

Retailers just say no to Junos and Columbia House

Columbia House has once again raised the ire of Canada's major music retailers, and this time the Juno Awards have become the unwitting victims of this ongoing battle.

Following a recent meeting of the Retail Music Association of Canada (RMAC), several of Canada's major music retailers, including HMV, Sunrise Records, Music World, CD Plus and Saturn Distributing, have opted to boycott the 25th anniversary Juno Awards (March 10 in Hamilton), refuse to hang signs advertising the awards, and have also agreed to ban display advertising featuring Juno-nominated artists.

According to Leonard Kennedy, president of Saturn as well as RMAC, the Columbia House sponsorship is "a slap in the face to us. We cannot compete with the giveaways (by Columbia House). It is very unfortunate this has turned out the way it has."

The one notable exception to the boycott is Sam The Record Man, who have opted not to take part in the protest.

Columbia House has been a thorn in the side

Virgin Canada and Plus 8 sign licensing deal

Virgin Music Canada and Plus 8 Records Inc. have agreed on a major licensing deal for multiple artists and compilations for the North American territory.

Considered one of the world leaders in progressive electronic music, Plus 8 Records is a Windsor/London-based label created by Richie Hawtin and John Acquaviva, both of whom are highly respected DJs and producers.

Hawtin and Acquaviva both regularly headline raves across Europe, the UK and elsewhere. Hawtin, aka Plastikman, has been critically acclaimed for his "intense live constructions of music and cutting edge remixing abilities." In addition to handling their own record label, the pair also own the only vinyl manufacturing plant in Canada, along with Intellinet - a prominent North American distributor of all genres of underground electronic music on vinyl.

The first albums to be distributed by Virgin under the new arrangement will be Spatial Specific, from The Legion Of Green Men, and G-Spot from Speedy J, a specially repackaged double pack with the original and live albums.

of traditional retailers for many years, due to their practice of enticing new members by offering 10 CDs for a penny. Retailers also claim that Columbia House receives preferential treatment from the labels in terms of purchase price, and pays significantly smaller royalties to the artists themselves.

RMAC did indicate however that it will continue to display and advertise the commemorative four-CD box set, Oh What A Feeling. According to Sunrise head buyer Tim Baker, the box set is a "bonfire piece of product, and it is what we are in business for. Secondly, the advertisements for the box set stipulated 'Only available through Canadian music retail', and this set will not be available in the clubs. Thirdly, this is something that needed to be done, this particular type of historical package. We have nothing against the Junos for the last 24 years.

MCA acquires 50% share in Interscope Records

Doug Morris, chairman and CEO of the MCA Music Entertainment Group, has announced that MCA has acquired a 50% stake in Interscope Records. Under the new agreement, Interscope will be distributed in the US by Uni Distribution and by MCA Music Entertainment International in Canada and other territories.

Interscope was established in 1990 by record industry veterans Ted Field and Jimmy Iovine, and quickly became one of the more successful new labels in the business, achieving hits in numerous formats, and building a reputation for signing cutting-edge artists. Interscope's roster includes Bush, Primus, Deep Blue Something, Toadies and BLACKstreet, as well as Nine Inch Nails via a joint venture with TVT Records. The company also distributes multi-platinum rap artists Dr. Dre and Snoop Doggy Dogg through Death Row Records.

Interscope currently accounts for almost 3% market share of US releases. An integral part of the agreement allows MCA to choose not to release any specific music which the company deems objectionable. MCA will not have any ownership interest in or profit from those titles, whether new releases or back catalogue. The agreement allows for such music to be manufactured, distributed and marketed through unrelated third parties.

According to Morris, "Interscope Records has continually proven itself to be one of the most

Baker and Kennedy have been insisted that they don't want to see the RMAC decision get blown out of proportion, and were in fact hoping to keep the decision out of the press.

The controversy over the possible sponsorship of the Junos by Columbia House actually began to fester as early as November of last year, when sources informed RPM that the deal with Columbia House was already pretty much done. CARAS president Lee Silversides was contacted by RPM at that time, and denied any such deal had been discussed. However, Baker notes that on a


CRIA investigation leads to bootleg arrest

On the heels of a joint investigation by the Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA), Toronto's 52 Division Major Crime Unit and 52 Division Special Task Force, three Toronto residents have been arrested and face a total of 289 charges under the Copyright Act.

An extensive investigation was conducted during the past year, focussing on the production and manufacture of compact discs containing the works of popular Asian artists.


Members of the 52 Division Major Crime Unit and 52 Division Special Task Force executed several search warrants and a large quantity of master digital tapes, recording equipment, packaging equipment and business records were seized. It is estimated that approximately half a million dollars worth of CDs featuring Asian repertoire and artists were being distributed in Canada every six months.





November 30th meeting, RMAC was informed that the deal with Columbia House was already done. The deal is said to be worth \$175,000.

"CARAS knew how we felt last year about this, adds Baker, "and they did it anyway. This was meant to be a quiet protest, it was never meant to get out into the press. It was never really meant to be discussed. And it was something that each individual member of RMAC elected to do on their own, it was definitely not an organized thing."

"I cannot honestly believe that CARAS would alienate one of the most important sectors in the music industry by allowing Columbia House to

sponsor our industry awards show. They alienated record retailers, and without us, they are nothing. And without us, there is no Junos, because we sell music, and to alienate us for the sake of the dollar, just makes no sense."

This protest will also affect the display advertising purchased by Levi Strauss & Co., who are sponsoring the entertainer of the year Juno. None of the retailers participating in the protest will be displaying the Levi's entertainer of the year award advertising billboards.

Stan Kulin, president of Warner Music Canada and a member of the CARAS board of directors, expressed disappointment at the retailers' decision.

"I think it's unfortunate, but they made the decision, and I'm sure the Junos will be a success. The show's already a sell-out, I think it's a tremendous lineup this year, and I think there's a lot to be proud of in this industry. Hopefully, next year things will be back to normal."

Paul Alofs had been the sole retailer on the CARAS board when he was still the president of HMV Canada, but of course he is now the president of BMG Music Canada, meaning that the CARAS board no longer has retail representation. Alofs also expressed disappointment in the retailers' decision,

Global Meltdown '96 set for Toronto's Bamboo

Punjabi By Nature and The Afronubians will comprise Global Meltdown '96, a world music party which will coincide with Canadian Music Week.

The party is set for March 7 at the Bamboo Club on Toronto's Queen Street West. Punjabi By Nature is on first at 10 pm with Afronubians following at midnite.

Led by Tony Singh, Punjabi By Nature, an eight-piece band that combines bhangra music with rock, reggae and funk rhythms, have performed at major festivals in Vancouver and Toronto. The band recently released its first full length CD

entitled Jumpn For Joy, which has been nominated for a Juno award in the Global Music category.

The Afronubians, founded in 1992 by Sudanese expatriate Tarig Abubakar, perform what is described as "a high energy blend of African musics such as rhumba, soukous and highlife." The Great Africans, the band's second CD was released in October of last year. The band has twice won the Music Africa Award for best group.

Produced by Billy Bryans, one of the founding members of the Parachute Club, Global Meltdown '96 is being presented by Festival Distribution and Toronto community radio station CKLN.

EMI, MCA and Warner unite for compilation albums

EMI Music Canada, MCA Music Entertainment and Warner Music Canada have formerly announced a new joint venture to market music compilation albums in Canada.

