



Oasis to distribute Dead Reckoning Records

Oasis Entertainment has signed an agreement to distribute Nashville-based Dead Reckoning Records in Canada. The first release under this new arrangement will be a new album from country music veteran Charlie Major.

Major comes to Dead Reckoning with a portfolio of ten number one hits in Canada from his three successful albums with BMG. Major has won a number of awards, his first, a Big Country Award in 1994, followed by CCMA, Juno and SOCAN

awards. His new album, 444, will be released on October 19.

As to the deal with Oasis, Dead Reckoning general manager J.D. May commented, "Dead Reckoning is thrilled to be working with Oasis Entertainment. We know there is a great audience in Canada for quality independent music, and by working as a team with Oasis, great artists like Kevin Welch, Kieran Kane and Charlie Major will be able to get the attention and retail coverage they need."

Oasis president Bill Ott commented, "As Oasis grows in the marketplace, I am absolutely delighted to be affiliated with a label as enterprising and creative as Dead Reckoning Records. And to have Charlie Major affiliate with Dead Reckoning and Oasis excites me no end."

The label also announced that Ed Harris, former country marketing director with Universal Music, will handle marketing of Dead Reckoning in Canada.

Oasis will introduce Dead Reckoning to Canada with the re-release of its catalogue on October 5.

Decca and Philips merge and restructure

The Decca Record Company and Philips Music Group have merged to form the new Decca Music Group. The announcement was made by Decca president Costa Pilavachi. The new company will encompass the Decca, Philips, Gimell and Point labels, and will operate from the Decca headquarters in London.

In addition to this merger, Pilavachi also announced a series of appointments within the Decca Group, and a restructuring of the group's international marketing department.

Beginning October 4, Liam Toner becomes vice-president of international marketing and artist development, reporting to Pilavachi. Toner had been

vice-president, classics and jazz, at Universal Canada since January of 1998. Previously, he was marketing director for PolyGram Classics and Jazz UK.

Toner will head up a restructured marketing department consisting of international marketing director Marc Johnston, senior director of marketing and artist development Paul Moseley, and director of marketing and artist development Suzana

Tomanic.

Also at Decca Group, Cheryl Grant has been moved to vice-president of marketing services, and Mark Cavell becomes vice-president of finance and administration. Both will report to the president.

Finally, Clive Bennett has joined the Decca A&R staff as executive producer, reporting to A&R senior vice-president Evans Mirageas.

Further appointments in the international marketing department will be announced shortly.

Spirit Of The West release Hit Parade

Capping off a terrific ten year stretch, Spirit Of The West is releasing a collection of some of their best work, Hit Parade. The album heads to retail on September 14 via Warner Music Canada.

According to the band, "This astounding, earth-shaking collection of 18 chart-busting anthems spans the period of 1989 to 1997. During this time we released six albums, had nine children, made a lot of lovely friends, and stood in sepulchral awe before the exotic tarts of Finland, Germany, USA, Shetland Islands, The Netherlands, Switzerland, Austria, France, Luxembourg, England, Scotland, Planet Zarkon and Canada. We parade this collection past you for review, as we march into the future."

Along with familiar songs such as Home For A Rest, Sadness Grows, Five Free Minutes and Save This House, the album also includes previously unreleased material such as orchestral arrangements of Political and their biggest hit, And If Venice Is Sinking.

Information session to be hosted by SOCAN

In an effort to provide a better understanding of performing rights and what a performing rights organization can actually do. SOCAN has scheduled an information session for Sept. 29 beginning at 7 pm.

SOCAN licenses music users and distributes royalties to its members -- songwriters, lyricists,

composers and music publishers -- based on public performances of their musical works. The session will be held at SOCAN's head office, 41 Valleybrook Drive, Toronto. They are also encouraging members to bring a friend and their questions about SOCAN.

Admission is free, but members should call SOCAN's Member Services department to register.

Johnny Gill signs with new Platinum label

Platinum Entertainment has signed multi-platinum artist Johnny Gill to a recording deal. Gill's yet-to-be-titled album will be released in the second quarter of 2000 through Platinum's newly-formed Black Music division.

This new division is headed up by Hank Caldwell, former president of Death Row Records. The Black Music division will bring the gospel label, CGI, and the urban label, Platinum, under one umbrella.

As senior vice-president of this new division, Caldwell will oversee the day-to-day operations, A&R, marketing and promotions. Caldwell is best known for his tenure at Death Row, where he guided the careers of artists such as Snoop Dogg and Dr. Dre, and from his work at Epic Records, where he worked with Michael Jackson, Babyface and Luther

Vandross.


Platinum has also entered into a production deal with Charles Farrar and Troy Taylor, better known as the 'Characters'. Farrar and Taylor, best known for their work with Boyz II Men, will introduce a new Washington-based rap group, Smash Task, and a New York-based female artist, Diamond.

Following Caldwell's appointment, Jeff Hargrove was appointed vice-president of gospel. Hargrove was formerly national director of promotions for CGI Platinum. And Al Mannerson was named vice-president of marketing and promotions. Both will report to Caldwell.

