## HMV Canada to be first with full E-commerce site

Peter Luckhurst, president of HMV North America, has revealed a number of "significant developments" in its global web strategy that will put Canada on the leading edge of HMV's global web presence.

Luckhurst explains that HMV is working with iXL, Enso and Muze to create a global Web presence "as dynamic as our current retail environment."

Canada has been chosen to be the first HMV full E-commerce site to launch in the world. And, as Luckhurst points out, "a broad range of new Web-specific jobs will be added at our Toronto head office, to run the Canadian site, and ensure our online service delivers the quality, selection, service and entertainment values our customers expect from HMV."

iXL, a strategic Internet services company with offices in the U.S. and Europe, has completed the creative design of the HMV Web sites. HMV and

iXL had worked together on the initial HMV U.K. site, and this relationship has now extended to the global HMV Web site strategy.

The Seattle-based Enso Audio Imaging Corporation, an audio sampling company, provides sound samples for the developing Web sites. Enso's MusicServer provides access to what is described as "the world's largest catalogue" of digitized audio music samples, which allows users to listen to excerpts of album tracks directly from the Internet.

The New York-based Muze, suppliers of enhanced entertainment data, provides data for HMV Web sites which complement HMV's own extensive product catalogues. Muze is regarded as the leading supplier of this type of data, including cover graphics, track listings and enhanced editorial information: notes, reviews and artists' biographies. Muze previously worked with HMV in North

America providing enhanced in-store product information.

In summing up, Luckhurst is confident that "HMV, the world's best music store, will provide customers with the added convenience of the world's best online music store."

## CD Plus/Urban Sound become used music leaders

CD Plus.Com Inc. (CD Plus) and Urban Sound Exchange (USE) have reached an agreement in principle whereby CD Plus will purchase a 49 per cent equity interest in USE. Founded in Nova Scotia seven years ago USE currently operates nine corporate locations and eight franchise stores that carry more than 40,000 used music titles.

The purchase will allow CD Plus to enter the used music scene with the implementation of USE P.O.S. systems and procedures into its CD Plus Street Division. It has been explained that the implementation of these systems and procedures will be "in combination with various campaigns," throughout the entire CD plus chain, expected to "enhance new music sales through the acceptance of used trade-ins." It's also expected that USE will add a selection of new music product to all their locations.

It was pointed out that the advance USE P.O.S. system "enables a location to effectively purchase and control inventory" via a centralized database through the accumulation of sales data. The database will also form the base of information for the used music Internet site which will operate in conjunction with CD Plus' Internet site ([www.cdplus.com](http://www.cdplus.com)).


Darren Throop, founder and president of USE, suggests that the CD Plus.com investment is an opportunity to solidify its position as "the number one used music retailer in Canada."


Jonny Lang receives gold for his A&M album *Wander This World* during his Toronto date at the Danforth Music Hall.



Hooper also reports the signing to TNA of T.A.L.E. (The Act Of Life Experience), an Ontario band. The band also recently signed a management deal with Joe Ferrari of the UK's Future Management. Founded by Rob Harris (drums, vocals), Carl DeBarros (bass) and Tim Bastmeyer (guitar), T.A.L.E. has been steadily building an active fan base over the past five years. Last year they were selected to perform in a showcase at Amsterdam's Melkweg (Milky Way) Club, and return this month for a 20-city tour of Europe that will include The Netherlands, Wales, England and Germany. They are just putting the finishing touches on their self-titled EP with Barenaked Ladies' producer Everett Ravestein. The album is expected to be released this month.

