy parties scheduled, and then there was the theatre invites? How do you look after them all? To keep with our reputation that we'd cover a bet, we hired extra staff to attend every car door opening. (EC: *What a reputation!!!*)

Beware of strangers!!! There's a guy, south of the border, trying to cash in on Canada's country music market. He seems to have a pretty good mailing/fax list as well. Whenever I see someone pushing their own publishing and management, I get a little concerned. There are

a lot of innocents in this business just waiting to be plucked. (EC: *Was that plucked???*)

Foth is on a roll!!!

Allan Fotheringham's column in the Nov. 7th issue of the Toronto Sun should be must reading for Canadians from coast-to-coast, and it probably was. I've read his nationalist kicks before, but man, he's never been so "cool". He covers it all . . . the Americanization of Canada. From the NHL and the CFL to the horesemen, the CBC and Air Canada and, of course, he wouldn't leave out BC's Mike Harcourt. "The sad aspect of Canadian life being swallowed by American life," is how he put it. Damn, it's annoying that the only real believers in this country are in the 40 to whatever age group. How come we can't excite young writers into realizing that we are a distinct society from the US (EC: *There's that "distinct" again!!!*). Even in our distinct music industry, there aren't too many left who know how it all began. They're forever trying to re-write history. "Let's get rid of the Canadian content. The MAPL logo threatens our future in the US." If you don't know where you came from, you sure as hell don't know where you're going, and the movie is getting worse every day. I heard a guy say the other day that he was fed up with these Canadian politicians, and what we needed was an American as prime minister. (EC: *Hello???*)

No shipping door??? There must have been an American rocket scientist consulting for that lower Yonge Street retail location. There it is, sitting right at the busiest intersection in the whole of Canada, and they don't even have a shipping door in the back. In fact, they don't have any back door. They don't even have an entrance from the subway or from that great Canadian tourist attraction. (EC: *They're only there temporarily. Remember???*) Eglinton and Yonge is the place to be, two doors from the corner, east side of the street.

Radio saved the day!!! Radio showed just how effective it can be in the news and information field and emerged as the unsung hero of the Quebec referendum, at least in these parts. His comment, on learning of the award, "I'm chuffed!" Hey! It's worth a trip to Aurora. (EC: *He's "chuffed"? Now, ain't that gratitude for you???*)

PA's successor is on hold!!! We're going to have a lot of time gathering initials for PA's old job. Seems that the stiff-upper-lip guys, over there, have decided that now isn't the time to do it. They seem to think that perhaps February or even March would be a better time. I wonder if they know about the returns season? On the broader front, if the snow doesn't kick in, we could be in store for the worst returns season of all time. (EC: *Oh! You mean because there are more outlets? But surely, they don't have the same return privileges as the legitimate houses, or do they???*)

Radio's stupidest move!!! Some of the radio guys are really complaining about the treatment they're getting from the record industry. On the other hand, radio has made its bed and boy is it messy and bumpy. Not all of them mind you. But the only real leader I've seen in radio is Warren Cosford, down in Windsor, and I'm surprised his pattern of success hasn't been copied. The stupidest thing radio did was to lose control of the record business. (EC: *What board meeting were you at???*)

CBC's Morningside stirs interest in flamenco guitarist

Jesse Cook expands career with Narada release

Strangest of all strange, Canada has a flamenco guitarist on the brink of international stardom.

The name Jesse Cook doesn't even conjure up the slightest suggestion of things Spanish, let alone the flamenco guitar. But, Jesse Cook it is and flamenco guitarist extraordinaire, he is.

Earlier this year, Cook recorded himself performing a number of his original songs in his home studio. He titled the music *Tempest*. The TV Guide channel began airing some of these selections (anonymously) 24 hours a day. After a number of inquiries poured into affiliated stations about who the artist was and where a CD could be found, Cook decided to release his *Tempest* CD.

A 20-minute interview on Peter Gzowski's *Morningside* (CBC Radio) resulted in the first pressing of 1,000 units being sold out. A further 4,000 units were sold within days of being manufactured, largely from the response of the Gzowski show.

That was in June. In July, he was featured on the People page of *Maclean's* which contributed significantly to his national recognition.