Platinum has had recent successes with Taylor Dayne, and have just released Peter Townshend: Live From The House Of Blues, a double-disc featuring a guest appearance by Eddie Vedder.

That important fan link!!! Warner Music Canada took a page from the Nashville book last year when they staged the first ever Canadian Country Music Fan Fest in Calgary. With Warner's country stars taking the stage and staying on to autograph copies of their CDs, it was the week's biggest event, outside of the awards show. The mall was packed with over two thousand country fans. So, having that kind of success, Warner is doing the same in Ottawa. Now! The big question! Shouldn't this be a CCMA presentation? That would open the door to those other country artists who don't get the promotion benefits of a major company and we know the independents couldn't afford it. With country music suffering at retail, could there be a better place and time to bring the fans together with the recording artists and stars they hear on country radio? (EC: *Maybe they prefer to sit back and let country radio do the promotion for them!!!*)

Cable! Stop it!!! Ever heard of overkill? I'm about to get off cable and buy an expensive dish if it meant not seeing the same promos over and over! Help! Who has some control over these people? Wharton, a highly successful improv comic is also has one of the most recognizable and successful commercial images in the field of advertising.

Carol Welsman launched the Windsor Arms' (Toronto) new nightly jazz series on Sept. 8 from Club 22. Welsman, who won the 1996 Jazz Report award as best female jazz vocalist, performed hits from her latest release, *Swing Ladies Swing*. Jazz musicians Ron Davis and Doug Banwell are coordinating the new format. Other jazz musicians confirmed to take the month of September out are Pat Wheeler (Sept. 14 & 27), Lorne Lofsky (15 & 24), Banwell/Davis (16 & 25), Russ Hyduk (17, 22 & 29), Pat LaBarbera (18), Brenda Earle (20), Chris Jennings (21), Kevin Barrett (23 & 30), Mark Eisenmann (28).

Grit Laskin was scheduled for Toronto's Flying Cloud Folk Club on Sept. 12. The club is in the Tranzac Club on Brunswick Avenue. Considered one of Canada's premier folk artists, Laskin has been making his living for the past 25 years as a much sought-after, internationally recognized guitar maker. He was awarded the 1997 Saidye Bronfman Award for outstanding achievement in fine crafts in 1998. Transformations, a travelling exhibition of the first 20 years of that award, is now open at the American Craft Museum in New York City. Laskin has also garnered a large fan base through his recordings, performances and songwriting talent. He is currently on release with Earthly Concerns, available on the Borealis label.

John Prine has a Sept. 18 date at Toronto's Convocation Hall. He recently returned to the world of studio recording with the release of *In Spite Of*




The teen set should just eat up this collection of 17 tracks from some of the hot names in the pop scene right now. The folks at BMG have timed this release for the opening of the school year, and have tossed in a couple of neat little goodies for the kids, including artist stickers and a fold-out four-colour poster with a school year calendar. 
CLAY WALKER - Country

Walker obviously has a winner out of the box with this one. The title track taken as the focus single is already catching impressive spins from country radio programmers and bulletins up to #77 this week on the RPM Country 100. The song was written by Gary Nicholson and Allen Shamblin. Walker has a unique vocal application that gets to the heart of country. He has a traditional bent with a contemporary flair that can fit into that new country mold, if in fact new country is as important today as it was built up to be. Nevertheless, Walker's smooth and nicely paced lyric projection leaves no doubt that he is in full control. The album also contains three songs he co-wrote with Jason Greene; Lose Some Sleep Tonight, Cold Heart and Once In A Lifetime, all three being key tracks. Singles consideration should also be given to This Time Love, written by Pat Bunch and Randy Boudreault, The Chain Of



Love, penned by Jonnie Barnett and Rory Lee, and It Ain't Called Heartland (For Nothin), a left-fielder written by Bryan Wayne and Justin Lantz. An added boost to the album is the heavy rotation the video for the title track is receiving at CMT. Walker also gave a giant boost to the album in the US with his North American summer tour. 



Where there is a simple acoustic accompaniment, the richness of Cogan's vocal talent perhaps shines through best. Soothing, provocative, a little to the left, a little to the right, but never pretentious and bordering on a bit of sobering awareness is Cogan's immediate impact. All tracks are key with a couple of radio friendly ones to boot. Recorded at Cogan's Salt Spring Island home studio with an unbelievable clutch of highly professional west coast pickers: guitarists Andrew Beddoes, Bill Henderson, bassist Kerry Galloway, drummer Jerome Jarvis, Mike Simpson on keys, violinist Calvin Cairns, Jane Phillips on viola da gamba, cellist Carol Young, Beth Smolar on tambura and Cogan on keys and acoustic guitars with background vocals by Charlie Erck, Christine Baxter and Wyckham Porteous. It was Fred Rose and Roy Acuff who first realized the potential for increased personal revenue by having artists perform their own compositions. Unfortunately, not all musicians are good composers. This is our roundabout way of expressing pleasure over an album of established songs performed with evident




affection by singer George Evans. To be honest, he isn't always true to their intentions. Ballads are to be presented in the manner say, of Johnny Hartman whose voice was similar in timbre to that of Evans, not Bobby Short whose phrasing is much in evidence here. In the main however, it's refreshing to hear again such once familiar songs as How Am I To Know and My Heart Tells Me. Our favourite from the 14 track programme is One Evening In May which was popularized by the late, and also from Montreal, Dick Todd. It's a good album and worth custom but it would have better sung, not swung.

