## TAPE TRACKS TREND

The Canadian tape cartridge business is in a mess. Some record dealers, who have reluctantly taken on the sale of cartridges, would like to be rid of the "nuisance". One problem, according to a major dealer, is that customers are taking unfair advantage of the one year guarantee (which is only natural) and returning the cartridges after a few months, most being the worst for wear, and

demanding an exchange. This has created problems for record dealers with regard to exchanges and re-ordering and the added storage problem. Another major dealer complains that they are dealing with a completely different type customer and find it unnecessary to give the personalized service that record buyers demand. What it all seems to boil down to is a complete lack of com-

munication between the supplier, the dealer, and the consumer, of this potentially explosive new consumer toy.

As in most avenues of Canadian business we tend to look to the U.S. for leadership, but in the case of the tape business, even the U.S. has appeared somewhat sluggish in getting its tape whistle-stopping on the move. Insofar as

the tape market is concerned it would appear that we in Canada may have put the cart before the horse. Automobile manufacturers and others have offered a sleek option for on the move listening. The homeowner has been offered a wide range of modern home listening units and the teenager has a special beach, poolroom, bike, or school locker unit to play with. Next comes the acquiring of and the supplying of

### STEREODYNE INC. OPENS OPERATION IN CANADA

### COLUMBIA TAPES ON MOVE

Toronto: In an effort to research the tape industry, Columbia Records of Canada sent sales representative Harry Dunnette into the field to gather pertinent information and to open, if possible, new tape accounts. The results have been most encouraging. Columbia is now experiencing solid tape sales. On their open end or reel to reel systems they are offering over 350 titles including pop, rock, R&B, and jazz.

product for the component.

When cartridges were first introduced on the market, record companies were eager to jump on the bandwagon and sign over their rights to reproduce. Laxity on the part of the tape grabbers has caused record companies to have second thoughts. Some are thinking seriously of getting into the manufacturing of cassettes and 8 track systems themselves. Meanwhile the tape industry dabbles along, hoping for a breakthrough that seems inevitable.

Canadian record companies have figures to prove that some areas of Canada show anywhere from a 150 to 410% increase in tape sales. These figures could be encouraging but misleading. It has been estimated that there are upwards of 65,000 stereo recorders and over 75,000 cassette players in use in Canada, yet the sales of cassettes, four and eight track cartridges would seem to indicate that most players are gathering dust, or still sitting on the dealers shelf.

Let's take a look at what this rebel industry has to offer. There are three principal systems offered to the consumer: four and eight track and the cassette. The trade prefers to refer to the system as the continuous loop operation, which as the name implies, feeds tape continuously in one direction, winding off the inside of the reel and back on the outside.

The matching stereo programs on the four track cartridge are on the first and third band with the second and fourth band containing another matching stereo program. Upon completion of the first channel program a strip of foil on the tape trips a sensing device in the player, moving the playing head over to channels two and four.

In the eight track system the stereo channels work on one

and five, two and six and so on, and again the foil strip switches the head to the next channel.

One present problem with the four and eight track systems is the limiting of quick selectivity of music. The listener must put up with a complete cut before moving on to the next. Some companies are now featuring a fast forward speed to overcome this inconvenience. To add confusion to the four and eight track systems, there is a war of nerves going on between the two, and it would appear that the eight track system would be winning out. But it should also be noted that eight track isn't getting that much needed acceptance from the high fidelity buff, possibly because the eight track might lack fidelity, which is so important to the music connoisseur.

One field in which eight track would appear to be well ahead is that of the automobile units. Apparently eight track designers worked very closely with automobile engineers which resulted in thinner playback equipment, a must for an under-the-dash accessory. Eight track would appear to be moving well in portable and home units as well. Both eight and four track systems have overcome many of the bugs that have made them unacceptable by the mass buying public. One major problem would seem to be the attitude of the consumer. He feels he's buying a luxury item and fails to give the same understanding and consideration to his player and tapes that he might have to his record entertainment unit. These tape cartridges require a certain amount of care to keep them in perfect working order. The tape cartridge that is returned as defective, may work perfectly if the player head was clean. Perhaps as the tape industry grows the suppliers will go on a "Be kind to your tape player" kick in an effort to raise the status of this new entertainment unit.