Also signed to TNA for co-management is Kiss The Midget (KTM), who are currently promoting their single Turn Away which was taken from Auto Erotica and is featured in Shaded Places, an

upcoming film starring Christina Applegate, Jonathon Schaech, Moon Zappa, Jonathon Lazard and Molly Ringwald. The band is currently writing material for their new studio album which is

**HELP . . . needed!!!** We would like to get a copy of an article book *The Day The Music Stopped!* If anyone has a copy, I would like to see it . . . again! I can remember many years back when it was circulating within our industry and just can't seem to lay my hands on this very creative work. If you have a copy give me a call! (EC: *Now you can tell us what it was about or why you want to see it!!!*)

**55 percent Cancon???** Either I'm confused or we all have it wrong . . . this compromise we are talking about with the foreigners who want to bring their split-run swim suit issues in to Canada. The 55 per cent of the magazines on newsstands must be Canadian . . . right??? (EC: *Now that's genius! But I think you've got that wrong! It's 50 percent! Troublemaker!!!*)

**April Fools? Lots of 'em!!!** Wanna buy the SkyDome? Well, I guess that's not a good example, but every year it happens without fail. Some smart-ass radio guy comes up with a way of fooling his listeners. And this year, the award goes to Rob Christie who anchors the morning show at Toronto's Mix 99.9FM. So, one click away you can get to see what's available and buy the CDs for mail order delivery and you can also take a look at feature titles for purchase from all the other music companies. Having read the short of it and got all excited, here's the rub, the [getmusic.com](http://getmusic.com) feature ain't part of the launch in Canada. (EC: *My finger was poised to do the click away thing!!!*)

**The ultimate Cancon!!!** A star is born! Although we have only thought of René Simard as the child protégé of the Quebec music scene of years gone by, he has grown up and become the star of the Toronto production of *Phantom of the Opera*. He stole the show and turned out to be no mystery phantom, but the real thing. So a new and wonderful career has opened for him if he wishes to pursue it and Canadian audiences will probably watch the rising new career of a Quebec superstar in theatre not only here but in New York and London. (EC: *There's just no end of talent in this country! Where were they all a few decades ago???*)

**No more batching it for Al!!!** Al Fletcher is finally tying the knot. It will be tied by the time you read this. Not wanting to let him have any peace before the wedding, Warner's top honcho, Garry Newman, showed up at the tux renting place before Fletcher and, you guessed it, there wasn't a tux for Fletcher when he arrived. Back at the office, a shaken Fletcher was called into the big guy's office where he was informed that he was going to be fitted by master tailor Newman in front of a quizzical audience of his peers. The tux, as it turned out, was six sizes too big which required a lot of nipping and tucking and rolling up. Lucky for Fletcher he has a sense of humour. 


**BRUCE SPRINGSTEEN** - Pop/Rock




The big name draw here is Alanis Morissette, who is heard on four tracks in both French and Hungarian, which is kind of a shaker, being as this is a package that treads the sort of inspirational path. Not that Morissette can't be inspirational, but it's kind of a loose fit for the "rage queen," who remarkably adds rather than takes away from Jonathan Elias' intentions. After all, this is a choral symphony in nine movements. Now get this, on the Mercy track, Morissette sings in Hungarian with Salif Keita doing it in Swahili and the English Chamber Chorus adding a little Swahili. They do it again



on Innocence from Movement VI with Morissette in French, Keita sticking to Mali and the English Chamber Chorus switching to French. Having a better fit is James Taylor with guitarist John Williams on the Grace track from Movement V. That English Choir is in again, this time in Italian. Another key track is Benediction from Movement VIII featuring Linda Ronstadt singing in Spanish. A pretty heavy track and very moving. Oh yes, don't overlook another Morissette track, Hope from Movement III, where she sings in French and has very impressive backing by The American Boys Choir featuring Devin Provenzan. Can't hear an anthem here, but with the Morissette and Taylor fan base, retail should kick in. -WG