That same month he was signed to a multi-album deal with Narada, which has distribution in 40 countries worldwide and with MCA in North America (RPM - Aug 14/95).

Now the pot is really boiling and record buyers are lining up. But first, the master is off to Milwaukee, Narada's head office, for the remastering of *Tempest*, which takes two weeks.

The new Narada album went to retail in the US on Sept. 28 and was relaunched in Canada on Narada/MCA on Nov. 1.

Why Narada? "We sent out copies of the CD to several companies. Narada had been looking for a young flamenco artist for some time. There were several companies that in fact offered us record deals. The Narada offer was not so much financially the best, but the people involved and their attitude about the project made us want to go with them. They are real caring people and their initial efforts have opened the doors for me in the US."

From a chance airing on the TV Guide channel and an interview on *Morningside*, Cook has been catapulted into the US market where record sales are now beginning to take hold.

"I'm moving steadily forward, which for me is really exciting. Five months ago, I was just a composer. I had no idea this was going anywhere. This was something I did for fun. And suddenly, I'm making a career change. Like it or not, I'm no longer composing a lot. We're performing a lot."


Cook and his band were the only Canadians to perform at the Catalina Jazz Festival in California and they performed at the opening gala of the new Princess Margaret Hospital in Toronto. They are returning to the US for a series of promotional dates in the western states.

Cook admits to being a writer of music only. He doesn't sing, and he won't sing. "I used to sing when I was a teenager. But I'm a bad singer. People like me should not sing."

Born in Paris, to Canadian parents, Cook's early years were spent in the south of France and Spain.

"I've tried to reconstruct why I would be living in Canada and be so interested in flamenco guitars. There's just not a lot of flamenco guitars in Canada. It has to somehow be connected to those early childhood. I know that in my earliest memories, I wanted to play the guitar. The first song I knew how to sing was *Quanta La Mara*, and that was when I was three years old. So obviously it had an impact on me. I kept trying to learn flamenco here in Canada, but it wasn't easy."

"I went to Eli Kassner Guitar Academy, but the focus there was really classical guitar. They had some flamenco guitars, but they trained me in a classical vein, which was good training, but not what I really wanted. It took me many years to realize



that what I wanted was that flamenco stuff I heard when I was real young."

Those many years were actually 16 in number, and included nine private teachers and five music schools, before returning to France and Spain where he got into the real meat of the "pure" flamenco, which was initially, Gypsy music from Spain, an improvised form.

Cook still improvises, rarely writing down his music.

"Flamenco music traditionally, is really an improvised form. There's strict 12/8 rhythmic structures. The music I do is not "pure" flamenco. It's called rumba flamenco, which is sort of one of the more fun forms of flamencos, which isn't taken too seriously. Most of the flamenco forms are extremely depressing, very sad and heart rendering. Besides, it's very complex to play."

The Spanish influence is very obvious, but Cook, who doesn't speak Spanish (he speaks French fluently), won't take any bows in that regard.

"I grew up in Canada. To claim this is Spanish music would be absurd. Sure there's a hint of flamenco. It's flamenco-inspired, but there's that hip-hop influence, sort of a Madonna tune you hear on *Orbit*. I also went to a jazz school. You can hear

the flamenco flavour, but with a jazz structure. I'm also surrounded by musicians from all over the world. They bring their musical interests and we end up with this potpourri of worldbeat music."

"When I was much younger, I wanted to do something like this, release an album, but I didn't have the structure. I wrote a lot of music. I've been a composer since I was 19, writing and arranging. But somehow getting the right focus to put it all together on a CD in one style and to get it out to the public, I don't know, somehow it didn't happen until I was 30."

"My day gig has always been composing. That's how I made my bread and butter. But now that the record deal has sort of kicked in, I'm mostly touring and I don't have time for composing. A record deal is probably the closest thing you can get to a stable job in the music industry where you're not constantly worried about where your next paycheck is coming from. As a composer, I never took weekends off. I was afraid that if I left town that when I came home my whole practice would be eliminated. Some new composer would have muscled into my territory. So, it's nice to have the freedom that comes with the record deal, you know, thinking about what should my next album be? I'll think about it in the spring. It's a real luxury being with a major record company."