The first album under this new agreement, titled Now!, is set for a March 26 release. The compilation series is modeled on the highly successful Now That's What I Call Music series in the UK, which was first launched in 1983 and is now 32 volumes deep. The comps contain recent pop/rock hits, and, thanks to some comprehensive high-profile advertising, have reached sales levels of 800,000 to one million units.

The Canadian venture will aim to duplicate the UK success, with a potential repertoire that will

feature recent hits by some of pop's biggest stars, including Seal, Janet Jackson, Coolio, Lisa Loeb, Shaggy, Everything But The Girl and others.

A national and regional advertising campaign supporting Now! will begin in mid-April with a television campaign reaching 25 million people, and supported by extensive print, radio and instore advertising.


The three joint partners in the venture have formed a long-term agreement within a framework that will allow cooperation in various genres. The first volume in the series will be distributed by EMI Music Canada, with further volumes being distributed on a rotating basis among the three partners.

Ehrlick appointed to business affairs at Enclave

Former BMG Music Canada business affairs VP Steven Ehrlick has been appointed to the top business affairs position at The Enclave, a new, full-service record company headquartered in New York. The announcement was made by The Enclave's president and CEO, Tom Zutaut.

Ehrlick will oversee the company's human resources policy and administration. Ehrlick was vice-president of business affairs and human resources for BMG Canada from 1992 to 1996. Prior to that, he was managing director of True North Records, and in-house counsel for the Finkelstein Group Companies. From 1988 to '90, he was president of Sirius Music Corp, a music production/publishing/management company.

The Enclave is distributed in Canada and the US by Cema, and by Virgin International in other territories.





Interesting too, and no one's making a big deal of it, or hiding it, there was a finder's fee of 10%, which leaves only \$4.5 million to refurbish the theatre. Anyway, I guess hummingbirds are cute and if they hang a lot of hummingbird feeders around the marquee, they'll attract the birders. And, there are as many of them as there are hummingbirds. Come out to my place any weekend and like Madonna says "You'll see." (EC: Hummingbird feeders???)

Graham Abbey and, as a matter of fact, check them all out. An excellent, fast-moving production. By the way, you can become a member of Equity Showcase Theatre for only \$25.00 (EC: Cheaper than a bar bill, by a long shot!!!)

Is that retail or wholesale??? A recent report in one of the dailies suggested bad times for the record business, but it was a little confusing. According to the report the Canadian recording industry grossed \$1.2 billion last year. But it doesn't make clear whether that was gross retail or wholesale after the returns. According to CRIA's figures, net sales for last year amounted to \$675 million. Now, if the \$1.2 billion figure was gross wholesale and if you factor in the returns, is it possible returns amounted to 56%? Speaking of returns, get ready for a big shock for this year. Talk about shipping platinum and taking back gold. That's no longer funny. One company, not known to strike heavy discount deals, is doing just that. Never in their history have they had to resort to offering such enormous discount selling deals. (EC: Quick! Turn the page!!!)

That's class!!! Each year the BMG people send me an invite to their post-Grammy Awards party. This is the kind of invite you put in your scrapbook, if you have one. A memorable invitation and very classy. This year happens to be the 30th anniversary of the awards. Maybe next year. (EC: You don't have a scrapbook???)

Alanis Morissette back at #1. Out of the 31 weeks that Alanis Morissette has been charting on the RPM 100, she has returned to the #1 slot no less than five times. She's back on top again this week. Her popularity isn't restricted to Canada this time round. She's got the ear of the world, and six Grammy nominations to boot. Not bad for a sweet little innocent from Ottawa. (EC: Have you heard her lyrics???)

Honest Ed gets his!!! It's not his birthday. He's not getting another award, and he's not giving anything away. Nothing like that. Charlie Cutts, the star of Massey and Roy Thomson Halls, is spearheading a tribute to Toronto's premiere showman, Ed Mirvish. The Toronto Entertainment District Association is having a gala evening in Ed's honour on March 4. They've reserved the Princess of Wales Theatre and they've already got 1,778 of Ed's friends to buy a seat for the night. That means it's already sold out. Good management!!! The amount of international press Ronnie Hawkins has been receiving lately is pretty awesome. The latest is a two-page spread in Country Music People, the January 1996 issue. Well-known writer Ian Wallace, made the return of his rockabilly column, Rockabilly Matters, even more credible with a great piece on Hawkins and his trip to the White House to renew his ties with fellow Arkansan Bill Clinton. It was during the G7 meeting in Halifax last year when Hawkins' manager Steve Thomson, invited Clinton to see The Hawk in concert. He couldn't make it and Thomson arranged for a phone conversation between the two. The Hawk's 60th birthday, the Quality-promoted CD and video (which was hard negotiating for Thomson to get Jerry Lee Lewis and Carl Perkins), and a deal in France with Warner Music and more deals pending, proves that a manager's work is never done. He's been looking after Ronnie for 20 years, which says something about the need for trust and mutual respect. (EC: Two of the good ole boys, Eh???)

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

but indicated that CARAS needed to get the funding from somewhere.

"I'm a member of the CARAS board and love Canadian music like everyone else, and it saddens me to see that anyone is boycotting the Junos. Having come out of retail, I know how tough it is out there. At the same time, the record clubs are out there doing business in a legal way, like the book clubs do business, they are in the market place doing what they do. In the UK, Britannia, which is the Columbia House of the UK, has been sponsoring the Brit Awards for the past five years, without any controversy. It's a very tough environment out there, and I'm saddened by this, but it's everyone's right to take a position, so I'm not going to pass judgement either way."

"I think CARAS, like any non-profit organization, needs funding. When you have someone that's offering to provide funding, there are virtually no not-for-profit organizations out there, be it in the music industry or otherwise, that can afford to pass up a major sponsorship opportunity."

Leonard Kennedy, president of RMAC, says that the retailer's biggest ally in the dispute with the record clubs could be, or should be, the artists themselves.

"Number one, we have to get the artists, the Canadian artists, who we've supported over the years, to support us in our endeavour against the clubs, by not having their product sold in the clubs. They've got to speak up, they've got to help us out, that's the bottom line. The advantage is more profitability for them, because the royalties are much greater at retail than they are at the clubs. Right now that's the only avenue we can take."

Kennedy also expressed concern at the fact that there is currently no retail representation on the CARAS board, and that there's been no effort on the part of CARAS to rectify that situation.

"No there isn't, and as Paul (Alofs) resigned his position, there's been nobody who's been asked to fill that position. For that matter, CARAS hasn't bothered to try to fill that position. Right now, CARAS doesn't have a spokesperson for retail."

Kennedy says that RMAC was offered the chance to sponsor the Junos, but he feels that the window of opportunity afforded the retailers was simply too small.

"There was a conversation, and it went down that we basically had two weeks to try and get together the funds that were needed to sponsor the Junos. And I'm not Superman, and in speaking to a couple of the members, they basically didn't want to know about it. But I believe the decision had already been made to go to Columbia House, no matter what I would have done."

"If you were with the Association, and I hit you up for \$20,000 to block Columbia House's sponsorship, does that make sense to you? What are you going to get from that \$20,000. We had nothing to offer the membership in terms of commercials that would most likely have to be made, which is an additional cost, and for which we don't have the funds."

"The thing that's important to know about this decision was that the decision was made well over three months ago, and nobody said anything from our end, but those decisions were made three months ago."

Sam The Record Man is one of the more notable retailers who decided not to back the RMAC protest. According to Jason Sniderman, he would certainly prefer not to see Columbia House sponsor the Junos, but he doesn't view it as that disastrous a situation.