**VINICIUS CANTUARIA** - Bossa Nova  
Tucumá

Bossa Nova is a catch-all for this release, probably because that's the music genre where this incredible guitar virtuoso first gained




international fame. The bossa nova influence is certainly here, but Cantuária has ushered in a plethora of sumptuous jazz licks from a variety of guest artists that boggles the ear. These include Bill Frisell, Sean Lennon, Laurie Anderson, Arto Lindsay, Nana Vasconcelos and Joey Baron. Brazilian music is exempt from description really. It's here. It's plentiful and it's crafted by Cantuária and his guests to create an entertainment package that will be a treasured property. He refers to the music on this album as having "a jazz attitude with a Brazilian style," and that's cool. All tracks are key. One awesome guest and somewhat unique to Cantuária's work is the cello on six tracks by Erik Friedlander. Not that noticeable, but nonetheless important is Lennon playing bass on three tracks. And that's Anderson's vocals and violin spicing up *Retirante*. Remember, Cantuária got his start in *Tercó*, a folk-rock band that was influenced by the Byrds and Crosby, Stills & Nash, so his move into the jazz and pop field comes naturally. So there's much more to Cantuária than bossa novba. By the way, that's Frisell's guitar work on *Amor Brasileiro*. -WG

**PATRICIA O'CALLAGHAN** - Cabaret  
Slow Fox

As this Toronto-based singer puts it, "I never felt entirely at home in either the rock world or the classical world," so where better to be vocally sensual than the freedom of expression world of cabaret? But let's not put restrictions on what O'Callaghan does here with her classically-trained voice. Superlatives aside, what she does to Kurt Weill's songs (nine out of the 15 are his) puts her in a unique class displaying an interpretive freedom he would be proud of. However, on the four German-language cabaret songs by Arnold Schoenberg, O'Callaghan strays just enough to take the edge off. Now, with Leonard Cohen's *Take This Waltz*, and *Hallelujah*, she really puts her vocal stack into the general mix. Cohen might be pleasantly surprised to


discover his writing talent can also be gently coaxed into cabaret. Unlike most cabaret singers, O'Callaghan injects a sort of down and dirty realism into the lyrics, with an uncanny insight and control that followers of cabaret music may have missed with other performers. This is most notably on the title track, *Nanna's Song*, *Stay Well, We'll Go Away* and *well, take your pick*. They're not songs to generate warmth, but O'Callaghan's projection does just that. Accompaniment is by Keyboardist Robert Kortgaard, Claudio Vena on viola and



accordion, bassoonist Mike Sweeney, percussionist Andy Morris, trumpeter Stuart Laughton, bassist Scott Alexander, Barry Shiffman on violin and Camille Watts on piccolo and flute. Recorded at Lydian Sound in Richmond Hill, Ontario and mastered by Ted Carson at MusicLane. The album was produced by Omar Daniel. -WG

**BILLY KERR** - Jazz  
The Eagle Has Landed... eh?  
Productions Bilanci-001

Given the number of expatriates making their way there to live there, Montreal could supplant



Toronto as Canada's jazz capital. Brooklyn born reed man Billy Kerr is now resident in North America's supposed Paris and it's here that he fronts a quartet of musicians we suspect are also from elsewhere. What ever, his excellent clarinet and saxophone impress muchly on a few standards but mostly originals with silly titles such as *Don't Get (sic!) Clarinoid*, *Northern Samba*, *Quasi-Modal* and the title tune. The last named, as performed here, sounds not unlike *Taboo* in minor with overtones of Ellington's *Caravan*. The most interesting track is *Body and Soul* where he evidently attempts to improve on Coleman Hawkins' definitive version. He doesn't but the attempt is laudable. Not a great album perhaps but certainly interesting and enjoyable. -BW

**STEVE TURRE**  
Lotus Flower

Verve-314559 787-J

Steve Turre has stated "this is my first album in a long time where I've put my trombone at the front and centre of everything." He's too self deprecating. Although it's prominent it's by no means dominant as he leads his sextet through a programme that courts East/West fusion. Intentionally or otherwise his



orchestrations are reminiscent of middle period Ellington. It could be the *Strayhorn* like piano of Mulgrew Miller; it could be the string work of Regina Carter and Akua Dixon on violin and cello. What ever the cause, the effect is decidedly that of rediscovering the Duke. Paraphrasing him, "and that ain't bad." All of the twelve cuts are enjoyable but this auditor's especial favourite is *Goodbye*, the Gordon Jenkins composition popularized by Benny Goodman. Somewhere in musicians' heaven there must be smiles.