Though percussion is his evident choice of expression Jay Boehmer possesses a melodic sense that's palpable on this collection of his original compositions. They are occasionally



challenging harmonically and, expectedly, rhythmically complex but the melody is always to the forefront. He leads basically a rhythm trio with an assist from Pat LaBarbera on tenor sax through a programme that's accessible and enjoyable to all musical tastes. One wishes it were possible to say it's a landmark MAPL album but that would be overstatement. Far better to say that contemporary jazz can sometimes sound like a legitimate late and love child of Swing. Proof is offered here.



MARIO LANZA - Classical

Au courant hoi polloi (an oxymoron if ever there was one) dismiss the late Mario Lanza as a good looking tenor who dissipated a glorious

talent before his death on Oct. 7th, 1959 at age 38. They might -- heaven forfend -- be correct but the talent in question is not to be gainsaid nor its inspiration to the two generations that have followed. Editorializing aside, here in ten tracks recorded between 1950 and 1955, some of them released for the first time, his voice is glorious as it rises to the challenge of the music. Yes, his emotionalism tended toward the florid but then, so did that of his predecessors such as Gigli, Caruso and Bjoerling. Best track is the 14-minute Di ti



giocondi, a duet with Licia Albanese from Verdi's Otello. There are a few lollipops -- Celeste Aida, La donna e mobile and Vesti La Giubba -- but for the most part the programme is made up of "hard tack" and performed beautifully. Deserved success of the album should portend a revival of interest in Lanza; one that's long overdue.


Superlatives are chancy at best but we consider Placido Domingo to be the greatest living tenor. He can perform better both in opera and concert than any of his contemporaries. What's more, he's been doing it longer. As proof, we offer this 2 CD album of opera arias recorded three decades ago. His voice, then as now, is as passionate as Bjoerling's; as disciplined as that of Leonard Warren. He is quite simply and simply quite the finest. There are an astounding 34 tracks on the two sides and though many are recognizable favourites, none is a lollipop. Indeed, such too rarely heard gems as Rachel from Halévy's La Juive, April to tua finestra! from Mascagni's Iris and Ah! tout est bien fini from Le Cid by Massenet are sure to become vox popular all over again. An extra bonus offered are the lyrics of the songs in their original languages and in English. Just don't try to sing along with Domingo; he's unique.

Clive Davis, the Arista maven of pop, has probably found another hit in this trio from south of the border who have tapped into the teen-pop craze and tried to raise it up a notch. Although there are obvious comparisons to Backstreet Boys, 'N Sync, Boyzone, 98 Degrees...etc, etc, L.F.O. have a sound that comes across as a little more street-wise, even a bit more mature. What's also impressive about these three guys is that Brad (Young), Devin (Brain) and Rich (Cronin) actually write their own material. They penned the lead single, Summer Girls, which has already begun climbing the charts (#30, RPM/Sept. 6/99), and could very easily be top ten within a week or two. In addition to that one, the threesome also contributed Girl On TV, and West Side Story, and also grab co-writing credits on Can't Have You (with the Gibb brothers, no less). If you're looking for a second hit, look no further than Your Heart Is Safe With Me, written by proverbial hitmaker Diane Warren. As with most guy groups today, L.F.O. have the image to pull some serious MTV/MuchMusic success, which certainly wouldn't hurt the album's sales. Look for this one in your daughter's collection. -RR



Paul Brandt to host CCMA Awards '99 from Ottawa

Reprise recording artist Paul Brandt has been named host of the Canadian Country Music Awards, which will be broadcast live by CBC Television from Ottawa's Civic Centre on Sept. 13.

The Calgarian-born Brandt has had a number of #1 records in Canada since signing with Reprise almost five years ago, and has won numerous Big Country, CCMA and Juno awards. Two of his #1 songs, I Do and My Heart Has A History, won SOCAN song of the year awards.

The nominations call for this year's awards show which were announced Aug. 4, revealed four nominees getting the nod in six categories: The Wilkinsons for group, single, video and SOCAN song of the year for their #1 hit 26 Cents, album for Nothing But Love and the Wrangler rising star award; Shania Twain for female artist, fan's choice, single, SOCAN song and video for That Don't Impress Me Much and collaboration of the year for her duet with Bryan White on From This Moment

On; Terri Clark for female, fan's choice, single for You're Easy On The Eyes, video for Everytime I Cry, and album and top selling album for How I Feel; and Prairie Oyster who have staged a comeback with nominations as best group or duo, single, video and SOCAN song for Canadian Sunrise, fan's choice and album for What Is This Country.

Brandt has been nominated in five categories; male artist, fan's choice, single and SOCAN song for That's The Truth and album for That's The Truth.

The final round of voting by the 1,700 CCMA members is being held over the next few weeks. All the 11 awards presented on the awards show are chosen by the CCMA's members with two exceptions; top selling album, which is based on sales figures, and the CMT Maple Leaf Foods fan's choice award which is voted on by fans across Canada who dial 1-900-870-CCMA (2262) to register their votes.






