EMI and the Canadian Connection

Promoting and signing Canadian bands has always been EMI's strong point. David MacMillan, EMI's marketing manager for Canadian acts, admits that working with some of Canada's best known bands is a patriotic dream come true.

"We're right in the thick of things. It has always been our forte. I'm totally proud to be a part of it. I love my country and I'm happy to be doing my part for my country and that's how I get excited," said MacMillan about EMI's and his role in developing Canadian bands.

For the past 50 years the label's mandate has been to support Canadian music by seeking out and signing new acts. This has paid off recently with the enormous success of the Tea Party's Triptych and the expected success of Moist's soon to be released album *Mercedes Five and Dime*.

MacMillan plays an important role in marketing Canadian acts, his sole responsibility at the label. The thrill of working with EMI's wealth of Canadian talent ensures he arrives at the company exhilarated, knowing that each day will be spent assisting the 11 bands he oversees. "For the work I do, I can't believe I have this job. It blows my mind. I'm very much a nationalist and to fulfill that side of me makes me

Moist develop new sound for *Mercedes Five and Dime*

With the release of their third full length album, *Mercedes Five and Dime*, Montreal based Moist have evolved from mosh pit rockers to relaxed musicians.

This change has come about after spending three months in the studio with producer David Leonard (Barenaked Ladies, Prince) and arriving at the recording session better prepared.

The use of home studios allowed each band member to develop demos before spending money and time in a more official setting. When they entered Studio Piccolo in January they became aware that their sound had been slightly changed, which they believe is for the better.

Instead of attempting to recreate the raw energy their live show has, which had been captured on 1994's *Silver* (certified four times platinum) and 1996's *Creature* (almost four times platinum) the five piece band developed music that is deeper. With Leonard's assistance their songs became more distinguishable than previous songs.

ViK announces major marketing appointments

Born two years ago, ViK recordings imprint, BMG Music Canada's domestic roster label, has announced personnel changes designed "to streamline marketing strategies and future growth."

One of the initial moves is the appointment of Susan Desmarais to the position of director of marketing and artist development. A 19-year music industry veteran, Desmarais is credited with successfully developing Jive/Zomba recording stars Backstreet Boys and Britney Spears as well as lending her "creative flare" to ViK's current roster.

In making the above announcement, Keith Porteous, vice-president of A&R, pointed out the need to restructure the A&R/artist development department in view of the label's continuing commitment to existing domestic artists and the desire to expand the ViK label roster in the future.

Assisting the other Canadian acts on the label "fulfills a lot of my own personal feelings about this country. I am the marketing manager for only Canadian acts. To be working with these acts for such a long time and taking on many of our younger acts is a day-to-day thrill. It's wonderful to be involved in the process and watching them make

What's Happening

Toronto's KISS 92FM had an exclusive, live, 30 minute interview with Ricky Martin when he was in town (June 24). He joined the station's Tarzan Dan for a one-on-one private interview. Security was pretty tight so they kept the location secret right up to and past airtime.

The Immigrants are working their new single, Be There, which is now at radio. The track was taken from their awkwardly Mobile CD which was produced by John Switzer. Guesting on the session were drummer Paul Brennan (Big Sugar, Odds), and Todd Lumley (The Waltons) on keys. The band is made up of Pete Zantingh (lead vocals, guitar), Rob Vanhartingsveldt (guitar, vocals), Paul Hogeterp (electric violin, vocals), and Fred Geus (bass, vocals). Music Solutions and dB Promotions are handling radio promotion. The band is managed by Jamie Porter who heads up the RamJam Management Group (416) 966-9404.

Patria heads for Japan for a tour to promote her Black Market CD, My Rules. She will be accompanied by her producer Domenic Troiano. Baby Feel My ... has been taken as the first single with an accompanying video. Patria's album will be released in Canada in mid-July. Black Market is distributed in Canada by Popular/EMI.

Zomba team strengthened with new appointments

Laura Bartlett, president of Zomba Records (Canada), has beefed up the company's marketing and financial picture with the announcement of three appointments.

Michael Wong comes on board as controller, effective July 5. He joins the company with years of experience in distribution and manufacturing and with seven years of label experience as controller/treasurer at Virgin Music Canada.