The cassette, is a reel to reel system, that also has some inconvenient limitations. The stereo cassette plays on two bands in one direction and has to be flipped over for bands three and four. Cassette manufacturers are working on a recorder that reverses automatically with hopes of providing up to 120 minutes of continuous music. One plus for cassettes is their size (4" by 2 1/2" and only three-eighths of an inch thick) which allows for easier storage and of course will probably woo the automobile industry.

One system we didn't touch on is Playtape in Canada. It's here, not many people know why or how, or if it will become a part of the industry. It is now being distributed by a company mainly interested in toys. This is a completely new area for the company who's chief product is plastics and plastic toys.

This year the Japanese will probably move into the tape business with a Sony eight track cartridge player with record capability not unlike the cassette.

Ampex is stirring as well. They apparently like the cassette idea but would like to go the route of the four and eight track player with automatic reversing. They just may combine all this in one package. Whatever they have in mind they're not saying too much.

Management of those giants expected to lead the field in Canada would appear to be confused and are therefore reluctant to reveal what their plans are for the future.

1968 seems to be shaping up as another year of trial and error for the tape industry which will only serve to confuse the market further.

Although the record industry is involved, to a degree, many of the record companies are not too interested in releasing music for pre-recorded cassettes, although they have made their libraries available for four and eight track systems.

It's natural to assume that record companies don't want to strengthen record capability product for competitive reasons. Looking into product availability, if the demand for tape cartridges could be compared with the demand for and availability for the pop record, which only lasts for a few weeks, would it be possible for cartridge manufacturers to supply this demand in the same short time that record companies are capable of? Tape again is much more expensive, whereby discs can be put out on a trial basis and scrapped without too much loss, but where does that leave the rather expensive four and eight track and cassette packages. On the other hand perhaps the tape industry will lead us back into the listening to music purely for the sake of listening, and buying for the same reason. We may be entering the era of "relaxed sound". Composers, artists, bands, groups and listeners may become important as a commodity not as a vehicle for the hectic HIT HIT HIT market.

As for distribution. If tapes are here to stay and influence, they belong in the music store. They are part of a highly professional entertainment business and deserve to be given the same consideration as any other entertainment package.

One of the problems the rather backward tape industry will have to overcome is the somewhat inferiority complex many of its representatives have when it comes to husking this potentially powerful new "sound machine". There are many millions of dollars being spent on the promotion of the tape industry, in the U.S., so it's pretty safe to assume that tape cartridges are here to stay.

The public must be sold on the idea but first the industry must create salesmen who believe that what the world needs is a good \$29.95, \$99.95, \$999.95 or what have you tape player. The supplying of sound is easy.

## NEW TAPE RELEASES FROM RCA VICTOR

Montreal: Rca Victor Stereo 8 releases for the month of January include "Silk and Soul" by Nina Simone; "Country Showtime, Vol. 2" with Floyd Cramer, Fannie Flagg, Waylon Jennings and Connie Smith; Peter Nero's "Nero-ing In On The Hits"; "Clambake" by Elvis Presley and the current LP success of the Jefferson Airplane "After Bathing At Baxter's. The release also includes the original cast album "Hair" an American tribal love-rock musical.

From Colgems comes "The Lewis and Clark Expedition" and "Sally Field, The Flying Nun". Releases from the RCA Classical Red

Seal library include "Mendelssohn Concerto in E Minor and Prokofieff Concerto in G Minor" with Heifetz, Munch and the Boston Symphony; and "Beethoven Piano Concerto No. 3" with Rubinstein and the Boston Symphony Orchestra.

Rca Victor's Stereo 8 sales have shown a tremendous increase over the past few months. Their catalogue now offers over 500 titles.

Automobile accessory stores have become an increasingly popular outlet for the product.

It is expected that RCA Victor will be distributing the Lear Jet Stereo home and auto cartridge playing systems in the near future.

classical and shows, as well as spoken word and French Canadian items. Their 8 track offers over 200 titles and the 4 track system 150 titles. The most popular items would appear to be that of their country line.

4 and 8 track are presently being imported but because of the obvious potential of tapes in Canada, it is expected that Columbia will be duplicating for themselves. It is also possible that Columbia will be moving into the cassette field and will probably establish a duplicating operation here as well.

Although cartridge sales in the western provinces are far ahead of other Canadian regions, Columbia is finding more encouraging sales in Ontario and what is more important, a very good repeat business.