TOP FEMALE VOCALIST CONTENDERS

STEPHANIE BEAUMONT

Like many burgeoning artists, Stephanie Beaumont did a great deal of traveling in her formative early years. Born in Halifax, Beaumont moved numerous times during her younger years, largely a result of her father's career with the Bank of

Nova Scotia. She called nine different places home, including Trinidad, before she eventually enrolled at the University of Western Ontario in London, majoring in finance and economics. But the financial world was not her desired destination, and music kept beckoning. With the financial support of her family, Beaumont was able to record *Love And Dreams* in 1996, produced by Canadian country vet Randall Prescott. The album produced six singles that found their way onto the charts, all of them with accompanying videos that played on Country Music Television (CMT). By this time, Beaumont had secured a licensing deal with Iron Music, and national distribution with BMG. *Love And Dreams* produced two CCMA nominations in 1996, and

four more in '97, including female vocalist and Rising Star. With major label support to back her up, Beaumont headed back to the studio to record *Way Over My Heart*. The album showcases the talents of Beaumont and her producers, Jeffrey Steele and Tom Harding. Steele, former Boy Howdy lead singer, co-wrote eight of the 12 tracks, and sings alongside Beaumont on *My Greatest Love*. This year, Stephanie Beaumont is nominated for top female vocalist at the CCMA Awards.

TERRI CLARK

Even though she already had million-selling success throughout North America, Terri Clark was eager to take another step forward creatively with her 1998 release, *How I Feel*. She wanted to create a 'career album', and the results, both critically and commercially, would suggest that she has.


The album runs the musical gamut, from the power of *Unsung Hero*, to the hillbilly honky-tonk of *Cure For The Common Heartache*, to the pop stylings of *Now That I Found You* – the album reveals an artist at their musical peak, and willing to change. Of course, one wonders why things needed changing.

From the release of her 1995 self-titled debut, Terri Clark has been a fixture on the country charts.

Spurred by the success of the #1 single, *Better Things To Do*, that album eventually reached platinum status, and earned Clark a slew of awards, including three 1996 CCMA Awards (top song and album, and the Vista Rising Star Award).

The year 1997 saw the release of Clark's second Mercury album, *Just The Same*. That album produced three top forty singles (*Poor Poor Pitiful Me*, *Emotional Girl* and the title track), and resulted in three more CCMA Awards, including top female vocalist, top album, and entertainer of the year.

How I Feel has picked up right



where the others left off, in terms of success. *Now That I Found You* and *You're Easy On The Eyes* were both hits, and *How I Feel* quickly equalled the sales success of her earlier releases.

For the 1999 CCMA Awards, Terri Clark has been nominated for six awards, including top female artist, single (*You're Easy On The Eyes*), video (*Everytime I Cry*), album and best-selling album, and the Fan's Choice Award for entertainer of the year.

SHANIA TWAIN

By now, the incredible rags-to-riches story of Shania Twain has become something of an industry legend. Growing up in difficult circumstances in the hinterlands of Timmins, Ontario, Twain has emerged from that trying existence to become one of the most popular artists in the world - country or otherwise.

The whirlwind of success for Twain in recent years has truly been staggering.

Surprisingly, however, it didn't start off that way. After making her way to Nashville in the early '90s, signing with Mercury Records and releasing her self-titled debut in '93, Shania's career was still at a standstill. But after partnering with rock producer Mutt Lange, both in and out of the studio, things seemed to come together.

The release of her second album, *The Woman In Me*, heralded the start of something special. As opposed to her first record, *The Woman In Me* consisted entirely of songs written by Twain and Lange. The combination of their writing talents, and Lange's producing skills, were a definite winner. *The Woman In Me* became one of the biggest selling records in country music history, producing four number one singles, and the awards started to roll in - top album honours from the Academy of Country Music and the CCMA, top country album at the Grammys, top female country artist at the CCMA's,

American Music Awards, World Music Awards, etc., etc.

The 1998 release of *Come On Over* was widely anticipated, and the results have been just as sweet. The album has already produced a series of hit singles (*You're Still The One*, *That Don't Impress Me Much*, *Don't Be Stupid*, *You've Got A Way*), and the awards continue to roll in, including top album, single (*You're Still The One*) and female vocalist at the '98 CCMA Awards.

For this year's awards, Twain is nominated for six awards - SOCAN song and video (*That Don't Impress Me Much*), vocal collaboration (*From This Moment*, with Bryan White), top female artist and the CMT Fan's Choice Award.

MICHELLE WRIGHT

Raised in a musical family in southwestern Ontario, it's no surprise that Michelle Wright ventured into a musical career herself. From her early beginnings as a teenager playing local clubs, Wright's career has expanded into platinum success throughout North America.

From the chart success of her first-ever single (*I Want To Count On You*) back in 1986, the doors swung open for Michelle both here and south of the border. She released her first album shortly thereafter (*Do Right By Me*) on the Savannah label, and after a constant stream of touring both in Canada and the US, Wright was eventually picked up by Arista Nashville, who released her self-titled album in 1990.