Jane Tattersall joins the Zomba team, effective late June, as national marketing manager. Tattersall is quite familiar with the Zomba/Jive roster. It was through her marketing position at BMG where she was instrumental in the marketing and development of a number of Zomba/Jive artists, most recently Backstreet Boys and their Millennium release.

April Robinson joins Zomba as marketing/promotion coordinator, effective June 28. Robinson has gained much experience at the retail level, most recently being an integral part of the day to day marketing events at HMV's Superstore at 333 Yonge Street in Toronto.

Heather Ostertag named president in FACTOR shuffle

In recognition of her many duties and responsibilities, FACTOR has changed the title of executive director Heather Ostertag to president, while re-shuffling the board of directors.

In so doing, J.J. Johnston will now hold the position of chair of the board. He held the position of board president. The two will work closely ensuring that Ostertag's views are presented to board members. She stressed she will not have a vote on the 11 member board.

This change will give everyone a clear indication about who to contact at FACTOR as board members are volunteer positions, whereas the president position isn't. These moves are meant to strengthen the non-profit organization's clout and to allow Ostertag to have a greater presence within the industry.

He co-wrote and performed Who Said, the theme song for the recent Tommy Girl fragrance spots, which is also included on his CD. This Time Around, the first focus track, goes to radio June 29. The album will be available Sept. 7. The Canadian leg of the tour, which also guests Sky, an EMI recording duo, begins in Hamilton at Copps Arena (July 13), followed by Toronto's Molson Amphitheatre (14), the Molson Centre in Montreal (16), Ottawa's Corel Centre (17), the Centennial Concert Hall in Winnipeg (20), Saskatoon's Centennial Arena (21), the Skyreach Centre in Edmonton (22), Calgary's Saddledome (23), and Vancouver's GM Place (25).

Vancouver's Michael Kaeshammer Trio has firmed a hectic summer of festival dates across Canada and the U.S. The 22-year old, described as the "boogie woogie, jazz, blues piano wunderkind", kicked off the tour (June 17) with a special and

MuchMusic maintains status with international awards

Competing against the giants of international television, MuchMusic's and CityTV's creative services department won three silver awards at the ProMax/BDA Festival.

MuchMusic received two awards, In-House Generic TV Announcement - Programming for its quirky promo for the MuchMusic Video Awards and in the Logo category for a print version of their logo. CityTV won In-House Event TV Announcement - Special Event/Project for its Traditional New Year's Eve promo.

ProMax/BDA is an international organization that is specific to the broadcast industry. The award show is part of their annual convention.

David Johnson, MuchMusic director of creative services points out "Every year it gets harder. We have won gold in the past, but it gets tougher and tougher for Canadian television to make a showing there. Because with the emphasis on branding and packaging of television stations,



greater budgets and attention are paid to it (promos). Plus there are so many more channels."

incredibly. I used to go to the convention years ago and it was really American dominated. Now we're seeing a lot of stuff from Europe, South America, and Asia."

Competing against stations like CNN, MTV, and ESPN with his staff and budget about a tenth the size, their strategy in creating winning promos is different. "We often win through doing more original organic stuff, which reflects MuchMusic at large. If we win awards it's based more on the idea itself, rather than being incredibly slick and expensive."

the work that I do now. More and more organizations are structured this way. The president does the day-to-day running of the organization."

Ostertag's duties aren't going to change much. "It (president title) lends some credibility to what I do. It gives me a stronger voice, whether it would be in Ottawa or the broadcasters. When people are meeting you and you can say you are the president of the organization it lends itself better to the organization when I can be identified as the president at various meetings."

While Factor has been running smoothly since its inception, it was time for the board to make some progressive changes. Ostertag concludes, "The fact that it has been done this way all along doesn't necessarily mean it can't be improved. It wasn't that there was anything wrong, it's just reorganizing to give people stronger voices."

music. To see their musical goals come to fruition - it's really cool."

When asked about his favourite moments at EMI, over his nine year career, MacMillan was quick to respond, "My biggest memory is happening right now. The Tea Party being number one for the past couple of weeks is just an unbelievable thing."

As the person who is responsible for marketing EMI's Canadian talent, MacMillan has been working with the Tea Party since the label signed the band four albums ago. "Coming from someone who has worked with them from day one, since signed to our company, I'm really excited about that. It's great to see the progression of the band and their music."