"For me, I would prefer if that record clubs did not have a part in sponsoring the Junos. I'm on record with you as saying that I think the record clubs devalue the intellectual property, and I think any artist that sells their publishing at a three-quarter rate is compromising their future. How can artist devalue their intellectual property? Having said that, I will say that I would rather have the Junos than not have them. If this is what the CARAS braintrust has chosen to do to get the Junos sponsored this year, then I guess that's the way it has to be."

Sniderman says that he hopes the bad blood will boil away in the coming months, and that eventually both CARAS and RMAC can sit down and map out a strategy that would see both sides work together on the '97 Junos.

"I would like to see, next year, some opportunity where all of us could sit down and see whether the retailers could participate with the manufacturers and music industry to create some kind of overall sponsorship of the Junos, so they don't have to run to record clubs, or car manufacturers or whoever. I have spoken with both Leonard (Kennedy) and Lee (Silversides), and I think that there is an opportunity for open dialogue in the future, so that we can solve this before next February, and I think we should do that solving in April or May, and not now. We're not solving anything right now, there's just a lot of industry infighting, and that's not good for anyone."

Canada's strong quota of female artists was much in evidence throughout the past year, and was duly acknowledged when the nominees were announced for the 1996 Juno Awards, which take place March 10 at Hamilton's Copps Coliseum.

Mercury/Polydor country star Shania Twain continued her incredible rise to success by scoring an impressive seven nominations: best-selling album (foreign or domestic) and album (The Woman In Me), female vocalist, country female vocalist, single (Any Man Of Mine), songwriter and the Levi's Entertainer of the year.

Maverick/Warner artist Alanis Morissette changed from dance/pop princess to grunge queen with the release of her Jagged Little Pill album. The album went on to sell more than 600,000 copies in Canada, five million worldwide, and this year earned Morissette six Juno nominations: album and rock album (Jagged Little Pill), single (You Oughta Know), female vocalist, songwriter (with Glen Ballard), and Levi's Entertainer of the year.

Aboriginal artist Susan Aglukark earned strong AC/country radio airplay with her latest EMI release, This Child. Aglukark's solid crossover success in the past year was acknowledged with five Juno nominations: album (This Child), female vocalist, single and video (O Siem), and best music of aboriginal recording (also This Child).

Two of Canada's most successful pop exports, Bryan Adams and Celine Dion, each earned four nominations. Adams' nominations include single (Have You Ever Really Loved A Woman), songwriter, producer and entertainer of the year. Dion earned nods for album, best-selling album (foreign or domestic) and best-selling francophone album (D'eux), as well as female vocalist.

Scoring a trio of nominations were Warner's Odds (rock album, group and songwriter), Jann Arden (single, video and entertainer of the year), The Tea Party (group, rock album and video) and Orchestre Symphonique De Montreal (classical album: vocal or choral performance, classical album: large ensemble or soloist with large ensemble accompaniment (two nominations)).

Earning two nominations were album designer David Andoff, Tom Cochrane, Lara Fabian, Headstones, Ben Heppner, producer Chad Irschick, Colin James, Ashley MacIsaac, Charlie Major, Mario Pelchat, The Philosopher Kings, The Rankin Family, Laura Smith, Tafelmusik and Neil Young.

Canadian Music Hall of Famer Anne Murray will host the 25th anniversary Junos. With 29 albums and 25 Junos to her credit, Murray was a natural to host the awards for the first time. Murray also heads an impressive list of performers for the Juno program, which also includes Twain,

Morissette, k.d. lang, Jann Arden, Our Lady Peace, The Rankin Family, Gordon Lightfoot, and Tom Cochrane.

For the second straight year, the awards will be opened up to the general public, in two ways. Fans will be able to vote for the Levi's Entertainer of the year by way of a 99 cent call to the special phone line: 1-900-870-1200. A portion of the proceeds go to the Kid's Help Phone Line, with the phone lines being open from February 1 to midway through the Juno telecast on March 10.

The fans will also be able to enjoy the Junos first-hand, with a limited number of tickets on sale at Copps Coliseum and all Ticketmaster outlets. Tickets for the public are \$25 and \$30. For the first time, the public will be able to see all 37 award presentations, starting with the off-air awards at 6:30 pm, and continuing into the telecast which begins at 8 pm. Once again, the Junos will be broadcast live across Canada on the CBC-TV network.

Finally, CARAS has also established an official CARAS and Juno world-wide web site. Juno Awards Online, produced by Tony Tobias and designed by Kevin Towes is hosted at Toronto's Good Media. The web site contains 25 years of Juno and CARAS history, including a section on the Juno Hall of Fame and one called How The Junos Work. GROUP OF THE YEAR CONTENDERS

HEADSTONES

This heavy sounding quartet first emerged from the potent Kingston, Ontario music scene back in 1991, blitzing through Toronto's infamous Queen Street club scene in an attempt to gain the attention of those stubborn A&R reps from the major labels.

Those many hours in the clubs, played before some rousing crowds, prompted the band to release a debut album in 1993, *Picture Of Health*. The success of that album allowed the band to gain a spot on fellow Kingstonians The Tragically Hip's Another Roadside Attraction tour. Unfortunately, the ravages of touring took their toll on original drummer Mark Gibson, who left the band at that

point.

But as the saying goes, that which does not kill me...It was in the spring of 1995 that the band released their sophomore album, *Teeth & Tissue*, an appropriate name for this gut-wrenching collection of jaw-chomping songs produced by Glen Robinson and Mark S. Berry. From the opening power strains of *Hindsight*, through the frenetic first single, *Unsound*, all the way through to the album's final track, *One More Move*, *Teeth & Tissue* is Cancon rock at its earthy best.

Hugh Dillon, Trent Carr, Tim White and Dale Harrison have earned their stripes via the endless club grind, and they've also earned a 1996 Juno nomination for group of the year.

THE TRAGICALLY HIP

The story of Kingston's most famous rock and roll exports begins in 1986 when a group of guys got together and decided to form a rock band. After a series of successful local club dates, the group released its first recording, an independently-produced self-titled EP, in 1987, distributed only in the Kingston area. The best was indeed yet to

come. The album also earned the group a 1990 Juno for best new group.

1991 saw the release of the *Road Apples* album, which ultimately spent more than 30 weeks on the album charts, spawning several AOR hits including *Little Bones*, *Twist My Arm* and *Three Pistols*, and eventually reaching triple platinum as well. 1991 also was the Hip's first of two straight victories in the entertainer of the year category at the Junos.

Fully Completely, the Hip's third MCA album was released in the fall of '92, spawning the hits *Locked In The Trunk Of A Car* and *Courage*. When this album eventually topped quintuple platinum (500,000 units), the Hip became the first domestic act to enjoy three consecutive quintuple platinum releases.

September of 1994 saw the release of the band's *Day For Night* album, breaking industry precedent by being released on a Saturday, drawing massive lineups at retail. The album made history by debuting at #1 on RPM's album chart, the first domestic release to do so. Combining the sales of *Day For Night*, *Road Apples*, *Up To Here*, *Fully Completely*, that debut EP and the *Heksenketel* video, the Hip have sold more than 3 million combined units in Canada.

One of the more successful touring acts in Canadian history, the Hip are once again nominated for entertainer of the year at the Juno Awards.

BLUE RODEO

The story of Blue Rodeo begins with a pair of high school friends, Greg Keelor and Jim Cuddy, who, after trying their luck in New York, came back to



Toronto to form a band with bassist Basil Donovan, and keyboardist Bobby Wiseman.