Another major plus with being signed to Narada, was the change in performance venues. Playing the Catalina Jazz Festival was perhaps one of the major highlights of Cook's career. "We got a standing ovation after every piece we played, because it was a jazz audience. They were there to listen to the music and they were totally focused on what we were doing and loving it. Whereas in Toronto, we got booked into clubs where they attract crowds that want to dance. We were there sort of as the opening act before the DJ comes on. People enjoyed us. They clap politely, but you can tell they're just waiting for the DJ to roll the records. So, it's difficult as an instrumental artist, to perform in that kind of setting. I prefer an audience that's there to enjoy the music. So I'm hoping that we do more performances like we did at the jazz festival."

The incredible sound that Cook entrances his audiences with is provided by himself and three other musicians. Besides Cook (guitars, palmas, synthesizer, djembe) he is accompanied by Mario Melo (congas, percussion, palmas), Blake Manning (darbuka, timbali), Andrew Morales (electric bass, palmas) and Bill Katsioutas (guitars).

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RADIO

Kelowna's The Lizard 104.7 FM has announced that CBC-TV's program Street Cents will be featuring music from The Lizard's Indiegenius CD. Street Cents is a new youth-oriented series focusing on consumer awareness issues. The agreement covers 18 episodes during the 1995-96 season. Released in May of 1995, Indiegenius featured such local independent acts as This Old House, Jesters Revenge, Painfully Obvious and Dick Janes Spot.

Rhona Raskin's popular Sex, Lies, Love and Relationships syndicated talk show is now being heard Sunday through Thursday nights at 9 pm on Calgary's LITE 96, CHFM radio. Raskin's show is nationally syndicated via the Rogers Broadcasting Satellite Radio Network division.

Edmonton's AM 1260 CFRN has had such great response with their Adult Standards/Nostalgia format, that the CFRN signal has now been picked up by Calgary's MIX 1060 via the Anik II Satellite. The nostalgia format, featuring the likes of Sinatra, Tony Bennett, Bing Crosby and Barbra Streisand, will now reach almost 85% of the province, from Grande Prairie to the US border. The station is also setting up a 1-800 number to allow listeners from across the province to call in. Calgary's AM 1060 will now feature legendary morning man Howard Langdale, who was the wake-up man at the station when it was known as CFCN. Both Langdale and CFRN's Bob Arnold will do their morning shows locally, with the signal beamed out simultaneously to both markets after 9 am. The nostalgia format is one of the fastest growing formats in North America, with more than 175 stations picking up a satellite signal in the US, via Westwood One, one of America's largest syndicators. CFRN and CKMX are both part of the Standard chain.

The Canadian Association of Broadcasters convention in Ottawa allowed the organization to

name their 1995/96 board. Bruce Cowie (president and COO, broadcast group, Electrohome) was elected to a second term as CAB chair. Ron Bremner (BCTV) returns as television board chair, while Charles Bélanger (CFCF) returns as television vice-chair. Anthony Viner (Rogers) returns as radio board chair, while James McCoubrey (Telemedia) replaces Liette Champagne as radio vice chair. Duff Roman (CHUM) replaces the retired Alden Diehl as treasurer. Fred Sherratt (CHUM) continues as special delegate to the executive committee. Bill Coombes (Fraser Valley) is immediate past chair, and Michael McCabe maintains his post as CAB president and CEO.

Michael McCabe had some harsh words for the CRTC and the federal government as part of his speech before the Canadian Association of Broadcasters national convention in Ottawa (Oct. 29). According to McCabe, the biggest problem facing radio today is the casual acceptance by government and the CRTC that half of Canadian radio stations are losing money. "Well it's not okay," noted McCabe. "By any standard, it's a disaster. Yet no one seems prepared to make the logic leap to say: 'If we want a strong radio industry contributing to our culture, we need to take bold steps to enable them to get back to profit - and quickly'." McCabe indicated that bold policy measures are needed to strengthen radio. The CAB's four point plan calls for repositioning radio as an effective advertising tool; reassessing financial management; turning digital radio into a profitable business; and pressing for a regulatory revolution.

The auction will be followed by a benefit concert at the Commodore featuring Rymes With Orange, David Gogo, Noise Therapy and Deadline. Tickets for the show alone will be just \$3.99 at the door, with proceeds again benefitting the BC Children's Hospital.