He has seen the Tea Party evolve over the years into a "power house live band, a unit that can really write songs." His role in this development comes

from providing the band with "a home here, and making them feel comfortable in our environment to help them get their job done."

The moment he knew the band had arrived on a national level was when they opened for Page and Plant in Montreal. He recalled this story. "Before they put out their first album with us, I obviously knew the band would do well in Montreal. So I went to Montreal with them and they were playing at McGill University. I brought out the whole branch to meet the band and we all went out to dinner. A band named Our Lady Peace opened for them and there were twenty people in the audience. I was sitting there in the audience going 'this is the start of their career in Montreal.' Then two albums later, I went to my boss and said 'I have to do this.' I flew out to Montreal and saw them open for Page and Plant at a sold out Montreal Forum and they got a standing ovation and I literally cried."

Another band that MacMillan is delirious over is Moist. "It's just really exciting to be working with a band like Moist. Just seeing these bands develop and to be right along side them all the way, cheering them on. Being part of this exciting time in Canadian music."


While MacMillan is extremely excited about working for EMI, he does have one little problem. "I take my job way to personally. When there is disappointment it hits really hard."

Along with marketing bands, over the past six months MacMillan has been filling his free time by going into the archives to compile the label's seven CD promo box set. It will be made available this weekend. Again he is happy that the set has 50 per cent Canadian content. "My box set is an overview of the music that has come through this company that has a very much Canadian slant to it. About 50 per cent Canadian content."

EMI throws family picnic for a family company

Much like the family picnic that will celebrate EMI's 50th Anniversary, president Deane Cameron describes the company like a big family or a clan.

"The company overall is like a family, which I think is for two or three reasons. First, if you work at EMI Music Canada you are very involved in domestic music. That takes up a lot of time. So we get to know each other very well. We get to share in

the victories and disappointments in local music. That brings you together as a family."

With stability at the management level, employees have been given the time to become close friends. "We have a very stable team here. The management team and the people across the country have worked for the company for a period of time.

"The outlook for the music industry is extremely bright. It's fast moving right now. Everybody is talking about online music opportunities. It's going to redesign the balance on how we distribute."

When you share so much time together it does feel like a family or good friends."

Cameron who has been with EMI (Capitol) for close to 30 years, "Before I turned 16 I was with this company as a musician trying to get a record deal." Cameron is now 46.

By spending all this time at EMI, the company has become like a second family to him. "I can hardly help but feel (it). Well over 50 per cent of my life has been in and around this building and this company. It defines me. I don't define EMI Music

Canada. This company defines me. I can't think of too many people who have enjoyed the distinction of being around the company as musician, distribution person, A&R and president."

Even the numerous artists that Cameron has worked with over the years, he still regards them like children. This came out when he was asked about highlights, "It's kind of hard, you're talking about your own children. Which of your 12 children do you really like?"

For the few highlights that he revealed that he enjoyed say "getting to know Steve Miller and Bob Seger. Got to be friends with Kate Bush, Radiohead and now the Manic Street Preachers. The local highlights are just way to numerous."

Cameron admittedly, is in a very fortunate position to observe the companies financial and structural growth. He recalled. "I loved the day we opened the vinyl pressing plant, the cassette pressing manufacturing plant and the CD plant. I really enjoyed that because manufacturing your product and distributing it really gives you control of your destiny."

While last year wasn't EMI's best financial year, Cameron still has a bright outlook for EMI and the industry. "The outlook for the music industry is extremely bright. It's fast moving right now. The corporate and management structure of Oasis reads like a "who was" from the PolyGram/A&M operation with Randy Wells taking on the mantle of senior vice-president and Ken Wells as vice-president of operations and distribution.

Former PGD regional managers have taken on similar duties with Oasis: Tom Jones (western division), Al Harrison (midwestern division), Roland Dufresne (eastern region), and Tony Tarleton (central division), who began his career at A&M and moved over to Universal as an account executive when the companies merged.

Wells will reveal the entire promotion and marketing team shortly.

Toronto's Harbourfront setting for Latin American fest

Ritmo y Color: A Latin American Arts Festival will once again create three days of music and dance at Toronto's harbourfront Centre (July 9 to 11). This will be the second year for the event which organizers are suggesting is "hotter than ever."