The first album of the new venture, 1987's *Outskirts*, became an instant hit in Canada, led by the infectious hit single, *Try*. *Outskirts* has gone on to sell more than 400,000 units in Canada. *Outskirts* was followed by the critically-acclaimed *Diamond Mine*, which again spawned a hit in the title track, and certified the place of Keelor and Cuddy among the first rank of Canadian songwriters.

The two albums that followed, 1991's *Casino* and 1992's *Lost Together*, were also well-received critically, although they didn't gain the commercial acceptance of the previous two. *Lost Together* also marked a significant demarcation point for the band, with the departure of Wiseman, and the additions of new keyboardist James Gray, drummer Glen Milchem and multi-instrumentalist Kim Deschamps.

In 1993, seeking to blow off some steam after a lengthy tour, the group gathered for a lengthy songwriting session at Keelor's farm north of Toronto. The original plan, to record an acoustic EP, soon developed into the highly successful *Five Days In July* album, which eventually found its way past quadruple platinum.

Not wanting to be placed in one corner or format, the group again used a portable studio in Keelor's farm to record the eclectic and definition-defying *Nowhere To Here* album. The group's sixth album for Warner Music Canada, it's also the second under the group's recently-signed US deal with Discovery Records.

Blue Rodeo has earned a well-deserved nomination for group of the year at the '96 Juno Awards.

ODDS

Sometimes it takes one or two albums before a band gains acceptance from both the masses and the media. The Odds have been considered one of this country's premier rock/pop bands for several years by those on the inside, but it was only via the release of their first album with Warner Music Canada, *Good Weird Feeling*, that the band gained that widespread acceptance, both critically and commercially.

This four-piece band from Vancouver is led



come.

In December of '88 the band signed with MCA, who picked up that first EP. A year later came the first full length album with MCA, *Up To Here*, recorded with Don Smith in Memphis. Producing such eventually Canadian staples as *Blow At High Dough*, *New Orleans Is Sinking*, *38 Years Old* and *Boots Or Hearts*, the album went

by singer/guitarists Steven Drake and Craig Northey, ably accompanied by bassist Doug Elliot and drummer Pat Steward. Steward, who turned down an offer to join the band in the beginning, returned for the *Good Weird Feeling* album, replacing the departed Paul Brennan.

As with their favored peers Matthew Sweet and the Gin Blossoms, and forerunners Neil Young and Tom Petty, the Odds have that particular talent to craft strong pop songs that don't sound poppy, combining deft hooks with occasionally witty and cynical lyrics.

The band released a pair of albums on the US-based Zoo Records label, 1991's *Neopolitan* and 1993's *Bedbugs*. Although the albums afforded the band a strong cult fan base in Canada, aided by a string of endless tours, they didn't make a great deal of headway on the charts.



For the 1996 Juno Awards, the Odds are up for a trio of honours: songwriter, group and best rock album.

THE TEA PARTY

Jeff Burrows, Stuart Chatwood and Jeff Martin had played together extensively in a series of bar bands in and around their Windsor, Ontario home for years, but it took a marathon jam session at Toronto's Cherry Beach Rehearsal Rooms in 1990 for the band to finally become solidified.

In 1993, the band signed a worldwide recording deal with EMI Music Canada, with the group's debut album, *Splendor Solis*, released later that same year. The response of the worldwide


music community was immediate and overwhelmingly positive.

Backed by a 150 date world tour in 11 countries, *Splendor Solis* eventually topped the platinum mark in Canada, and earned the group a Critic's Choice Award from Germany's *World Of Music* magazine. The band also scored well at the '94 MuchMusic Canadian Video Awards, where they were honoured with best Canadian video (*The River*) and best Canadian group awards.

In December of '94, the band headed to the A&M Studios in Los Angeles to record their

follow-up album. *The Edges Of Twilight*, released in the spring of '95, was certainly one of the more eclectic Canadian releases in years, featuring spoken word performances by Roy Harper, and over 30 different instruments. The album again earned critical accolades around the world, and quickly became their second straight platinum release.

The Tea Party is clearly one of the more ambitious and adventurous bands in Canadian rock circles, and judging by the worldwide critical acclaim, one that definitely hasn't reached its fullest potential. The Tea Party are nominated for group of the year for the 1996 Juno Awards.



THE RANKIN FAMILY

East coast families tend to be very close-knit groups, and this family from Mabou, Cape Breton, is really no exception. What is exceptional is that the group has transferred those tight family bonds into their music, with the results being the kind of success most families only dream of.


The Rankin Family success story really began with the album and song *Fare Thee Well Love*. The song became an instant classic at radio, crossing the boundaries of numerous formats to become a hit at both adult contemporary and country radio. The album went on to be the second biggest country album in Canada in 1994.



That same year, 1994, the band quickly came back with a follow-up album, *North Country*, which offered a series of country and AC hits. That album also popped up on both the 1994 year-end albums and country albums charts. While the chart success signified the Rankins' arrival in the industry, they didn't really become a household word in the public's mind until their stunning showing at the '94 Juno Awards, when they swept away four

awards, including entertainer of the year.


The Rankins are once again riding some strong chart success, courtesy of their latest EMI release, *Endless Seasons*. The album, already certified platinum in Canada, recently garnered the Rankins a group of the year win at the East Coast Music Awards, and has helped earn the band a pair of '96 Juno nominations: group and country group or duo of the year.

FEMALE VOCALIST NOMINEES

CELINE DION

Few, if any, Canadian artists have achieved the incredible career accolades and milestones that this Quebec native has. The fact that she has done so much and is still just 28 years old is a testament to her incredible popularity around the world.

Dion's success story began with the 1988 release of her first album, the French-language record *Incognito*. That was followed two years later by Dion's English-language debut, *Unison*, which featured a smash hit in the song *Where Does My Heart Beat Now?*

Following the 1991 release of her second French-language album, *Dion Chante Plamondon* (a tribute to Francophone songwriting great Luc Plamondon), Dion released her second English-language album, titled simply *Celine Dion*. That 1992 album created a series of top 40 hits (*Love Can Move Mountains*, *Water From The Moon*, *If You Asked Me To*, *Beauty & The Beast*), and was really the album that propelled Dion to stardom across North America. In the wake of the self-titled album's success (900,000 units in Canada), Dion became the first Canadian artist to ever win a Grammy, Oscar, Juno and Felix Award all in the

same year (1993).

The Colour Of My Love, released in 1993, became one of the most successful Canadian releases ever. The album again spawned a string of top 40 hits (*The Power Of Love*, *Misled*, *Think Twice*, the title track, *Only One Road*, *When I Fall In Love*), and became just the fifth domestic release certified diamond in Canada (one million units). The album also topped triple platinum (3 million) in the US, 6 times platinum in the UK, and platinum in a dozen other countries. Total worldwide sales for *The Colour Of My Love* now top 12 million.

Dion's last studio release, the French-language *D'Eux*, has become the most successful French-language album in history. The record is already five times platinum (500,000 units) in Canada, and has topped sales of four million in Europe.

The Dion success story will continue in 1996 with the impending release of her newest English Language album, *Falling Into You*. Working with the likes of producers David Foster, Jim Steinman, Humberto Gatica and Ric Wake, the album will feature classics like Carole King's *Natural Woman*, Eric Carmen's *All By Myself* and Ike & Tina Turner's *River Deep Mountain High*, along with originals written by Dan Hill, Aldo Nova, Jean

Jacques Goldman and Diane Warren, who penned the album's lead single, *Because You Loved Me*.