FOXWEAR is finally available to loyal CFOX listeners, after years of demand. The Fox's afternoon drive announcer, Bill Courage, broadcast live at the grand opening of the FOX Rocks Shop in Surrey Place Mall on Oct. 20. The shop houses t-shirts, mugs and other memorabilia featuring the FOX logo. Virgin recording artist Brother Cane performed live for the crowd of 300 at the opening.

Hamilton's 102.9 K-Lite FM and Tim Hortons are once again sponsoring the Annual Share The Warmth campaign. This year's event, the eighth in total, runs from November 6 through to December 16. K-Lite listeners will be asked to drop off their unwanted winter coats and jackets to any Cameo, Parker's, Wright's, Professional, Presstine, Langley, Parisian or Star dry cleaning location. The donated garments will be cleaned, repaired and distributed to those in need by the Salvation Army. Since the campaign began in 1988, Share The Warmth has brought in some 40,000 winter coats and jackets which have been donated to disadvantaged men, women and children in the Hamilton-Wentworth Region.

Private broadcasters honoured at CAB's Gold Ribbon Awards

The Canadian Association of Broadcasters honoured thirteen private radio and television stations at the 1995 Gold Ribbon Awards, which were announced as part of the CAB's annual convention, held this year in Ottawa.

VOCM St. John's in-depth coverage of last December's three-day power blackout in Newfoundland garnered the station the '95 award in the radio news category. In the television side, Vancouver's BCTV was awarded in the news category for their coverage of the 1994 Stanley Cup riots in Vancouver. In praising the station's coverage of the event, CAB also noted that footage shot by their news team was requested by CTV, ABC and other stations.

Vancouver's CKVU-TV and Montreal's CFTM-TV each claimed gold awards in the new television entertainment category. CFTM won for Le Grand Frisson, a variety package that spotlighted top notch Canadian singers and skaters. Two other CFTM shows reached the semi-finals.

CKVU's gold ribbon was for Get Serious, four 60-minute specials on the bizarre world of comedy. The series featured famous comedians in rare home movies, interviews and performances.

There were three winners of the \$1,500 Ruth Hancock Scholarships, with the winners receiving their cheques from the local CTV affiliates closest to

their homes. The three winners were Jessica Brown of Knowlton, Quebec, who attends Concordia University; Lorraine Mention of London, who attends the University of Western Ontario; and Christopher Hope of Toronto, who is studying at Ryerson.

Sponsored by CTV and the Broadcast Executives Society, in cooperation with the CAB, the Hancock Scholarships honour candidates who 'best exemplify the admirable qualities' of the late Ruth Hancock, a longtime CAB executive.





AOR label launches with Medley single

AOR is a unique venture, with the name highly indicative of the nature of the label. The artists will retain complete ownership of their copyrights, masters and publishing, with the label itself providing merely an administrative role.

AOR will offer a wide range of services to their clients, including Canadian distribution via Page Publications, Internet distribution via Dirt Distribution, Internet web sites for each artist, radio promotion through Mira Laufer, tour coordination, marketing and publicity campaigns, accounting and retail tracking.

As well, the label is offering an informal internship program, in which each individual artist can bring in their own prospective management candidate, who can then gain valuable hands-on training in every aspect of their artist's career.

The first release under the new label will be a pre-Christmas single from Sue Medley entitled *What I Want*. Medley will be releasing a new, full-length album in the first quarter of '96.

Also slated for release on the AOR label is Toronto band Thinktank Fish, with their debut album *TV Lies* scheduled for January 12 release; and Vancouver's Raw Red Moses will launch their self-titled debut on February 2, preceded by a single/video for the lead single, *Alphabet City*.