Besides an enormous helping of music and dance, the three day "free extravaganza" will allow fans of Latin music to view documentary films and theatre, plus visual arts, food, storytelling and workshops.

Highlighting the music aspect of the festival will be Brazil's Cascabulho with their traditional "forro" music; Columbia's Bloque and their brand of rock en Espanol; Cuba's La Familia Valera Miranda, who's speciality is authentic son; Vancouver's Celso Machado with his Brazilian-based brothers Carlinhos and Geraldo; and the Los Angeles-based Ricardo Lemvo and his high-powered posse Makina Loca with a blend of Afro-

Cuban rhythms.

In recent years Toronto has become a hotbed for Latin music, attracting professional musicians and singers from many parts of South America and Cuba who came to visit, but remained to help structure what is considered a vibrant Latin community.

A number of these Toronto-based artists have been included on the bill as "klave kanadiense" with Diego Marulanda's Columbia rhythms with the dance beats of Pacande; Mambo Urbano's Latin fusion; the Afro-Cuban rhythms of both Ventura and Sonora Habanera; swinging salsa charanga with Vibrason; Latin sleaze with the Que Vida quartet; and Johan Aguirre y su Orquesta Bestial, a new voice on Toronto's salsa scene.

The above is only a small sampling of what organizers have in store for this year's Ritmo y Color: A Latin American Arts Festival.



Capitol Launches Sounds Canadian

Capitol Records (Canada) Ltd. have launched one of the most aggressive and costly record product promotions in the history of the Canadian recording industry. With the eyes of both the recording and broadcast industries focused on Ottawa and the CRTC hearings, it's almost ironic that Capitol should launch a promotion of such magnitude.

It should be noted however, that the suggested proposals of the CRTC for 30% Canadian content has not been a factor in Capitol's concentration on more of the domestic type of product. It was during the label's 7th Anniversary, in August of 1968, when S.M. Gortikov, President of Capitol Inc., suggested that the Canadian operation look for and groom domestic talent, and not to mirror the parent company. William E. Tallant Jr. Vice President of Capitol Inc., who attended the Canadian convention, re-emphasized the president's "go it alone" policy, insofar as the Canadian operation was concerned. Tallant pointed out, at that time, that he had been aware for sometime that the Canadian market was ready to make moves toward world recognition. He also suggested that because of the non-existence of a language barrier, the world breakthrough point could happen within a few months after an all-out domestic promotion campaign.

That was in August of 1968. Now, almost two years later, with the looking and grooming complete, and an administration strengthen-

ing, Capitol (Canada) Ltd. are now moving out on their domestic promotion campaign.

What Capitol has spent on production, and laid aside for this nationwide campaign to promote domestic talent might be considered larger than what most companies budget for the entire year. In the past, Canadian record companies depended chiefly on masters which were leased for a royalty. This promotion and their many productions could well be more than Capitol has spent on Canadian talent in the past six years — it is so gigantic in its scope.

Working hand in hand with Capitol's promotion and publicity department is MacManus, John and Adams of Canada, one of the largest ad agencies on the continent. Heading up this label/agency team is Capitol's Director of Advertising, Hal Schatz, and M J & A's Vice President, John Rush.

Tagged "Sounds Canadian", the promotion is centred around the initial release of 4 albums for the month of April, followed by 5 sets in May. One of the April releases has already created a national demand — this being "The Letter" by Brian Browne. A single "Morning, Noon And Night Time Too", a self penning, has been culled from the album and become a major chart item. The other releases for



periencing good chart action with his recent single, "The Call".

The May release includes albums by Bobby Curtola ("Changes"), containing his current release and chart climber "Jean"; Gary Buck ("Wayward Woman Of The World"); Anne Murray ("Honey, Wheat And Laughter"); Pierre LaLonde ("The Young Years"); and Mother Tucker's Yellow Duck ("Starting A New Day")

Much interest has also been shown in the new Claude Valade album, particularly in the Quebec area. Dual market action is expected for the Natalie Baron set, also skedded for May release.

Capitol has been gently setting up the market for this final promotion push with a very healthy scheduling of Canadian singles over the past few weeks. Album and single product have been coordinated by the label's A&R Director, Paul White, and of much importance is the fact that 80% of the releases are 100% Canadian content — which meets with the CRTC's four conditions.