The follow-up to that release, *Now & Then*, was the album that propelled Wright into the spotlight. The album produced five Canadian #1's, including the huge American hit, *Take It*



Like A Man. The awards followed as well, including the '93 CCMA entertainer of the year.

She regained that award the following year, after the release of her '94 album, *The Reasons Why*. In '95 came the album *For Me It's You*, producing more hits, including *Nobody's Girl*.


As the decade nears its close, Wright is preparing her Greatest Hits package, set for a fall '99 release, and led by a new single, *When I Found You*, co-written by Wright. For the 1999 CCMA Awards, Michelle Wright is again nominated for female artist of the year.

LISA BROKOP

Born in Surrey, B.C. back in 1973, there are those who will tell you that Lisa Brokop was singing before she was even talking. By the time she was eight, Brokop was already accompanying herself on guitar, and by age 12, she was already performing with local bands, and stirring up industry interest. By age 15, she had made the move to professional, touring across Canada with a Vancouver-based band. A year later, she started her own band, and began releasing her first singles. Her victory at a songwriting contest in 1991 led to a songwriting relationship with Nashville writer Peter McCann, who eventually produced Brokop's first album, *My Love*, on the Libre label.

That album started the ball rolling. In 1992, she headed to Nashville to do a label showcase, which led to a signing with Liberty (Capitol) Records, and the release of *Every Little Girl's Dream* (1994). That album led to the top new female artist award from the Academy of Country Music, and a performance on the awards show.

Her second Capitol album, simply titled *Lisa Brokop*, brought further attention both north and south of the border. In 1998, Lisa signed with Columbia Nashville, who released the album *When You Get To Be You*. The album produced a number of charted singles, including the hit *How Do I Let Go?* At the 1999 CCMA Awards, Lisa Brokop is once again nominated for top female artist.



East Coast Awards, where Guthro received the SOCAN songwriter of the year award, he was signed by EMI Music Canada. *Of Your Son*, his EMI debut produced by Chad Irschick, contained the popular first single *Walk This Road*. After a year and a half of strong radio and retail success, Bruce Guthro has been honoured with a CCMA nomination for male artist of the year.

JASON McCOY

For most 28 year olds, their lives and ambitions are just beginning to unfold. For Minesing, Ontario native Jason McCoy, his 28 years have already provided an ample amount of experience and success. That musical experience began by winning a talent contest at age 17, which led to the production of several independent singles and an album, *Greatest Times Of All*. Seeing the talent that was there, veteran Nashville producer Scott Baggett encouraged McCoy to head to the country music capital, where they produced a series of songs that caught the ear of MCA Nashville officials, who signed McCoy in early 1995. McCoy's self-titled MCA (now Universal) debut catapulted him into country star status, with the album remaining on the RPM country albums chart for an impressive 62 straight weeks. The album's success led to his first cross-Canada tour with his band, The Real McCoys, and ultimately led to the outstanding new artist award at the 1996 Big Country Awards. With his name firmly on the minds of country fans, McCoy headed back to Nashville in '97 to record his second album for Universal, *Playin' For Keeps*. Being



more established, McCoy was able to enlist the help of some of country's best and brightest. Names like Craig Wiseman, Al Anderson and Clay Curtis appear on the song credits, and McCoy also received instrumental support from keyboard giant Reese Wynans, and harmonica legend Delbert McClinton. The result has been further success for McCoy, both in Canada and the U.S. The album reached gold status here in Canada, and the McCoy received a SOCAN song of the year award at the '98 CCMA for *Born Again In Dixieland* (with Denny Carr and Naoise Sheridan). McCoy is heading back to the studio shortly to record his third Universal release. This year, he has garnered a 1999 CCMA nod for top male artist.

PAUL BRANDT

Since the release of his successful debut release four years ago, Paul Brandt's star has been steadily rising. His first two albums have garnered Brandt a slew of awards, including a trio of Junos, seven CCMA awards, and a pair of SOCAN



song of the year awards (for *I Do* and *My Heart Has A History*). At last year's Junos, Brandt scored a minor coup by winning both the country male and male vocalist awards. Brandt is hoping his recently released third album, *That's The Truth*, will continue to increase his popularity, both here and south of the border. Produced by Brandt and country music veteran Chris Farren, the album features contributions from a number of different writers (including Farren, Steve Rosen, and swingman Brian Setzer), as well as Brandt's own usual supply of well-written songs. This year, in addition to hosting the awards, Brandt is nominated in five categories: male artist,

single and SOCAN song (*That's The Truth*), album (*That's The Truth*) and the CMT Maple Leaf Foods Fan's Choice Awards.


