


Stan Kulin, who will be retiring as Chairman of Warner Music Canada in June, has been elected Chairman of the CARAS board. He will be relocating to the Calgary area. Over his 45 years in the music business, Kulin has held executive positions with RCA, United Artists, CBS Records and Warner Music Canada. He has also served as both an officer and a director of CARAS in the past.

Daisy Falle has been appointed president, replacing Lee Silversides. Falle, a veteran in the music industry, has been with CARAS in various capacities since its inception in 1974, most recently as executive director. Prior to that she worked in the areas of public relations, marketing and human resources for several major corporations, among them IBM, Xerox and Maclean-Hunter.

CHUM Group's Ross Davies, who is chairman of the CARAS search committee and the academy's 1st vice-president said of the new management team, "We are very excited about the new executive structure at CARAS. Stan Kulin and Daisy Falle share a great passion for our industry and will form a formidable team in keeping Canadian music

dominant on the world stage."

MacKeel to headline MIAC

MacKeel, a new Celtic rock band from Pictou County, Nova Scotia, has been firmed to headline the annual industry gala of the Music Industries Association of Canada (MIAC). The gala will take place Aug. 16 at the Metro Toronto Convention Centre, as part of the two-day conference and trade show (16-17).

The six-member band, nominated for an ECMA award this year in the group and roots/traditional vocal categories, comprises Randy

MacDonald, Dane Grant, Kevin Brennan, Glenn Gordon, Fleur Mainville and David Hoare. The band's album, *Plaid*, is released on the A&M label.

It was also revealed that the association has already confirmed close to 100 exhibitors for this year's event, the largest show in its 27 year history. New exhibitors this year include Mel Bay Publishing, Sony Music of Canada and United Musical Instruments.

A "free admission" policy is also in place this

year, which gives attendees access not only to the show floor but to the entire conference program. "This value is virtually unequalled in the trade show and convention industry," noted MIAC's executive director Al Kowalenko, "and we're expecting more than 1500 dealers to attend this year."

MIAC is a national, non-profit trade association established in 1972 to support the promotion and development of the music products industry in Canada and to foster the growth of active music participation among Canadians."



VIVA! Latin to make summer sweep

A seventeen title Latin music campaign will be issued forth from the towers of Warner Music Canada this week, in anticipation of the festival-filled summer months ahead. VIVA! Latin campaign will bring together an ambitious mix of meringue, romance, rock, pop, salsa, son, classical, jazz and grassroots for a June 1 retail debut for import items at domestic prices. The campaign will include new releases from pop artist Miguel Bose, Mexican alternative band La Bay, jazz group Sierra Maestra, romance star Ricardo Montaner, meringue player Toño Rosario and Cuban/grassroots artist Compay Segundo, among many others, with catalogue items from Afro Cuban All Stars, Daniel Barembaum, Los amigos Invisibles, Mana, and Luis Miguel.

"After looking at the Billboard charts we realised that we hadn't released a lot of these artists here and thought it was a good time to start," says Georgia Tsao, who heads Warner's International Division. "We thought the best way to do that was to avoid releasing one or two albums with a fan base of maybe a few thousand, and instead release

Nancy Yu appointed Lilith Fair publicist

Industry veteran Nancy Yu, a major player in the building of the Virgin label in Canada, has been appointed publicist for Lilith Fair in Canada. Her appointment is effective immediately.

Yu, who left Virgin earlier this year, where she was the national artist and media relations manager, is obviously no stranger to the industry, having worked with and generated national exposure for such major artists as Spice Girls, Verve, Daft Punk, Chemical Brothers, Janet Jackson, Rolling Stones, Smashing Pumpkins, David Bowie, Leahy and more.

Yu's responsibilities will involve coordinating and implementing all press and media information to Canadian media, concert promoters, artist labels and management involved in Lilith Fair '98. Five Canadian cities have been included on the 57-city North American tour.

"I'm back," says Yu. "I'm very honoured to be part of this year's celebration of excellence in women's music."

a whole wad of them and see if we could broaden people's taste for the format. The idea was to let them know that Latin music encompasses everything from classical to rock to romance to whatever else is available."

Recent interest in Latin music from the US, which showcased the format for the annual MIDEM conference, spilled over into Canada last year with a similar Latin emphasis placed for Canadian Music Week. The format found its monetary proof, however, in Warner's own release of last year, Ry Cooder's Buena Vista Social Club, an album of traditional Cuban rhythms that exceeded all expectations by surpassing the gold mark earlier this year. The industry's response has conformed with the success of the album, forcing any retailers still left lagging after CMW to pick up the slack and educate themselves on the format.