They're out there by the hundreds, calling Meat Loaf a musical farce, an overweight blowhard, a guy who never should have left the Rocky Horror Picture Show. Well, 40 million albums later, I think we know who's had the last laugh. Following the major comeback success of Bat Out Of Hell II, the mighty Meat has once again hopped on that brash, bold type of sound that made him famous. Therefore, if you liked Bat Out Of Hell and its sequel, you're bound to like this one too. The lead single, I'd Lie For You (And That's The Truth) is a Diane Warren penning that sounds suspiciously close to I Would Do Anything For Love, the lead single from the last record. But that's a petty criticism. Warren contributes a couple other songs to this one, namely Not A Dry Eye In The House and If This Is The Last Kiss. And of course a Meat Loaf album couldn't exist without a contribution from Jim Steinman, in this case the songs Original Sin and Left In The Dark. Also making an appearance is Van Halen's Sammy Hagar, who wrote and co-produced (with Steven Van Zandt and Ron Nevison) the boisterous Amnesty Is Granted. Again, say what you want about Meat Loaf but the fact is, this one should sell billions. -RR


The thing that made The Pretenders such an interesting band in the '80s was the unmistakable presence of Chrissie Hynde. Not to sound too politically incorrect, but it was somewhat unique to have a woman fronting a band at that time, especially one with a voice and an attitude like Hynde. She kind of murmured and purred her way through the material, wavering in and out of the tune like an off-balance metronome,

never dominating the tracks, but never straying too far from them. This latest offering from the band is an unplugged type of thing, offering up 14 tracks culled from the group's various albums. It features the obvious: Brass In Pocket, Back On The Chain Gang - along with less well-known tracks like The Phone Call, 2,000 Miles, Criminal and Chill Factor. In spite of its unplugged label (it has been done a little bit to death), Isle Of View offers a fine overview of what makes The Pretenders what they are. 
It still seems kind of silly for one guy to be classified as a 'band'. Why couldn't he just call himself Roland Orzabal, or The Roland Orzabal Band, and be done with it? Why the need to perpetuate this whole TFF thing, when the duo (Orzabal and Curt Smith) split up years ago. Tears For Fears did produce a plethora of outstanding music in the late eighties/early nineties, including the monstrous Songs From The Big Chair, clearly one of the dominant albums of that decade. But that great sound that was evident on Songs and 1990's Sowing The Seeds Of Love has now become part of history, with Orzabal venturing into more rhythmic-based, guitar-driven stylings on his first 'solo' venture, Elemental, and this new offering. A an album structured around the theme of family, Orzabal gained the inspiration for this record through tracing the roots of his father, whose own lineage is of a Spanish heritage. This album was originally supposed to be released on PolyGram, but something happened (no one knows what) and it's now on Epic, complete with two tracks which were added to the unreleased PolyGram version. God's Mistake, already a radio hit, is typical of the material here - fairly mainstream guitar pop, with Orzabal's throaty voice dominating the songs. Other notables include Falling Down, Sketches Of Pain, Don't Drink The Water and Humdrum And Humble, one of the two 'new' tracks. -RR

No this is not the new U2 album, although there are many who are

claiming that it is. Instead, this unique (and yes, we can say that word) 14-track compilation features music by Brian Eno and the U2 gang (Bono, The Edge, Larry Mullen and Adam Clayton), along with a few select guests, all inspired by a host of films, both documentary and otherwise. Now, we're not talking about Rambo Part II here. Instead, the films are the works of European giants like Antonioni and Wim Wenders, along with lesser known directors like Von Heineken, Lurline Cleman, Bill Carter and Gianicolo. The music is a diverse mixture of ambient instrumentals and soaring vocals, melding elements of pop, classical and opera. The lead single is a track called Miss Sarajevo, a musical take on Carter's award-winning documentary chronicling a bizarre beauty contest in the war-torn former Yugoslavian capital. The track features Bono's impassioned voice, with a strong vocal take from none other than Luciano Pavarotti. Other tracks worth noting are Elvis Ate America, Ito Okashi, United Colours and A Different Kind Of Blue. No, it's not really a new U2 record, but it is interesting, very interesting. -RR