BRUCE GUTHRO

Born and raised in Sydney Mines, Nova Scotia, Guthro describes his native territory as "A songwriter's heaven." But it wasn't until he moved out on his own and headed to parts west that Guthro's musical odyssey first began. His discovery of the guitar inspired him to start crafting his own songs, and after returning home to Cape Breton, Guthro won a local songwriting contest, which led to the release (via MCA Canada) of his first single, *Livin' In The '90s*. The strong support gained at radio resulted in BMG Publishing co-funding his first album, *Sails To The Wind*. Guthro's stellar performance at the '95 Remembering Stan Rogers tribute concert brought even further attention. Guthro also received plaudits for his performance at the '95 East Coast Music Awards, where he was nominated for three awards. Following the '97



JAMIE WARREN

Although Kitchener native Jamie Warren has always had a love of music, his initial career aspirations were in the broadcasting business. After graduating from nearby Conestoga College with a broadcasting diploma, Warren did shifts at several local stations, but just couldn't ignore the musical muse. After winning a pair of local talent contests, Warren hooked up with producer Rick Hutt (Northern Pikes, Tom Cochrane) and soon released his first single, 1983's *World Of A Child*. He later released a half-dozen more singles, including *Take Me Home Mississippi*, which hit the top ten on the country charts. That song also garnered him outstanding new artist honours at the 1985 Big Country Awards. Eventually, Warren semi-retired from the touring and recording to stay home with his children, but he reemerged in 1996 with his first album, *Fallen Angel*. That album spawned several top twenty songs (*Ready To Run*, *What Goes Around Comes Around*, *One Step Back*), and also featured the song and video, *The Secret*, telling the story of an abusive relationship. That song inspired the



singer/songwriter to form The Warren Foundation for Victims of Abuse, which has raised more than \$30,000 for victims of domestic violence. The success of Fallen Angel resulted in a deal with River North Nashville, and the album was eventually released by Mercury/Polydor in the US. In 1998 came his second album, Just Not The Same, which immediately produced a hit in Cried All The Way Home. For the 1999 CCMA Awards, Warren has been nominated in three categories: SOCAN song (with Naoise Sheridan, for Cried All The Way Home), vocal collaboration (Love How You Listen To Me, with Beverly Mahood), and top male artist.

JULIAN AUSTIN

It's hard to argue the fact that this Saint John, New Brunswick native may be the fastest-rising star in Canadian country music. Austin happily embraces the tag of country music 'bad boy', and he has the hard experience to back it up. Austin openly talks about his earlier hard times, as a boy who started drinking at age 11, who eventually got into drugs, and spent time in prison. But music, as is

often the case, proved to be his salvation. Playing bars and clubs throughout eastern Canada helped hone his craft, and his songwriting talents eventually caught the ear of the folks at BMG. Producer Daniel LeBlanc brought in an A-list of talent to perform on the debut record, and the results have spoken for themselves. His first single, Little Ol' Kisses, hit the top of the country charts in the summer of '97, and Austin has been on a roll ever since. The song and album garnered him the Rising Star Award at the '97 CCMA Awards, and he earned a slew of nominations at the '98 awards, including top single, album and male vocalist. The album has since produced more charted hits, including Hard Time Loving You, and the result has been more recognition from his peers. For the 1999 CCMA Awards, Julian Austin has been nominated for a pair of awards, including the CMT Fan's Choice, and top male artist.




RICK TIPPE

His last 14 singles have hit the top 40 in Canada, including six from his debut album, Shoulda Seen Her Comin', another six from his second album, Get Hot Or Go Home, and a couple more off his latest release, Shiver 'N Shake. His videos are also receiving strong airplay on Country Music Television. In 1998, Tippe



BEVERLEY MAHOOD

Although born in Ireland, Beverley Mahood first began performing the day she arrived in Canada at the age of six. At the age of 11, Mahood hit the big stage, winning the Ontario Open Country singing contest, and a year later, she won the Canadian Open Country singing contest, performing the Patsy Cline classic Crazy. In 1986, Mahood met producer J. Richard Hutt, who would become a major figure in her musical life. In 1988, she began singing backing vocals for numerous artists, including Jamie Warren, and headed to New York to perform on Star Search. By the time she turned 20, Mahood was heading out into the working world, but music was still in the forefront, and she continued to write her own songs. In '96, she began recording (with Hutt) the songs for her first album. A year later came her first single and video, Girl Out Of The Ordinary, a song which hit the top ten on the Canadian country charts. Later that year came a call from noted producer David Foster, who agreed to work with her in the immediate future. Early in 1998 came the release of the album, Girl Out Of The Ordinary. That same year, she received five CCMA and one Juno nomination, and won the Rising Star Award at the Big Country Awards. This year, Mahood is nominated for the Wrangler Rising Star Award. She is also part of the new trio, Lace. Their Foster-produced album is due out shortly.



LORRIE CHURCH

A singer/songwriter from the Sweetgrass First Nation reserve, Lorrie Church has been able to bring her cultural background into her own brand of country music. The 12th of 16 children, Church began performing early and often. She formed her own band in high school, performing throughout her native Saskatchewan. After high school, she hit the road with a new band, performing throughout western Canada and the territories. In addition to furthering her own ambitions, Church has also given back to the native community. She organized the Have You Seen The Future? tour, which involved 60 free shows at native centres across the province of Saskatchewan. Her 1998 debut release, I Never Gave Up Hope (Eagle Hill Music) was produced by veterans Kim Tribble and Cyril Rawson. The results have already been outstanding, with



charted success for the lead single (Running Away), video releases on CMT, and five Saskatchewan Country Music Awards, including entertainer of the year. This year, Church is nominated for the Wrangler Rising Star Award at the Canadian Country Music Awards.