For the 1996 Juno Awards, Celine Dion is nominated for four awards: album, best-selling francophone album and best-selling album (foreign or domestic) for *D'Eux*, as well as top female vocalist.



SHANIA TWAIN

This Timmins, Ontario native's musical focus began at an early age, with her parents pulling her out of bed as a child to go to perform at local clubs after the liquor sales had stopped at 1 am. Soon, Twain was performing at every TV station, radio station and community centre in the area, developing what looked to be a most promising career.

Things took a tragic turn, however, when both of Twain's parents were killed in a car accident when she was just 21. Despite her relative youth, the accident suddenly made Twain responsible for her entire family, and in a strange twist of fate, propelled her even faster into the world of professional music. Forced to put food on the table for her siblings, Twain took a job at nearby Deerhurst Resort in Huntsville, singing in the resort's nightly showcase, honing her skills on everything from country music to show tunes.

The word got out, however, and instead of Twain heading to Nashville, Nashville came to her in the form of entertainment lawyer Richard Frank, who came to see her Deerhurst show. It was via Frank that she met producer Norro Wilson, who in turn introduced her to Mercury/Nashville's Buddy Cannon. Just like that, Twain was signed to Mercury/Nashville.

Her self-titled debut spawned charted songs in *What Made You Say That* and *Dance With The One That Brought You*, and earned her a Rising Video Star Award from CMT Europe.

Twain's life and career took a significant turn in the summer of '94 when she married mega-producer Robert John 'Mutt' Lange, who, not surprisingly, lent his writing and producing talents

to Twain's sophomore release, *The Woman In Me*. The rest has been truly phenomenal. The album resided in the #1 slot on the country albums chart for 10 weeks, pushed out of the top slot by none other than Garth Brooks (*The Hits*). The album has produced four #1 country singles (*Any Man Of Mine*, *Whose Bed Have Your Boots Been Under?*, the title track, *If You're Not In It For*

four Grammy nominations, Twain leads all artists with seven nominations at the 1996 Junos: album and best-selling album (*The Woman In Me*), single (*Any Man Of Mine*), female vocalist, country female vocalist, songwriter (with Lange), and the Levi's entertainer of the year.

RITA MACNEIL

Rita MacNeil's latest album, *Porch Songs*, comes at a time when her career, both on CD and everywhere else, is skyrocketing. It's been a long time coming for the Big Pond, Cape Breton native, whose famous and well-attended Tea Room in her hometown bears her name.

MacNeil was still a struggling single mother living in Ontario when her stunning voice and songwriting skills impressed everyone who saw her at Vancouver's Expo '86. Things just took off from there and now, 20 years and 13 albums later, Rita MacNeil is as popular an artist as there is in Canada.

Of course, beyond her platinum album sales and her always popular concert tours, MacNeil's greatest success may lie in her enormously popular CBC-Television series, *Rita & Friends*. It's a project that Rita is proud to host, since it allows millions of Canadian television viewers the opportunity to see some of the brightest newcomers in Canadian music.

Her skyrocketing career has led to a number of changes for the singer/songwriter in the past year. She left her former label, Virgin Records, to sign directly with EMI Music Canada. She recently left her former management company, Balmur, and expanded her own Lupins Productions company. This year, MacNeil is nominated for top female vocalist at the Juno Awards.

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
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
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ALANIS MORISSETTE

This Ottawa native says that writing songs is something "I had to do, like I didn't have any other choice." While her songwriting has taken on many different guises through her surprisingly lengthy career (she's still just 20 years old), it seemed to finally find its ideal outlet in the ravaged teen angst of the phenomenal best seller, *Jagged Little Pill*.

The content and lyrical ferocity of *Jagged Little Pill* caught many in the industry off guard, particularly those who had grown accustomed to the dance/pop starlet who recorded a pair of albums for MCA in the eighties. Although the two albums afforded Morissette some modest success in this country, she was never able to dispel the dance princess image, and decided to move to Los Angeles to rediscover her musical purpose.

In Los Angeles, her songwriting took on an entirely different theme, reflecting her own personal experiences and feelings, many of them of an angry nature. She managed to hook up with noted songwriter/producer Glen Ballard, who help mold the new Alanis sound. But perhaps her biggest break came when Madonna's Maverick Records label decided to give her a recording contract. After that, it's been a little out of control.

Jagged Little Pill has gone on to become one of the most successful Canadian recordings ever, particularly internationally. The album topped the charts both in Canada and the US, Morissette became the first artist to ever grace the covers of

Spin and Rolling Stone simultaneously, and sales have topped four million worldwide. To top it off, Morissette earned an incredible six Grammy nominations earlier this year.

Morissette could be in for a delightful



homecoming when she returns to Toronto for the 1996 Junos. There, she is up for six awards, including album, single, female vocalist, songwriter, rock album and the Levi's entertainer of the year.

SUSAN AGLUKARK

Born in Churchill, Manitoba, Susan Aglukark and her family moved around the Northwest Territories for the first 12 years of her life before finally settling in Arviat, NWT.

Initially, Aglukark seemed destined to involve herself in the political life, first employed by the



department of Indian and Northern Affairs as linguist, later taking a position with the political lobby group Inuit Tapirisat. It was almost by accident that she forayed into the world of music.

In the four years since she gave her first public performance in Canada's north, Aglukark's career has taken off. First, she appeared on a CBC Radio eastern Arctic compilation, eventually releasing her own contribution independently. In 1992, her first full-length independent album, *Arctic Rose*, was released in the northern provinces. Despite its very regional distribution, the album sold more than 10,000 copies, prompting EMI Music Canada to immediately sign the artist.

EMI released her Christmas album in December of 1993, which was followed in the spring of 1994 by the re-release of her *Arctic Rose* album, an album produced by country veteran Randall Prescott.

In the months following the release of *Arctic Rose*, Aglukark became a household word in this country. She was featured in such notable publications as *Saturday Night* and the *New York Times*, and *MacLean's Magazine* named her one of Canada's Leaders To Watch For. She's performed before a pair of Prime Ministers and Queen Elizabeth II.

In March of '95, Aglukark released her first full-length album for EMI, *This Child*. The album quickly rose up the charts, topping the RPM Country Albums chart on May 22. The lead single, *O Siem*, hit the #1 slot on both the AC and Country charts, and was later followed up the charts by the hits *Hina Na Ho* (Celebration Song) and *Breakin' Down*.

With *This Child* now certified two times platinum in Canada, Aglukark has confirmed her place as one of this country's most important and diverse talents. Aglukark has received five 1996 Juno Award nominations: female vocalist, album, best music of aboriginal Canada recording, and single and video (*O Siem*).

MALE VOCALIST NOMINEES

TOM COCHRANE

It was back in 1977 when Tom Cochrane answered a call to join a fledgling Toronto bar band called Red Rider, which at that time featured Ken Greer, Rob Baker and Peter Boynton. The Lynn Lake, Manitoba native, who had toiled in vail for a solo career, immediately became the band's principal songwriter.

Joined by bassist Jeff Jones, the group released their Capitol debut, *Don't Fight It*, in 1980, featuring their first hit, *White Hot*. Other albums followed thereafter, including 1981's *As Far As Siam*, 1983's *Neruda*, and 1984's *Breaking Curfew*.

It was the release of the 1986 offering, titled *Tom Cochrane & Red Rider*, that confirmed Cochrane's status as the leader of the band. That '86 album was essentially the beginnings of Cochrane's arrival as one of Canada's preeminent songwriters, producing such hits as *Boy Inside The Man* and *The Untouchable One*.