Tapestry was one of those albums that everyone had back in the seventies, and even if you didn't have it, you probably still knew every song off it. If you didn't know, or care, who Carole King was, you probably at least knew songs like Natural Woman, You've Got A Friend or It's Too Late. This

lavishly packaged set is, as advertised, a reversion of this landmark album, with some of the top names in pop, both old familiar and fresh faces, doing justice to King's immortal pop ditties. The lead single is Eternal's take on I Feel The Earth Move. But there are other gems here: the Bee Gees on Will You Love Me Tomorrow?; Bebe & Cece Winans with Aretha Franklin on You've Got A Friend; or Amy Grant on It's Too Late. However, the gem of gems is Celine Dion's cover of (You Make Me Feel Like) A Natural Woman. Dion puts enough into this one to make you think that Rene is a very happy guy. Then again, in some ways it doesn't really matter who sings some of these songs - it's pretty tough to screw up material like this. -RR




Although the Stones have made a whale of a lot of money via a series of monstrous world tours involving massive staging at huge venues attracting thousands upon thousands of people, the pure fact is, the group's raw, aggressive sound and street-wise attitude has always seemed best suited in a more intimate, club environment. The Stones' sweaty sound is more at home in a place where you can see the clouds of smoke in the air, where you can smell the spilt beer, and you can almost reach out and touch Mick's skinny frame. Which makes this new live album, recorded in a series of clubs in Tokyo, Paris, Lisbon and Amsterdam, such a wonderful idea. The album contains 14 tracks, featuring songs from many of their older classic albums, something the true Stones fans will be happy to see. Along with such immortals as Wild Horses, Let It Bleed, Street Fighting Man and Angie, the album also features such tour faves as Willie Dixon's Little Baby, Buddy Holly's Not Fade Away, and this album's first single, Bob Dylan's Like A Rolling Stone, a song that Stones' fans have been clamouring for the band to perform for years. 

Affectionately dubbed "the granny composer", Toronto resident Annie Reisler has released her third album containing 15 instrumentals, all Reisler originals. She is a little more daring this time out, with a gentle mix of romantic emotions, but she cleverly included a couple of upcoming holiday items; Sleigh Ride Party and Dancing Bells. Reisler's keyboard work, which is fairly basic, not to mention her writing talent is particularly interesting in view of her late start. She started composing music when she was given a keyboard for her 60th birthday. As her liner notes read, her "songs without words are a captivating mix of emotions with romance, fantasy, joy and memories to dream on.". Reisler has perfected a simplistic approach to the piano that lovers of this instrument will immediately recognize. Although a little repetitious, each track builds its own creative niche, whether it be country (One More Mile), Latin (Read My Eyes or I Was So Wrong), Romantic (the title track or Moonlight), March (Grannie Annie March) or Fantasy (High On The Hill). JASCHA HEIFETZ - **Classical**

As is well known, Heifetz was and, on recordings, remains the world's finest violinist because of his combination of artistry and facility, emotion and technique. It's especially notable here on the Prokofiev Concerto No. 2 in G Minor, Op. 63 (with the Boston Symphony Orchestra, conducted by Charles Munch.) Prokofiev's music was composed deliberately dissonant. Yet, emotionalism in his music, far from being absent, is almost achingly pervasive. It's a challenge for soloists and many fail in full achievement. Heifetz however, plays it in manner that makes one thrill to his masterful technique while allowing oneself to be bathed in the warmth of sweetness. The Prokofiev will likely be the composition to find most favour on this disc, but the others also deserve full custom. The Sibelius Concerto in D Minor, Op. 47 is true to the wishes of the composer and Heifetz is ably backed by the Chicago Symphony Orchestra under Walter Hendl.

Maestro Hendl also conducts the orchestra (the wonderful old RCA Victor Symphony of fond memory) on the Glazunov Concerto in A Minor, Op. 82. There are those who consider Glazunov one of the lesser composers and that might be so; we have no intention of entering the controversy. We know only that under the loving attention of Hendl and Heifetz this concerto becomes a most moving experience. -BW