"A lot of the buyers are aware of this music now," says Tsao. "When you release it at a domestic price and have it available and have it racked so people see it for the first time, you not only get the community that knows the Latin music but people outside that come in and give it a shot."

Fairchild and CBC Bravo will be front and centre on the radio end of the campaign, while key advertising within and without the community will raise awareness on the releases. Timing, says Tsao, is also a key part of the campaign, which has been set around international events of the summer; besides the festival season -- much of which will be geared towards the hispanic community and

Cuban music in particular -- there is also the World Cup event, which will place international music front and centre throughout the season.

"We realise that not everyone that listens to Luis Miguel will want to listen to the rest of it," she says, "but at the same time if we can rack it all they have the choice. The bottom line is that it's great summer music, and we feel that people are really looking for something to buy other than the Titanic soundtrack."

VIVA! Latin will be rounded out by NEK, Alejandro Sanz, Olga Tañón, Daniel Barembaum, Chanticleer Vocal Ensemble and Ry Cooder.

BMG big promo guns set to launch UK's 5ive

was discovered by Bob & Chris Herbert, the father and son talent brokers who also put the Spice Girls together. Signed to RCA worldwide, with the exception of the US where they are signed to Arista, the band's album was produced by Denniz Pop, who did the same for Backstreet Boys and Ace of Base.

Seagram buys PolyGram for \$10.6 billion

After weeks of speculation and rumour, Canada's Seagram Company Ltd. announced last week that it will in fact move to acquire PolyGram in a transaction valued at \$10.6 billion. The major label is to be combined with Universal Studios Inc., Seagram's entertainment subsidiary, in what will result in the world's largest music company and a global entertainment leader.

"The addition of PolyGram to Universal's

operations moves us to the forefront of the entertainment industry," commented Frank J. Biondi Jr., chairman and CEO for Universal Studios Inc. "Universal will now operate the largest music company in the world, and second largest theme park resort company, a major motion picture studio and a worldwide television production and distribution business."

The deal, which involves Universal to acquire Royal Philips Electronics' 70% ownership position in PolyGram through a tender offer for all issued shares, will generate an estimated cost savings of \$275-\$300 million annually. Board of directors at Seagram and Philips' board of management and supervisory board each unanimously recommended the proposed offer as fair and in the best interests of PolyGram shareholders.

Separately, Seagram's Board of Directors authorised the sale of Tropicana products Inc. through the initial public offering of common stock. The company stated it was selling Tropicana as part of its continuing effort to realign the company's assets as well as to realise the subsidiary's full value for Seagram shareholders.

PolyGram remains one of the world's leading record companies and parent label to A&M, Decca/London, Def Jam, Deutsche Grammophon, Island, London, Mercury, Motown, Philips, Polydor and Verve. The company has annual revenues of approximately \$5.5 billion.





New tune for Mercury's Terri Clark

She should feel just fine

Terri Clark is one of those country artists that has been getting bigger and bigger with each passing year. The Medicine Hat native had humble beginnings, sure, but then she took a now legendary trip to Nashville and scored big. BIG. Now, a million selling album later, Clark has become a household name and -- in line with that success -- has recently been chosen to host this year's Canadian Country Music Awards in Calgary. The story, it appears, has come full circle.

And it's great to hear that, in the wake of those successes, everything is as it should be for Terri Clark; a great new single, lots of hype and a new album, tellingly titled *How I Feel*, in stores this week. *How I Feel* is a cause celebre not least because it marks a musical departure for the twenty-eight year old singer, an item that has turned her label on to promoting the release as one of those career albums.

"I feel like it is a giant step forward in the aspect that it's different," remarked the singer during a media junket last week. "It's a little bit of a twist for me, there's a lot of growth and maturity there, it has a little more depth, I was able to sing in different ranges and try some new things vocally."

Surprising, and refreshing, to hear a statement like that from an artist who could easily have played it easy with another album in the mould of 1997's *Just The Same*. *How I Feel* is rather a drawing to a close of an epoch in Clark's career; her trademark tongue-in-cheekiness, for example, has been abandoned for a more sober take on the issues of love, pain and life.

"You can't just keep doing that over and over again," she says, "I was going to get bored if I kept doing it. Three or four of those are enough, you know, then you have to try and do something else."