THE WILKINSONS

The success of this family trio has been nothing short of spectacular since the release of their Giant Records debut, *Nothing But Love*. Father Steve, son Tyler and daughter Amanda have won the hearts of country music fans throughout this country, and they're starting to win over hearts south of the border as well. Their sound reflects the myriad of influences on Steve, who had already written numerous songs for several Canadian country artists. Those influences include such diverse country names as George Strait, Reba McEntire, Restless Heart and Garth Brooks. When the family trio decided to put their talents onto CD, the result was a major label bidding war that included MCA, Dreamworks, Capitol, Arista and Sony, but the Wilkinsons were looking for a strong commitment and a family atmosphere, which led them to Giant. The results have been an unprecedented success story in Canadian country music. This

year, The Wilkinsons have been nominated for six CCMA Awards: top group, single, video and SOCAN song (26 Cents), album (*Nothing But Love*), and the Wrangler Rising Star Award.



Shane Minor a slave to the musical habit

Leading the life of a newly-signed country artist may sound like a fun ride, but for Mercury artist Shane Minor, the ride to the world of major label music has, in itself, been an interesting ride.

Hailing from California farm country, Minor was almost automatically drawn to country music and his other early love - steer and bull riding. Bull riding isn't exactly the safest hobby in the world, and Minor has his share of scars to prove it.

He kept on the bullriding circuit all the way through his high school years, but all the while, his love of music and desire to make that his life's pursuit kept growing.

But life, of course, often takes strange twists and turns, and Minor's life took a dramatic turn in his 21st year, when he graduated from the police academy and joined the Los Angeles Police Department. It was his misfortune that he wound up serving in the south central district of the city, the most infamous section of L.A.

It was also Minor's bad luck that he was serving in south central L.A. during the time of the Rodney King riots, one of the most terrifying periods in recent US history.

Minor says that seeing some of the things he saw over those couple of days would change anyone forever.


"I was there for the '92 riots, I watched them put Reginald Denny in the ambulance at Florence and Normandy. It was amazing watching all that go down. That really makes you thankful for what you have. That was in '92, and I quit in the end of '94."

During the five years he spent with the LAPD, Minor continued to pursue his musical goals. He continued to play in a band, continued to write songs, continued to play at bars, fairs, wherever he could

find an audience.

And his music also provided an escape for him from the ravages of the south central LA streets.

"Music was my escape, especially because of my work. The majority of the time you were seeing 15 shootings a day. I usually saw a death every night.



I stayed with it because there was some good people caught in the middle of that stuff."

Naturally, the experiences of the LA streets found their way into his songwriting. As he points out, it's difficult to see the things he has seen and not have it creep into your creativity.

"I grew up on a farm, and my family's very down to earth, there wasn't a whole lot of pain there. But going to L.A. and seeing all that stuff...it's pretty hard to get over it. So I learned to go deeper into my spirit and myself, to know that there are people worse off than me and to feel things I wouldn't normally have felt. So I touch into those feelings to help me write songs."

After five years as a beat cop, Minor decided that he'd had enough. Even though he really had nowhere to go, career-wise, he just couldn't handle another day on the streets. As he himself says, "I didn't want to spend 20 years in south L.A. watching people die every day."

Fortunately for Minor, one of the first phone calls he made after leaving the force was to legendary manager Bud Prager, who's worked with the likes of Foreigner and Bad Company.

After hearing Minor's rough demo, Prager recognized his talent and put him in touch with

Nashville writer/producer Dan Huff. Their joining was the first serious step towards Minor's recording career.

Huff and Minor worked together long-distance for the next three to four years - Minor in LA, Huff in Nashville. Minor went from making \$40,000 a year as a policeman to "about \$8,000 a year as a musician." He would send Huff demo after demo, and Huff would call him back, telling him what he needed to work on.

"Finally one day I sent him a song called *What Have I Got To Lose*, and he called me back and said I was ready. I expected to wait another year for him, but he said I was ready. So a couple months later I went to Nashville, lived in his basement with him for two or three months. We did my demo tape but we didn't know what the outcome would be."

Minor had meetings with five labels, two of which passed right away, while two others passed because of budget restrictions.

Eventually, Minor and Huff met with Mercury president Luke Lewis and A&R VP Keith Stegall. After the initial handshakes, Lewis and Stegall asked Minor to leave the room while they listened to his tape.

"I could hear the song playing and then it stopped about halfway through, so I figured 'well, he's done with me'. Then he came back out and asked if I sing live. Of course I said yes, so we went to the studio, myself, Dan Huff, Keith Stegall and Luke Lewis.

"Dan played the piano to this song I'd written called *Change Your Mind*. Then I sang another song called *A Girl Like That*, a song I'd written about Sandra Bullock. And after I was done that, I looked over and saw Luke Lewis kind of nodding his head at Luke Stegall, and Luke said, 'Let's do it.' The whole thing took an hour and a half. But it was being there at the right time."