Title notwithstanding, this isn't a collection of sweetmeats proffered by a languid tenor. The 23 songs -- robustly tender and tenderly robust -- are by Gounod, Mascagni, Massenet, Bizet, Zandonai, Leoncavallo, Tosti, Nacho (no jokes please about theatre confections) and Gastaldon. They were performed live in Vidna at the Musikverein and are all the better for it. Recording in a studio with retakes and sometimes, overdubs can present music in absolute purity, but it's like comparing motion pictures to the legitimate stage. Intimacy and immediacy are lacking. Both thankfully are very much in evidence on this most enjoyable disc. Mr. Carreras, as always, sings with angelic sweetness in the higher notes and still surprising strength in the lower. His diction is impeccable and so too is his interpretation. If his vibrato sometimes approaches tremolo, we suspect it's because of the conditions under which he is performing. That's academic; what matters is the music and his singing of it. Given the title, one tends to give most attention to the serenades; one is not disappointed. The Sérénade by Bizet is always enjoyable but rarely is there the opportunity to hear Leoncavallo's Serenade Napolitaine and Sérénade Française sung back-to-back. Tosti and Nacho are brilliantly interpreted in L'ultima Canzone (an obvious crowd pleaser here) and Intima respectively. And, of course, there is the familiar Elégie by Massenet given new life here by this remarkable singer. -BW

Brothers Brad and Ken Johner from Midale, Saskatchewan have been slowly building a fan base, particularly in the west with their past releases. They have been doing it for eight years, during which time they have released four albums. Several singles have caught the attention of country programmers over those years. But this album should give them a bit more of a power base with programmers. The




title track, taken as the first single, has already made good inroads up the charts, and there's a lot more. The strength of this band lies with their vocals, Brad, up front and Ken on harmony vocals. They work beautifully together, giving that important ingredient of warmth and emotion so necessary in attracting the ear. They get a little help on the high harmony on Feel So Bad from Sheila Lytle, a key track. Also key is These Walls. The brothers have built their reputation on original material, but stay a bit on this album with Children Of The Wildworld, written by Jamie O'Hara. And that's Louis Sedmak doing the acoustic finger pickin', which adds to the entertainment value of this track. The album was produced by the Johner Brothers and Bart McKay, an impeccable keyboardist, and recorded at Saskatoon's Sound Edge Studio, with the exception of Wildworld and These Walls which were recorded at Joe's in Edmonton. Nice fiddle work by Jason Heistad. -WG



ASHLEY MacISAAC - **Fiddle/Pop**

When news of the signing of MacIsaac to a major label came down the pipe, the immediate question that came to mind was how do you market a fiddle player. The answer, of course, is exposure, lots of it. MacIsaac has become a star even before the release of his album. He's received more

press, been on more television specials and played to a growing and astonishingly mixed demographic than many established stars. On stage, he's more fun than a dancing bear and he's managed to transfer that same feeling from the recording studio to disc. Now, this isn't just some down east fiddler playing with himself. Get a load of his guests, jale, Gordie Johnson of Big Sugar, Chin Injeti of Bass is Base, Ian Burton of Change of Heart, Quartetto Gelato plus the awesome Gaelic vocals of Mary Jane Lamond on the traditional Sleepy Maggie. Not too shabby! MacIsaac also throws us a curve. He actually does sing. That's him on lead vocals on Bob Snider's penning of What An Idiot He Is. He gets a vocal assist from guitarists Jennifer Pierce and Eve Hartling, but there's no denying, that's him out front, and this track could become a classic. His vocals reveal the same kind of blunt honesty and sweat as his fiddle playing. With this album that was produced and engineered by Michael Phillip Wojewoda, Ashley MacIsaac brings the fiddle into a new dimension of entertainment value -- a gentle mix of the old and the new -- with an overpowering thrust of youthfulness. All tracks are key. How do you market a fiddle player? The answer is in the grooves. -WG

We commend to custom this splendid album of poetry and music commemorating the two world wars. God knows, no thinking person could wish to relive them, but if everything of value came out of them it is the poetry that they engendered and the music that has somehow come to be associated with them. Here is poetry read by Phyllis Calvert, John Gielgud, Derek Jacobi and Peter Orr. Here also is superb music played by the BBC Symphony Orchestra under the direction of Andrew Davis. The poetry is by Rupert Brooke, Lawrence Binyon, Thomas Hardy, Siegfried Sassoon, John Masefield and, of course, John McCrae among others. The music is by Elgar, Holst, Delius and Britten. The poetry is admirably read (we wept upon hearing "They shall not grow old as we that are left grow old") and the music played with wonderful drama that maestro Davis never allows to lapse into bathos. No doubt this album will receive much airplay during Remembrance Day observations, but we believe it should be played more often than that. Our reasons are twofold. One, this is a wonderful collection of poetry well read by masters of the English tongue. More importantly though, there is a masterful lesson to be learned here; war is hell but should be recalled . . . lest we forget. -BW

Jason McCoy steps up to #1 with Learning A Lot About Love, the title track from his MCA album, which spawned his last #1, This Used To Be Our Town (July 31/95). McCoy is enjoying a busy fall (RPM - Nov. 6/95).