## QUALITY TO BOW DUPLICATING OPERATION

Toronto: Quality Records Limited are completing installation of necessary machinery to assemble and create four and eight track cartridges for their growing tape market. The duplicating operation should be in full swing by the end of February. Plans are also underway for cassette duplicating.

This new operation puts Quality in the enviable position of being able to duplicate an album release on cartridge just days after the initial release which will close considerably the gap of disc and cartridge releases.

Ed LaBuik, formerly with the pre-recorded tape division of Ampex of Canada Ltd., as sales manager and previously with Philips Industries, takes up duties as Canadian marketing manager for Stereodyne.

Total staff including Ontario and Quebec representatives will remain at 25 for the time being. The new firm has arranged for manufacturing agents representatives in Halifax, Winnipeg, Calgary and Vancouver.

The present operation will deal only with the transferring of tape programs from a master tape ("pancake" which contains 20 complete albums) to the cartridges.

Future plans call for the actual molding of the Dynapak cartridge in Canada as well as the use of wholly Canadian masters, which will make the Canadian operation independent from the U.S. manufacturing facilities in their Troy, Michigan, plant.

Stereodyne is also expected to move into the cassette assembly to accomodate this market that is shaping up to have a tremendous potential.



### 90 G's FOR ORBISON ON CANADIAN TOUR

NYC: Roy Orbison is currently taking it easy in his home base of Nashville after picking up \$90,000 for a series of nine one-nighters that took him from Vancouver through to Winnipeg. Vancouver topped the take with \$19,000, while Calgary and Edmonton both gave a return of \$12,000 each. Victoria and Winnipeg handed over more than \$10,000 each. The tour was so successful that return dates have been submitted for confirmation for his 1968 tour.

Before heading for a European tour, the latter part of January and February, Orbison will complete the necessary cuts for another MGM album release expected to be released early this year.

### MGM INTRODUCES ULTIMATE SPINACH

NYC: From Morton Wax offices comes news of MGM's newest acquisition, Ultimate Spinach, a product of the Boston Music scene. Their first album is to be released later this month and will feature a unique vertical fold jacket with contemporary art work on the cover.

The group will leave shortly on an MGM sponsored promo tour which will kick off in their native Boston. The cocktail and press parties will precede their engagements in many of the U.S. cities including San Francisco where they will be appearing at The Fillmore Jan 18, 20 and 25th to 27th. The Hullabaloo in Los Angeles Feb 1st through the 4th and 9th through the 11th. In Charlotte, North Carolina they have a college booking convention Feb 14 and they play Chicago's Cellar, Feb 15th to 18th and 21st to the 23rd. They will also make appearances on the Joey Bishop, Woody Woodbury and Pat Boone TV shows.

Their album was produced by Alan Lorber Productions. Amphion manages Ultimate Spinach, which is booked by Premier Talent and under the direction of International Career Consultants.

### MONTRAL SWINGS ON UNITED STATES RECORD SCENE

NYC: Jimmy Parks brings to light the recent discovery, by the U.S., of the "Montreal Sound", which has become a potent force and the area of one of the hottest recording centres in North America as well as throughout the world.

The city now is in the limelight and is being talked about as the new "Mecca" for recording, throughout the U.S. On the heels of the recognition of Montreal artists, by the U.S., came the announcement by RCA Victor to build a million dollar studio complex in Montreal. This construction is now under way. In addition, Stereo Sound Studios, a major independent, has been expanding its facilities quietly and very shortly will offer the largest studio facilities anywhere on the North American east coast with accommodations for Symphony orchestras ranging up to 150 musicians.

The "Montreal Sound" has come about very quietly. It's invaded the pop market as well as the classical and very important country market, and it just happened casually. Writes Parks, "It wasn't planned that way".

### BOBBY CALENDAR SIGNED TO ALAN LORBER PRODUCTIONS

NYC: Alan Lorber has signed Bobby Calendar to his production firm and is expected to bow Calendar's first MGM album, the latter part of February. Calendar will co-produce the LP with Lorber and will introduce an unusual musical quality with a social commentary lyrical content.

### "THE BELLS OF SAN FRANCISCO" - AN ATLANTIC HOPEFUL

NYC: Morton Wax breaks the news that Atlantic Records is to rush release "The Bells Of San Francisco" by Carnegie Hall. The session was produced by the team that created "Winchester Cathedral", Geoff Stephens and Peer-Southern Publishing. They also take publishing and writing credits.