That album was followed by '87's *Victory Day*, which again spawned a series of hits in the title track, *Good Times*, *Ocean Blues* and the anthemic *Big League*. Although Tom Cochrane & Red Rider would release one more album, *The Symphony Sessions* (1989), it was around that time that Cochrane decided to go out on his own.

In 1991, Cochrane resurfaced with his first official solo album, *Mad Mad World*, the album



that made him a star. The album produced three #1 singles in *No Regrets*, *Sinking Like A Sunset* and Cochrane's signature song, *Life Is A Highway*. The latter made Cochrane a voice to be reckoned with south of the border, reaching the top ten of the US charts. The album went on to become just the sixth domestic diamond album in history.

Tom Cochrane returned in 1994 with his latest release, *Ragged Ass Road*, which immediately offered up a hit song in the first single, *I Wish You Well*. Cochrane, a multi-Juno winner in the past, is nominated for a pair of '96 Junos: album and top male vocalist.

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
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Canadian Music Week

NEIL YOUNG

It says something about the many different sides that make up Neil Young that the man they now call The Godfather of Grunge began his career



with the Winnipeg folk/rock group The Squires in the early '60s. After they disbanded, Young headed back to his Toronto birthplace to join The Mynah Birds with Rick 'Super Freak' James, but the band disintegrated with James' arrest for desertion.

Young and bassist Bruce Palmer headed for Los Angeles, where a chance meeting with Stephen Stills and Richie Furay led to the formation of Buffalo Springfield. After three albums and numerous break ups/make ups, the band split for good in '68 with Young embarking on a solo career. 1969 saw the release of the first Neil Young &

Crazy Horse album, *Everybody Knows This Is Nowhere*. Later that year, Young had his first stint with Crosby, Stills & Nash, joining them at Woodstock. But his solo career continued with the '72 release of the classic *After The Gold Rush*, featuring the hits *Tell Me Why*, *Birds* and *Southern Man*.

Young followed that with his landmark *Harvest* album, which featured his only #1 single, *Heart Of Gold*. Other '70s albums from this prolific and diverse artist included *Journey Through The Past*, *Time Fades Away*, *On The Beach*, *Tonight's The Night*, *Zuma*, *Long May You Run*, *American Stars 'N Bars*, *Comes A Time* and *Rust Never Sleeps*.

In the '80s, Young continued his experimental forays, from the country sounds of *Hawks & Doves* and *Old Ways*, to the techno sounds of *Trans and Landing On Water*, to the retro sounds of *Everybody's Rockin'*. He joined with Crazy Horse on the albums *Reactor* and *Life*, and took one more kick at CSNY with 1988's *American Dream*. At the end of the decade, Young appeared re-energized with the album *Freedom*, featuring the electric *Rockin' In The Free World*.

Young opened the '90s with *Ragged Glory*, followed by the double live effort *Weld*. It was 1991's *Arc* that established that Godfather Of Grunge rep, but he quickly changed directions again on the follow-up, *Harvest Moon*. Following the release of '93's *Unplugged* album, he gained an Oscar nomination for the title track from Philadelphia. 1994 saw the release of the critically-acclaimed *Sleeps With Angels*, while '95 saw Young team with Pearl Jam for the release of *Mirror Ball*.

This year, Young is nominated for top male vocalist and best rock album at the Juno Awards.

COLIN JAMES

It was in 1988 when Colin James burst onto the Canadian music scene with his electric debut album. It was pure rock and roll, played with a zest and raucous attitude that few soft-spoken Canadians were used to. James was a true triple-threat artist: a talented songwriter, a raunchy singer, and a ferocious guitarist. Combining the three elements, James was quickly stamped with the 'can't miss' label by critics throughout the country.



That first album contained songs that have since become staples at Canadian rock radio: *Five Long Years*, *Voodoo Thing*, *Chicks N' Cars* and *Why'd You Lie?*, the latter of which was turned into one of the more memorable videos in recent memory. Growing up in Winnipeg, and consuming a steady diet of blues and classic rock and roll, James took the classic rock 'n roll sound and combined it with an '80s energy, an energy that came across in spades in his dynamic live set.

Quickly following up on the success of the debut album, James released his second album with Virgin, *Sudden Stop*, in 1990, which featured the harder-edged cuts *Just Came Back* and *Keep On Lovin' Me Baby*. Since their release, both albums have gone on to sell more than 200,000 copies in Canada alone. In 1993, James returned with the roots oriented *Colin James & The Little Big Band* album, his ode to the great rock and roll artists of the fifties, an album that spawned hits in *Cadillac Baby*, *Surely (I Love You)* and *No More Doggin'*.

In February of 1995, James released his final album with Virgin, a greatest hits package entitled *Then Again*. After signing with Warner Music Canada, James released his latest effort, *Bad Habits*, which exudes the sounds of the Delta blues and Memphis funk.

Bad Habits has earned James a 1996 Juno nod for top male vocalist.

CHARLIE MAJOR

Success has come fast and furious for Charlie Major in the last two years, but it's a success story that has been building for some time. It only took the release of Major's Arista debut, *The Other Side*, for that success to be fully realized.

Major's career, in fact, was up and running long before *The Other Side* came into being. Many in the country community will remember that Major first earned his stripes as a songwriter, with his 1990 penning of *Backroads* becoming a #1 hit stateside for American country star Ricky Van Shelton. But Major wasn't quite ready to do his own album just yet, saying "I couldn't do it because I hadn't fully realized who Charlie Major was."

When the right time came, he made all the right moves, signing with Arista/BMG, and travelling down to Nashville to record with red-hot producer Steve Fishell and a core of veteran players. The results have been nothing short of a Major phenomenon.

The Other Side went on to produce an incredible six #1 country singles, unprecedented for a domestic country act. The title track, *I'm Gonna Drive You Out Of My Mind*, *I'm Somebody*, *Nobody Gets Too Much Love*, *It Can't Happen To Me* and *I'm Here* all topped the RPM Country Tracks chart, with the album also hitting #1 on the Country Albums chart, eventually lasting on that chart for more than 100 weeks. The album

also earned Major a slew of Big Country and CCMA honours, as well as two straight Junos for country male vocalist.

Major returned in September of '95 with his sophomore release, *Lucky Man*, which spawned an immediate hit in the lead single, *(I Do It) For Money*. This year, Major is nominated for top male vocalist and country male vocalist at the Juno Awards.



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ENTERTAINER OF THE YEAR HOPEFULS

BRYAN ADAMS

Take a listen to the first album, 1979's near-discoish *Let Me Take You Dancing*, and you may quickly realize just how far Bryan Adams has come in the 17 years since that somewhat ill-fated first release. After that first release there was a rendezvous with Sweeney Todd, and a couple more less than spectacular releases, before the **BIG BREAKTHROUGH** came with 1983's *Cuts Like A Knife*, an album that produced four hit singles and propelled Adams on his way. Little wonder that the title track from that album was the one Adams tune included on the commemorative box set, *Oh What A Feeling*.

While *Cuts Like A Knife* signified Adams' presence in Canada, it was his 1985 monster release, *Reckless*, that made Adams a star worldwide. The album produced a slew of hit singles (*Run To You*, *Somebody*, *One Night Love Affair*, *Heaven*, *Summer Of '69*, *It's Only Love*) and eventually became the first domestic release ever to be certified diamond in Canada.