Since the release of the album, Minor's career has been taking off quickly. The lead single, *Slave To The Habit*, reached as high as #8 on the RPM Country chart (Aug. 2/99), while the second single, *Ordinary Love*, has already climbed to #43, after just five weeks.

Of course, Minor's album sales have been spurred on by his appearance as the opening act on Shania Twain's recent North American tour.

Minor says that touring with Shania has been tremendous, and she herself has been a great source of encouragement.

"I did 25 shows with her, I did the last part of the tour with her and Leahy. It was crazy. I was a big fan of her's before I ever got the tour, and when I got it I was ecstatic. And once I got to know her, she's the best. And I'll always remember what she told me - 'If you treat the guy sweeping off the stage like he's the head of the label, then you're set.' I'll never forget that."

By the way, *Your Love* will be released for the first time in the US to A/C radio on Sept. 27. The single, the third released from his *Destiny* album, won the CCMA Award last year in the vocal/instrumental collaboration category. Wright's new single is the most added this week entering the chart at #66. Her album will be in the stores on Oct. 26.

Lonestar stays at #1 with *Amazed*, considered a "smash" and the biggest singles success they've had in their history. The track has also broken at pop and A/C with its special mix.

Clay Walker moves quickly to establish chart action with *Live, Laugh, Love*, the title track of his new Giant CD (RPM New Releases - Sept. 13/99). The single entered the chart last week modestly at #86 and bullets up to #74, the biggest mover of the week.



Canadian Country Countdown launched on 25 stations

Canadian Country Countdown, a three hour weekly Top 30 countdown hosted by Cliff Dumas and Lisa Monroe, was launched the first weekend in September on 25 radio stations from Newfoundland to BC.

The show features country stars from Canada and the US, including a showcase artist, a #1 song artist feature, a dedication letter from listeners, Today's country music headlines and live versions of the big hits of today.

Watch for big action on Lace, a new girl trio that has an important Cancon connection. The trio comprises Canadians Beverley Mahood and Giselle (she goes by her first name only) and Texan Corbi Dyann. Mahood is no stranger to Canadian country




Lace is Corbi Dyann, Beverley Mahood and Giselle

programmers. She has had a number of charted singles over the last couple of years, and is currently charting with *The Way A Woman Feels*, a song she wrote with Mark Dineen. The single has been

charting for the past 12 weeks and had begun descending, but makes a good recovery this week, bulleting up to #82. Mahood won a Big Country Award in 1998, the year she released her first album, as outstanding new artist. She has been nominated for CCMA Awards this year in the vocal/instrumental collaboration category for *Love How You Listen To Me*, a duet with Jamie Warren, and for the Wrangler Rising Star Award. The big break for the trio was being discovered by David Foster, who signed them to his 143 label. *I Want A Man* was the first single out of the gate, which caught enough attention of US country programmers for chart listings. However, it's now apparently been decided to go with *You Could've Had Me*, which has Cancon properties. More on this as the information becomes available.

Charlie Major has signed a record deal with Nashville's Dead Reckoning label. Major began collecting awards with his first Big Country win as male artist of the year 1994, winning the next three in the same category. He also won the Big Country Award as Canadian Country Artist of the Year in 1994 and 1995 and won the top country composer of the year award with Barry Brown in 1994. The Ottawa Valley native, now living in Nashville, has also won six CCMA awards, two SOCAN writing awards, a MuchMusic video award and three Juno awards. Major co-produced his debut CD release, titled *444*, with Dead Reckoning founder Harry Stinson, which is being targeted for an Oct. 19 store date. *Right Here, Right Now*, the first single, goes to radio in mid-September. The video will follow the next month. Major's release in Canada will be distributed by Oasis Entertainment Inc.

Julian Austin has a new single just in time for Ottawa's Canadian Country Music Week. *Back In Your Life*, a song he wrote with producer Daniel LeBlanc, has been a long time coming for the popular New Brunswick recording artist, who won Big Country Awards in 1998 as top country composer and Canadian country video, both for *Little Ol' Kisses*. Austin will be performing with Prairie Oyster at the Canadian Country Music Week Kick-Off Party on Sept. 10 (8 pm - 11 pm) which is sponsored by HMV Canada. Austin releases on the ViK label. Nominated this year for the CCMA/CMT Maple Leaf Foods fan's choice award and as male artist, Austin will also be performing on the CCMA Award broadcast on Sept. 13.



In spite of two days of rain, Durham's KX96FM brought the crowds out to the Havelock Country Jamboree where they branded hundreds of their listeners with the KX96 logo.

Tara Lyn Hart enjoyed an awesome Sony launch of her self-titled Epic album at a posh Art Gallery of Ontario reception in Toronto on Aug. 31. The Gallery's Walker Court was packed to capacity and the response from the audience is an early indication of Hart's obvious potential, not only for country but for the pop and A/C market. Sony's manager of Epic product, Dave Deeley, has been giving priority treatment to Hart's first single release *That's When You Came Along*, which is now beginning to pay off. The three-parter Cancon single (MAL) enters the chart this week at #78.

Tony Moreau gets his foot in the chart door with *Boulevard Of Dreams*, the title track of his debut album (RPM New Releases - Sept. 6/99), taken as the first single.