### BOBBY SCOTT TO ARRANGE PRYSOCK'S LP

NYC: Harriet Wasser has news that Bobby Scott, who has his own vocal album out on Columbia ("My Heart In My Hands") will arrange Arthur Prysock's next album. The outing, on Verve, is to be recorded "live" at New York's Village Gate.

### TOM JONES OPENS NORTH AMERICAN TOUR FEB 15

NYC: Tom Jones, Britain's top selling singer of 1967, will open his North American tour with a two week engagement at New York's Copacabana Feb 15. Ren Grevatt, who keeps the press on top of the activities of London Records, notes that London's Parrot label has set up a heavy concentration of radio spot advertising in connection with the current "Tom Jones Live" album as well as a nationwide distribution of empty album covers and assorted display pieces for dealer in-store and window promotions. This promotion will include all of Jones' Parrot catalog of six LP's including his current "Live" entry, which was cut at London's Talk Of The Town Club. This should put Jones in the enviable position of being the talk of the business as he moves across the United States nation. Prior to his Copacabana opening Jones will tape a Kraft Music Hall TV show on Wednesday Feb 14th. Jones will also make a special guest appearance at the annual formal dinner awards presentation of the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences in New York Feb 29. He will then fly to California for several TV guest appearances including the taping on March 6 for the Red Skelton Show to be aired March 12. He will also be taping from the 7th to the 11th of March for the Hollywood Palace Show; and taping from the 13th to the 18th of March for the Jonathan Winters Show.

Jones will conclude his tour with a four week session at the Flamingo Hotel in Las Vegas. Commencing 21 March, this is the first of five scheduled dates at the Flamingo.

### NEW ROCK MUSICAL OPENS AT ORPHEUM

NYC: Bob Ganshaw, of Michael F. Goldstein has news of yet another rock musical to influence the great white way. "Your Own Thing", with Marian Mercer portraying a lady discotheque operator who digs younger men, opened at the Orpheum Theatre, 8th and Second. Miss Mercer comes well prepared for the role having appeared in notable B'way successes like "Greenwillow" and "Fiorello" as well as an off B'way "Little Mary Sunshine."

Zev Bufman and Dorothy Love are behind "Thing" which has lyrics by Hal Hester and Danny Apolinari. The book is by Donald Driver, who is also supervising the entire production. Walter Gidaly is associate producer.

The Canadian tape scene has always been a "Let Sam do it!" proposition. The current cassette, 4-track and 8-track influx is suffering from the same thing. Tapes aren't being promoted in Canada. Certain companies are not sure the tape scene will happen at all, and have indicated to RPM that they are sitting and waiting. Meanwhile they aren't ready to lease their tapes to outsiders who are willing to promote their product in their own outlets (in many cases not record stores.) In the U.S. the tape cartridge business has taken on a different picture. Tapes are being sold in stores where records aren't available. As usual, you can sum it up by saying that Canada remains a small, late market because we depend too much in U.S. spillover.///

The Canadian music industry has become a football for a few peiodical writers of late. Ex-columnist on the rock scene in the Toronto Star, Ralph Thomas predicted that the Canadian music industry was shaky because of its own problems. Thomas never wrote about the "problems" which might indicate they weren't newsworthy enough to cover, or so explosive that the Star didn't want to get involved. Telegram's After Four teen supplement (in the Reb's column) says the Canadian music industry will happen in 1968. Possibly they might even be able to tell who it will happen for. Jack Batten in MacLeans magazine says it was all a hype. There really wasn't that much to get excited about. Batten viewed the whole scene from a Toronto standpoint. The article all but ignored the attempts of the rest of Canada. Not one of these critics went into the depths of the problems of programming and with the exception of one very valid comment by Ian Tyson (which might have been the key to the whole problem,) their views are generalizations. So far there hasn't been a good explosive exposé of the Toronto music scene. If there were it might lead to a national exposé of some pretty fancy double dealing.