That album was followed in 1987 by *Into The Fire*. While not as commercially successful as *Reckless*, it may have been Adams' most critically-praised release yet, featuring solid rock anthems in the title track, *Heat Of The Night*, *Remembrance*

Day and Night, and *Native Son*.

Adams-mania resumed again in 1991 with *Waking Up The Neighbours*, which eventually became Adams' second diamond-seller in Canada. The album again featured a series of top 40 hits (*Can't Stop This Thing We Started*, *Thought I'd Died And Gone To Heaven*, *Do I Have To Say The Words?*), including the previously released theme from *Robin Hood: Prince Of Thieves*, *Everything I Do (I Do It For You)*, one of the biggest selling singles of all time, which got Adams a spot in the *Guinness Book Of World Records*.

1994 saw the release of his greatest hits package, *So Far So Good*, which again sold millions worldwide and featured another hit in the previously-unreleased *Please Forgive Me*. That same year, Adams hit the top of the charts again, this time teaming up with Sting and Rod Stewart on the *Three Musketeers* theme, *All For Love*. Although Adams didn't release an album in '95, he once again scored a #1 hit with *Have You Ever Really Loved A Woman*, from the *Don Juan Demarco* Soundtrack, which gained him an Oscar nomination.

It is the success of *Have You Ever Really Loved A Woman* that has earned Adams four nominations for this year's Junos: single, songwriter, producer and Levi's entertainer of the year.



JANN ARDEN

Calgary native Jann Arden has a very simple formula for success: "Every time you take a step up, it seems that it's the right thing and you should be happening that way. If it doesn't feel right, then you just don't do it."

Arden burst onto the Canadian music scene in February of 1993 with the release of her A&M debut, *Time For Mercy*. Following that release, Arden embarked on an arduous stretch of touring to promote the record, with shows across Canada, the US and Europe. The endless promotion paid off, as Arden accrued both critical and commercial success for the album.

Time For Mercy eventually topped platinum status in Canada, earning Arden a pair of Junos: most promising solo performer and best video for *I Would Die For You*. The video's director, Jeth Weinrich, went on to capture best director honours at the Canadian Music Video Awards. Three songs from the album hit the top 40: *Will You Remember Me*, *I Would Die For You* and *I'm Not Your Lover*.

In the summer of '94, Arden released her


sophomore album, *Living Under June*, once again produced by veteran Ed Cherney. The title, despite its eclectic sounding name, actually refers to the fact that Arden was living in a basement apartment underneath a woman named June when she wrote much of the material for the album.

The album quickly became a platinum success in Canada, spawning a string of top 40 hits, including *Could I Be Your Girl*, *Unloved* (her duet with Jackson Browne), *Insensitive* (written by Juno nominee Anne Loree, which hit #1 not only her in Canada but in Italy as well), and *Good Mother*, a song which featured one of the more stirring videos in recent memory. The album's critical and commercial success was certified at the '95 Junos, where Arden picked up three awards: single (*Could I Be Your Girl*), female vocalist, and songwriter.

With *Living Under June* having recently reentered the top 100 Albums charts, Arden's presence in the industry continues to remain strong. This year, Arden is nominated for three '96 Juno Awards: single (*Insensitive*), video (*Good Mother*), and the Levi's entertainer of the year.



Edgar Allan Poe's *The Masque of the Red Death* inspired this girl to change her name, but the fascination with the macabre doesn't seem to end there. By now everyone's heard her line (presumably learned from experience) that "You can't talk to a psycho like a normal human being." And if that is a self referential statement, then it stands to sense that she would try to bury the discussion in as many instruments as possible - which she has. But the main instrument on this dancy, heavy and impressive debut is Technology, and that means plenty of keyboard programming and techno babble (ever heard the word 'modem' used in a lyric before?). But the digital gadgetry is used creatively enough for unsympathisers of the man-machine to yield to the seductions of Poe's very natural vocal prowess. Infrequent lulls in *Another World* and *Fingertips* (where the music runs the risk of drowning in its own off kilter melodies) are rescued by the logic and coherence her vocals impose on the circumstance. A debut album wouldn't be right without some experimentation, and Poe makes room for it by way of a trumpet, flute and piano (*Beautiful Girl*, *Junkie*) which could yield some highly prized new territory if pursued on her next album. After the success of *Trigger Happy Jack*, Warner will have lots to choose from for a second single, dead ringers of which could be *Angry Johnny*, *Dolphin* or the title track. A new wave in alternative? This could very well be it. -RG

AIMEE MANN
I'm With Stupid


We're tempted to say that this is one of the sweetest rock alternative albums we've heard in a while. By that we mean that ex-TiI Tuesday singer Aimee Mann has a



musical style crystallized in her Bostonian features and adorable vocals that would make this debut a shoo in if not for the accompanying music. A modest production guides *I'm With Stupid* through its 50 hesitant minutes up at bat and its several hits. Principle songwriting by Mann and Jon Brion (from *Suede*) and a few guest appearances by Juliana Hatfield have made this a well anticipated album, but Mann and Brion seemed to have asked politely of their muse rather than worked the bugger to the ground. This is the downshot to *I'm With Stupid*; that Mann and Brion play it a little too safe and lose a lot of colour as a result. Its strong points will redeem this release, however; tunes like *Long Shot* and *All Over Now* which stand a better shot than most at alternative radio. -RG


With *Replicants*, the members of *Failure* and *Tool* have banded together to pay tribute to their roots, especially new wave and early seventies rock (!?). Anyone who's familiar with *Tool* and their industrial metal will wonder just what these guys purported to add to the Cars' *Just What I Needed*, Gary Numan's *Are 'Friends' Electric?* or *Missing Person's Destination Unknown*: once you kill




the arterial melody, the tune stands a good chance of dying. Still, there are successes in the mire, not to mention a prevailing logic (witness Lennon's *How Do You Sleep?* and McCartney's *Silly Love Songs* response - a must hear with Maynard Keenan at the mike). While Neil Young's *Cinnamon Girl* could have been a live outtake from the master himself, Bowie's *Bewlay Brothers*, Floyd's *Ibiza Bar* and T. Rex's *Life's A Gas* give troubled shades to these obscure classics. The atypical nature of the product could do wonders for it - a good shtick is hard come by in these cross generic times and *Replicants* can certainly claim that much. While we feel confident that musical maturity will bring maturity of interpretation, the album should nevertheless create a more than minor hubbub in the alternative fringe. And with a musical form now thirty years old, there are certainly enough resources worth exploiting to keep these *Replicants* replicating. -RG

VOX VIOLINS
Playing With Pollywogs In The River Of Life

Mark Clifford and Beth Bartley have been performing for years as the duo *Vox Violins* and have evidently established a considerable reputation for their creativity and versatility. We can believe it after listening to this, their first national release. Truth to tell, it's difficult to describe because of the diversity of presentation. Running *Away*, for example, reminds one of *Lambada*. *Lost Irish Melody*, on the other hand, has a soft pastoral texture to it. There's *Do You Remember?* which seems instrumentally and artistically self indulgent. The *Sand* sounds like celtic music at a country hoedown. End *That Way* could well be white bread rock and *Amazing Grace* opens with a structure that might have been recorded on Waikiki Beach. And, so it goes. Each track is distinctive and,



this is most important, very interesting and pleasurable. We're not sure if our ham-fisted comments are doing this project the full justice it deserves. We can only suggest that you try it for yourself. We think you'll like it. We think we did. -BW