An indication of this non-profit motive is the inclusion of Edward Bear's hit single "You Me And Mexico", now well on its way to becoming an international hit.

Capitol's Director of Marketing, E. Taylor Campbell, will shortly embark on a cross Canada promotion trip for "Sounds Canadian". Luncheon dates are being set up in major centres from Halifax to Victoria. Invited guests will include key dealers, radio and television personalities and the press. Campbell will outline Capitol's proud new "Sounds Canadian" baby with an impressive slide presentation plus samples of in-store and window displays, available to retailers. These include colourful browser boxes, window banners and streamers — all using the theme "Sounds

coming campaign. An inter-company contest has been arranged for these promotional areas for the most aggressive chart, play-list, and sales action on the new Canadian product.

In setting the wheels in motion for this mammoth first for the Canadian recording industry, Ron Plumb, youthful Vice President and General Manager of the Canadian operation, has pulled all stops in making the campaign rich in both product and presentation. From four colour album jackets to lush orchestration and high quality sound, Capitol's positive push and obvious belief in the development and promotion of their artists could generate an entirely new feeling for Canadian talent — generally — in Canada.






FUNHOUSE **- Rock**

CYCLEFLY **- Alternative**





Making his home in Peterborough, Ontario where he launched the Haggarty Sound Studio in 1991 where this CD was recorded. Haggarty honed his guitar playing in the early '80s as a member of Ronnie Hawkins' band and later with Bentwood Rocker, a pop band. He also played guitar for the Family Brown and Ronnie Prophet in the late '80s, which included the Browns' TV show. With all that experience,



Haggarty obviously believed he was ready to reveal his other talent, that of a solo vocalist. He was right. He has a vocal rawness that makes an immediate impact. This isn't a trained voice. He reaches and on occasion doesn't make it. But that's part of his vocal charm and lays the way open for a definitive interpretation of his lyrics. Haggarty wrote all the material here with the exception of *Would've Could've Should've*, which he wrote with Ed Arnold and *Talk About Love*, where he shares writing credits with Bob Steele and Elise Dallaire. The session musicians are some of the best pickers in the business: drummer Ken Post, bassist Andrew Affleck, Steve O'Connor on keys, fiddlemeister Don Reed, steelmen Tony Hignett and Al Brisco and Haggarty on guitar. Haggarty merely eased his vocals and guitar work into a ready-made session that was tailored to fit and where the magic flows from track to track. The title track which features background singers Dan Bronson, Peter Brown, Theresa Foley, Tammy Edgerton and Dan Washburn, is a singles contender as is *Far Cry Away*. But don't overlook *Talk About Love*, a lilting, end-of-summer kind of song that will create an immediate bond with listeners. *Give Me A Break* has been taken as the first single. **-WG**




VIOLET RAY **- Country/Pop**

Born in Winnipeg and now living in Toronto, Ray makes a pitch for the country/pop arena with this 11-song release that oozes confidence and immaculate professionalism. Ray's projection and vocal control injects credibility into her song message, several of which she wrote and co-wrote. *Why*, written by Steve Fox, has been taken as a single. For that real vocal essence, click on *Three Long Days*, which was solo-written by Ray. Now, here's a sun-splashed summer song that should get an airing. The same thing goes for *The Honky Tonky*, which Ray also wrote. There's a Shirley Eikhald penning here as well. *Wake Me If I'm Dreamin'*, like most of Eikhald's writings, has crossover possibilities, as do a number of other tracks. The instrumental backing on all tracks is superb adding prominence to the vocals with a gentle enhancement that adds to that A/C attraction. *Good Things* is also a key track, written by Ray with Jean McKen and Anthony Vanderburgh, the latter doubling on keys and guitars and also supplying background vocals. But don't overlook *You Hurt Me Best*, written by Cyril Rawson and Scott Phelps, which is perfect for the Autumn season. The CD was recorded at various Toronto studios with Vanderburgh and Ray taking producer credits. All tracks are 100% *Cancon*. 
Though it's a stretch to compare Swedish-based, Chilean tenor Tito Beltrán to the renowned Jussi Björling, it's accurate to say that the young man does seem to have the same intensity of expression in his singing. He shares with José Carreras and Helmut Lotti the early influence of Mario Lanza. Lanza's life was a pitiful one as he sacrificed his art, and eventually his life, to unfortunate excess. One



doubts that will be the case with Mr. Beltrán even though one is always wary of operatic tenors offering a programme of lollipops. Still, one doesn't throw out the baby with the bath water and in that spirit it pleases us to state that this album is a joy to experience. Nineteen lusciously orchestrated tracks begin with a tribute to Lanza and his million and more sellers and continues through opera at the movies and songs from the movies. 