### BERNIE EARLY MOVES INTO DISC BUSINESS

Newly signed Columbia recording artist **Bernie Early** is one of the most unique of Canadian country artists. He started out in the business as a country performer but because of the **Elvis Presley** influence in the late 50's he changed his style and moved into the rock and roll business. He was only 19 when he got a break through **Fat's Domino**'s manager, who happened to hear Early in Ottawa and arranged for Bernie to go to New York and record "Bernie's Rock Doll" for **MGM** which became a top ten item across the U.S. nation and resulted in him appearing on the **Dick Clark** "American Band Stand" and a road show with **Brenda Lee**. He became a big item on the night club circuit, fronting a full rock band. His first love however was always a part of him and he slowly moved back into the country field and one of the first people he came across was **Roy Penny**, the house guitarist at Toronto's **Horseshoe Tavern**, who in turn introduced Bernie to **Ben Kerr**, a Toronto specialist in good country music. Kerr supplied Bernie with a few original compositions to use on the road and "Chaser For The Blues" turned out to be such a crowd pleaser that it was used when he appeared on the **CTV** "Country Music Hall". The next break for Early was when he met independent record producer and promoter **Gordon Hill**, who managed the printing department of **Columbia Records Of Canada Ltd.**, for almost 11 years. Hill rushed Bernie into **Sound Canada** studios and along with the best country sidemen available: **Roy Penny**, **Ollie Strong**, **Rick Lamareux**, **Billy Gibbs**, **Wally Dean**, **Roddie LePrieur** and **Rolly Chambers**, cut Bernie's first entry into the country disc business, "Chaser For The Blues" and "Stop Me" (Columbia C4-2786).

### COUNTRY MUSIC GETS BOOST IN NORTHWESTERN ONTARIO



Fred King will also be taking a live country music group on the road throughout the coverage area. The **CKPR-Kingsmen** will play for dances and shows throughout the Northwestern Ontario area, in cooperation with the station.

### CHARLEY PRIDE ADDS CANADA TO HIS LIST OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Charley Pride, to use a well meant description, "is a shade darker, but a shade better than many of today's country artists". On stage he quickly puts his audience at ease with "Well, I guess you all thought I'd sound like Joe Tex", and went on to explain how tough it is nowadays to tell who's who. "I even thought the Righteous Bros. were two of us". It's this type of delivery that has made Charley Pride one of the top country artists in the **RCA Victor** roster and one of the biggest draws throughout the south including Atlanta, Georgia, and Galveston, Texas. He just keeps picking up fans, and it's very easy to convert to the Charley Pride brand of country. Charley comes from Sledge, Mississippi, where his father operates a barber shop and drives a school bus. Like most Southerners he got caught up in the baseball fever and was determined to be a top pro and after two years in the army, he got his chance, with the **Los Angeles Angels** of the minor league. He almost got to the top but apparently **Casey Stengel** put a damper on that dream, which sent Charley hurtling into his second love - country music. What was big league baseball's loss has certainly been one of the greatest gains for country music, and here on stage at Toronto's **Horseshoe** this big strapping country talent wearing dinner jacket and black patent leather shoes had the usual half hour drinker staying until closing. He sang most of his hits and several big ones of other country artists. The audience applauded his "The Snakes Crawl At Night" and his just done with hit "Does My Ring Hurt Your Finger" and his latest "The Day The World Stood Still" (RCA 9403). Charley Pride brought colour and a fine talent to Toronto's country scene. Like most **RCA Victor** visiting talent, country or otherwise, Charley Pride, was given the whirlwind but effective tour of Toronto's radio and television VIP's by **RCA Victor**'s **Ed Preston**, who seems to accomplish the almost impossible with country artists. Like **George Hamilton IV**, Ed arranged for Charley to appear on **Elwood Glover's CBC-TV** "Luncheon Date" as well as an interview bit at **CFGM**.

Three's a Crowd's initial album "Movie Matinee" will cost close to \$30,000. There should be a lot of fine sounds for that money...Aretha Franklin's current Atlantic single "Chain of Fools", has passed the million mark in sales as certified by the RIAA. The record has been the fastest seller ever issued on Atlantic, having passed the million mark less than six weeks after release...Wayne Newton makes his MGM debut with "All The Time", a cut from his upcoming album "Walking On New Grass"...Glen Yarbrough is now signed with Warner Bros. - Seven Arts.

The Columbia "rock machine" display is the newest approach to promotion of LPs through visual effects. This replaces psychedelic posters. Judy Lishinsky Corman rejoined RCA Victor as manager of press and information for popular records...Davy Jones has a damage suit against his former manager, Al Cohen. Davy's asking for \$150,000. In his suit Davy alleges that the contract he signed with Cohen was not valid because he was a minor when the contract was signed...Petula Clark just finished "Finian's Rainbow" for Warner Brothers and she's already signed to star in MGM's musical version of "Goodbye Mr. Chips" along with Peter O'Toole. Roy Orbison did all right for himself in Canada, brought in just under \$90,000 for nine dates. Bet Canadians will see him again soon.