The proliferation of memorial and "Salute to" orchestras is welcome, but it's also nice to hear new charts. The liner notes don't make it clear if this is a studio band or a touring one, but the distinctive Elgart sound is still very much in evidence on this album that we predict will become a special favourite at suburban house parties -- the kind where people dance touching. That sound comes from arrangements that feature a rhythm section, but no piano, muted brass and strong emphasis on bass trombone. The 14 tracks can justifiably be called standards and include *Yearning*, *Honeysuckle Rose*, *Sleepy Time Gal*, *Wabash Blues* and the too seldom heart *Mountain Greenery*. Swing isn't dead yet and this album proves it. -BW

ASTOR PIAZZOLLA
Luna

Astor Piazzolla held that tango should be not only dance music but concert music as well. So, he expanded the form and became world renowned whole playing music that seems to begin as tango but then expands -- or degenerates, depending upon one's personal preference -- into a classical oeuvre or at least an approximation of same. This live recording is of Piazzolla and the New Tango Sex-Tet at the Royal Carré Theatre in Amsterdam. It was their last (he died of a stroke in 1992 in his early seventies) and should be considered a memorial. Whether the maestro will achieve respectful remembrance as the man who legitimized the tango is for the ages to decide. Luna is a vexing listening experience to this pair of North American ears. Each measure starts promisingly enough with the familiar rhythm of the tango but then wings off into seeming improvisation, rather like Victor Borge in some of his comic turns. There is no doubt however, that he will be remembered as a mater of the bandoneon. The instrument, invented in Germany, has been described as a cross between a standard button accordion and a boa constrictor. Its bellows are exceeding long, allowing the musicians great gusts of air with which to seize upon chords, accentuate rhythms and sustain the most sinewy elongated notes. Though many Latin Americans play it, none have ever equalled the mastery of it displayed by Astor Piazzolla. -BW




Not all will enjoy Luna, but anyone with an ear for instrumental achievement will appreciate it. -BW

If at first you do succeed, why not do it again. That would seem to be the philosophy behind this compilation package, the followup to a similar project released by NARAS and Sony for last year's Grammys. Last year's effort did some nice numbers at retail, and this one should do equally as well, if not more so. It would be tough to find another compilation released anytime in the last couple of years that had the star power and hit content that this one does. The 11 tracks included here are based on the nominees in three categories: record of the year, song of the year and best new artist. In some ways, it's a shame that Sony couldn't have gotten this one out of the box a little sooner, as the numbers for it could have been even better than what is now projected (2-300,000 in Canada). Features many of the biggest songs of '95: the Mariah Carey/Boyz II Men duet *One Sweet Day*; Coolio's *Gangsta's Paradise*; Seal's *Kiss From A Rose*; Joan Osborne's *One Of Us*; TLC's *Waterfalls*; All-4-One's *I Can Love You Like That*; Michael Jackson's *You Are Not Alone*; Baby from Brandy and Let Her Cry by Hootie et al. Also includes some nice Canon quota from Alanis Morissette (*You Oughta Know*) and Shania Twain (*Any Man Of Mine*). A fine and worthy effort, something our own academy should take a look at. -RR

Blackhawk eases into #1 with their latest Arista release, *Like There Ain't No Yesterday*. The song is included on their *Strong Enough* album.

Patricia Conroy has the biggest mover this week with *Keep Me Rockin'* jumping up to #27 from #44 after five weeks of charting.

Terri Clark has the most added single this week with *If I Were You*, the follow-up to *When Boy Meets Girl* (#24). There's a pleasant twist to the new release, it was written by Clark and qualifies as three-parts Cancon (MAL). Taken from her self-titled Mercury album, the single enters the chart at #78.

BMG's Dale Peters brought around the latest Diamond Rio album, which is entitled *IV*. The band produced the album with Tim DuBois and Michael Clute. *Walkin' Away*, taken as a single from the album, is already working its way up the charts, and bullets into the #22 slot this week. Peters also brought along Alan Jackson's *Greatest Hits Video Collection*, and the *Lonestar* album, which is hot at retail and enters the RPM Country Albums chart at #39. Interest in the album has been fuelled by the band's second release, *No News*, which jumps up to #25 this week.

Lawnie Wallace is getting the old MCA red carpet treatment from Ed Harris on the release of *Thought I Was Dreaming*, the title track of her debut album which was produced by John Gulley. Wallace gets a good start with the single which enters the chart at #80. The song was written by Steve Earle and Greg Trooper. Wallace, who lives in Stouffville, Ontario, was discovered by Harris, Ross Reynolds and Stephen Tennant when she was showcasing at Canadian Country Music Week '94 in Calgary. The album is being targeted for a March release. Wallace appears on the Feb. 24 edition of *Today's Country*, performing her first single, *Little Lies*, *Big Trouble*. She'll also treat listeners to a live version of the follow-up single. She will be backed by the Hot House Band.

MCA's Pete Watson brings us up to date on Frazier River, a new band that's beginning to pick up action at country radio with their release of *She Got What She Deserved* (#69). Based in Cincinnati,

the band is made up of Danny Frazier (guitar, lead vocals), Jim Morris (keyboards, vocals), Chuck Adair (guitar), Bob Wilson (bass, vocals), Brian "Gigs" Baverman (drums), and Greg Amburgy (guitar, keyboards, vocals).

George Fox continues to fill in his tour dates across the west and in the North West Territories. He is scheduled for three Alberta dates beginning at the McGrane Theatre in Lac La Bishe (April 26), followed by Peace River's Athabasca Hall and the Agricultural Hall in Manning. He heads north to the Fort Smith Arena in the North West Territories (May 1), returning south for more Alberta dates at the Sawridge Hotel in Slave Lake (4), Hinton's Roxy Theatre (5) and Grande Prairie's College Theatre (6). Three BC dates follow, Fort Nelson's Phoenix Theatre (8), the Cultural Centre in Fort St. John (9), the Williams Lake Stampede (June 29), and the Lakefest '96 in Brooks, Alberta on Canada Day (July 1). Saskatchewan dates include Yorkton's Exhibition (3), the Prairieland Exhibition in Saskatoon (12) and Craven's Big Valley Jamboree (13). A quick trip west to Camrose, Alberta (August 2) for the Big Valley Jamboree, and east to Ontario for the Gananoque Festival of The Islands (10) and the Peterborough Exhibition (13). He continues his summer dates at the Corn & Apple Festival in Morden, Manitoba (23). More dates are expected. No news on a new single. He just recently came down the charts with *Time Of My Life*, which enjoyed a 19 week run. His WEA album, *Time Of My Life*, remained on the albums chart for 47 weeks.

Mercury/Polydor's Gerry Vogel is expecting big things from Mark Knopfler. He dropped off Knopfler's new single, *Darling Pretty*, which was taken from *Golden Heart*, his upcoming debut album for the Vertigo label. The album was recorded over two years, some of it in Nashville, and some in Dublin, which gives the album a beautiful celtic feel. The album goes to retail on March 27. Knopfler is a highly regarded songwriter, having had many of his compositions recorded by big names in country music. He is

putting together a touring band, and we just might see him in Canada over the next few months.

Farmer's Daughter has another Juno nomination for country group, their second. The west coast-based trio won last year's Vista Rising Star award at the Canadian Country Music show. Their current video release, *Fallin' Outta Love*, was a pick hit at NCN on its release. The band's current single, *Callin' All You Cowboys*, taken from their *Girls Will Be Girls* album, had a good run up the charts. The band releases on the Stubble Jumper label. Tony Rudner, the band's mentor and producer, is working on a new album.

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