Clint Black has the big gainer this week with Life Gets Away jumping into the #47 slot from #79. The track was taken from his Arista album One Emotion. If you're looking for a bit of Christmas country from Black, Looking For Christmas is available.

Garth Brooks has two singles on the go. She's Every Woman has been threatening the top of the chart for the last three weeks and moves up to #3 this week. The most added single is his release of The Fever, an old Aerosmith song written by Steven Tyler, Joe Perry, Bryan Kennedy and Dan Roberts. The single was officially released to radio on Nov. 7 at precisely 9 am EST, and was delivered via satellite throughout the Satellite Radio Network, GTO and CountryMusic Radio Channels. The single, which was taken from his upcoming Capitol Nashville album Fresh Horses, enters the chart at #85. The album, produced by Allen Reynolds, goes to retail on Nov. 21. A special live radio show celebrating the release of the album is planned for Tuesday, Nov. 21. The special will be aired worldwide at 7 pm EST. Brooks will be in Canada late November/early December for an extensive promotional campaign. It has been rumoured that the 20th Century Fox film studios has signed a two-year deal with Brooks to produce movies based on his material.

Terri Clark, the subject of a feature this week, bounces back on the chart, this time with When Boy Meets Girl which enters the chart at #89. This is the follow-up to Better Things To Do, which peaked at #3 (Oct. 30/95), a good door-opener for her career, now descending the chart #24. The Polydor/Mercury people have put a lot of muscle behind Clark which is now paying off with the follow-up making a stronger impact than her debut single. Both tracks were taken from her self-titled album, which is also making a lot of noise at retail where it moves up to #10 this week.

Faith Hill, still making news with her release of Let's Go To Vegas (32), follows this up with It Matters To Me which has a #90 position this week. The new song

was written by Hill and Mark Sanders. Both tracks are included on her Warner Bros album, It Matters To Me, which was produced by Scott Hendricks.

Reba McEntire didn't do too well with her last release, On My Own (#34), but looks to do better with the follow-up, Ring On Her Finger, Time On Her Hands, moves onto the chart at #94. The new deck was written by Don Goodman, Pam Rose and Mary Ann Kennedy. Although On My Own didn't do it for Reba, her album, Starting Over Again, which contains both of these tracks, made a phenomenal impact at retail, jumping into the #1 position last week after only three weeks on the chart. The album, which was produced by Reba and Tony Brown with Michael Omartian, holds at #1 this week.

Blackhawk makes it onto the chart with their latest Arista release, Like There Ain't No Yesterday

Wayne Pronger, who has Cerebral Palsy, is well-known in Canadian country music circles. It was Pronger and friends, who wrote The Circle Of Wood, which refers to the circle of wood on the stage at the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville where country music stars stand to sing their songs.

Pronger met country music legend, George Hamilton IV earlier this year at Canadian Country Music Week '95 in Hamilton and discovered that Hamilton had

recorded his song for his next album release. He also told Pronger that he would be performing the song at the Grand Ole Opry on Nov. 17 and invited him to be on stage with him.

Says Pronger, "My dream is to be there." However, there is a bit of a problem. Funding to get him there, but he's getting help.

EDI Productions, a music production and promotion company is donating its time and services to help Pronger, by informing the Nashville people of Pronger's wish. In place so far The Nashville Network (TNN) has scheduled appearances for Pronger on the Ralph Emery Show and the Opry Backstage telecast; Shoney's Hotel, in cooperation with Opryland USA, has donated Pronger's accommodation during his stay and offered a substantial discount to those accompanying Pronger; TNN has arranged to have a film crew meet Pronger and his party outside of Nashville to document his arrival; and, a professional health care attendant has donated her services for the trip.

The main stumbling block is obtaining funds for transportation for the trip. Pronger's needs are such that a special vehicle is required.