## ALBUM PICK

**SAMMY HAGAR AND THE WABORITAS**  
Red Voodoo

MCA - 11872-J

Mr Van Hagar's first MCA release *Marching To Mars* was most likely a working project after fronting rock'n'roll's most recognized band Van Halen for 11 years and it fell to the wayside despite some intricate marketing from MCA including a barbecue with Hagar bouncing around chatting with the press and radio personalities. *Red Voodoo* boasts all the substance and creativity that took Van Halen to heights it could only have dreamed of prior to Hagar fronting the band. The first single culled from this innovative rock'n'roll masterpiece is *Mas Tequila*, a virtual anthem for partiers that borrows the riffs from Gary Glitter's *Rock And Roll Part 2* with an apparent Mexican accent. Hagar credits Glitter with co-writing *Mas Tequila* along with himself and Mike Leader. The album was produced by Hagar and Jesse Harms. Throughout the album Hagar and his band The Waboritas run like a well-oiled machine, evident in *Mas Tequila*, *Shag*, the title track and *Sympathy For The Human*. The material is so raw it begs for a live audience and Hagar has already got a world tour in mind including a unique setup design that will resemble his bar Cabo Wabo with tables, waitresses and patrons (comprised of contest winners) around the stage. He claims "it will be very theatrical and if someone is up there snoozing, I'll throw them the fuck out and grab someone from the audience." *Red Voodoo* will be a strong force at radio and subsequently retail. It may have been 27 years ago when Hagar started his career with Montrose, but this veteran rock'n'roller isn't showing any signs of slowing down just yet. The collaboration of Hagar's powerful vocals and years of expertise and Jesse Harms production skills make magic and bring back a genre of rock'n'roll that has been dead (with the exception of the rebirth of *Kiss*) for quite some time. Programmers are already jumping on *Mas Tequila*, one of the Q's most requested rock tracks. More radio breakers to come from *Voodoo* and possible cross-over action for the gripping ballad *Lay Your Hands On Me*. Hagar may have been kicking his ass for working on *Voodoo* in Hawaii while everyone was basking in the sun, but it will have proved well worth it when it becomes his most recognized solo effort in 25 years.



**George Strait** has a #1 single with *Meanwhile* squeezing into the top slot. Just in time too, because the follow-up, *Write This Down*, is beginning to catch fire at radio. Both tracks were taken from Strait's MCA Nashville album *One Step At A Time*.

**The Wilkinsons** are back and they have the biggest mover this week. *Boy Oh Boy*, the most added single last week (#71) jumps up to #51 this week. This is the follow-up to *Fly (The Angel Song)*, still charting at #90 after 23 weeks. Both tracks are included on the Giant album *Nothing But Love*.

## Country Music Week to prioritize showcases

More, and a greater variety of submissions is the call going out for this year's very important showcase slots for Canadian Country Music Week being held in Ottawa (Sept. 10-13).

"Getting a showcase spot at Country Music Week can be a big step forward for artists looking to move their careers upward," says CCMA executive director Sheila Hamilton. CCMA organizes the yearly event that takes place in the host city.

"There are never any guarantees," continues Hamilton, "but this showcase can help an artist or a band find a record company, a publisher, a manager, a publicist . . . or an influential believer."

**John Michael Montgomery** has been suffering a bit of chart uneasiness with his last couple of releases, which might change with his latest single, *Hello L.O.V.E.* Taken from his Atlantic album *Leave A Mark*, the single is the most added this week entering the chart at #81. Montgomery is just coming down the chart with *Hold On To Me* (#45) which didn't do that bad, charting for 26 weeks.

"We're looking for a wide range of artists, representing the whole range of country music, who believe they are ready to seek wide audiences."

Those interested in taking part should call the CCMA office (905-850-1144) for an application form. Submissions are to include the completed form with a copy of a CD or cassette, plus a bio, photographs and video material (if available). An application fee of \$10 is also required. The deadline for submissions is April 30.

The final roster of artists for the showcases are chosen from the applications by a jury of established country people. Those selected will be notified by June 1.