Questions unanswered: Is Mama Cass going on her own? Is the rumor that The Doors are breaking up true?

The Rolling Stones formed their own label, known as Mother Earth Records. Mariann Faithful is first artist on the label...Jay and the Techniques recently completed a week-long tour during which they entertained U.S. servicemen waiting to be sent to Viet Nam. Their second album "Love, Lost and Found" will be released shortly...Johnny Crawford, well-known for the five years he spent appearing as Chuck Connor's son in the Rifleman TV series, has just finished a two-year hitch in the Army. He marks his return with "Angelica" (Tower) and an album to follow shortly.

Youngbloods have a hot West-Coast sound in "Quicksand" (RCA Victor). It will undoubtedly catch on in Canada...History repeats itself, Samson and Delilah return with a hard rhythm and blues sound, "Keep Me In Mind" (ABC)...Another ABC winner is "The Marvelous Toy", the old Tom Paxton tune, refreshed by Jane Morgan.

The Seekers present a pleasing rock sound in their new album "Seen in Green". The use of the gentle harpsichord (sounding almost like a honky tonk piano) plus the folk-like voice of Judith Durham make a real swinging arrangement on "All I Can Remember". An unusual combination of sounds are found in "Chase A Rainbow". The deep low sound of the bass clarinet mixed with the high pitched trumpet add a great lift to an already beautiful melody. A sad story plus flute and violins make "If You Go Away" a real tear jerker. Judith adds a touch of feminine sentimentalism, which gives the words true meaning and feeling.



Scott Walker of the Walker brothers may head out on his own to be a solo. His brother Gary might be forming a new group which might mean the end of the Walker Brothers. Charlie Watts of the Rolling Stones has taken over the home which was once a hunting retreat for the Archbishop Of Canterbury. The mansion in Sussex is filled with antiques and historia. The Foundations' new single is "Back On My Feet Again" and could be a great follow-up to their current single which is headed toward no. 1 in Canada. "The Ballad of Bonnie and Clyde" is the no. 1 record in Britain currently. Watch for a new single called "Everlasting Love" by the Love Affair. It is currently in the top ten in England. The Small Faces may have a big one with their new "Tin Soldier" single. "Itchycoo Park" has launched them in Canada, and U.S. action looks inevitable. "Everything I Am" by The Plastic Penny is now definitely HITBOUND (I mentioned it last week.) A new group called The Herd look very good with their current single "Paradise Lost". The BBC's new sound would make you wonder if you were listening to a pirate of the staid old BBC which has revamped its programming. It might be an inspiration to CBC in Canada to go-go radio. (It might take a year for CBC to modernize.) P.J. Proby. You probably liked his hits and are wondering what he is doing. P.J. has just released a new single "It's Your Day Today" and the prediction is that it will be his next chart entry in Canada and possibly the U.S.. You may be seeing a series of 12 minute films by the Traffic produced by their manager Chris Blackwell soon on TV. The Traffic may also be recording in the U.S. soon for the U.S. market. George Harrison is recording the Indian music for a film called Wonder Wall. The Beatles will soon start working on their third full length movie. "You're A Good Man Charlie Brown" opens at the Fortune Theatre in London this month. Watch for a new single by a great group called "The Move." It's called "Fire Brigade" and looks like a very HOT item. Freddy and the Dreamers will be coming out with discs featuring them separately in solos. I will keep you posted. British groups are using insignias to promote their image. The idea is about three years old with Canadian groups, but the British are just catching on to the idea of trademarking your name in a Madison avenue way.

## QUALITY TAPE SALES FAR EXCEED EXPECTATIONS

Toronto: Ross Ferris, co-ordinator, tape sales division of Quality Records Limited, reports that tape cartridge business in Canada is on its way up and that sales to date have far exceeded their expectations. Sales in Toronto are also improving, but it is still the small towns surrounding Toronto and the western provinces where sales figures are

most impressive. Tape sales in the west would seem to be fully established.

Largest seller for Quality are releases by The Tijuana Brass (all nine of them). Quality's limited country line has also been well received.

The "Zhivago" sound track is showing well as are the Billy Vaughn and Lawrence Welk instrumentals.