The single, *Now That I Found You*, was originally an r&b pop song that came out of LA, that reminded the singer of Whitney Houston. It was, nevertheless, one of those songs that was destined to be a hit, despite the musical stretch. Ultimately, the song became indicative

of Clark's meandering tastes and desire to expand her musical vocabulary.

"It was the biggest sounding hit on the whole album and we're not talking about artist imaging, we're not talking about this artist can't do that kind of song, we're talking about what is the best song," she says. "When I first heard it certainly the song captured me in a way; there are some songs you hear and it's a no brainer, you just go, that's a hit song, and that's how I felt when I heard it. There is another side of me that a lot of people haven't seen or don't see and I think it's my own fault for not showing that," she continues, "and this song was an opportunity to show that."

How I Feel will benefit from a huge push from Mercury Records, who are adamant that Clark be the brightest country star of Canadian origin, second only to megastar Shania Twain. The sentiment is entirely within reach; Clark has already won six statuettes from the CCMA's, earned the TNN/Music City News Star Tomorrow Award and has been lauded by virtually every country music association on the globe.

"I think success is a measure of where you are inside," she says in response to being asked whether all her dreams have come true. "To me success is really inner peace and happiness and I'm just trying to be happy and that includes my career and where I'm at musically. I make money and I have a good time and I get up and get to sing everyday; what more could I want? I don't need anything else."


THE AMAZING ROYAL CROWNS - The Amazing Royal Crowns

We've been listening to this disc pretty much non-stop since we heisted a copy of it over at that Horseshoe thingie with which the Velvet staff introduced this band to Toronto audiences. The word on that evening was energy, or should we say ENERGY, as the foursome -- replete with slick duds, slicker hair, tattoos, standup bass and the shadow of the King over the mike -- howled up a cyclone of unfettered psychobilly madness. We get a slightly muted report of that on the band's self-titled calling card, tunes like Shiverin' In The Corner, Wreckin' Machine and Gretschy, which still burn with the incandescent light of four guys in the heat of the moment despite less than worthy production values (the disc was apparently laid down in just two days). Amazing Royal Crowns hail from Providence, Rhode Island, and ought not to be confused with our own Royal Crowns, who practice out-and-out rockabilly rock. The difference, which you will hear on this disc and to much greater degree on the stage, has to do with a scene that has been a bubblin' around the borderlands a while; stuff like the Reverend Horton Heat, Tenderloin and The Cramps, the latter with whom this band toured with of late. The Amazing Royal Crowns stick out of the batch with fiery licks, devilled lyrics, a tip o' the hat to the venerable past and those amazing live shows. This is nothing short of an altar call: heed the gospel and quit puttin' off your conversion. The single, appropriately enough, is Do The Devil. -RG

THE IMMIGRANTS - Pop

In the beginning there was Celtic... then there was pop. And it was good. That is the word from The Immigrants, who you will remember from their 1995 independent Celtic debut titled In Between Before and After. Apparently the band felt that a fine-tuning was still in the works, not an easy decision taking into consideration the kind of responses which they received on




the first outing. Nevertheless, the decision was made and Awkwardly Mobile is the result, clearly one of the more audacious sophomore efforts to come from a band who is, as yet, still unsigned. We say 'still unsigned' not out of kindness but out of a sense of inevitability; this is a very strong album with a lot of tightly arranged, guitar driven songs taking the place of the mandolin, tin whistle and accordion of the past. Paul Hogterp maintains flavour via electric violin and fiddle but the sound changes from there for something toothier; tunes like Bumbling Steady, Satellite and Leave It All Behind which reveal a little bit of the Counting Crows here, even if the twists are still very much The Immigrants' own. A wise decision brings John Switzer (Jane Siberry, The Waltons) in for production while Big Sugar's Paul Brennan and The Walton's Todd Lumley lend drum and keyboards, respectively. The result is a tightly wrought, solid album that should ring in the band's number for label interest. Impressive. -RG







Life Is Sweet follows up with an epic single, if it is ever chosen for that purpose, while Kind & Generous strikes the balance between soft acoustic and full band dressing that progressively overtakes the situation. Merchant, who writes all the material, here proves that she is easily one of the most enduring musicians currently active in the pop format. 





Tapuska also points out that the festival has attracted audiences of more than 100,000 for the event "making it the largest one day country music festival anywhere."