Record labels often shudder when an established band plans on moving in a new direction, but for Moist's third release changing their sound is an improvement. 


Brad Paisley has come alive with *Who Needs Pictures*, his latest single, jumping up to #40 from #65, the biggest mover this week. The single is the title track from his Arista album. Paisley wrote the song with two other Nashville writers Chris DuBois, son of Tim, and Frank Rogers who produced the album. Paisley was on hand for Fan Fair '99 in Nashville which happened just two weeks after the release of his CD. It shows the popularity he has gained in so short a time. Tower Records in Nashville reports that Paisley's CD was the #2 most-purchased disc during Fan Fair. It was while he was backstage at Fan Fair when he had a reunion of sorts with Naomi Judd. It was almost 12 years ago when he opened for The Judds when he was only 14 on WWVA Radio's Jamboree USA live radio show out of Wheeling, West Virginia. The reunion resulted in Paisley being asked to guest on Big Kmart's *Heart To Heart* with Judd on June 27. The show was

broadcast live from Judd's home outside of Nashville. Paisley's appearance marked a first for the syndicated radio show. Judd asked him to acoustically perform a selection from his *Who Needs Pictures* CD live on air, just like he did for the live radio show 12 years ago. Paisley's album will be released in Canada over the next few weeks.

Clay Walker also makes a giant move with *She's Always Right* jumping up to #41 from #64. The track is included on Walker's upcoming Giant album which should be released shortly.

Farmer's Daughter are back on the chart. *Let It Ride*, a song written by Randy Bachman and Ted Turner, is the most added this week entering the chart at #84. The single should qualify as *Cancon*, but there is no MAPL logo displayed on the CD pro.

John Gracie has his foot in the door with *She's All I Got*, his new *Grey Sea* single, entering the chart at a modest #92. The track, which qualifies as two-parts *Cancon* (AP), was taken from his *Identity* album, which he produced with Ross Billard.

Ponto does it for the love of music

The opportunity to write songs all day on his piano provides plenty of self satisfaction for Northern Quebec singer/songwriter Ponto.

"I've been sticking at this for twenty years. If you believe in yourself it'll happen. I want to do what makes me happy. If it makes me happy and it's worthy, someone else will like it," he said before showcasing his songs at Toronto's C'Est What?.

Ponto's faith in his music comes from his songs. "I believe in my songs. I believe that I've given a lot to my songs. Now it's the songs turn to give something back to me - and that's just a matter of time. I wrote my first song when I was 11. When I was young I said 'if these melodies don't leave my head it must mean something.'"

On his debut self-titled CD, Ponto has captured smooth eloquent songs about his life experiences. Some of these life affairs come from hitch-

hiking and growing up in Elliot Lake, a small Northern Ontario town. "I've lived in Northern Ontario almost all my life so I know about the snow and the mosquitos."


This influence makes an appearance on the single and soon to be released video Northern Town Sky.

Another experience that shaped his music was when he first came to Toronto to become a musician. "Years back I used to sleep on park benches on University Avenue (Toronto). I'm 19 years-old and I think I know the music business - I'll go down there and put an album out. Then I get down there and realize I should go learn my craft. Learn how to write a song," the singer recalled about his early days as a struggling musician.

It's not all life experiences and Canadiana that have influenced this talented artist. "When I was young I was influenced by Billy Joel. I had a piano around the house. I used to play

drums, but I was always fiddling around on the piano. I heard a Billy Joel song and said 'Wow that sounds like me. I write like that.'"

While his music doesn't mimic Billy Joel, Ponto describes it as "pop adult contemporary on a folk country side. It sounds like Elton John or Billy Joel. It's on a piano, I'm not going to sound like Jimi Hendrix."



